#### OTTAWA SENATORS

All-Time Wild Record: 15-10-4 (8-5-2 at Xcel Energy Center, 7-5-2 at Ottawa)

**2022-23:** Minnesota went 2-0-0 against Ottawa...The Wild won, 4-2, in the series opener at Ottawa (10/27) and claimed another 4-2 victory at Xcel Ennergy Center (12/18)...LW Kirill Kaprizov led Minnesota with five points (3-2=5)...C Frederick Gaudreau (2-1=3) and RW Mats Zuccarello (2-1=3) each had three points...C Ryan Hartman (1-1=2) and D Jared Spurgeon (1-1=1) had two points each...G Marc-Andre Fleury stopped 27-of-29 shots faced in the first meeting...G Filip Gustavsson made 26 saves in the second meeting...RW Alex DeBrincat (1-1=2), RW Drake Batherson (0-2=2), RW Claude Giroux (1-1=2) and D Travis Hamonic (0-2=2) had two points each...G Anton Forsberg went 0-2-0 with a 3.08 GAA and a .902 SV%.

**WILD LEADERS:** Zuccarello leads Minnesota with 17 points (7-10=17) in 18 matches vs. Ottawa...D **Alex Goligoski** has 13 points (2-11=13) in 23 contests...LW **Marcus Johansson** (5-6=11, in 31 games) and Spurgeon (5-6=11, in 17 games) have 11 points each.

**WILD GOALIES:** Fleury is 20-10-2 with a 3.14 GAA, a .900 SV% and one shutout in 37 career games (35 starts) against Ottawa...Gustavsson is 1-0-0 with a 2.00 GAA and a .929 SV%.

**SENATORS LEADERS:** RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** leads Ottawa with 30 points (13-17=30) in 34 games against Minnesota...Giroux has 13 points (5-8=13) in 19 games against the Wild...D **Jakob Chychrun** owns 12 points (9-3=12) in 23 games...Harmonic has six points (2-4=6) in 20 contests.

**SENATORS GOALIES:** Forsberg is 1-3-0 with a 2.53 GAA and a .929 SV% in four career starts against Minnesota...G **Joonis Korpisalo** is 0-2-0 with a 4.02 GAA and a .850 SV% in two starts.

**CONNECTIONS:** Gustavsson went 10-13-3 with a 3.12 GAA and a .905 SV% in 27 games in two seasons with Ottawa (2020-22).

**FAST FACTS:** Minnesota has earned points in 15 of its last 19 contests against Ottawa (13-4-2) dating back to Oct. 11, 2011...The Wild is on a sixgame point streak at Canadian Tire Centre (5-0-1) and is 6-1-2 in its last nine games in Ottawa...The Wild has won seven of its last nine meetings at Xcel Energy Center (7-2-0).

#### **NOTES & MILESTONES**

Marc-Andre Fleury: Made 24 saves at NYR (11/9) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Patrick Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history...Currently at 547 career wins, needs five wins to pass Roy (551 career wins) for second-most in NHL history...Earned the 65th shootout victory of his career vs. NYR (11/4), further extending his own NHL record.

**Joel Eriksson Ek:** Reached 100 career goals by scoring a PPG at BUF (11/10), becoming the 11th player in franchise history to reach the landmark...Won 19-of-23 faceoffs (83%) at BUF (11/10), tying his career high (10/19/21 vs. WPG, 19-of-25).

**Kirill Kaprizov:** With a PPG at BUF (11/10), reached 119 career goals and tied Andrew Brunette for fifth-most in franchise history.

**Marco Rossi:** Ranks third among NHL rookies in goals (five), T-4th in shots (31) and T-7th in points (5-2=7).

**Jared Spurgeon:** Made his season debut at BUF (11/10), marking his 14th season in a Wild sweater (2010-24), second-most in franchise history behind Mikko Koivu (15 seasons, 2005-20)...Currently with 110 career goals, tied with Nino Niederreiter for eighth-most in franchise history, needs one goal to tie Eric Staal for seventh-most in franchise history.

**Mats Zuccarello:** Leads the Wild with 16 points and 12 assists this season... Currently at 399 career assists...Has recorded a point in seven consecutive home games (4-5=9), a franchise record.

