On Monday vs. Vegas, forward **Quinton Byfield** registered four assists, marking his first career four-point game (0-4=4) and bringing his season point total to 33 (11-22=33). Byfield joins **Adrian Kempe** (Oct. 18, 2017) and **Tyler Toffoli** (Feb. 12, 2015) as the third Kings skater over the past decade to record a four-point game at age 22 or younger. Furthermore, he is just the fifth different Kings skater in franchise history to tally a four-assists game before turning 23 years old.

HOME SWEET HOME

The Kings returned to DTLA following the League's 4 Nations Face-Off Break with a 5-3 victory over Utah last Saturday night and 5-2 win against Vegas Monday night for their 18th and 19th home wins of the season. With the back-to-back victories at Crypto.com Arena, the club improves their home record to 19-3-2 with an NHL-best .833 points percentage (PTS %). As part of Monday night's victory, the Kings staged a four-goal third period comeback over the Golden Knights to mark their seventh third-period comeback win this season. Only Philadelphia (8), Utah (7), Anaheim (7) and Vegas (7) have more such instances. Earlier this month, the team secured points in all three home-ice appearances with wins against the Stars and Canadiens to enter the break with a 2024-25 home record of 17-3-2. The team earned their 16th home victory on Feb. 5 vs. Montreal to establish their highest win total through their first 20 home games in a season.
