### **GAME NOTES**

### THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the third of three games the Stars will play against the Avalanche this season and the second time that they have played in Colorado this year.
  - o Dallas and Colorado split their first two games, with the Stars winning 5-3 on Nov. 29 and the Avalanche winning 6-3 on Jan. 18.
- The Stars enter today's game with a 42-21-2 record for 86 points and a .662 points percentage. Their point total, points percentage and 42 wins ranked third in the NHL this season entering play Saturday.
- Jamie Benn enters today's game one goal shy of scoring his 400th career goal. When he reaches the milestone, he will become...
  - o The second player in franchise history to score 400 goals, joining Mike Modano (557). 438 of Modano's 557 goals were scored with the Star after the team relocated to Dallas.
  - The second player drafted in 2007 to score 400 goals, with the other being Detroit's Patrick Kane (485).
  - o The 10th active skater to score 400 career goals.
- Cody Ceci enters today's game riding a three-game point streak. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in four consecutive games for the first time since he had a point in five straight games from April 17 to 24, 2021.
  - o In Dallas' last game, the Stars outshot the Jets 12-5 when **Ceci** was on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick. His 62.6 percent Corsi rating in that game topped all skaters from either team.
- Entering play Saturday, the Stars were the only team this season to have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- Entering play Saturday, the Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL this season in both goals for per game (3.38, fourth) and goals against per game (2.60, fifth).
  - o Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 33 of the 65 games that they have played this year.

#### FROM START TO FINNISH

- Prior to the 2025 NHL Trade Deadline, the Stars acquired forward Mikko Rantanen from the Carolina Hurricanes in exchange for forward Logan Stankoven, a 2026 first-round pick, a 2026 third-round pick, a 2027 third-round pick and a 2028 first-round pick. Once the trade was completed, Rantanen signed an eight-year, \$96 million extension with the Stars.
- Today will mark Rantanen's first career game against the Colorado Avalanche. Prior to being traded to Carolina he spent the first 10 years of his career with the Avalanche after being drafted by the team with the 10th-overall pick of the 2010 NHL Draft.
- Rantanen totaled 681 points (287-394-681) in 619 regular-season games with the Avalanche and still ranks in the top 10 in Colorado franchise history in goals (sixth), assists (seventh) and points (seventh).
- Rantanen helped Colorado capture the 2022 Stanley Cup and ranks in the top five in their franchise history in playoff goals (34, tied fourth), assists (67, third) and points (101, fourth).
- Rantanen, who averaged 1.13 points per game in 2024-25 at the time of the trade, was scoring at the highest rate of any player dealt on the NHL trade deadline since Joe Juneau (1.14) in 1994 according to Sportsnet Stats.
- Rantanen scored a goal and added an assist in his first game with Dallas on March 8 at Edmonton, making him the fifth player in the past 10 years to record multiple points in their Stars debut according to NHL Stats. The others are Mason Marchment (2-0-2 on Oct. 13, 2022), Mats Zuccarello (1-1-2 on Feb. 24, 2019), Connor Carrick (0-2-2 on Oct. 4, 2018) and Adam Cracknell (1-1-2 on Oct. 13, 2016).
- Rantanen's goal was also his 250th career power-play point. He became the seventh Finnish player in NHL history to reach the mark according to NHL Stats, behind Teemu Selanne (588), Jari Kurri (395), Kimmo Timonen (332), Saku Koivu (290), Teppo Numminen (274) and Mikko Koivu (251).
- Rantanen scored again in his second game with the Stars, becoming the sixth player in Stars team history to score in each of their first two games with the club according to NHL Stats. He joined Pelle Eklund in 1993-94, Lane MacDermid in 2012-13, Brett Ritchie in 2014-15, Mattias Janmark in 2015-16 and Mason Marchement in 2022-23.
- Entering play Saturday, Rantanen ranked 13th in the NHL in scoring this season with 73 points (29-44-73) in 65 regularseason games with the Colorado Avalanche, Carolina Hurricanes and Stars. His goal, assist and point totals top all Stars skaters this season.
- Rantanen's next goal will be his 30th of the season, which will make him the third Finnish player in NHL history to record five straight 30-goal seasons according to NHL Stats, following Jari Kurri (10 from 1980-81 - 1989-90) and Teemu Selanne (6 from 1995-96 - 2000-01).
- Rantanen has totaled 690 points (291-399-690) in 635 regular-season games. Among Finnish-born players in NHL history, he ranks fourth in goals (291), seventh in points (690) and 10th in assists (399).
  - Rantanen is now one of five Finnish players on Dallas' roster, joining Mikael Granlund, Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz and Esa Lindell.
- Rantanen enters tonight's contest one assist shy of totaling 400 career assists. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 46th active skater and third player from the 2015 draft class (Connor McDavid, Mitch Marner) to record 400 NHL assists.

