- The Stars improved to 7-1-2 (16 points) on the road this season. Dallas has posted more points through their first 10 road games in a season only once (2023-24: 8-1-1, 17 points) according to NHL Stats.
- Mavrik Bourque (0:55) scored the fastest game-opening goal for the Stars since April 16, 2025 (Mason Marchment: 0:16) according to NHL Stats.
- **Esa Lindell** tied his single-game career high with seven blocked shots.

# THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

• Tonight is the first of three games the Stars will play against the Flames this season. The two teams will face each other again on March 3 in Calgary and April 7 in Dallas.

58/73 (79.5%)

- Entering play Friday, the Stars ranked second in the NHL in both wins (13, tied) and points (29) and ranked third in points percentage with .690. The team's success this season comes despite having 78 combined man games lost with Oskar Bäck, Jamie Benn, Matt Duchene, Adam Erne, Thomas Harley, Roope Hintz, Nils Lundkvist and Ilya Lyubushkin all missing multiple games with injury at various points this season.
- Lian Bichsel scored his first goal of the season in Dallas' game on Nov. 15 against the Flyers, making him the 20th Stars skaters to score a goal for Dallas this season. Entering play Friday, Dallas, Anaheim (21) and Carolina (20) were the only teams in the NHL to have at least 20 unique goal scorers this season.

- Since Nov. 8, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 8-0 during 5-on-5 play when the defensive pair of Lian Bichsel and Alexander Petrovic is on the ice. Entering play Friday, Vegas' Brayden McNabb and Shea Theodore (9-0) were the only defensive pair in the NHL to be on the ice for more 5-on-5 goals for during that span.
- Since Nov. 9, Dallas has gone 15-for-16 on the penalty kill for a 93.8 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Friday.
- Mikko Rantanen (109) and Jason Robertson (102) are both pacing to finish the season with more than 100 points. If they were to maintain that pace, they would become the second set of Stars teammates to have concurrent 100-point seasons, joining Bobby Smith (114) and Dino Ciccarelli (106) who did so during the 1981-82 season for the Minnesota North Stars.
- The defensive pair of Miro Heiskanen and Esa Lindell (60.7 percent) ranked fifth in the NHL in expected goal share among defensive pairs to play at least 100 minutes together entering play Friday according to MoneyPuck.com. The pair's 1.85 expected goals against per 60 this season also ranked fifth in the NHL among defensive pairs to have played at least 100 minutes together.
- All five Dallas skaters that have taken at least 100 faceoffs this season have a win rate above 50 percent: Tyler Seguin (56.2), Roope Hintz (55.7), Radek Faksa (55.0) and Wyatt Johnston (50.8).
- Roope Hintz has tallied eight points (3-5—8) in eight games since returning to the Stars lineup after missing five games with an
- Sam Steel enters tonight's game two assists shy of becoming the 17th player selected in the 2016 NHL Draft to total 100 career assists.

#### **EXTINGUISHING THE FLAMES**

- Dallas is 80-72-36 all-time vs. Calgary, including a 34-41-18 mark on the road.
- The Stars have won their last three games against the Flames dating back to Dec. 8, 2024, outscoring Calgary 14-6 during that span.
- Jason Robertson has 18 points (10-8—18) in 12 career games against Calgary and has totaled at least one point in 11 of those 12 games, also carrying a plus-minus rating of +7.
  - Robertson enters tonight's contest riding an 11-game point streak against the Flames, his longest point streak against a single opponent.
  - His 1.50 points per game average ranks second among active NHL skaters who have played Calgary at least three times in their career.
- Mikko Rantanen has tallied 18 points (8-10—18) in his last 10 games played vs. Calgary. In 22 career games against the Flames, Rantanen has totaled 26 points (12-14—26), averaging 1.18 points per game.
- Jamie Benn has 11 points (3-8—11) in his last 10 games played against the Flames. In all, Benn has registered 46 points (23-23— 46) in 46 career games vs. Calgary, carrying a plus-minus rating of +5.
  - His 46 career points against Calgary rank eighth among all active NHL skaters.
- Colin Blackwell has nine points (3-6—9) in nine career games against the Flames and upholds a plus-minus rating of +7.
- Roope Hintz enters tonight's game riding a three-game point streak vs. Calgary, earning five points (2-3—5) during that span. Hintz has totaled 13 points (3-10—13) in 15 career games played against the Flames.
- Wyatt Johnston enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak vs. Calgary, earning four points (3-1-4) during that span. In all, **Johnston** has seven points (6-1—7) in nine career games played against the Flames.
- Miro Heiskanen has 13 points (1-12—13) in 16 career games against the Flames with an average time on ice of 24:58 which ranks fourth among active NHL defensemen.
- Tyler Seguin has tallied 29 points (13-16—29) in 31 career games vs. Calgary. His 29 points against the Flames rank third among active Stars skaters.

