GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the final of three games the Stars will play against the Golden Knights this season and the second time the teams are facing off in Vegas this year.
- The Stars enter tonight's game with a 31-17-1 record for 63 points and a .643 points percentage. Their .643 points percentage was the fifth-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Monday.
 - o Of the top five ranked teams, four of them are in the Western Conference: Winnipeg (.696), Edmonton (.663), Vegas (.660) and Dallas. The Washington Capitals (.724) top both the NHL and the Eastern Conference.
- Defenseman **Brendan Smith** has played in each of Dallas' last two games as a forward. He's logged a 56.3 percent Corsi rating in those games according to Natural Stat Trick, which is the best mark of any Stars skater during that span.
- Matt Duchene enters tonight's game three assists shy of totaling his 500th NHL assist. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 27th active skater and the fourth played from the 2009 Draft class to tally 500 career assists.
- Entering play Monday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.45 goals against per game this season, which was the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Monday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 28 of the 49 games that they have played this year.

ROLLING THE DICE

- Dallas is 7-8-4 all-time vs. Vegas, including a 3-4-1 mark on the road.
- Roope Hintz has recorded seven points (3-4—7) in his last eight games against Vegas.
- Evgenii Dadonov has seven points (3-4—7) in 12 career games against his former club. Dadonov recorded 43 points (20-23—43) in 78 regular season games with the Golden Knights in the 2021-22 season.

- Jason Robertson has eight points (5-3-8) in 11 career games played against the Golden Knights. On the road vs. Vegas, Robertson has tallied three points (1-2-3) in five games.
- Jamie Benn has tallied nine points (4-5—9) in 18 career games against Vegas. Of Benn's nine points against the Golden Knights, four (1-3-4) have come on the road.
- Wyatt Johnston enters tonight's matchup riding a two-game point streak against the Golden Knights, earning three points (0-3-3) in those games. In all, Johnston has registered four points (1-3-4) in eight career game against Vegas.
- Jake Oettinger holds a 5-2-2 record in nine games played against Vegas, with a .920 save percentage and a 2.26 goalsagainst average.

BACK TO DECEMBER

- Since Dec. 23, the Stars have posted an 12-4-1 record for 25 points and a .735 points percentage. Dallas' win total, point total and points percentage during that span all topped the NHL entering play Monday.
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 52-37. Their plus-15 goal differential was tied with Winnipeg for the second-best mark in the league since Dec. 23 entering play Monday, trailing only the Washington Capitals (plus-16).
 - Only the Columbus Blue Jackets and Vegas Golden Knights (54 each) had scored more goals that the Stars since Dec. 23 entering play Monday.
- Thirty-seven of the Dallas' 52 goals since Dec. 23 have been scored at 5-on-5, which was tied for third in the NHL entering play Monday, trailing only Montreal and St. Louis (38 each).
- The Stars have gone 521-for-981 at the faceoff dot since Dec. 23 for a 53.1 percent success rate, which was tied with Florida for the third-best mark in the league during that span entering play Monday.
- Jason Robertson is the team's leading scorer since Dec. 23, totaling 23 points (10-13-23) in 17 games played. His 23 points were the third-most in the NHL during that span entering play Monday, trailing only Boston's David Pastrnak and Tampa Bay's Nikita Kucherov (24 each).
- Fourteen different Stars skaters have scored at least one goal since Dec. 23: Jason Robertson (10), Jamie Benn (7), Roope Hints (6), Matt Duchene (5), Evgenii Dadonov (5), Wyatt Johnston (5), Mavrik Bourque (3), Thomas Harley (3), Esa Lindell (2), Logan Stankoven (2), Oskar Bäck (1), Colin Blackwell (1), Matěj Blümel (1) and Miro Heiskanen (1).
 - Robertson's 10 goals since Dec. 23 were tied for the third-most in the NHL entering play Monday.

ROAD WARRIORS

- The Stars have posted a 7-2-0 record in their last nine road games dating back to Dec. 23. Their 14 points (tied) and .778 points percentage on the road during that span both topped the NHL entering play Monday and their seven wins were tied for second.
- Dallas has outscored its opponents 29-19 on the road during that span. Their plus-10 goal differential on the road during that span was the best mark in the league entering play Monday.
- Jake Oettinger has posted a 4-0-0 record in four games played on the road since Dec. 23, posting a .936 and 1.70 goals-against average during that span.
 - o His four road wins were tied for the second-most in the NHL during that span entering play Monday.
- Matt Duchene is the team's leading scorer on the road this year, totaling 25 points (9-16-25) in 23 games.
- Jason Robertson has 16 points (5-11-16) in his last 15 road games and enters tonight's game riding a four-game road point streak. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in five consecutive road games for the first time this
- Evgenii Dadonov has totaled nine points (4-5-9) in his last eight games played on the road dating back to Dec. 29 against the Chicago Blackhawks.

