

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****January 16, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. ARIZONA COYOTES [2] (OT)**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames kicked off a six game homestand on Tuesday night by welcoming the Arizona Coyotes to the Scotiabank Saddledome. Neither team would score in the first, and the game's first goal wouldn't come until the midway point of the second when Sean Durzi would break the ice to give Arizona a 1-0 lead. Logan Cooley would extend Arizona's advantage 6:37 into the third, but Blake Coleman would respond for the Flames just over two minutes later to draw the Flames within one. Shortly after, Martin Pospisil would drive the net and find Nazem Kadri who would tie the game with his 15th of the campaign and this game needed overtime. In the extra frame, the Flames would muster seven shots with Yegor Sharangovich netting the overtime winner to give the Flames a 3-2 comeback win.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second and final meeting this season between the Flames and Maple Leafs. The Flames suffered a 5-4 overtime setback in their first matchup on November 10th.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 5-2-1 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 7-7-3 against Eastern Conference opponents.

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

With his tallies in Arizona and Vegas last week, Mikael Backlund recorded his 100th road goal and surpassed Al MacInnis (99) for the sole possession of the sixth most in franchise history. He joins five players with 100+ road goals for the franchise: Jarome Iginla (257), Theo Fleury (160), Joe Nieuwendyk (135), Gary Roberts (110) and Lanny McDonald (102). Backlund has 95 tallies at the Scotiabank Saddledome over his career and is looking to become the 13th skater in Flames franchise history to score 100 or more goals at home. Backlund has scored on home ice against the Toronto Maple Leafs five times in 13 meetings with the Leafs at the Saddledome over his career.

FIRST MEETING:

The Flames began a three-game Eastern-Canadian road trip on November 10th in Toronto for game number one of the season-series. The Leafs would open the scoring with William Nylander making it 1-0 for the home side before Connor Zary would respond to draw the Calgary Flames level. The Leafs would then get goals from Calle Jankrok, William Nylander, and John Tavares to go up 4-1. However, Calgary didn't quit with Nikita Zadorov and A.J. Greer both scoring before the end of the second to draw the Flames within one and make it 4-3 through two periods. Rookie Martin Pospisil would find a puck in front of the net and slide home his second of the season to tie the game for Calgary, and this game would require overtime. Despite chances from both sides the extra frame solved nothing, and it would take five rounds in a shootout, but the Flames fell 5-4.

THE TEXAS TIGER:

Blake Coleman was named the NHL's Second Star of the week for January 8-14th. The 32-year-old leads the Flames in goals (20) and points (38) this season and with his goal on Tuesday against the Coyotes, Coleman has reached the 20-goal plateau for the third time in his career. Coleman's other two 20-goal campaigns came on 2018-19 (22) and 2019-20 (21), and the Plano, TX native is just two goals away from matching his previous career best of 22 which he set in 78 games. Coleman has also tied his single season high in points at 38 which he set last season and has also registered goals in four-straight games which is the longest goal streak of his career.

MANGIAPANE 200:

With his assists on Mikael Backlund's insurance goal on Saturday night in Vegas, Andrew Mangiapane recorded his 200th career point. Mangiapane has become the 11th active skater drafted in the sixth-round to reach the 200-point plateau, joining Mark Stone (558), Cam Atkinson (473), Anders Lee (435), Jared Spurgeon (384), Nick Bonino (358), Jesper Bratt (322), Pat Maroon (302), Jesper Fast (204), Kevin Labanc (223), and Connor Brown (219). Mangiapane has registered 103 goals along with 97 assists so far in his NHL career.

SHARAN-GOAL-VICH:

With his overtime winner on Tuesday against Arizona, Yegor Sharangovich has registered six goals over his last four games. Since December 9th, Sharangovich's 13 goals are tied with teammate Blake Coleman for the third-most in the NHL and trail only Auston Matthews (18) and Sam Reinhart (15). The 25-year-old is now six goals away from matching his career-best of 24 which he set during the 2021-22 campaign as a member of the New Jersey Devils.

DOME SWEET DOME:



The Flames get set for game two of a six game homestand starting tonight against the Toronto Maple Leafs after knocking off the Arizona Coyotes last night. This is tied for the Flames longest homestand with their other six-game stretch at the 'Dome coming from November 27th to December 9th when they went 3-3-0. Following tonight, the Flames will welcome the Edmonton Oilers on Saturday night, before playing host to the St. Louis Blues, the Columbus Blue Jackets, and Chicago Blackhawks next week.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

MacKenzie Weegar skated in his 400th NHL game in Toronto during the teams first meeting this season on November 10th.

Yegor Sharangovich scored with 17 seconds remaining in overtime to lift Calgary to its second multi-goal, third-period comeback win of the season. The Flames are one of five teams with multiple such victories, joining the Maple Leafs (3), Ducks (2), Avalanche (2) and Hurricanes (2).