#### **SEEING STARS**

- Jason Robertson was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 16 after leading the League in both goals (6) and points (9) in three games played. It marks the sixth time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors.
  - He was named the First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 6, Nov. 27 and April 13 during the 2022-23 season and for the week ending on March 6 during the 2021-22 season.
  - He also earned Third Star of the Week honors for the week ending on Dec. 4, 2022.
- Robertson enters tonight's game riding a six-game point streak dating back to Nov. 9 against the Kraken, totaling 13 points (9-4-13) over that span. Entering play Friday, his six-game point streak was tied for the longest active streak in the NHL.
  - If Robertson were to record a point tonight, it would extend his point streak to seven games for the first time this season. It would also be the longest point streak by a Stars skater this year.
- During Robertson's current six-game point streak, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 10-2 during 5-on-5 play when he has been on the ice according to Natural Stat Trick. His 10 on-ice goals for and plus-eight goal differential both top the Stars during that
- Robertson has also scored in the last five games that he has played in, finding the back of the net nine times in total during that span. According to NHL Stats, he is the sixth player in Stars team history to record multiple five-game goal streaks, joining Mike Modano (4x), Jamie Benn (4x), Wyatt Johnston (3x), Brenden Morrow (2x) and Jere Lehtinen (2x).
- Robertson's nine goals over the last five games are tied for the most ever by a Dallas skater over a five-game span in Stars team history (since 1993-94) according to NHL Stats. Dino Ciccarelli owns the franchise record, scoring 11 goals in five games from Nov. 2 to 12, 1983.
- Entering play Friday, Robertson's five-game goal streak was the longest active such streak in the NHL and made him one of four players this season to score in at least five consecutive games, joining Morgan Geekie (6), Mark Scheifele (5) and Brad Marchand

- If Robertson were to score again tonight, it would extend his goal streak to six games for the second time in his career, matching his career high that he set from Oct. 27 to Nov. 8, 2022. It would also make him the first Stars skater to record a six-game goal streak since Wyatt Johnston did so from March 24 to April 3, 2025.
- From Nov. 13 to 18, Robertson recorded three consecutive multi-goals games for the second time in his career according to NHL Stats. Robertson previously had three consecutive three-point games for the first time in his career after doing so from Nov. 11 to 15.
- Robertson scored two goals in the Stars' game on Nov. 18 against the Islanders for his 31st career multi-goal game, which surpassed former Minnesota North Stars forward Steve Payne for ninth place on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats.
- Robertson scored the sixth hat trick of his career in Dallas' game on Nov. 15 vs. Philadelphia to tie Neal Broten and Steve Payne for seventh place on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats. All three of his goals came consecutively, making him the second player in franchise history (Neal Broten) to score multiple natural hat tricks.
- Robertson scored two goals in 1:39 of game time in Dallas' game on Nov. 13 at Montreal, a 7-0 win over the Canadiens, also notching an assist in that game to finish the night with three points.
- He scored a goal and had two assists including on **Roope Hintz's** overtime winner on Nov. 11 against the Ottawa Senators.
- In all this season, Robertson has totaled 26 points (12-14—25) in 21 games this season, ranking second on the Stars in scoring and 15th in the NHL in points entering play Friday.
  - Robertson's 12 goals were tied for 10th in the League entering play Friday.
- Robertson ranked second in both goals (tied) and points among American skaters this season entering play Friday.
- Robertson's 90 shots on goal ranked second to only Cutter Gauthier (91) for the most in the NHL this season entering play Friday.
- Entering play Friday, Robertson ranked fourth in the NHL this season with 12 expected goals according to MoneyPuck.com.