POWER TRIP

- Since Jan. 1, the Stars have gone 11-for-33 on the power play for a 33.3 percent success rate, which was tied for the fourth-best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Monday.
- Only the Detroit Red Wings (15) had scored more power-play goals than the Stars' 11 since Jan. 1 entering play Monday.
- The Stars have scored at least one power-play goal in each of their last two games played. If there were to do so again tonight, it would give them power-play goals in three consecutive games for the first time this season.
- Seven different Stars skaters have scored at least one power-play goal since Jan. 1: Evgenii Dadonov (2), Matt Duchene (2), Roope Hintz (2), Jason Robertson (2), Jamie Benn (1), Mavrik Bourque (1) and Esa Lindell (1).
 - Lindell's goal in Dallas' last game on Jan. 25 against the Blues was his first power-play goal since the 2019-20
- Entering play Monday, the Tampa Bay Lightning were the only other team in the NHL to have seven skaters score at least one power-play goal since Jan. 1.

JUST IN CASE

- Casey DeSmith recorded his second shutout of the season in Dallas' last game a 2-0 win over the St. Louis Blues stopping all 33 shots he faced.
- According to MoneyPuck.com, DeSmith saved 2.73 goals above expected. The Stars were outshot 19-33 in the game.
- The shutout was the 12th of DeSmith's career, making him one of 30 NHL goaltenders to record at least 12 shutouts since the start of the 2017-18-season.

- DeSmith is now one shutout shy of tying his career high of three that he set in 2018-19 and matched in 2021-22, both while playing for the Pittsburgh Penguins.
- In all this season, DeSmith has a 7-6-0 record with a 2.42 goals-against average and a .913 save percentage. He has allowed two or fewer goals in nine of the 15 games he has played in.

ROBO ON THE GOGO

- Jason Robertson enters tonight's matchup having totaled 32 points (12-20-32) in his last 27 games played dating back to Dec. 1 against the Winnipeg Jets. His 32 points during that span are the most of any Stars skater and were tied for eighth in the NHL entering play Monday.
 - Robertson has multi-point efforts in eight of the last 14 games that he has played.
- Robertson scored two goals in Dallas' game on Jan. 24 against Vegas including the game winner to bring his career total to 150. He is the 19th skater in franchise history to score 150 goals with the team.
- Robertson's second goal of the game was 358th career point (150-208-358), giving him sole possession of 19th on the franchise's all-time scoring list.
- Robertson factored in on all three of Dallas' goals in their Jan. 18 game against the Avalanche, scoring two goals and adding an assist to bring his season total to 40 points (14-26-40). Robertson has recorded at least 40 points in each of the five full NHL seasons that he has played.
 - His two goals came just 39 seconds apart, marking the fastest two goals by a Stars skater since Joe Pavelski on Nov. 26, 2021 (0:19) according to NHL Stats.
- Robertson scored the deciding goal in the shootout in Dallas' Jan. 11 game, a 2-1 victory over the Montréal Canadiens.
 - In his career, Robertson has gone 16-for-28 in shootout attempts. His 57.1 career percent success rate in the shootout is tied for the sixth-best mark among all active NHL skaters that have at least five shootout attempts.
- Robertson recorded two assists in Dallas' game on Jan. 2 against the Ottawa Senators for his 100th career multi-point game, becoming the 15th player in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 multi-point games according to NHL Stats. Only four players in franchise history have posted 100 multi-point games before age 26: Brian Bellows (151 GP), Mike Modano (126 GP), Bobby Smith (123 GP) and Dino Ciccarelli (101 GP).
- Robertson tallied three points (1-2-3) in Dallas' game on Dec. 31 against the Sabres to take sole possession of 21st on the franchise's all-time scoring list, passing Joe Nieuwendyk and Al MacAdam. Robertson has 344 career points (142-202-344) in 329 regular-season games.
- Robertson's second assist against the Sabres was the 200th of his career, making him the 27th player in Stars franchise history at the seventh player from the 2017 draft class to total 200 NHL assists.
- Additionally, Robertson who turned 25 on July 21 became the third player in Stars team history to register 200 career assists at age 25 or younger (all assists w/ DAL) according to NHL Stats.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- Wyatt Johnston enters tonight's game having totaled 32 points (9-23-32) in 32 games since Nov. 28. He is one point shy of reaching the 40-point plateau for the third consecutive season.
- Johnston is now pacing to finish the year with 18 goals, 47 assists and 65 points. Forty-seven assists would be a career high for the forward and 65 points would match his career best that he set last season.
- Since Nov. 28, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 23-14 at 5-on-5 when Johnston is on the ice according to Natural Stat Trick. His 23 5-on-5 on-ice goals for since Nov. 28 are the most of any Stars skater.
- Johnston tied his single-game career high with three assists in Dallas' game on Jan. 18, factoring in on all three of the Stars' goals.
- Johnston also went 20-for-24 at the faceoff dot on Jan. 18, setting career highs in both faceoffs taken and draws won in a single game. It also made Johnston the first Stars skater to win 20 draws in a single-game since Brad Richards went 20-for-37 at the faceoff dot Dec. 18, 2008.

