Game Summary I Event Summary

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Detroit Red Wings to the Scotiabank Saddledome for a matinee affair on Saturday afternoon. The Flames would outshoot the Wings 12-8 in the opening frame, but late goals from Patrick Kane and J.T. Compher would see Detroit skate into the intermission up 2-0. The Red Wings would add a pair in the second and one more in the third to take this contest 5-0.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of three meetings this season between the Flames and Jets. Calgary knocked-off Winnipeg 5-3 in their first meeting on October 11th.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 9-8-1 against Central Division teams and a record of 15-14-2 against Western Conference opponents.

FIRST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames opened the 2023-24 campaign by welcoming the Winnipeg Jets to the Scotiabank Saddledome on October 11th. Andrew Mangiapane would score the Flames first goal of the year on the powerplay to put his side up 1-0. Kyle Connor would respond for the Jets shortly after, before a MacKenzie Weegar shot found its way through traffic and into the back of the net to restore the Flames lead. Alex lafallo would tie the game again for Winnipeg, but Rasmus Andersson would strike shorthanded just over two minutes later to once again restore the Flames lead through 40. It would stay 3-2 with 14:18 remaining in the game until a Mark Scheifele strike drew the Jets level. It looked like extra time was coming but Andrew Mangiapane would register two points late in the third including an empty netter to help the Flames claim game one of the season-series 5-3.

MARKY MARK:

Jacob Markstrom has played 199 games with the Calgary Flames and can become just the sixth goalie to play in 200 NHL games in franchise history. With a record of 99-70-25 in 197 games as a Flame, Markstrom is just one win shy of becoming the fifth goaltender in Flames history to record 100 victories. The Gavle, SWE native has recorded 15 of his 20 career shutouts in Calgary which rank third in Flames franchise history, trailing only Miikka Kiprusoff (41) and Dan Bouchard (20).

WEEGSY BABY:

MacKenzie Weegar is in the midst of a career season, and his 15 goals on the campaign lead all defensemen in the NHL. Weegar is looking to join Al MacInnis (28 in 1993-94 & 1990-91) and Dougie Hamilton (17 in 2017-18) as the third Flames skater to conclude a season as the League leader in goals among defenseman (outright or tied). Weegar also has 17 helpers for 32 points which ranks him fourth on the Flames in scoring. In nine career meetings against the Winnipeg Jets, Weegar has a goal and an assist for two points averaging 17:44 of ice-time over those contests.

DEFENSIVE SCORING:

Calgary Flames defenceman have scored 35 goals which is tied for the the second-most by a defensive core in the league so far this season, trailing only Colorado (46). Weegar leads the charge with 15 tallies, while Noah Hanifin (9), and Rasmus Andersson (7) are currently second and third in scoring among blueliners on the Flames.

WINNIPEG TIES TO CALGARY:

Jets centre Sean Monahan spent the first nine seasons of his NHL career as a member of the Calgary Flames after being drafted sixth-overall by the Flames during the 2013 NHL Draft. Monahan's 656 games in a Flames sweater are the ninth-most in franchise history, and the Brampton, ON native recorded 212 goals and 250 assists for 462 points during his time in Calgary. Winnipeg blueliner Josh Morrissey was born in Calgary and coming into today's game has skated in 25 contests against his hometown team.

JUNIOR CONNECTIONS:

Flames forward Walker Duehr and Jets defenceman Neal Pionk were teammates on the USHL's Sioux City Musketeers during the 2014-15 season. Duehr was a rookie and played in 49 games, registering two goals and five assists for seven points while Pionk was in his final season of junior hockey and posted a career best 48 points from seven goals and 41 assists. Flames blueliner MacKenzie Weegar and Jets forward Nikolaj Ehlers were teammates on the Halifax Mooseheads of the QMJHL in 2013-14. Weegar posted a career-best 59 points with 12 goals and 47 assists while Ehlers finished second on the Mooseheads in scoring with 104 points.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

In Calgary and Winnipeg's first meeting on October 11th, the Flames scored shorthanded, on the powerplay, and at even strength all in the same game for the first time since March 12th, 2023. Rasmus Andersson scored the shorthanded marker in both instances, the only two shorthanded goals of his career.

Jacob Markstrom has recorded four assists this season and only four different goaltenders in Flames history have recorded more helpers in a season, with the most recent being Roman Turek who registered five during the 2001-02 campaign.



ON THE FARM CALGARY WRANGLERS (AHL): 25-16-5

The Calgary Wranglers enter their second season in Calgary, AB after moving from Stockton, CA prior to the start of last season. Calgary welcomed the Manitoba Moose to the 'dome for a back-to-back on Tuesday and Wednesday night. The Wranglers would pick up a 4-2 win on Tuesday with Brett Sutter scoring twice in his return to the lineup, while Cole Schwindt, and Matt Coronato also tallied along with 32 saves from Connor Murphy. The Wranglers fell 2-1 in a shootout on Wednesday as they now travel to Abbotsford to face the Canucks on Saturday and Monday.