#### **ROAD WARRIORS**

- Tonight's matchup against the Flames marks the sixth of eight road games the Stars will play this month and the second game of a four-game road trip that will also see the Stars take on the Canucks, Oilers and Kraken.
- The Stars have a 7-1-2 record in 10 road games this season. Their .800 points percentage when playing on the road was the best mark in the NHL this year entering play Friday.
  - Dallas' one regulation road loss was tied for the fewest in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Dallas have posted more points through their its 10 road games in a season only once (2023-24: 8-1-1, 17 points) according to
- The Stars are averaging 3.60 goals per game on the road this year, which was tied for second in the NHL entering play Friday. The team's 2.60 goals per game against was tied for the eighth-best mark in the League entering play Friday.
- Dallas has gone 27-for-32 on the penalty kill on the road this season for an 84.4 percent success rate, which was the fifth-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Friday.
- A win or overtime loss today would extend the Stars' road point streak to a season-best eight games. It would mark their longest road point streak since they also had a point in eight straight road games (6-0-2) from Feb. 1 to 28, 2025.
- A Dallas victory tonight would also give the team five consecutive road victories for the first time since Dec. 23, 2024 to Jan. 11, 2025.
- Mikko Rantanen is the Stars' leading scorer on the road this season, totaling 14 points (6-8—14) in 10 games. Despite only playing in 10 road games this season, his 14 points were tied for ninth in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Rantanen (1.40), Jason Robertson (1.30) and Jamie Benn (1.00) are all playing at a point-per-game pace on the road this season.
  - Rantanen's 1.40 road points per game ranked fifth in the NHL this season among players to play in at least five road games entering play Friday.
  - Robertson was tied for 12th in the NHL entering play Friday with 13 road points (6-7—13) entering play Friday.
- If Robertson were to score tonight, it would give him goals in four consecutive road games for the first time since he scored in five straigth road games from Nov. 3 to 15, 2022.
- Rantanen enters tonight's game having tallied at least a point in each of the last five road games he has played, totaling eight points (3-5—8) over that span. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in six consecutive road games for the first time as a member of the Stars.
- Colin Blackwell (2-2-4) and Mavrik Bourque (2-2-4) each have four points in their last four road games played. Both players scored in Dallas' last game on Nov. 20 at Vancouver.
  - If Blackwell were to score tonight, it would give him goals in three consecutive road games for the first time in his career.
- A goal or an assist tonight would extend Radek Faksa's road point streak to three games for the first time since he had a point in four straight road games from Nov. 10 to 16, 2019.
- If Justin Hryckowian were to record a point tonight, it would extend his road point streak to three games for the first time in his career.
- Casey DeSmith has a 2-0-1 record on the road this season, posting a .935 save percentage, 1.63 goals-against average and one shutout in those games. Entering play Friday, he ranked in the top five in the NHL in road goals-against average (third) and save percentage (tied fourth).

#### **NOVEMBER TO REMEMBER**

The Stars have posted a 7-2-1 record in nine games played this November, tying for the League lead in wins and points (15) this month entering play Friday.

- Dallas' 39 goals scored were the second-most this month (Washington; 40) entering play Friday and their 3.90 goals per game ranked third.
  - The team's 25 5-on-5 goals for in November were tied for fourth in the NHL entering play Friday.
- The Stars have gone 11-for-33 on the power play since Nov. 1 for a 33.3 percent success rate on the man advantage, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL this month entering play Friday.
- Entering play Friday, Jason Robertson (9-8—17) ranked second in the League in points this month with 17. No player had scored more goals this month than **Robertson's** nine entering play Friday.
- Mikko Rantanen (6-10—16) ranked fourth in the League in scoring since Nov. 1 entering play Friday followed by Miro Heiskanen (1-12—13) who led all defensemen and tied for sixth in the NHL in November scoring.
- Entering play Friday, Dallas was the only team to have three players ranked in the top 10 in scoring this month.

