### GAME NOTES

#### THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the final of four games the Stars will play against the Blackhawks this season and the second time the two teams are facing off in Chicago this year.
- The Stars have posted a 11-3-0 record against the Blackhawks since the 2021-22 season, outscoring Chicago 55-36 in those games.
  - No team has scored more goals against the Blackhawks than the Stars since the start of the 2021-22 season.
  - The team's 22 points against Chicago since 2021-22 are the third-most of any NHL team.
- **Esa Lindell** is expected to play in his 639th career game tonight, which will give him sole possession of 17th on the franchise's all-time games played list.
- **Wyatt Johnston** had a goal and an assist in Dallas' last game and now has five points (1-4–5) in his last five games played.
- **Miro Heiskanen** is averaging 25:13 of ice time per game this season, which was the fifth-most in the NHL this year entering play Saturday.
- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's game three assists shy of recording 200 career assists. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 27th player in Stars franchise history at the seventh player from the 2017 draft class to total 200 NHL assists.
- Entering play Saturday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.59 goals against per game this season, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL entering play Saturday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 18 of the 34 games that they have played this year.

### BLACKHAWK DOWN

- Dallas is 126-138-42 all-time vs. Chicago, including a 51-80-20 mark on the road.
- **Jamie Benn** has 15 points (7-8—15) in his last 15 games against Chicago dating back to May 10, 2021.
- **Matt Duchene** has six points (4-2—6) in his last six games against Chicago.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has 16 points (2-14—16) in his last 16 games against Chicago dating back to April 8, 2021.
  - Since the start of the 2020-21 season, **Heiskanen** has recorded 17 points (2-15—17) in 21 games against the Blackhawks, which is the second-highest total of any NHL defensemen during that span.
  - In all, **Heiskanen** has 18 career points (2-16—18) in 28 career games against Chicago, which is his highest total against a single opponent.
- **Roope Hintz** has 26 points (14-12—26) in 25 career games against Chicago. His 14 goals and 26 points are both his highest totals against a single opponent.
  - **Hintz** is the highest-scoring player in the NHL against the Blackhawks since the start of the 2020-21 season, totaling 25 points (13-12—15) in 19 games. His 13 goals against Chicago are also the most of any skater during that span.
- **Mason Marchment** has five points (4-1—5) in his last five games against Chicago.
- **Jake Oettinger** has won nine of the last 10 games he has played against Chicago, posting a .909 save percentage, a 2.50 goals-against average and one shutout in those games.
- **Jason Robertson** has 23 points (9-14—23) in 22 career games against Chicago. His 23 points against the Blackhawks are his second-highest total against a single opponent, trailing only his 24 career points (10-14—24) against Nashville.
  - **Robertson's** 23 points against Chicago since the start of the 2020-21 season are the second-most of any NHL skater, trailing only Dallas teammate **Roope Hintz**.
- **Logan Stankoven** has three points (1-2—3) in four career games against Chicago.

### KILLING IT

- Entering play Saturday, the Stars had the fifth-ranked penalty kill in the NHL this season with an 85.1 percent success rate.
- Dallas has allowed only 14 power-play goals against this season, which was tied with Nashville for the mark in the NHL this season entering play Saturday. Their 0.41 power-play goals against per game ranked second in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- The Stars have not allowed a power-play goal against in eight consecutive games, going 17-for-17 on the penalty kill dating back to Dec. 8 vs. Calgary.
  - The Stars are the only team in the NHL that has been perfect on the penalty kill since Dec. 8.
- If the Stars were to remain perfect on the penalty kill tonight, it would mark the first time that they have gone nine straight games without surrendering a power-play goal against since Nov. 23 to Dec. 11, 2021. They went 20-for-20 on the penalty kill during that stretch.
- **Esa Lindell** has skated 118:32 minutes on the penalty kill this season, which was fourth-highest total of any NHL skater this season entering play Saturday.
  - **Lindell**, who skated 7:58 of shorthanded ice time, was on the ice for all but two seconds of Dallas' eight penalty kill minutes in their game on Dec. 16 against the Washington Capitals.

### ROAD WARRIORS

- **Matt Duchene** is the team's leading scorer when playing on the road this year, totaling 16 points (5-11—16) in 15 games.
- **Colin Blackwell** has recorded a point in each of his last two road games, scoring one goal and tallying one assist. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in three consecutive road games for the first time since he had a point in four consecutive road games from Jan. 24 to Feb. 18, 2021.
- **Wyatt Johnston** has recorded a point in six of the last seven road games that he has played and enters tonight's contest riding a three-game road point streak.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give both **Oskar Bäck** and **Mavrik Bourque** points in three consecutive road games for the first time in their respective careers.

### IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 100 consecutive games: **Jamie Benn** (331), **Jason Robertson** (244), **Esa Lindell** (204) and **Wyatt Johnston** (198). Entering play Saturday, only the Calgary Flames and Vancouver Canucks (five each) had more players on their roster to have an Iron Man streak of at least 100 games.
- Dallas' last game on Dec. 27 against Minnesota was the 331st consecutive game that **Benn** played in, which is the fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL. He is one of six players to have an Iron Man streak of at least 300 games.
- **Robertson's** 244-game Iron Man streak was the 13th-longest in the NHL entering play Saturday. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Saturday.
- **Lindell's** 204-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.

### ILY[A]

- **Ilya Lyubushkin** recorded his eighth assist of the season in Dallas' last game, matching his total from the 2023-24 season in 40 fewer games played.

- He is now five assists shy of matching his career high of 13 that he set during the 2021-22 season while playing for the Arizona Coyotes and Toronto Maple Leafs.
- **Lyubushkin** is pacing to finish the year with 19 assists and 19 points, both of which would be career highs for the defenseman.
- **Lyubushkin** also had six hits in the Stars last game, which is tied for the most by a Dallas skater in a single game this season.

## TOUGH AS NILS

- In Dallas' last game on Dec. 27 against Minnesota, the Stars outshot the Wild 17-10 when **Nils Lundskvist** was on the ice during 5-on-5 play. No skater on either team was on the ice for more shots for during 5-on-5 play than him.
- The Stars outshot the Utah Hockey Club 13-7 in their previous game on Dec. 23 during 5-on-5 play. Similarly, no player from Utah or Dallas was on the ice for more shots for than **Lundskvist**.
- Since Dec. 8, when **Lundskvist** has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 5-3 and outshot them 57-36. His 60.4 percent Corsi rating during that span tops Stars skaters to play in at least two games since Dec. 8.
- **Lundskvist** has totaled 23 shots on goal since Nov. 29, which was tied for second among NHL defensemen that have averaged less than 18 minutes off ice time per game during that span entering play Saturday.
  - This includes recording six shots on Dec. 4 against Los Angeles, which match his career high and were the second-most by a Stars defenseman in a single game this season (**Miro Heiskanen**; 7 on 10/22 at BUF and 11/11 at PIT).
- In all this season, **Lundskvist** is averaging 16.5 shot attempts per 60, which is the sixth-best mark on the Stars roster and tops all Dallas defensemen.

## WHAT IN THE WORLD

- The 2025 IIHF U20 World Junior Championship began on Dec. 26 and will be played in Ottawa through Jan. 5.
- Stars prospects **Emil Hemming** (Finland) and **Aram Minnetian** (United States) have each been selected to represent their home countries at this year's tournament.
- **Hemming**, who was selected by Dallas with the 29th-overall pick in the 2024 NHL Draft previously represented Finland at the 2024 IIHF U20 World Junior Championship where he tallied two assists in seven games and has also played for Finland's national team in several U18 tournaments.
- This tournament marks **Minnetian's** first appearance at the World Juniors. The Woodcliff Lake, New Jersey native previously played for Team USA at the 2023 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship.
  - **Minnetian** was originally selected by the Stars in the fourth round (125th-overall) of the 2023 NHL Draft.
- Fifteen Stars skaters have previously played at the IIHF U20 World Junior Championships: **Oskar Bäck**, **Jamie Benn**, **Lian Bichsel**, **Evgenii Dadonov**, **Matt Dumba**, **Thomas Harley**, **Miro Heiskanen**, **Roope Hintz**, **Esa Lindell**, **Nils Lundskvist**, **Ilya Lyubushkin**, **Jake Oettinger**, **Jason Robertson**, **Logan Stankoven** and **Sam Steel**.

## BICHS BETTER HAVE MY MONEY

- Dallas' game against the Predators on Dec. 12 marked the first NHL game of defenseman **Lian Bichsel's** career.
- In making his NHL debut, **Bichsel** became:
  - The 33rd player and 13th defenseman selected in the 2022 NHL Draft to appear in an NHL regular-season game.
  - The eighth player drafted by the Stars between 2017 and 2024 to play in at least one regular-season game for Dallas.
  - The 46th Swiss player and 15th Swiss defenseman in league history to appear in an NHL regular-season game.

