TONIGHT'S GAME

The Anaheim Ducks continue their 2024 preseason schedule tonight when the club hosts the Los Angeles Kings at Honda Center (7 p.m. PT). The Ducks continue a stretch of playing all six exhibition contests every other night, with tonight marking the second of two contests against the Kings, a home-and-home, this preseason. Anaheim has posted a 93-92-25 record in all-time exhibition contests, including a 56-44-8 record on home ice and 37-48-17 mark on the road. Facing Los Angeles in exhibition contests, the Ducks have posted a 19-32-4 record, including an 12-16-1 at home (7-16-3 on the road).

GUDAS NAMED DUCKS CAPTAIN

The Ducks named defenseman **Radko Gudas** team captain Sept. 19, the ninth captain in Ducks history and first since Ryan Getzlaf (2010-22). Gudas also becomes the sixth NHL captain from Czechia, joining Peter Stastny (Quebec, 1985-90), Jaromir Jagr (Pittsburgh, 1998-01, and NY Rangers, 2006-08), Patrik Elias (New Jersey, 2006-07), Bobby Holik (Atlanta, 2007-08), Milan Hejduk (Colorado, 2011-12). Gudas, 34, is entering his 13th NHL season and second with Anaheim. In his first season with the club in 2023-24, he recorded 6-12=18 points in 66 games, leading Ducks skaters in plus/minus (+14), hits (232) and blocked shots (154), while also leading Anaheim defensemen in goals (6). The defenseman has collected 39-143=182 points with a +87 rating and 971 PIM in 748 career games with Anaheim (2023-present), Florida (2021-23), Washington (2019-20), Philadelphia (2015-19) and Tampa Bay (2012-15). The Kladno, Czechia native helped his country to a gold medal at the 2024 World Championship on home ice in Prague while serving as an alternate captain.

DUCKS RANKED NO. 1 IN ANNUAL FUTURE WATCH

The Hockey News released its annual Future Watch issue March 8, ranking the Ducks No. 1 in the NHL in a poll of top 21-and-under NHLers plus prospects (ranked by a panel of NHL scouts). Anaheim received an 'A' letter grade for 2024, with the Ducks the only team to achieve a grade this high in this issue of Future Watch. Anaheim is the only franchise to achieve an 'A' grade each of the past two editions (A+ in 2023 Future Watch). The Ducks have been ranked first in two of the last three Future Watch issues (also 2022) and were second despite an A+ rating in 2023. Among all NHL clubs ranked in Future Watch, Anaheim is first in five-year average position and also 20-year average position. No NHL team has had more top-10 finishes (13), top-five finishes (10) and top-three finishes (eight) than the Ducks over the past 20 years.

WHERE TO WATCH

The Ducks recently announced new media partnerships with Victory+ and FOX 11 Plus (KCOP Channel 13) to stream/televise all regional games at no cost to fans beginning this season. All local games will be available to stream on a newly formed network, Victory+, a free direct-to-consumer streaming service created for Ducks fans by APMC. The agreement with FOX 11 Plus will include 65 Ducks games on over-the-air television. As a result, locally broadcast Ducks games will be available to 100% of the Los Angeles regional market, entirely free to all fans. Tonight's contest marks the first game on both networks.

THE 2024 PRESEASON

Anaheim's 2024 preseason schedule includes six exhibition contests, all in the state of California. The Ducks will host three home games at Honda Center and participate in three road contests. Anaheim's three home games include Thursday, Sept. 26 vs. the San Jose Sharks (3-2 SJS OT win), in addition to Monday, Sept. 30 vs. the Los Angeles Kings (7 p.m.) and Wednesday, Oct. 2 vs. Utah (7 p.m.). The Ducks will visit San Jose at SAP Center on Tuesday, Sept. 24 (4-3 ANA win) and Friday, Oct. 4 (7 p.m.). In addition, Anaheim will participate in a neutral-site game on Saturday, Sept. 28 against Los Angeles as part of the 'Empire Classic' at Toyota Arena in Ontario, Calif. (3 p.m.). Anaheim's game Wednesday, Oct. 2 vs. San Jose will include a scheduled shootout following the conclusion of the contest.

ROSTER REPORT

The Ducks opened their 2024 Training Camp presented by OC Navigator on Thursday, Sept. 19 with 66 players (39 forwards, 20 defensemen and seven goaltenders). Anaheim made 10 cuts to the roster on Sunday, Sept. 22, one cut Sept. 27 and 12 Sept. 29, trimming the roster to 43 players (24 forwards, 13 defensemen and six goaltenders). The roster currently features eight Anaheim first-round selections (seven the past six drafts) and 19 Anaheim draft selections overall.

