The Calgary Flames headed to Vancouver to face the Canucks in their final road game of the season. Vancouver would lead 2-0 through 20 after Tyler Myers and Nils Hoglander put the home side up. The Canucks would add a third in the second, but in the final frame Brayden Pachal would score his first as a Flame to give Calgary life. However, Vancouver would add another and knock off the Flames 4-1.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the final meeting this season between the Flames and Sharks. Calgary and San Jose have split their two prior matchups, with the road team winning on both occasions.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 12-12-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 22-24-2 against Western Conference opponents.

LAST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames began a three-game California road trip in San Jose on April 9th. The Sharks would score the only goal of the opening 20 with William Eklund giving the home side a 1-0 lead. San Jose would double their advantage 2:22 into the second, but a pair of goals from Rasmus Andersson and Nazem Kadri helped Calgary draw level through 40 minutes of play. In the third, the netminders stood tall, and this game required overtime. In the extra frame, San Jose's Mario Ferraro would be called for holding, and Calgary would capitalize on the man advantage with Andrei Kuzmenko netting the overtime winner and the Flames left the SAP Center with a 3-2 win.

KYLINGTON 200:

Oliver Kylington skated in his 200th NHL game on Tuesday night in Vancouver. The Stockholm, Sweden native made his NHL debut on April 9th, 2016 in Minnesota where he played in 17:22 of ice-time with one shot. Kylington was the Flames second-round pick in the 2015 NHL draft has become the 18th-active Swedish defenceman to reach 200 NHL games and now joins Rasmus Andersson as two of 21 defenceman from the 2015 draft class to reach 200 NHL games in their careers.

BELARUSSIAN HISTORY:

With his goal in Sunday night's 6-5 win over Arizona, Yegor Sharangovich recorded his 59th point of 2023-24 (31G, 28A) to become the all-time highest scoring Belarusian in a single season. Mikhail Grabovski previously held the record with 58 points from 29 goals and 29 assists during the 2010-11 campaign as a member of the Toronto Maple Leafs. This season, Sharangovich also became the first player of Belarusian descent to score 30 goals in a single season when he did so on April 6th vs. Edmonton.

NAZ-HIM KADRI:

Nazem Kadri enters play tonight with 29 tallies on the season and is looking to reach the 30-goal plateau for the third time in his career joining his 32 goal efforts in 2016-17 and 2017-18. In 2023-24, Kadri has registered a team-leading 75 points for his second-highest total in a single campaign, only trailing his 87-point season in 2021-22 with the Colorado Avalanche.

WEEGSY BABY:

With 19 goals on the campaign, MacKenzie Weegar is looking to become the first Flames defenceman to post a 20-goal season since Mark Giordano did in 2015-16. The Ottawa, ON native has already set a career-high in points (51) in 2023-24, and his 19 goals rank him fourth among defenceman in the NHL this season. Since being acquired by the Flames in the summer of 2022, Weegar has posted 23 tallies which leads all Flames rearguards since the start of 2022-23.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Rasmus Andersson is currently at 199 points and just one point shy of becoming the 11th active Swedish-born defenceman to reach the 200-point plateau, and sixth rearguard from the 2015 draft class to achieve the feat.

In these clubs last meeting, the Flames recorded their 70th win all time against the Sharks and have now hit the 70-win mark against 11 different franchises. The Flames own a .558 points-percentage against San Jose.