#### THE QUEBÄCK LINE

- In Dallas' last game on Nov. 21 against Vancouver, the line of Oskar Bäck, Mavrik Bourque and Justin Hryckowian played 5:58 of 5-on-5 ice together. When the trio was on the ice during that time, the Stars outshot the Canucks 7-0 and outscored them 1-0.
  - Bourque scored a goal and Bäck and Hryckowian both tallied an assist in the win.
- Among all NHL forward lines to play at least 50 minutes together this season, the Bäck /Bourque/Hryckowian line is tied for 15th in the NHL with a 65 percent expected goals rate according to MoneyPuck.com.
- With seven points (3-4—7) in 21 games played this season, **Bourque** is pacing to finish the year with 12 goals, 16 assists and 27 points, all of which would be career highs for the forward.

#### **ALEXANDER THE GREAT**

- Since Nov. 8, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 11-1 during 5-on-5 play when defenseman Alexander Petrovic is on the ice. His 11 on-ice goals and plus-10 goal differential are both the best marks on the Stars roster during that span.
- Petrovic's plus-10 even-strength on-ice goal differential since Nov. 8 was the third-best mark in the NHL and topped all defensemen during that span entering play Friday.
- Petrovic skated 22:06 of ice time in Dallas' last game on Nov. 20 against the Vancouver Canucks, his highest single-game total since he skated 24:02 on Oct. 19, 2018 against the Washington Capitals while he was a member of the Florida Panthers.
- Petrovic notched an assist in Dallas' game on Nov. 15 against Philadelphia and now has five points (1-4—5) in 19 games played this season, ranking fourth among Stars defensemen in scoring. He is currently on pace to finish the season with five goals, 19 assists and 24 points, all of which would be career highs.
- Petrovic scored his first goal of the season in Dallas' game on Nov. 13 against the Montreal Canadiens, a 7-0 Stars win. It marked his first regular-season NHL goal since April 2, 2018.
- Petrovic finished the Stars' game against the Canadiens with a plus-5 plus/minus rating. It marked the highest plus/minus rating in a single game in his career and the best mark by a Stars defenseman since Ryan Suter (plus-5) on March 9, 2023 at Buffalo.

#### **BISH BETTER HAVE MY MONEY**

- Since Nov. 8, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 9-0 during even-strength play when Lian Bichsel is on the ice. His plus-9 even-strength goal differential during that span was tied for the fourth-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday.
  - Defensive partner Alexander Petrovic (plus-10) was the only defensemen to rank higher than Bichsel entering play
- Entering play Friday, Bichsel was the only skater to be on the ice for nine even-strength goals for while not being on the ice for an even-strength goal against. The second ranked players were Parker Kelly (6-0) and Simon Nemic (6-0).
- Bichsel has totaled a team-high 74 hits this season, which ranked sixth in the NHL and led all NHL defensemen entering play Friday. He is currently on pace to finish the season with 289 hits, which would be the most hits in a single season by a Stars skater in franchise history.
  - Steve Ott, with 278 in 2011-12, currently holds the single-season franchise record.
- Bichsel has recorded eight hits in a game three times this season, on Oct. 23 vs. Los Angeles, Oct. 28 vs. Washington and Nov. 15 vs. Philadelphia. Entering play Friday, Bichsel was the only skater in the NHL this season to have three eight-hit games.
- If he were to have at least eight hits in a game again, he would become the eighth player in franchise history to have recorded four eight-hit games and the fourth player to do so in one season, joining Mark Fistric (5; 2011-12), Joel Lundqvist (4; 2006-07) and Steve Ott (5; 2008-09, 7; 2009-10, 6; 2011-12).

#### **POWER UP**

- The Stars have gone 22-for-71 on the power play this season for a 31.0 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday. Dallas' 22 power-play goals scored this season topped the NHL entering play Friday.
  - The Stars didn't score their 22nd power-play goal of the season until their 42nd game played during the 2024-25 campaign on Jan. 12, 2025 against the Ottawa Senators.
- When playing at the American Airlines Center this season, the Stars have gone 15-for-38 on the power play for a 39.5 percent success rate, which was the best mark in the League entering play Friday. Their 15 home power-play goals ranked second to only Minnesota (16) for the most in the NHL this year entering play Friday.
- Dallas has scored at least two power-play goals in a game six different times this season on Oct. 14 vs. Minnesota, on Oct. 16 vs. Vancouver, on Oct. 23 vs. Los Angeles, on Oct. 25 vs. Carolina, on Nov. 1 at Florida and on Nov. 4 vs. Anaheim. Entering play Friday, the Stars were the only team this season to have scored two or more power-play goals in six games.