NEW FACES

Over the offseason, Anaheim added four players through trades and free agency, including defenseman **Brian Dumoulin**, centers **Robby Fabbri** and **Jansen Harkins**, and right wing **Carson Meyer**.

- Brian Dumoulin (acquired from Seattle for a 2026 4th round pick, July 2)
 - Won back-to-back Stanley Cups with Pittsburgh in 2016 and 2017. In his 11th NHL season with Seattle in 2023-24, set a single-season career high of six goals and had 6-10=16 points with a +3 rating in 80 games.
- Robby Fabbri (acquired from Detroit with a 2025 4th round pick for G Gage Alexander, July 5)
 - Won a Stanley Cup St. Louis in 2018. In his ninth NHL season and fifth with Detroit in 2023-24, tied a career high with 18 goals, totaling 18-14=32 points in 68 games.
- Jansen Harkins (signed to a two-year contract, July 2)
 - Split 2023-24 between Pittsburgh and Wilkes-Barre/Scranton (AHL). Had four points (0-4=4) in 45 NHL games with the Penguins and 5-7=12 points in 14 AHL games with the Penguins.
- Carson Meyer (signed to a one-year, two-way contract, July 3)
 - Split last season between Columbus and Cleveland (AHL). Had 1-1=2 points in 14 NHL games and set AHL career highs in points (22-15=37) and goals in 55 AHL contests.

NEW-LOOK COACHING STAFF

Anaheim's 2024 Training Camp will feature three new members of Greg Cronin's coaching staff. **Richard Clune** joined as Assistant Coach June 21, while **Tim Army** (Assistant Coach) and **Peter Budaj** (Goaltending Coach) were named to their roles July 10. **Sudarshan Maharaj** was promoted to Director of Goaltending July 10 (formerly Goaltending Coach), overseeing all aspects of the club's goaltending (coaching, development and scouting). The Ducks' 2024-25 coaching staff includes Head Coach **Greg Cronin**, Assistant Coaches **Tim Army**, **Richard Clune** and **Brent Thompson**, Goaltending Coach **Peter Budaj** and Video Coordinator **Austin Violette**.

2024-25 REGULAR-SEASON SCHEDULE

The Ducks will begin the regular season with consecutive road games Saturday, Oct. 12 vs. San Jose (7 p.m.) and at Vegas Sunday, Oct. 13 (7 p.m.). The season opening back-to-back is the second straight campaign Anaheim opens with consecutive games. The club's home opener is Wednesday, Oct. 16 in the first-ever matchup vs. Utah Hockey Club (7 p.m.) and the regular-season Honda Center debut of the club's new primary uniforms. Anaheim will host 23 home weekend dates, including nine Friday, three Saturday and 11 Sunday contests.

LA KINGS PRESEASON QUICK HITS

King of the Hill-er

With the interim tag removed on May 23, Head Coach **Jim Hiller** is set to begin his first full season at the helm behind the Kings' bench. Hiller, 55, was originally elevated to Kings interim head coach on Feb. 2, 2024, after serving as an assistant coach for the previous two seasons. In 34 regular-season games as last season, Hiller led the Kings to a 21-12-1 record for 43 points and a .632 points percentage.

Under Hiller's guidance, the Kings were the best home team in the NHL after the All-Star Break, accumulating a league-leading 14 wins (14-3-1), 29 points and .806 points percentage in 18 games. The club finished the regular-season winning nine of their last 10 home contests, including eight consecutive victories on home ice from March 11 through April 13 to mark the team's longest such streak since their eight-game run (8-0-0; Oct. 12 – Nov. 13) in 2010-11.

5 More for 55

The second overall selection in the 2020 NHL Draft, forward **Quinton Byfield** signed a five-year contract extension that will keep him in Los Angeles through the end of the 2028-29 season. The then-21-year-old played in 80 regular season games in the 2023-24 campaign, establishing career-highs in games played, goals (20), assists (35), points (55), power-play goals (6), power-play points (14) and game-winning goals (4) with a plus-19 rating, the third highest plus/minus rating on the team and highest among any Kings forward.

Making his NHL debut against the Anaheim Ducks on April 28, 2021, Byfield became sixth-youngest player to ever skate in a game for the Kings at 18 years and 252 days old. Since then, the Newmarket, ON, native has accumulated 28 goals and 60 assists for 88 points (28-60=88) in 179 career NHL games. Byfield is only the 10th skater in franchise history to record at least 80 career points before turning 22 years old – a list led by teammate **Anze Kopitar** (79-125=204 in 236 GP).