- **Bichsel** scored his first NHL goal in the game, making him the third defenseman in franchise history to score in his NHL debut according to NHL Stats, joining Daniel Poulin (Dec. 12, 1981) and Bryan Maxwell (Feb. 16, 1987). **Bichsel's** goal came exactly 43 years to the day after Poulin's.
- **Bichsel** scored the second goal of his NHL career in Dallas' game (and his third NHL game) on Dec. 16 against the Washington Capitals, making him the second defenseman in franchise history to score two goals within his first three NHL games according to NHL Stats, joining Minnesota North Stars blueliner Derian Hatcher (2 in 1991-92).
- **Bichsel's** goal was the eventual game winner, making him the club's second-youngest defenseman with a game-winning goal according to NHL Stats, behind only **Miro Heiskanen** (4; youngest: 19 years, 99 days on Oct. 25, 2018).
  - **Bichel** was 20 years and 212 days old on Dec. 16.
- **Bichel's** two goals this season were just one shy of tying New Jersey's Seamus Casey for the league lead among rookie defensemen entering play Saturday.
  - **Bichsel**, Casey and the Islanders' Isaiah George were the only rookie defensemen to score a game-winning goal this season entering play Saturday.
- Since making his NHL debut on Dec. 12, **Bichsel** has recorded 24 hits in seven games played. His 24 hits are the most of any Stars skater during that span and 11 more than the second-ranked player (**Ilya Lyubushkin**; 13).
  - This includes totaling six hits in Dallas' game on Dec. 23 against Utah, which is tied for the most by a Stars skater in a single game this season.
  - Bichsel has recorded at least four hits in four of the seven games he has played this season.
- Standing at 6'7", there are only four players to appear in a regular-season game this year that are taller than **Bichsel**: New York's Matt Rempe (6'9"), Vancouver's Tyler Myers (6'8"), Chicago's Louis Crevier (6'8") and Calgary's Adam Klapka (6'8").
- **Bichsel** was originally selected by the Stars with the 18th-overall pick of the 2022 NHL Draft, the only Swiss player to be drafted that year. It made him the seventh-highest drafted Swiss player in NHL history, behind Nico Hischier (first overall, 2017), Nino Niederreiter (fifth overall, 2010), Timo Meier (ninth overall, 2015), Kevin Fiala (11th overall, 2014), Sven Bärtschi (13th overall, 2011) and Michel Riesen (14th overall, 1997).
  - Defenseman Mirco Müller was also drafted 18th overall, taken by San Jose in 2013.

### BENN THERE DONE THAT

- Dallas' game on Dec. 18 was the 1,143rd game of captain **Jamie Benn's** career, which is the most-ever by a Stars skater.
  - **Benn** surpassed Mike Modano's 1,142 games with Dallas.
- **Benn's** 1,146 career games rank second on the franchise's all-time list behind Modano, who played in 317 games for the North Stars before the team relocated to Dallas.
- **Benn** also ranks in the top five in franchise history in career goals (390, second), assists (540, third) and points (929, second).
- **Benn** enters tonight's game 10 goals shy of scoring 400 career goals. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 10th active skater to score 400 NHL goals.

### ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- **Jake Oettinger's** next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- **Miro Heiskanen** is one assist shy of tying Brad Maxwell (217) for seventh on the franchise's all-time assists list by defensemen.
- **Matt Duchene** is five points away from recording his 100th point with the Stars.
- **Esa Lindell** enters tonight's contest four assists shy of tying Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.

### CONNECT FOUR

- Stars forward **Roope Hintz** (Finland), defensemen **Miro Heiskanen** (Finland) and **Esa Lindell** (Finland), and goaltender **Jake Oettinger** (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.
- Only six teams have had more players selected to a 4 Nations roster than the Stars: Colorado, Florida, Minnesota, Tampa Bay and Vegas. The full breakdown is as follows:

- All four players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.



- **Heiskanen** has played for Finland at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships, 2018 and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2018 Winter Olympic Games.
  - **Lindell** suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
  - **Hintz** previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
  - **Oettinger** has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that all three of **Heiskanen**, **Hintz** and **Lindell** are playing for Finland together.
  - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** previously won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with **Jim Nill** (Associate GM), **Pete DeBoer** (Assistant Coach) and **Misha Donskov** (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star **Jere Lehtinen** will serve as Finland's General Manager.

- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and Blackhawks forward Ryan Donato skated for the Seattle Kraken during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Blackhawks forward Nick Foligno and defenseman Seth Jones were all members of the Blue Jackets following the trade deadline during the 2018-19 season.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** played for the Toronto Maple Leafs alongside Blackhawks forwards Nick Foligno and Ilya Mikheyev as well as defenseman TJ Brodie and goaltender Petr Mrazek during the 2020-21 season.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Blackhawks forward Taylor Hall were both with the Arizona Coyotes during the 2019-20 season.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and Blackhawks forward Craig Smith played with the Predators from 2018-19 to 2019-20.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** played alongside Blackhawks forward Craig Smith with Nashville in the 2019-20 season.
- Stars defenseman **Breandan Smith** and Blackhawks forward Teuvo Teravainen were teammates with the Hurricanes during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward **Evgenii Dadonov** and Blackhawks defenseman Alec Martinez were teammates for a short time with the Vegas Golden Knights in 2021-22.
- Stars goaltending coach **Jeff Reese** and Blackhawks head coach Luke Richardson were both drafted by the Toronto Maple Leafs (Reese in 1984 and Richardson in 1987). The two played together for the Maple Leafs from 1987-88 to 1990-91.

- Blackhawks assistant coach Kevin Dean played the 1999-00 season with the Dallas Stars, playing in 14 games.
- Stars goaltending coach **Jeff Reese** and Blackhawks assistant coach Derek King both played for the Toronto Maple Leafs during the 1998-99 season.
- Blackhawks assistant coach Derek Plante played two seasons with the Dallas Stars organization (1998-99 to 1999-00), playing in a total of 26 games.
