



SEYMOUR H. KNOX III Chairman of the Board and President

It's been more than a decade since the determination and drive shown by the Sabres' president put Buffalo's first National Hockey League team on the ice, and his ambitions for the team and the community which supports it still remain the same: a first Stanley Cup for Buffalo, and many more to follow.

Seymour and his brother Norty went to great lengths to get NHL hockey here, and didn't slow down in the

first eleven seasons of the Sabres. Their leadership was the key factor in the successful hockey history the franchise has chalked up.

Formerly a nationally-ranked squash racquets player and ex-president of the United States Squash Racquets Association, Seymour had his hockey career ended as a schoolboy with a football injury. He continued his interest in the game and it paid off in December, 1969, with the grant of the Sabres franchise. He is a vice president of Kidder, Peabody and Co., Inc., members of the New York Stock Exchange, and active as a leader in a variety of community organizations. He is the Sabres' representative on the NHL Board of Governors and a member of its Advisory Committee.



### NORTHRUP R. KNOX Vice Chairman of the Board

Dogged persistence by the Knox brothers and their hockey associates led to the Buffalo Sabres franchise, and persistence to build toward championship status describes Norty Knox's life style. He was undefeated world champion in the grueling sport of court tennis for ten years, and captain and number one player on the U.S. Polo team in 1966 and 1969. Norty is the Sabres' alternate representative on the NHL Board of Governors and is

Chairman of the Board of Marine Midland Bank-Western Region.



### ROBERT O. SWADOS Vice President and Counsel

There are a few men who worked long and hard to convince the nation that Buffalo was a big league sports town in the days when there wasn't a big league sports franchise on the Niagara Frontier. Bob Swados was one of those men, and in large part it was his dedication and articulate advocacy for big time sport here that resulted in this becoming one of pro sports premier hotbeds in the past few years.

Former vice president of the Buffalo Bisons Baseball Club and vice president of Major League for Buffalo Inc., he has been counsel to the Knox brothers since their first NHL application in 1965. He is a senior partner in the law firm of Cohen Swados Wright Hanifan Bradford & Brett. This past summer he was re-elected Secretary of the NHL Board of Governors.



# DAVID G. FORMAN Executive Vice President

The day-to-day headaches of the business of sport have been handled since the beginning of the Sabres by Dave Forman, whose administrative ability centers on separating the wheat from the chaff when problems are put before him. If it's sometimes hard to find Dave Forman at his desk, it's because he's out in the Auditorium — in hard hat if need be — checking out some construction, or off at a TV studio arranging for a broader schedule of game telecasts.

A well-known business and civic leader in Western New York for three decades, he was named administrative vice president and a member of the Sabres' executive committee in the fall of 1970, after serving as club VP since the franchise was awarded. He was made executive vice president October 6, 1980.



MITCHELL OWEN Administrative Vice President

Mitch was the key addition when the Sabres announced the first major restructuring of the Niagara Frontier Hockey Corporation in October, 1980.

Formerly the Senior Vice President of Healy-Schutte & Comstock Advertising Ltd. in Buffalo, Mitch has been one of the leading advertising executives on the Niagara Frontier for nearly 30 years.

Mitch, a Colgate University alumnus. entered the advertising business in 1952 with the Buffalo Evening News. He later

worked as an account supervisor with Batten, Barton, Durstine & Osborn Inc. and became Vice President of Comstock Advertising in 1970, moving up to President in 1975.



ROBERT W. PICKEL Vice President/Finance

One of the "original" Sabres, Bob joined the club in 1970 and served as comptroller and office manager for ten years before being appointed to his new position in 1980. In addition, he has served as chairman of the National Hockey League comptrollers' committee, headed up several league audit committees, and is a member of the Erie County Sports Board. Bob was also instrumental in computerizing the Sabres' accounting department.

Prior to joining the Sabres, Bob was a

senior accountant with Loblaws Inc. for 12 years and comptroller of Boss-Linco Lines Inc. for three years.



# **WILLIAM SCOTT BOWMAN** Director of Hockey Operations, General Manager and Coach

Following a year of concentrating on the duties of general manager, Scott Bowman returns to the coaching ranks. One of the most successful coaches of all time. Bowman resumes bench duties with the Sabres after also coaching Team Canada in the 1981 Canada Cup tournament.