- In 2024-25, the Stars recorded their sixth multi power-play goal game in their 45th game of the season.
- The Stars scored two power-play goals 14 seconds apart in their game on Nov. 1 at Florida, which set the franchise record for the fastest consecutive power-play goals for. They bested the previous record of 15 second set by Steve Payne and Mike Fidler on March 21, 1979 against the Philadelphia Flyers while the team was still located in Minnesota.
- Dallas' 22 power-play goals have been scored by nine different skaters: Wyatt Johnston (8), Mikko Rantanen (4), Jason Robertson (4), Matt Duchene, Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz, Justin Hryckowian, Tyler Seguin and Sam Steel.
  - Steel's power-play goal against the Hurricanes on Oct. 25 was only the second of his career and his first since Nov. 18, 2018 against the Washington Capitals while he was playing for the Anaheim Ducks.
- Rantanen was leading the NHL in power-play points this season with 15 (4-11—15) entering play Friday.
- Johnston led all NHL skaters with eight power-play goals and tied for second with 13 power-play points (8-5—13) entering play Friday. His eight power-play goals are just three shy of tying his career high of 11 that he set last season.
- Rantanen (59) and Johnston (51) are both on pace to set career highs in power-play points and set franchise records for most power-play points in a single season by a Stars skater.
  - Bobby Smith in 1980-81 currently holds the franchise record for power-play points in a season with 44 (13-31—44).
- Robertson's 11 power-play points (4-7—11) were tied for the sixth-most in the League this season entering play Friday.
- Heiskanen has totaled seven points (1-6-7) on the power-play this season, which was tied for the fourth-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Friday.

#### THE MOOSE IS LOOSE

- Mikko Rantanen has tallied 28 points (10-18—28) in 21 games played this season and enters tonight's game leading the team in scoring. He has recorded a point in all but three games this season.
- Rantanen's 28 points were tied for the fifth-most in the NHL and his 18 assists were tied for sixth entering play Friday.
- His current scoring rate puts him on pace to finish the season with 70 assists and 109 points, both of which would be a career high for the 11-year veteran. 109 points would tie Jason Robertson in 2022-23 (46-63—109) for the second-highest scoring season in franchise history behind only Bobby Smith who had 114 points (43-71—114) in 1981-82.
- Fifteen (4-11—15) of Rantanen's 28 points this season have come on the power play, which was the most in the NHL entering play Friday.
  - Rantanen is currently on pace to finish the season with 59 power-play points which would set a franchise record and surpass his career high of 40 (14-26—40) that he had in 2023-24 while playing for the Colorado Avalanche.
    - Bobby Smith in 1980-81 currently holds the franchise record for power-play points in a season with 44 (13-31-44).
- Rantanen has drawn 11 penalties this season, which was tied for the fourth-most in the NHL entering play Friday. His 11 penalties drawn account for 13.9 percent (11 of 79) of the penalties the Stars have drawn this season.
- Rantanen had two points (1-1-2) in Dallas' game on Nov. 11 against Ottawa. His goal marked his 40th point as a member of the Stars in his 37th game played with the team. He tied Russ Courtnall as the second-fastest player in franchise history to reach the mark, behind only Mike Gartner (35 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- According to NHL Stats, Rantanen became the 14th player in franchise history and sixth skater in Stars team history to have at least 20 points through the team's first 14 games of a season. Jason Robertson was the last player to do so, notching 21 points (9-12-21) through the team's first 14 games played in 2022-23.
- Rantanen scored his 300th and 301st career goals on Nov. 4 against the Oilers, making him the fourth Finnish skater in NHL history, the second player drafted in 2015 and the 39th active NHL skater to score 300 career goals.
  - Rantanen is also the third-fastest Finn to score 300 NHL goals, doing so in his 665th career game.