Byfield's 35 assists and 55 points last season respectively ranked fifth and fourth among all NHL skaters under 22 years of age. Byfield registered five multi-goal outings in his fourth professional season, tied for most on the team with **Trevor Moore**, and for most in the league among all skaters 21 years of age or younger. In doing so, Byfield became one of six skaters in franchise history to have five or more multi-goal games in a single season before their 22nd birthday, and the first to do so in more than three decades (**Jimmy Carson**, nine times in 1987-88).

Long May They Reign

Franchise cornerstones **Anze Kopitar** and **Drew Doughty** begin their 19th and 17th respective campaigns with the Kings. The forward-defenseman duo continued to rewrite the history books last season, both for the Kings franchise and for the NHL writ large.

With his ninth career 70-point season (26-44=70), Kopitar notched 20 goals for a 13th time and reached the 40-assist plateau for the 14th time in his career, setting new franchise records in both categories. With 1,211 points (419-792=1,211), the captain enters his 19th year of professional hockey one helper behind **Guy Lafleur** (793) for the 36th most assists all-time and sits 63 points back of **Al MacInnis** (340-934=1,274) for a place in the top 40 scorers in NHL history.

On the blueline, Doughty finished the 2023-24 regular season second in the league in time-on-ice (TOI), averaging 25:48 minutes of TOI per game. A four-time All-Star and former Norris Trophy winner, Doughty accumulated over 25 minutes of TOI in 53 of the team's 82 games last season and over 26 minutes of TOI in a league-leading 43 of those games. With his fifth career 50-point (15-35=50) campaign last season, the London, ON, native sits third in franchise history in total games played (1,177), eighth in points (156-513=669), and six tallies back from **Rob Blake** (161) for most goals scored by a Kings defenseman all-time.

Nine for Nine

Forward **Adrian Kempe** skates into his ninth season as a King fresh off of a stellar 2023-24 campaign that saw him capture the team's Bill Libby Memorial Award for Most Valuable Player. Kempe was the team's leading scorer for the first time in his career, finishing the campaign with a career-high 75 points (28-47=75). The 28-year-old topped the Kings' charts in several additional statistical categories, including assists (47), shorthanded goals (3), and shots on goal (246).

The Kramfors, Sweden native capped the 2023-24 regular season in memorable fashion, scoring in overtime against the Chicago Blackhawks on April 18 on home ice. The marker came 0:06 in the extra frame, erasing the previous franchise mark for fastest goal to start an overtime (Aaron Miller, 00:14 on Dec. 16, 2001, at Anaheim) and tying an NHL record that has been matched five times prior, per NHL PR.





Oh, We've Got Moore

Thousand Oaks, Calif. native **Trevor Moore** scored a career-high 31 goals and 57 points (31-26=57) in 82 games played to lead the Kings in goalscoring last season. Of those 31 tallies, 27 came at even-strength, ranking among the top 15 in the NHL. A veteran of 345 regular season contests, Moore enters the second season of his five-year contract a single assist shy of his 100th career helper. In six NHL seasons, the winger has tallied 175 points (76-99=175) and maintained a plus-21 rating.

In addition to Moore's pacesetter 31 tallies, the Kings finished last year with four other 20-goal scorers (Kevin Fiala – 29; Adrian Kempe – 28; Anze Kopitar – 26; Quinton Byfield – 20) for the second consecutive season. The Kings have not had consecutive seasons with as many 20-goal scorers on the roster since a decade-long stretch from 1982-83 to 1992-93.

The first California-born player to score 30 goals for a California-based team was one of two Kings to score a hattrick during the 2023-24 campaign and tied **Quentin Byfield** for the most multi-goal outings on the team with a total of five apiece. Moore closely followed Kempe's lead in a number of offensive categories for his hometown club this past season, including shorthanded goals (2), game-winning goals (5), and shots (244).

The Kuemp-ire Strikes Back

Acquired via trade with the Washington Capitals for forward **Pierre-Luc Dubois** this past June, goaltender **Darcy Kuemper** will suit up in black and silver for the first time since the 2017-18 campaign. In 19 games played that year, Kuemper posted a 2.10 goals-against-average (GAA), .932 save percentage (SV%), and three shutouts to power the Kings to a 10-1-3 record.

Kuemper returns to Los Angeles for his 14th NHL season, having appeared in 389 regular season games with the Minnesota Wild, LA Kings, Arizona Coyotes, Colorado Avalanche and Washington Capitals. In that span, the Saskatoon, SK, native has been named an NHL All-Star (2019-20), won a World Championship Gold Medal (2020-21), and hoisted the Stanley Cup with Colorado (2021-22).

