On the team's competitiveness

I think that's been the biggest thing this camp. Just being super competitive, hard on pucks, forechecking, hunting pucks down. First preseason game for a lot of guys, so just kind of getting your timing back is the biggest thing. Kind of just gradually felt that in the first period.

On Cutter Gauthier and their power play unit

On his offseason focus

It was a long summer, especially for me. I missed a little [time], 10 games there at the end of the year with the knee, so the biggest thing at the start was just getting my knee healthy an then just go from there. Go through a regular summer, working out, skating. I think the biggest thing on the ice was working on my cutbacks, protecting the puck and speed.

Leo Carlsson

On Cutter Gauthier

I played with him one game last season. It's good. He has a good shot, gets open good... He's a goal scorer, so he gets the passing and the scoring.

On his line with Gauthier and Alex Killorn

Feels natural. Felt like we played 20 games together. Feels good. Happy playing with them.

On playing on the penalty kill

Just be a solid guy on the PK. Going on offense we had chances too. Not much more there.

Head Coach Greg Cronin

On John Gibson's absence for 3-6 weeks following appendectomy

Well, I think the impact's going to be on Dostal's workload and who's going to back him up. I think the goaltending staff will get together and organize that.

On Leo Carlsson and Cutter Gauthier playing together

You can tell, they read off each other really well. They're both really good skaters, they've got a high IQ, they both can shoot a puck. I think the challenge for the bold of them is, and not so much Cutter because he shoots it, is Leo shotting it. He's got a good shot, his goal is a reflection of that, and he could have shot a few more times. I think if we can get Leo into that mindset, shoot, shoot, shoot, those passing lanes will open up because he is a scoring threat.

On Mason McTavish

He's strong. I think he's confident, he's excited. I think he wants to build off his year last year. His points per game was a career high for (him), and he got hurt in a bad time and that he would have probably scored 20, I don't know, 23, 24, 25 goals...I think he ended up at 19, I think he he's got a number in his head (for this season). He's got a heck of a shot. His goal was a great play by Trevor, and you know. We've said this quite a bit, before we start the preseason, that all these young guys have another year under that bel from last year. I think they know exactly what they need to do to take a step forward and I'm excited to watch them grow.