# **GLOBAL SERIES NOTES**



# **TEAM AND PLAYER NOTES**

- Minnesota is set to play its third and fourth regular season games outside North America, following losses against the Hurricanes at Hartwall Arena (now Helsinki Halli) in Helsinki during the 2010 Premiere Series (4-3 L Oct. 7, 2010 and 2-1 S/O L Oct. 8, 2010). The Wild also have played one preseason game outside North America.
- The most recent NHL regular season games played in Sweden were a back-to-back set between the Sabres and Lightning in 2019-20. Tampa Bay won both games and eventually ended the season as Stanley Cup champions. Four players who participated in those contests are now on a club headed to Sweden in 2023-24: Wild forwards Pat Maroon (TBL) and Marcus Johansson (BUF; Landskrona, Sweden), Senators forward Mathieu Joseph (TBL) and Maple Leafs defenseman Jake McCabe (BUF).
- Maroon collected 2-1—3 for Tampa Bay across the two contests in 2019-20, including the primary assist on the game-winning goal on Nov. 8, 2019 (TBL 3, BUF 2). The next day, Maroon scored two goals in another Tampa Bay victory (TBL 5, BUF 3) to outshine Johansson, now his now teammate with Minnesota, who assisted on the opening goal for Buffalo with a cross-ice feed.
- G Filip Gustavsson (Skelleftea, Sweden) will have an opportunity to appear in an NHL game in his home country. Entering 2023-24, only two Swedish-born goaltenders have appeared in an NHL regular season game in Sweden: Henrik Lundqvist (0-0-2; Are, Sweden) and reigning Vezina Trophy winner Linus Ullmark (0-1-0; Lugnvik, Sweden).
- Gustavsson recorded his 30th win in his 62nd career appearance in 2022-23, tying Johan Hedberg (62; Leksand, Sweden) for the fourthfewest games to reach the mark among Swedish-born goaltenders behind Lundqvist (51), Johan Holmqvist (55; Tolfta, Sweden) and Pelle Lindbergh (56; Stockholm, Sweden).
- D Jonas Brodin (Karlstad, Sweden) was selected 10th overall by Minnesota in the 2011 NHL Draft, with 2023-24 set to be his 12th NHL season (all with the Wild). Only Mikko Koivu (15) and captain Jared Spurgeon (14, including 2023-24) have had as long a tenure with the franchise.
- Brodin was the first Swedish-born the Wild ever selected in the first round of the NHL Draft and one of five opening-round picks the club has made who hail from the country, with Joel Eriksson Ek (No. 20 in 2015; Karlstad, Sweden), Filip Johansson (No. 24 in 2018; Vasteras, Sweden), Liam Ohgren (No. 19 in 2022; Stockholm, Sweden) and Jesper Wallstedt (No. 20 in 2021; Vasteras, Sweden) following in his footsteps.

- Mats Zuccarello: Oct. 7, 2011, New York vs. Los Angeles as part of the Premiere Series in Stockholm. Los Angeles beat New York 3-2 in OT, Zuccarello had two PIM in 9:54

# KIRILL THE THRILL

- Kirill Kaprizov is T-1st on the Wild with four PPGs and second with 15 points this season (5-10=15).
- Kaprizov scored the 119th goal of his career at BUF (11/20) to tie Andrew Brunette (119 career goals) for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Currently with 43 career PPGs, Kaprizov scored the 40th PPG of his career at MTL (10/17) to become the fifth player in franchise history to reach 40 career PPGs. He joined Zach Parise (69), Mikko Koivu (60), Marian Gaborik (59) and Andrew Brunette (55).
- Kaprizov recorded the 22nd three-point game of his career vs. EDM (10/24, 0-3=3). Only two players have more such games in a Wild sweater (Mikko Koivu, 34 and Marian Gaborik, 29).
- Kaprizov led the Wild with 75 points (40-35=75) last season.
- The left winger led the Wild in both multi-goal games (seven) and three-point games (seven) was tied for first in multi-point games (18).
- Kaprizov recorded his 100th career goal at CAR (1/19/23), becoming the third-fastest active player to reach that mark (180 games), trailing Patrik Laine (179 games) and Alexander Ovechkin (167 games).
- Kaprizov was the first player in Wild history to record his first 200 career points with the franchise in fewer than 200 games.


# STONE-COLD KIRILL-ER

- Kaprizov's game-winning goal in overtime vs. CBJ (2/26/23) marked his sixth overtime goal since entering the NHL in 2020-21. The total is tied for fifth-most in the league since the start of the 2020-21 season.
- Kaprizov currently stands at 10 career overtime points in a Wild sweater, tied with Pierre-Marc Bouchard and Marian Gaborik for second-most in franchise history.