The 34-year-old netminder has maintained a 2.61 GAA and .914 SV% with 31 shutouts, while assembling a 178-135-46 career record in the regular season. Through 34 career postseason appearances, Kuemper has recorded a 17-10 record with a 2.72 GAA and .908 SV% and two shutouts.

Bigger, Tougher, Meaner.

The Kings' 'new look' for the 2024-25 season will feature several new players donning the recently unveiled logo and uniforms. Forwards **Tanner Jeannot** and **Warren Foegele** join defensemen **Joel Edmundson** and **Kyle Burroughs** as the newest members of a roster replete with a wealth of playoff experience and physicality.

On the first day of free agency, the Kings signed Foegele and Edmundson to three- and four-year contracts, respectively. Foegele, a 28-year-old native of Markham, ON, skated in all 82 games for the Edmonton Oilers last season, setting NHL personal bests in games played, goals (20), assists (21) and points (41). He was one of five Edmonton skaters to hit the 20-goal mark and added three goals and eight points (3-5=8) in 22 Stanley Cup Playoff games, including five (2-3=5) in the 2024 Stanley Cup Finals. Edmundson, a 6-5, 225-pound defender, joins the Kings as a veteran of 530 career NHL games split between the Toronto Maple Leafs, Washington Capitals, Montreal Canadiens, Carolina Hurricanes, and St. Louis Blues, with whom he won a Stanley Cup in 2019.

Days before signing Foegele and Edmundson, the Kings traded for Kyle Burroughs from the San Jose Sharks, adding a 6-0, 193-pound veteran to the defensive corps. Two days later, the team acquired forward Tanner Jeannot from the Tampa Bay Lightning in exchange for a pair of draft picks. The 27-year-old Jeannot enters his sixth NHL season having notched 80 points (42-38=80) in 227 career games. The 6-2, 220-pound forward had a standout rookie campaign in 2021-22, leading all first-year skaters with 24 goals while also recording personal-highs in games played (81), assists (17), points (24-17=41) and game-winning goals (5).

They Grow Up So Fast...

On the heels of impressive individual campaigns with the Ontario Reign in the American Hockey League (AHL), forwards **Samuel Fagemo**, **Akil Thomas**, and **Alex Turcotte** and defenseman **Brandt Clarke** look to graduate to the Kings lineup in 2024-25. Following 2023-24 campaigns split between the AHL and NHL, the three forwards signed contract extensions this past June while Clarke enters the second year of a deal inked the prior summer.

The quartet last played together during the Calder Cup Playoffs this past May. Through eight post-season games, the four skaters combined for 20 points, led by six assists from Clarke.





Fagemo led the AHL with 19 power-play goals, 10 game-winning goals and a 1.24 points-per-game pace (min. GP: 20) as part of a career-best 43 goals and 62 points (43-19=62) in 50 games. The 24-year-old Swede's 43 goals, 19 power-play goals and 10 game-winning goals are also the most scored in each respective category in a single season in Ontario's franchise history. Turcotte, 23, tallied 29 points (10-19=29) in 35 regular-season games with the Reign and scored both his first NHL goal and assist for his first multi-point game in the league on Jan. 31, 2024, in Nashville.

Two months later, Akil Thomas tallied his first career NHL goal in his second career game on April 4 in San Jose. Thomas finished last season with 46 points (22-24=46) in 64 games with the Reign and added four points (3-1=4) in seven games for the Kings. The Toronto, ON, native netted nine game-winning goals to finish second among all AHL skaters, trailing only teammate Samuel Fagemo.

Brandt Clarke had an unparalleled rookie season on the Reign blueline, leading AHL newcomers with 36 assists and closing the campaign with 46 points (10-36=46) in 50 games. Over 16 outings with the Kings, Clarke registered six points (2-4=6), including a highlight-reel overtime game-winner in Boston for his first career NHL goal on Feb. 17, 2024. Clarke represented the Reign at the AHL All-Star Game and was named to the league's All-Rookie Team and Second All-Star Team.

Starting How We Finished (How We Started)

The 2023-24 regular season began and ended on streaks of dominance: first on the road, and then on home ice. Winning 11 straight road games over the first three months of the season, the Kings set a new NHL record for the longest season-opening road win streak (11-0-0), besting the 2006-07 Buffalo Sabres (10-0-0). Their 11-game road-winning streak also established the longest such stretch in franchise history:

The Kings finished the season with a similar run of dominance on home ice. The Kings won nine of their last ten regular season contests at Crypto.com Arena, dating back to March 11, 2024. With eight consecutive victories at home from March 11 through April 13, the team recorded their longest home winning streak since the 2010-11 campaign where they went 8-0-0 from Oct. 12 to Nov. 13, 2010.
