- The Stars defeated the Nashville Predators 4-3 to extend the season-opening win streak to five games, joining the Vegas Golden Knights as the only two teams to win each of their last five season openers.
- **Roope Hintz** and **Jason Robertson** scored 19 seconds apart, marking the second-fastest two goals in a season-opener for the Stars/North Stars according to NHL Stats. The fastest is 0:18 on Oct. 5, 1996 (Craig Ludwig & Pat Verbeek in P3).
- **Logan Stankoven** assisted on each of the team's first three goals, becoming the second rookie in franchise history (Roland Eriksson) to record three points in the team's season opener according to NHL Stats.
- **Mason Marchment** scored twice in the game, including the game winner, making him the first Stars player in team history (since 1993-94) to record two goals in multiple season openers according to NHL Stats, having also done so on Oct. 13, 2022 at Nashville.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- The Stars have posted a 7-2-3 record against the Islanders since the start of the 2017-18 season. Their .708 points percentage during that span ranks fifth in the NHL among teams that have played the Islanders at least twice during that span.
- Dallas enters tonight's game riding a five-game point streak against the Islanders.
- Stars Vice President of Cultural Growth and Strategy **Al Montoya** played for the Islanders for two seasons (2010-11 to 2011-12). In 51 regular-season games, he posted an 18-16-10 record with a 2.82 goals-against average and a .905 save percentage.
- Stars assistant coach **Alain Nasreddine** played three regular-season games for the Islanders during the 2002-03 season.
- The 2024-25 season marks captain **Jamie Benn's** 16th in the NHL, which is tied with Neal Breten for the second-most in Stars/North Stars history behind only Mike Modano (20) according to NHL Stats.
- Tonight is the first of 11 back-to-back sets that the Stars will play this season and the only time in which both games will be played at home.
 - The Islanders and Stars' second and final meeting of the season will be played on Feb. 23, 2025 in New York, which will be the second game of a back-to-back set that the Stars will play on the road. They will face off against the New Jersey Devils the night before.
 - Dallas will play back-to-back against Florida on Nov. 1 and 2. Although both games are being played in Finland, the Nov. 1 game is Dallas' 'home' game and the Nov. 2 matchup is Florida's.

LONELY ISLAND

- **Matt Duchene** has four points (2-2-4) in his last three games against the Islanders.
- In four career games played, **Jake Oettinger** has posted a 3-1-0 record against the Islanders, posting a 1.97 goals-against average and a .922 save percentage in those contests.
 - He has won both of the games that he has played against the Islanders at home and enters tonight's matchup riding a three-game win streak.
- **Tyler Seguin** has five points (1-4-5) in the last five games he has played against the Islanders. Seguin also has six points (1-5-6) in his last six games against the Islanders that have been played at American Airlines Center.
- **Logan Stankoven** recorded a multi-point game, scoring one goal and adding one assist, in his one career game against the Islanders, which was played on Feb. 26, 2024 in Dallas.

ROOKIE REPORT

- **Logan Stankoven** recorded three assists in Dallas' 4-3 win over the Predators on Oct. 10, making him one of 12 players, and the only rookie, to record at least three points in a game this season entering play Friday.
- According to NHL Stats, **Stankoven** became the second rookie in franchise history to record three points in the team's season-opening contest, alongside Roland Eriksson (0-4-4 w/ MNS) on Oct. 6, 1976.
- If **Stankoven** were to record at least two points tonight, it would give him multi-point efforts in consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- Originally selected by the Stars in the second round (47th overall) of the 2021 NHL Draft, **Stankoven** appeared in 24 regular-season games for Dallas last year, totaling 14 points (6-8-14) in those contests and adding eight points (3-5-8) in 19 Stanley Cup Playoff games.

FROM START TO FINNISH

- Forward **Roope Hitz** was named one of the Stars alternate captains this season. 2024-25 will mark the first time that **Hitz** and fellow Fins **Miro Heiskanen** and **Esa Lindell** are all a part of Dallas' leadership group.
 - Captain **Jamie Benn** and alternate captain **Tyler Seguin** round out the team's leadership group for this season.
- **Heiskanen**, **Hintz** and **Lindell** are three of six Finnish players in the NHL this season to be a part of their team's leadership group, joining Florida captain Aleksander Barkov, Carolina alternate Sebastian Aho and Colorado alternate Mikko Rantanen.
- **Heiskanen**, **Hintz** and **Lindell** are set to faceoff against Barkov the NHL's Global Series when the Stars will take on the Panthers in back-to-back games on Nov. 1 and 2 at Nokia Arena in Tampere, Finland.
- All three of **Heiskanen**, **Hintz** and **Lindell** rank in the top 15 in all-time scoring among active, Finnish skaters. At eighth, **Hintz** ranks the highest with 312 career points followed by **Heiskanen** (258, 10th) and **Lindell** (191, 13th).

BÄCKSTREET'S BÄCK, ALRIGHT!

- Dallas' Oct. 10 matchup against the Nashville Predators marked the first NHL game of **Oskar Bäck's** career. **Bäck** was originally drafted by the Stars in the third round (75th overall) of the 2018 NHL Draft.
- **Bäck** became the seventh player drafted by the Stars between 2017 and 2024 to play in at least one regular-season game for Dallas.
- According to Natural Stat Trick, when **Bäck** was on the ice during 5-on-5 play, the Stars outshot the Predators 2-0 and recorded an 66.7 on-ice Corsi percentage.
 - Only **Mason Marchment** (72.7 percent) had a better on-ice Corsi percentage during the team's season opener.

HOME COOKING

- Tonight marks the first Dallas Stars home game of the 2024-25 season. A win tonight would give the Stars victories in five consecutive home openers dating back to the 2020-21 season.
 - Entering play Friday, the Stars were one of four NHL teams to have an active home opener win streak of at least four games.
- Dallas has outscored its opponents 16-4 in its last four home openers.
- Tonight's game marks the first time since the franchise relocated to Dallas that the team is playing its home opener against the Islanders.
- **Roope Hintz** leads all active Stars skaters in scoring in home openers, totaling seven points (4-3-7) in five games.

FOR PETE'S SAKE

- Dallas' win over the Predators on Oct. 10 marked Head Coach **Pete DeBoer's** 100th behind the Stars bench. He became the fourth Stars head coach (since 1993-94) to record at least 100 regular-season wins with the team, joining Ken Hitchcock (319), Dave Tippett (271) and Lindy Ruff (165).
- Since the start of the 2022-23 season – **DeBoer's** first as the team's head coach – the Stars have posted a 100-42-23 record for a .676 win percentage, which is tied for the fourth-best mark in the NHL during that span.
 - Only Jim Montgomery (Boston; 113), Rod Brind'Amour (Carolina; 104) and Jared Bednar (Colorado; 101) have recorded more regular-season wins since the starts of the 2022-23 season
 - This excludes the Utah Hockey Club, which has won each of it's first two games this season after relocating to Salt Lake City from Arizona.

- **DeBoer** has posted a 613-421-146 record over the course of his coaching career with the Dallas Stars, Vegas Golden Knights (2019-20 to 2021-22), San Jose Sharks (2015-16 to 2019-20), New Jersey Devils (2011-12 to 2014-15) and Florida Panthers (2008-19 to 2010-11). His 613 career wins rank 23rd all-time among all NHL coaches and rank fifth all-time among active coaches.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- **Roope Hintz** enters tonight's game two goals shy of becoming the 18th skater in franchise history to score 150 goals with the team.
- **Tyler Seguin** is seven assists away from bringing his total with the stars to 380, which would tie him with Brian Bellows for fifth-most assists by a skater in franchise history.
- **Esa Lindell** is nine points shy of becoming the 49th player and 13th defenseman in franchise history to record 200 points with the Stars. He is also just three goals away from tying Philippe Boucher (52) for the 10th-most goals among defensemen in franchise history.

BENN THERE DONE THAT

- **Jamie Benn** enters tonight's game having played in 298 consecutive games, which is the fifth-longest active such streak in the NHL. He is one of 15 players to have an active Iron Man streak of at least 200 games.
- **Benn** is one of 11 NHL players to appear in each of his team's 246 regular-season games between 2021-22 and 2023-24.
- Currently two games shy, **Benn** is set to become the fourth player in franchise history to play in 300 consecutive games for the team according to NHL Stats.

