PLAYER NOTES

- **Mitch Marner** scored for the Maple Leafs at 5:15 of the second period and scored his second goal of the game on a Maple Leafs power play opportunity at 9:34 of the second period. Marner recorded his first multi-goal game of the season and his 11th multi-point game of the season. Marner has posted a multi-point outing in seven of his last eight games. Marner's power play goal at 9:34 of the second period is the 202nd goal of his career. The goal moves him past Syl Apps (201) for 14th on the Maple Leafs' all-time goal list. Marner has recorded eight points (4G, 4A) in his last four games.
- William Nylander scored the game-winning goal for Toronto at 10:50 of the second period, scoring his 14th goal of the season. Nylander earned his fourth game-winning goal of the season and the 43rd game-winning goal of his NHL career, tying George Armstrong for sixth on the franchise all-time list for most game-winning goals. Nylander also recorded the secondary assist on Marner's second goal of the game. Nylander marked his 10th multi-point game of the season. Nylander scored his 231st career goal at 10:50 of the second period, which moves him past Ted Kennedy (230) and into sole possession of 11th on the franchise's all-time goal register.
- John Tavares posted the primary assist on Marner's first goal of the game, recording his 11th assist of the season. Tavares has registered six points (1G, 5A) in his last four games.
- Chris Tanev posted the secondary assist on Marner's first goal of the game, recording his fourth assist of the season.
- **Fraser Minten** registered the primary assist on Marner's second goal of the game. With the assist, Minten recorded the first assist of his NHL career. Minten has posted a point in back-to-back games (1G, 1A).
- Alex Nylander skated in his Maple Leafs debut tonight. Alex and William Nylander become the 13th set of brothers to play for the franchise, and the fifth set of brothers to play a game together for the Maple Leafs.
- Joseph Woll stopped 23 of 25 shots he faced in tonight's win. Woll has earned a win in four-consecutive starts.
- Alex Steeves registered six hits tonight, tying a single-game NHL career-high.
- John Tavares earned 18 face-off wins tonight, setting a new single-game high this season.
- Jake McCabe was on the ice for a team-high 24 Toronto shot attempts-for at 5-on-5.
- **Chris Tanev** finished the game with a team-high 5-on-5 shot attempt percentage of 68.97 percent (20 for, 9 against).

TEAM NOTES

- The Maple Leafs were 1-for-6 on the power play and 1-for-2 on the penalty kill tonight.
- Toronto has posted a 10-3-0 record on home ice this season. With their 10th win of the season at Scotiabank Arena, the Maple Leafs currently lead the league in wins on home ice.
- The Maple Leafs have earned a win in four-consecutive games and have posted a win in seven of their last eight matchups.
- Per NHL Stats, "The Maple Leafs improved to 23-13-3 all-time in their first-ever meeting against a franchise. The only teams with as many wins in that scenario are the Rangers (27-8-2) and Golden Knights (23-7-3)."
