POWERED UP

The Penguins' power play has been clicking as of late, scoring on the man advantage in their fifth-consecutive game on Friday night in Florida.

- The Penguins have nine power-play goals in their last five games and stretching back further have 17 power-play goals over their last 15 games dating back to November 30. In that span, the Penguins' 34.7 power-play percentage and 17 goals lead the league:

- Pittsburgh's five-game streak of scoring a power-play goal is their longest such streak since they tallied a goal on the man advantage in 10-consecutive games from Dec. 1-22, 2022.
- Michael Bunting leads the Penguins with seven power-play goals this season, which all have come since November 15. In that span, only Patrik Laine has more power-play goals (8) than Bunting.

WHEELIN' AND DEALIN'

Sergei Murashov is thriving in his first professional season in North America with the Wheeling Nailers of the ECHL, going 14-2-0 with a .927 save percentage and 2.24 goals-against average.

- The rookie goaltender, who was drafted in the fourth round (118th overall) of the 2022 NHL Draft by Pittsburgh, is currently riding a franchise-record-breaking 13-game win streak.
- Murashov's 13-game win streak is tied for the fourth longest in ECHL history:

- Entering tonight's game, Crosby has 15,171 career face-off wins, while Bergeron won 15,182 face-offs in his career:

HOW SWEDE IT IS

Rickard Rakell sent Friday night's game to overtime in Florida with the game-tying goal with 39.9 seconds to go, marking his second game-tying goal in the final minute of a game this season (Oct. 16 at 59:14).

- Entering the Penguins' halfway point of the season tonight, Rakell has a team-leading 18 goals. He is on pace for 36 goals, which would mark a career high for the forward.
- Pittsburgh's goal leader has been one of the top performing Swedish-born players this season, ranking second with 18 goals and fifth with 32 points among his countrymen:
