AT A GLANCE

HOLLYWOOD NORTH

Forwards **Quinton Byfield** (Newmarket), **Warren Foegele** (Markham) and **Jeff Malott** (Burlington) all skate into familiar territory being natives of the Greater Toronto Area (GTA). With **Drew Doughty** (London), **Cody Ceci** (Ottawa), **Brandt Clarke** (Nepean) and **Corey Perry** (Peterborough) also on the 23-man roster, the Kings will have seven Ontario-born skaters enter Thursday night's contest. The Ontario-born natives are hardly the only Kings with meaningful ties to 'Hollywood North,' as Head Coach **Jim Hiller** and Associate Coach **D.J. Smith** served behind the Maples Leafs' bench together from the 2015-16 campaign through 2018-19. Only Seattle (8) and San Jose (8) have more Ontario-born players on their active roster than the Kings' seven.





THE KUEMPIRE STRIKES BACK

Goaltender **Darcy Kuemper** made 21 saves on 22 shots on goal to earn his sixth win of the season on Tuesday in Montreal, extending his point streak on the road to seven consecutive results (5-0-2), dating back to Oct. 13 in Minnesota. Last week, the 35-year-old netminder turned aside all 23 of the Jets' shots on goal on Tuesday, Nov. 6, to earn his fourth victory, and first shutout, of the 2025-26 season. In doing so, Kuemper secured his 45th win as a member of the LA Kings and broke a three-way tie with **Cal Petersen** (44 W) and **Mathieu Garon** (44 W) for sole possession of the ninth most in franchise history.


DYNAMIC DUO

Defensemen **Brandt Clarke** (2-6=8) and **Joel Edmundson** (1-7=8) have led the Kings' offense from the defense through the first 17 games of the campaign. On Tuesday night in Montreal, Edmundson scored his first goal of the season to tie the contest at a goal apiece before providing the primary helper, his seventh assist of the season, on the go-ahead tally exactly three minutes later. Clarke followed his partner's performance by contributing his sixth assist and eighth point of the season. The two blueliners each have a plus-6 rating on the season, the highest by a Kings defenseman and tied for the second highest in the category behind **Anze Kopitar** (plus-8). Clarke earned an assist in his only previous trip to Toronto on Oct. 16, 2024, while Edmundson carries eight points (2-6=8) in 25 career games played against his former team.