 Kaprizov is tied for first in franchise history with six OT goals, matching teammate Matt Dumba. Six of his 13 career game-winning goals have come in overtime.



# **MATS-TER OF HIS CRAFT**

- Mats Zuccarello leads the Wild with 16 points (4-12=16) and 12 assists this season.
- Scored a goal vs. DAL (11/12) to record a point in his first seven home games of the 2023-24 season, furthering a new franchise record for a season-opening home-point streak.
- Zuccarello started the season on a six-game point streak, his longest point streak to open a season and tied for the second-longest seasonopening point streak in franchise history.
- The 36-year old Norwegian's 16 points this season rank tied for third in the NHL among players age 33 or older, while his 12 assists lead all players in the same age range.
- Zuccarello posted 22-45=67 during the 2022-23 season, leading the team in assists, ranking second in points and fourth in goals.
- Zuccarello recorded four points (3-1=4) and his second career hat trick vs. CHI (12/16/23). His last hat trick came Oct. 30, 2015, vs. TOR as a member of the New York Rangers.
- At 35 years, 106 days old, Zuccarello became the oldest player in Wild history to notch a hat trick.
- The native of Oslo, Norway, became the first Norwegian-born NHL player with multiple career hat tricks.
- Zuccarello ranks second among active undrafted NHL players in career points (589), third in career goals (190) and third in career games played (781).



# **BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL**

- **Matt Boldy** led the team in takeaways (51), tied for first in multi-point games (18), was second in goals (31) and shots on goal (255) and third in points (63) during the 2022-23 season.
- Boldy scored his 31st goal of the 2022-23 season at CHI (4/10) to surpass Marian Gaborik (30 in 2002-03 and 2001-02) for most by a Wild player age 22 or younger.
- Collected his 100th career point (45-55=100) in the 125th game of his career at PIT (4/6). Among players to debut with the franchise, he required the second-fewest games to reach the mark behind Kirill Kaprizov (92 GP).
- Scored 12 goals in the month of March 2023, becoming the third Wild player with as many in a calendar month (Kaprizov, 14 in March 2022; E. Staal, 13 in Feb. 2018).
- Recorded his third career hat trick (3-0=3) vs. SEA (3/27), the first natural hat trick of his career and his second hat trick in a five-game span.
- Became the fourth U.S.-born NHL player to record three hat tricks before turning 22, joining Jimmy Carson (seven), Alex DeBrincat (four) and Jeremy Roenick (four).
- Recorded his second career hat trick vs. WSH (3/19), becoming the seventh player in franchise history to notch multiple hat tricks.
- Has joined Marian Gaborik (67 in 2001-02 & 65 in 2002-03) and Pierre-Marc Bouchard (59 in 2005-06) as the only Wild players to record a 50-point season before age 22.
- Boldy reached the 30-goal mark in the 94th game of his career, joining Kirill Kaprizov (30 goals in first 67 games) and Marian Gaborik (30 goals in first 93 games) as the only players to debut with the Wild and reach the mark in fewer than 100 games.



#### SPURGEON GENERAL

- Jared Spurgeon led the Wild with 179 blocked shots, 25.6 shifts per game and a plus-32 rating last season.
- His single-season blocked shot total ranked third in franchise history behind Greg Zanon (212, 2010-11 season; 196, 2009-10 season).
- He finished sixth in the NHL in blocked shots during the 2022-23 season.
- His plus-32 rating ranked 12th in the NHL and fourth in the Western Conference. Among defenseman, Spurgeon was sixth in the NHL and second in the Western Conference.
- His plus-113 career rating is first in Wild history.
- Spurgeon has played the second most games in franchise history sits third on the team's all-time assist list.

- The Edmonton native was named the second full-time captain in team history on Jan. 3, 2021.
- He is the franchise leader in goals, points, shots on goal, PPG, GWG and blocked shots by a defenseman and ranks second in assists, PPA, PPP, and hits among defensemen.