HEATING UP

- Evgenii Dadonov has recorded multi-point efforts in each of Dallas' last two games, notching two assists on Jan. 24 against the Golden Knights and scoring a goal and adding an assist on Jan. 25 against the Blues.
 - If he were to have at least two points again tonight, it would give him multi-point efforts in three consecutive games for the first time since Oct. 11 to 14, 2019 while he was playing for the Florida Panthers.
 - Dadonov is now pacing to finish the year with 45 points, which would be his highest-scoring season since he had 47 points for the Florida Panthers in 2019-20.
- Jake Oettinger has an 8-2-0 record in his last 10 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .925 save percentage and a 1.88 goals-against average during that span.
 - His eight wins since Dec. 29 were tied with Washington's Logan Thompson for the most in the NHL entering play Monday.
 - Among goalies that have played in at least five games since Dec. 29, Oettinger's 1.88 goals-against average ranked fifth in the NHL entering play Monday.
- Miro Heiskanen has recorded an assist in each of Dallas' last four games. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in five consecutive games for the first time since Feb. 15 to 24, 2024. An assist would give him his first five-game assist streak since he had an assist in nine straight games from March 6 to 23, 2023.

Roope Hintz scored his 20th goal of the season in Dallas' game on Jan. 24 against the Golden Knights. Hintz is the sixth Stars skater in the last 30 years to have at least four consecutive 20-goal seasons according to NHL Stats, joining Mike Modano (8: 1995-96 - 2002-03), Jamie Benn (6: 2013-14 - 2018-19), Tyler Seguin (6: 2013-14 - 2018-19), Loui Eriksson (4: 2008-09 - 2011-12) and Joe Pavelski (4: 2020-21 - 2023-24).

LEAGUE LEADERS

- Miro Heiskanen is averaging 25:16 of ice time per game this season, which was the sixth-most in the NHL this year entering play Monday.
- Thomas Harley enters tonight's matchup against the Golden Knights with a plus-25 on-ice, even-strength goal differential this season, which was tied for the fifth-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Monday.
 - In all this season, Harley has a plus-22 plus/minus rating, which was the second-best mark among all NHL defensemen entering play Monday.
- Oskar Bāck has gone 73-for-130 at the faceoff dot this season for a 56.2 percent success rate, which ranked second among rookies that have taken at least 20 draws this season entering play Monday.

DOUBLE DUTCH

- Matt Duchene had two assists in Dallas' game on Jan. 24 against the Golden Knights and now has 17 points (5-12-17) in his last 15 games played dating back to Dec. 29 against the Chicago Blackhawks.
- His 17 points during that span are the second-most on the Stars' roster and were tied for 10th in the NHL entering play
- Duchene has 47 points (18-29-47) this season, which tops all Stars skaters. It puts him on pace to finish the year with 30 goals, 49 assists and 79 points.
 - Forty-nine assists would be a career high for the forward.
 - Eighty points would be the second-highest totals of his 15-year career.
- In all, Duchene has totaled 112 points (43-69-112) in 129 regular-season games with the Stars since the start of the 2023-24 season, which is the second-most of any Stars skater during that span (Jason Robertson; 125).

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: Jamie Benn (346), Jason Robertson (259), Esa Lindell (219) and Wyatt Johnston (213). Entering play Monday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on Jan. 25 against the Blues was the 346th consecutive game that Benn played in, which is the fifthlongest active Iron Man streak in the NHL. He is one of seven players to have an Iron Man streak of at least 300 games.
- Robertson's 259-game Iron Man streak is the 13th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Monday.
- Lindell's 219-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.
- Johnston's Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise
- Esa Lindell enters tonight's contest two assists shy of tying Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.
- Miro Heiskanen is one assist shy of surpassing Gordie Roberts (224) to take the 5th-most assists among all-time defensemen.
- Roope Hintz is one point shy of tying Joe Nieuwendyk and Al MacAdam (340) for 23rd-most points in franchise history.
- Jason Robertson is four goals shy of tying J.P. Parise (154) for 17th-most goals in franchise history.

CONNECT FOUR

- Stars forward Roope Hintz (Finland), defensemen Miro Heiskanen (Finland) and Esa Lindell (Finland), and goaltender Jake Oettinger (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.
- Only six teams have had more players selected to a 4 Nations roster than the Stars: Colorado, Florida, Minnesota, Tampa Bay and Vegas. The full breakdown is as follows:

- All four players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.
 - Heiskanen has played for Finland at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships, 2018 and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2018 Winter Olympic Games.
 - Lindell suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
 - Hintz previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
 - Oettinger has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that all three of Heiskanen, Hintz and Lindell are playing for Finland
 - Heiskanen and Lindell previously won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with Jim Nill (Associate GM), Pete DeBoer (Assistant Coach) and Misha Donskov (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star Jere Lehtinen will serve as Finland's General Manager.

- Stars defenseman Brendan Smith and forward Colin Blackwell were members of the New York Rangers when Vegas forward Brett Howden was in New York. Smith and Howden were there from 2018-19 to 2020-21 and Blackwell joined them in the 2020-21 season.
- Stars defenseman Ilya Lyubushkin and Vegas forward Victor Olofsson were teammates in Buffalo during the 2022-23
