AT A GLANCE

THREE TIMES THREE, MADE NINE

Forward **Adrian Kempe** (1-1=2) tallied his fourth goal and fifth assist of the playoffs in Edmonton on Friday night. With his eighth and ninth points (4-5=9) of the postseason, Kempe enters Game 4 as the NHL's leading goal-scorer and point producer, while his five assists are one shy of tying linemate Anze Kopitar (6) and St. Louis defenseman Cam Fowler (6) for the League-lead in that category as well. His nine points are also tied for the most through the first three games of a postseason since 1990, one of 16 total playoff-opening performances in NHL history to average 3.00 points-per-game or higher through the first trio of matchups. Kempe's nine points are already the most through an opening four games in Kings postseason history, one more than the eight recorded through four contests by Daryl Evans (4-4=8) in 1982 and by both Dave Taylor (4-4=8) and Todd Elik (2-6=8) in the 1990 Stanley Cup Playoffs.

TAKE THE 11 NORTH TO THE 101

Captain **Anze Kopitar** (0-2=2) played the 100th career Stanley Cup Playoff game of his career on Friday night. While becoming the first Kings skater to reach the postseason century mark in franchise history, Kopitar contributed two assists to also become just the third player in Kings history with a double-digit number of multi-assist games. Kopitar (10 GP) joins current team president Luc Robitaille (11 GP) behind Wayne Gretzky (17 GP) on that list. The forward now enters his 101st postseason appearance with seven points (1-6=7) through the first three contests of the second season. His six assists on the postseason are tied with **Cam** Fowler for the most in the NHL this year, while his seven points so far are the most in an initial three-game span by any skater aged 37 or older in NHL history. Fueling that offensive surge was Kopitar's second career four-point (1-3=4) playoff game on Wednesday in DTLA, which saw the captain join Gretzky (6 GP), Bernie Nicholls (2 GP), Drew Doughty (2 GP) and Dave Taylor (2 GP) as the only skaters in franchise history with multiple four-point playoff outings.
