

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****December 10, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [4] vs. NASHVILLE PREDATORS [3]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames finished off a brief two-game road swing on Tuesday against the Nashville Predators. Nashville would open the scoring with Jonathan Marchessault giving the home side a 1-0 advantage. Nazem Kadri would stay hot and draw Calgary level just under three minutes later before another Predators goal would see them lead 2-1 heading into the intermission. In the second, the Flames offense would explode with goals from Kevin Rooney, Brayden Pachal, and Jonathan Huberdeau all countering a second Jonathan Marchessault tally to give Calgary a 4-3 lead through 40. The Flames would lock things down in the third and knock off the Preds 4-3.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of two meetings this season between the Flames and Lightning. Calgary swept the season-series against Tampa Bay in 2023-24.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 1-1-3 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 7-4-3 against Eastern Conference opponents.

LAST SEASON VERSUS THE LIGHTNING:

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Tampa Bay Lightning to the Scotiabank Saddledome for their first meeting of 2023-24 back on December 16th, 2023. The first would see the clubs combine for 14 shots but both Dan Vladar and Andrei Vasilevskiy were solid in the opening 20 to keep the game scoreless. In the second, Calgary's offense would explode with A.J. Greer scoring just 2:30 into the middle stanza, followed by MacKenzie Weegar giving the Flames a 2-0 lead, and shortly after Yegor Sharangovich extended his goal-streak at the time to five games to make it 3-0 Flames through 40. Tampa would push back with two goals early in the third, before Connor Zary scored a huge insurance marker for the home-side, and Calgary won 4-2. In their second matchup, Yegor Sharangovich recorded four points with two goals and two helpers, Jonathan Huberdeau had a pair of assists, and Jakob Pelletier scored his first of the season to help the Flames leave Tampa with a 6-3 win.

HUBY DOO:

Jonathan Huberdeau registered a goal and an assist on Tuesday in Nashville to extend his point streak to five games, with three goals and four assists for seven points over the run dating back to November 30th. Huberdeau has now totaled a team-leading 19 points so far this season from 10 goals and nine helpers, including two game-winning goals. This is Huberdeau's second five-game point streak with the Flames and only Nazem Kadri (5) has recorded more since Huberdeau joined the club in 2022-23.

DARTH VLADAR:

Dan Vladar turned aside 17 shots to backstop the Flames to a 4-3 win over Nashville on Tuesday night to record his sixth win of the season. Vladar recorded the 41st win of his Calgary Flames tenure, and only five goalies have registered more victories through their first 85 appearances with the Flames: Miikka Kiprusoff (51), Jacob Markstrom (47), Mike Vernon (44), David Rittich (44) and Rick Wamsley (42).

WORKIN' ON A COLE MINE:

Flames forward Blake Coleman spent two years with the Tampa Bay Lightning from 2019-2021. Coleman skated in 64 regular season games for Tampa Bay scoring 14 goals and 18 assists for 32 points and was a plus-17 throughout his Lightning tenure. Coleman won back-to-back Stanley Cups with the Lightning and was a key contributor on both teams with five goals and eight assists for 13 points in 25 games during the NHL Bubble in summer 2020, and had 11 points (3G, 8A) the following playoffs in 2021. Coleman joined the Flames prior to the start of the 2021-22 season as a free agent and has skated in 270 games with Calgary, registering 136 points from 69 goals and 67 assists.

TAMPA BAY TIES TO CALGARY:

Lightning forward Brayden Point was born in Calgary and will be making his seventh trip to his hometown as a member of Tampa Bay. Point played for the Calgary Bisons and Calgary Buffaloes before moving onto the Canmore Eagles of the AJHL, followed by the Moose Jaw Warriors, a club he would captain for two seasons in the WHL.

HANLEY MAN:

Flames blueliner Joel Hanley skated in his 199th NHL game in Columbus on Nov. 29 and is just one game away from 200 in his NHL career. Hanley can become the 17th-active undrafted defenceman to reach 200 games in their NHL career. The Keswick, ON native made his NHL debut on March 20th, 2016 against Calgary as a member of the Montreal Canadiens, and has spent time with Montreal, Arizona, Dallas, and Calgary through his 199-previous NHL games.



HEY DID YOU KNOW?

On Tuesday in Nashville, the Flames scored three game-tying goals in a game for the first time since April 14, 2024 (vs. ARI).

Jakob Pelletier played his first NHL game against the Tampa Bay Lightning on January 21st, 2023 at the Scotiabank Saddledome, recording one shot through 14 shifts.

Rasmus Andersson (42) needs one goal to pass Noah Hanifin and Dougie Hamilton for sole possession of ninth most by a Flames defenseman.