#### **MIRO THE HERO**

- Miro Heiskanen has 18 points (3-15—18) in 21 games played this season, ranking fourth on both the Stars and among all NHL defensemen (tied) in scoring this season entering play Friday.
- Heiskanen is averaging 25:32 of ice time per game this season, which was the fourth-highest total in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Heiskanen tallied an assist against Montreal on Nov. 13 for the 300th point of his career, making him:
  - The second defenseman and ninth skater from the 2017 draft class to tally 300 NHL points.
  - The fifth defenseman and 29th skater in franchise history to reach the 300-point milestone. 0
  - The ninth Finnish defenseman in NHL history to record 300 points.
  - The 45th active defenseman to have 300 career points.
- Heiskanen's assist against the Canadiens was the 238th of his career, surpassing Reijo Ruotsalainen for the eighth-most assists by a Finnish defenseman in NHL history. Heiskanen's next assist will give him sole possession of seventh on the all-time assists list among Finnish defensemen.
- Heiskanen recorded at least two assists in four consecutive games from Nov. 6 to 11, which tied Roope Hintz (March 24 to 29, 2025) for the longest streak of multi-assist games in franchise history according to NHL Stats. His 10 assists over that stretch also tied Hintz for the most assists by a Stars skater in franchise history over a four-game span according to NHL Stats. Hintz first accomplished this feat from Feb. 28 to March 6, 2025.
  - He is one of three active defensemen to have posted a multi-assist streak of four games, joining Erik Karlsson (four games in 2014-15 and 2011-12), Josh Morrissey (four games in 2023-24) and Roman Josi (four games in 2021-22).
  - His performance against the Kraken on Nov. 9 was the 52nd multi-assist game of his career, which gave him sole possession of 13th in franchise history according to NHL Stats. He was previously tied with Dennis Hextall (51).

- Heiskanen tied his single-game career high with four assists in Dallas' game on Nov. 6 against Anaheim. He is now the sixth defenseman in franchise history to have multiple four-point games.
  - He joins Colorado's Cale Makar and Vancouver's Quinn Hughes as the only defensemen this season to tally four assists in a single game.
  - Heiskanen last had four assists in a game on March 5, 2024, against the San Jose Sharks.
- Heiskanen scored two goals in the team's Oct. 25 game against the Hurricanes, opening the scoring for the Stars and tallying the game-winning goal on the power play in the third period. It marked the first multi-goal game by a Stars skater this season.
- His performance against Carolina marked the sixth multi-goal game of his career and first since Nov. 11, 2024. His second goal of the game also was his first power-play goal since Feb. 20, 2024 against the New York Rangers.
- Heiskanen's six multi-goal games are the third-most by a Stars defenseman in franchise history according to NHL Stats, trailing only Brad Maxwell (11) and Craig Hartsburg (8). He now also ranks fourth all-time among Finnish born defensemen in career multi-goal games behind only Reijo Ruotsalainen (12 GP), Kimmo Timonen (7 GP) and Risto Siltanen (7 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- Heiskanen has now scored 61 total goals in his career, making him the seventh Finnish defenseman in NHL history to have 60 or more career goals and the only active one to do so according to NHL Stats.