In two years with the Sabres, Scotty has been able to keep the Sabres among the league leaders while transforming the club from one of the oldest, to one of

voungest in the NHL. Through his dealings, he has brought the Sabres an additional first round draft pick in each of the next two drafts (both from Los Angeles in exchange for Jerry Korab and Richard Martin). Shrewd drafting has brought such bright young prospects such as Alan Haworth, Mike Ramsey, Lindy Ruff and Steve Patrick to Buffalo. Bowman's first pick in the 1981 draft, Jiri Dudacek of Czechoslovakia, was hailed as the finest junior since Guy LaFleur and Gil Perreault.

A veteran coach of 13 seasons, Bowman-coached NHL clubs in Montreal. St. Louis and Buffalo have won 562 games, lost 204 and tied 160. In Stanley Cup playoff competition, Bowman clubs have won 105 games and lost 59 enroute to five Cups.

The 48-year-old native of Montreal previously held down the dual job of coach and general manager of the St. Louis Blues from 1967 through 1971. During that time, he guided the Blues to three Stanley Cup final appearances.

He was chief coach of Team Canada, winner of the 1976 Canada Cup tournament, and coach of the 1979 NHL All-Stars in the three-game series against the Soviet Union. In 1977 he was named NHL Coach of the Year. The Hockey News named Bowman "Executive of the Year" in 1980 after Bowman guided the Sabres to a second place regular season finish and then into the Stanley Cup semi-finals before the Sabres bowed to the eventual champions, the New York Islanders.

Scott and his wife, Suella, and family live in suburban Amherst.





# JOHN "BUCKY" KANE **Director of Player Personnel Director of Scouting**

The first scout ever hired by the Sabres' organization was promoted to the dual scouting and personnel posts on the eve of the 1980-81 season. Though his Christian name is John, he's known throughout the hockey world as "Bucky." A native of Boston and a former employee of the Boston public school system. Bucky joined the Bruins organization under the late Lynn Patrick in 1950, and worked for two decades with famed Boston scout Harold "Baldy"

Cotton.

He came to the Buffalo organization in 1970 and increased his involvement in personnel matters under Scott Bowman to the point where he was named to both posts on the same day. He is in charge of evaluating player talent at Buffalo's American Hockey League farm club in Rochester, working as a liason with Bowman's Buffalo staff, as well as overseeing the extensive Sabres' scouting operation.



JIM ROBERTS **Associate Coach** 

Jim spent almost his entire playing career under Scott Bowman and now he enters his third season at the coaching level - all under Bowman. After two seasons as an assistant coach with the Sabres, the 41-year-old Roberts now moves into the associate coach post. While Bowman deals with the day-today general manager and director of hockey operation chores, Roberts will handle a good portion of the duties that normally are delegated to a head

coach.

Roberts, who retired after the 1977-78 season, is among the NHL's alltime leaders in games played, having appeared in 1,006 games over his 16year career with Montreal and St. Louis. Jim was a member of five Montreal Canadiens' Stanley Cup winning teams.

When Bowman is behind the bench, Jim will be alongside, serving as the man in the middle of the Sabres' three-man coaching system, receiving and relaying information from the press box to the players. When Scotty is not coaching, Roberts will serve as the Sabres' bench boss.

Jim and his wife, Judy, and their two daughters live in Williamsville.



### **NICK POLANO Assistant Coach**

Nick brings an impressive list of credentials to the Sabres as he makes his NHL coaching debut. Named the Hockey News "Minor League Executive of the Year" for the 1980-81 season, he has coached the Erie Blades since the 1975-76 season. During his last three seasons with the Blades (Eastern Hockey League), Nick served as the club's general manager and coach and, in all three seasons, the Blades won the regular season title and then went on

to win the playoff championship.

The 40-year-old Polano guided the Blades to a combined regular season record of 145-54-12 over his last three campaigns, a winning percentage of .716. In the playoffs, Polano's teams won 24 and lost just five, for a winning percentage of .827. Twice during his last three seasons, Nick was named the EHL'S Coach of the Year.

Prior to breaking into the coaching profession, Nick spent 15 years as a player, mostly in the American Hockey League with Baltimore, Hershey and Providence.