- The Stars captain leads all Dallas players in career games played (1,113), goals (383), assists (524) and points (907). His 907 career points rank 12th among active NHL skaters, and he is the second-highest scoring fifth-round draft pick in NHL history (Alexander Mogilny; 1,032).

FIRST THING'S FIRST

- Dallas opened the 2024-25 season with 11 former first-round picks on its roster; **Mavrik Bourque** (DAL; 2020), **Matt Duchene** (COL; 2009), **Matt Dumba** (MIN; 2012), **Thomas Harley** (DAL; 2019), **Miro Heiskanen** (DAL; 2017), **Wyatt Johnston** (DAL; 2021) **Nils Lundkvist** (NYR; 2018), **Jake Oettinger** (DAL; 2017), **Tyler Seguin** (BOS; 2010), **Brenden Smith** (DET; 2007) and **Sam Steel** (ANA; 2016)
- **Tyler Seguin** is the highest drafted player on Dallas' roster, selected by Boston with the second-overall pick in the 2010 NHL Draft. **Seguin** leads all 2010 draft picks in career assists (437) and points (788), and ranks second in goals (351).
- There are two sets of Stars skaters that were taken with the same pick in different years: **Matt Duchene** and **Miro Heiskanen** were both taken with the third-overall pick, **Duchene** by Colorado in 2009 and **Heiskanen** by Dallas in 2017. Additionally, **Sam Steel** and **Mavrik Bourque** were both drafted 30th-overall – **Steel** by Anaheim in 2016 and **Bourque** by Dallas in 2020.
- Six additional Stars draft picks are on Dallas' opening night roster this year: **Oskar Bäck** (2018; 3rd round), **Jamie Benn** (2007; 5th round), **Roope Hintz** (2015; 2nd round), **Esa Lindell** (2012; 3rd round), **Jason Robertson** (2017; 2nd round) and **Logan Stankoven** (2021; 2nd round).

CONNECTIONS

- Stars player development assistant **Jordie Benn** and Islanders forward Bo Horvat played in Vancouver together from 2019-20 to 2020-21.
- Stars player development coordinator **Ben Bishop** and Islanders forward Jean-Gabriel Pageau both played for the Senators in 2012-13. The two then reunited on the United States' roster for the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and defenseman **Brendan Smith** both played for the Rangers with Islanders forward Julien Gauthier – **Blackwell** in 2022-23 and **Smith** from 2019-20 to 2020-21.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and Islanders defenseman Dennis Cholowski were both selected by Seattle in the 2021 NHL Expansion Draft – **Blackwell** from the Rangers and Cholowski from the Red Wings.
- Stars forward **Evgenii Dadonov** and Islanders defenseman Mike Reilly both played for the Ottawa Senators in 2020-21.
- Stars forward **Evgenii Dadonov** and Islanders goaltender Ilya Sorokin both played for Russia at the 2016 and 2017 IIHF World Championships, winning a bronze medal in both tournaments.
- Stars assistant coach **Misha Donskov** was the video coach for Team Canada at the 2016 IIHF World Junior Championship, a roster that Islanders forward Mat Barzal was a part of.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Islanders forward Jean-Gabriel Pageau both played for the Senators for parts of two seasons (2017-18 and 2018-19).
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Islanders goaltender Semyon Varlamov played for the Avalanche together from 2011-12 to 2017-18.

- Stars defenseman **Matt Dumba** and Islanders forward Anthony Duclair both played in Tampa Bay for part of the 2023-24 season.
- Stars defenseman **Matt Dumba**, Islanders forward Bo Horvat and Islanders defenseman Adam Pelech all played for Team Canada at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars defenseman **Matt Dumba** and Islanders defenseman Mike Reilly played for the Wild together for three seasons (2015-16 to 2017-18).
- Stars assistant coach **Alain Nasreddine** was a part of New Jersey's coaching staff in the same role for six of the seasons that Islanders forward Kyle Palmieri played for the Devils (2015-16 to 2021-22).
- Stars forward **Jason Robertson** won a silver medal with Islanders forward Oliver Wahlstrom while playing for Team USA at the 2019 IHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars assistant coaches **Steve Spott** (head coach) and **Misha Donskov** (video coach) were both a part of Team Canada's coaching staff at the 2015 IIHF World Junior Championship, a roster that Islanders forward Anthony Duclair was on.