# **JOHNNY B. GOODE**

- Wyatt Johnston has totaled 21 points (11-10—21) in 21 games played this season and enters tonight's game ranked third on the team in scoring.
- Entering play Friday, Johnston was tied for ninth in goals and 11th in points among Canadian NHL players this season.
- Johnston was one of six skaters under the age of 23 to have at least 20 points this year entering play Friday. He was joined by Macklin Celebrini (19 years old, 13-18—31), Connor Bedard (20 years old, 13-16—29), Will Smith (20 years old, 7-13—20), Leo Carlsson (20 years old, 11-17—28) and Cutter Gauthier (21 years old, 12-12—24).
- Johnston is currently on pace to finish the year with 43 goals, 39 assists and 82 points, all of which would be career highs. Fortytwo goals would tie for the 10th-most in a single season in franchise history.
- Johnston's scored his 100th NHL goal in Dallas' Nov. 13 game, a 7-0 win over Montreal. In doing so, he became the first player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft to score 100 NHL goals and the 26th player in franchise history to score 100 goals for the Stars/North
- Johnston, who was 22 years and 183 days old on Nov. 13, became the third-youngest player in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 career goals according to NHL Stats. Only Brian Bellows (20 years, 179 days) and Mike Modano (22 years, 173 days) reached the mark at a younger age.
- Johnston recorded at least one point on the power play in five consecutive games from Nov. 1 to 9, which was the longest such streak of his career. He is the first Stars skater to have a power-play point in five straight games since Tyler Seguin had a six-game power-play point streak from Dec. 29, 2018 to Jan. 8, 2019 according to NHL Stats.
- Johnston recorded three consecutive multi-point efforts from Nov. 4 to 8, notching three assists against the Oilers, three points (2-1—3) against the Ducks and two assists against the Predators.
  - Both of Johnston's goals against Anaheim came on the power play, marking the second time in his career that he has had multiple power-play goals in the same game, after scoring three on March 2, 2025 against the St. Louis Blues.
  - Johnston also scored the game-deciding goal in the shootout against Edmonton. It marked the second shootout goal of his career and the first time he has scored a game-winner in the shootout.
- Johnston enters tonight's game two assists shy of becoming the first player from his draft class to total 100 career assists. He is also set to become the 60th player in franchise history to have 100 assists with the club.
- Johnston needs two more points to reach the 200-point milestone. Similarly, he will become the first player in his draft class to total 200 career points and the 50th player in franchise history to have 200 points with the team.

#### IT'S NOT OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER

- The Stars erased a two-goal deficit in their game on Nov. 11 against the Ottawa Senators, eventually winning the game 3-2 in overtime. It marked the first time the Stars won a game in Ottawa since March 6, 2016.
- Dallas' performance against the Senators marked the fourth time this season that the Stars have been trailing in a game by two goals and have come back to win, the most in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Overall, the Stars have seven comeback wins this year, which was tied for the third-most in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Additionally, Dallas has won five games when allowing the first goal in a game this season, which was tied for the third-most in the NHL entering play Friday.

#### **IRON SHARPENS IRON**

- The Stars have two players on their roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: Jason Robertson (313) and Wyatt Johnston (267).
- Robertson's 313-game Iron Man streak was the eighth-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Johnston has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022-23 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 24 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 267 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Friday, it was tied for the 13th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- Johnston was one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only Will Borgen (248) and Charlie Coyle (247) appeared in more.
  - Borgen (84) and Coyle (83), who were traded midseason, both played in more than 82 regular-season games in 2024-25.

# THE FINNISH FOUR

- Dallas' roster currently houses four Finns: Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz, Esa Lindell and Mikko Rantanen. Dallas' four Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (Heiskanen), Nokia (Hintz), Nousiainen (Rantanen) and Vantaa (Lindell).
- Heiskanen, Lindell and Rantanen were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with Hintz expected to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the four Finns had played together in international competition.
  - All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before Heiskanen had to withdraw due to injury.
  - Heiskanen and Lindell won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
  - Heiskanen and Rantanen represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
  - Lindell and Rantanen won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
  - Hintz and Rantanen played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016
- The four Finns, along with current Ducks forward and former Star Mikael Granlund, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL began tracking starers in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.
- In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

- Stars defenseman Nils Lundkvist and Flames forward Dryden Hunt were members of the New York Rangers for the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward Jason Robertson and Flames forward Joel Farabee skated for Team USA during the 2019 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars goaltender Jake Oettinger and Flames forward Joel Farabee were teammates at Boston University (NCAA) during the 2018-
- Stars forward Mikko Rantanen and Flames forward Dryden Hunt skated together in Colorado during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars defenseman Thomas Harley and Flames forward Connor Zary both represented Team Canada during the 2021 IIHF World Junior Championship and 2019 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward Nathan Bastian and Flames defenseman Kevin Bahl shared the ice in New Jersey from 2021-22 to 2023-24.
- Stars forward Sam Steel and Flames defenseman Jake Bean were both members of Team Canada during the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars defenseman Alexander Petrovic and Flames defenseman MacKenzie Weegar were in Florida together from 2016-17 to 2018-