Nick and his wife Elva have two sons.

For 641 consecutive games, Ramsay, a second round draft pick in 1971, has gone up and down his wing as well as anyone else in hockey, without much fanfare. At the end of the season, the former Peterborough star can usually be found near the top of the plus-minus figures. Ramsay has now scored 20 or more goals in eight straight seasons and he scored his 200th NHL goal during the past season. The real value of a Craig Ramsay can best be illustrated late in a game when the Sabres are protecting a one-goal lead. Most often the Sabres' defensemen will send the puck along the left boards as Ramsay is one of the best players in hockey at getting the puck out of his own zone. The Sabres' player representative in the NHL Players Association, Ramsay spends much of his time on the road reading. He and his wife Susan, and their two sons live in suburban Amherst.

Sabres' second pick in 1971 . . . #### RADIO AND TELEVISION

Broadcast coverage of the Sabres continues to be among the most extensive in the National Hockey League. All Sabres games will be on WGR Radio (550 AM) for the 12th consecutive season and on a regional network, with Rick Jeanneret and Ted Darling handling the play-by-play, commentary by ex-Sabres forward Jim Lorentz and intermissions hosted by Don Dussias.

Television coverage will be the broadest in Sabres history in 1981-82, with 15 road games on WGR-TV, and 53 games (31 home and 22 road) on cable television. Cable systems in the metropolitan area and in upstate New York have traditionally carried all or part of the cable television schedule, and will do so this season.

Darling and ex-NHL winger Pat Hannigan will provide play-byplay and commentary respectively on WGR-TV and cable TV. WGR sports director Ed Kilgore will serve as intermission host on his station's telecasts and Paul Wieland will do likewise on cable.

All Sabres' night games are played indoors and under the lights unless otherwise noted.\* Day games are played indoors except when played at Rich Stadium when natural ice is available or in Wrigley Field when on the road in Chicago.

Visiting radio is located in the main press box, and the principal visiting TV booth is located on the face of the balcony at center ice. Requests for special needs in broadcast facilities should be made to Paul Wieland at the Sabres offices. The WGR-TV and cable telecast schedules are indicated on the outside back cover.



## **ACCOMMODATIONS/MEDIA SERVICES**

The Sabres press box is located on the west side of Memorial Auditorium suspended from the ceiling. Telecopy transmitting facilities are located in the press box during games, and in the press lounge after games.

The press lounge is located on the west (press box) side of the building between Level Two and Level Three and opens two hours before game time. Food and refreshments are served to accredited members of the media during that time. Refreshments are served in the press box only during the game, and are available afterward in the press lounge, which is also the post game work area for the media.

Application for single game press credentials must be made by 12 p.m. game days to the Sabres public relations office. They will be filled on a space available basis. The press entrance is located on the Pearl St. (west) side of the Auditorium at sidewalk level and entry must be made there in order to receive proper accreditation.

Sabres media identification tags must be displayed for admission to the press box, press lounge and dressing rooms.

#### UNBALANCED SCHEDULE:

Each of the 21 teams will play an 80-game schedule with those teams in the Smythe, Patrick and Adams Divisions having eight games (four home, four away) against each of their Divisional opponents, plus three games against each of the remaining 16 teams in the League. In the case of the three games against the remaining clubs, teams will play two home, one away or vice-versa, alternating the extra home game each year.

The six clubs in the Norris Division — Chicago, Detroit, Minnesota, St. Louis, Toronto and Winnipeg — will play each other seven times with three games against each of the remaining 15 teams. The home-ice differential will be alternated each season.

#### STANLEY CUP PLAYOFFS:

At the conclusion of the regular schedule, the top four finishers in each of the Divisions will qualify for the Stanley Cup playoffs.

The preliminary round features divisional playoffs that will have the first place club oppose the fourth-place team and second versus third in a best-of-five series. The winners of each series will remain in the division and play a best-of-seven quarter-final round with the team gaining higher standing during the regular-season holding home-ice advantage.

The four divisional winners will meet in a best-of-seven semi-final round. The Smythe Division winner will face the Norris Division champion, while the Patrick Division victor will oppose the Adams Division winner. The Conference winners will meet in a best-of-seven final series for the Stanley Cup.