# **CROWN JOEL**

- Joel Eriksson Ek reached 100 career goals by scoring a PPG at BUF (11/10), becoming the 11th player in franchise history to reach the milestone.
- Won 19-of-23 faceoffs (83%) at BUF (11/10), tying his career high (10/19/21 vs. WPG, 19-of-25).
- Eriksson Ek (8-6=14) currently leads the team in goals, tied for first with four PPGS, ranks second in shots on goal (51) and third in scoring this season.
- Eriksson Ek has recorded a team-leading five multi-point games this season.
- Eriksson Ek scored two PPGs at MTL (10/17), marking the second time in his career recording multiple PPG in a single game (two PPG vs. WPG, 10/19/21)
- Now with 29 career PPGs, Eriksson Ek is tied for eighth on Minnesota's all-time list with Pierre-Marc Bouchard.
- With 61 points (23-38=61) in 78 games last season, Eriksson Ek established a new single-season career high (previously 26-23=49, 2021-22 season).

#### **MARCO POLO**

- Marco Rossi is currently third among NHL rookies in goals (five), T-4th in shots (31) and T-7th in points (5-2=7).
- Rossi recorded a point in three consecutive games (2-1=3) from 10/24 to 10/27, a career-long.
- He scored the first goal of his NHL career at TOR (10/14), becoming the ninth Austrian-born player to score a goal in a NHL regular-season game.
- Rossi joined Thomas Vanek (39 goals with Minnesota) and Christoph Brandner (four goals with Minnesota) as the only Austrian-born players to score goals for the Wild.

# SHOT THROUGH THE HART

- **Ryan Hartman** is second on Minnesota with seven goals this season and is fourth on the team with 11 points (7-4=11).
- Hartman was awarded the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the week ending Oct. 29 after ranking second in the NHL with five goals (5-2=7) in four appearances.
- Recorded five points (3-2=5) vs. EDM (10/24), marking his second career hat trick (first with MIN) and tying his career-best in points in a game.

# THE MOOSE IS LOOSE


- Marcus Foligno is tied for fourth in the NHL with 52 hits this season.
   He led Minnesota with 237 hits last season.
- Foligno has recorded five 200-hit seasons in his career, including three with the Wild.
- His 3.6 hits per game played were tied for seventh-most in the NHL last season (min. 50 games played).
- Since entering the league in 2011-12, Foligno ranks eighth among NHL players with 2,234 hits.

# **PHONE BOOTH FREDDY**

- Freddy Gaudreau finished tied for third in the NHL with four shorthanded goals and tied for sixth in shorthanded points during the 2022-23 season
- Became the first player in Wild history to record multiple shorthanded goals in a single game, netting two at COL (3/29).
- Gaudreau led the NHL with eight shootout goals last season, tied for the largest since-season total in Wild history (Mikko Koivu, 2006-07 season).

#### **BROCKED AND LOADED**

- Brock Faber leads all rookie skaters with 23:13 in time on ice per game and 25 blocked shots.
- Faber scored his first NHL goal and recorded his first NHL point with a first-period goal vs. FLA (10/12).
- Faber made his NHL debut with the Wild at CHI (4/10), leading the team in time on ice (21:49) and blocked shots (six) while recording a plus-one rating and one shot on goal.
- Faber's six blocked shots were tied for most among players making their NHL debut since the league began tracking the stat in 2005-06.
- He is one of 33 Minnesota-born players (31 skaters) to wear the Wild sweater in a regular-season game.





# IN FULL BLOOM

- Goaltender Marc-Andre Fleury made 24 saves at NYR (11/9) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Patrick Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history.
- Fleury made his season debut at MTL (10/17), making 27 saves in the 5-2 win and improving his record to 27-13-6 all-time against the Canadiens.
- Currently at 247 career wins, needs four wins to tie (five to surpass)
   Roy (551 career wins) for second-most all-time.
- Fleury played 58:31 vs. LAK (10/19), moving his career minutes total to 57,164:32 and surpassing Terry Sawchuk (57,155:51) for fourth on the all-time list among NHL goaltenders.
- Fleury notched the 65th shootout win of his career vs. NYR (11/4), further extending his all-time NHL record.
- Finished 24-16-4 for the 2022-23 season, Fleury recorded his 15th career season of 20-plus wins, tied for third-most in NHL history: Patrick Roy (17), Martin Brodeur (16) and Ed Belfour (15).
- With 73 career shutouts, Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
- Currently at 990 career games played, Fleury played in his 972nd career game vs. VGK (2/9) to move past Terry Sawchuk for fourth place in NHL history among goalies. Roy currently ranks third with 1,029 career game appearances.