### **SNOWPLOWS**

- Dallas is 69-68-21 all-time vs. Colorado, including a 26-45-8 mark on the road.
- Jamie Benn has five points (2-3-5) in his last three games against the Avalanche.
- Matt Duchene has 20 points (13-7—20) in 18 career games against Colorado. He enters tonight's game riding a threegame point streak against the Avalanche (2-3-5). Duchene was a member of the Avalanche from 2009-10 until 2017-18, totaling 428 points (178-250-428) in 586 games.
- Jason Robertson has 16 points (7-9-16) in 13 career games against Colorado. Robertson also has totaled nine points (3-6—9) in six career games played at Ball Arena, earning at least one point in all but one of those contests.
- Wyatt Johnston has nine points (2-7-9) in 10 career games against the Avalanche. He enters tonight's contest riding a four-game point streak vs. Colorado, registering eight points (1-7-8) during that span.
- Mikael Granlund has registered four points (0-4-4) in his last four games vs. Colorado. In all, Granlund has 32 points (5-27—32) in 39 career games against the Avalanche.
- Jake Oettinger is 5-3-1 in his career vs. Colorado, posting a .914 save percentage and a 3.05 goals-against average in those games.
- Casey DeSmith is 2-1-1 in his career against the Avalanche, posting a .911 save percentage and a 3.45 goals-against average in those games.

### **ROAD WARRIORS**

- Matt Duchene leads the Stars in road scoring this season, totaling 39 points (14-25—39) in 33 games. His 39 road points were ranked sixth in the NHL this season entering play Saturday.
  - Duchene's 25 road assists this season are already a career high and his 39 road points are the second-most of his 16-year NHL career.

- Mikael Granlund has recorded 37 points (12-25-37) in 37 road games this season, which includes notching seven points (1-6-7) in nine road games with this Stars. Entering play Saturday, he was tied for 10th in the NHL in road scoring this season.
  - Granlund's 25 assists and 37 points on the road this season are already career bests, and his 12 goals scored on the road are tied for the most of his career.
- Duchene's and Granlund's 25 road assists this year were tied for ninth in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- Jason Robertson has been playing at a point-per-game pace on the road since Nov. 17, totaling 25 points (11-14—25) in 25 games played.
- Wyatt Johnston has been playing at a point-per-game pace on the road since Jan. 12, totaling 14 points (6-8-14) in 14 games played.
- Evgenii Dadonov enters tonight's game having tallied an assist in each of Dallas' last four road games. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in five consecutive road games for the first time since he had a point in six straight road games from Jan. 2 to 21, 2020.
- Thoams Harley has seven points (4-3-7) in his last eight games played on the road dating back to Feb. 7. His seven points during that span were tied for the fourth-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Saturday.
- Cody Ceci has five assists in his last five games played on the road.
- Casey DeSmith has won each of the last four games that he has played on the road dating back to Jan. 25, posting a .948 save percentage and a 1.50 goals-against average during that span.

#### **BIKER GANG**

- Thomas Harley scored the team's opening goal in their March 9 against the Canucks and now has 16 points (4-11-16) in his last 15 games played dating back to Jan. 31. His 16 points during that span rank fifth on Dallas' roster.
- Harley's 16 points since Jan. 31 were tied for the second-most during that span among all NHL defensemen entering play Saturday, trailing only Colorado's Cale Makar (19) for the league lead.
- Since Jan. 31 Dallas' first game without Miro Heiskanen Harley has been averaging 25:13 of ice time per game, which tops all Stars skaters and ranked seventh in the NHL entering play Saturday.
  - Harley has logged at least 26 minutes of ice time in seven of those 14 games during that span.
  - Prior to Jan. 31, Harley was averaging 22:27 of ice time per game.
- In all, Harley has totaled 39 points (12-27-39) in 63 regular-season games this season, which would put him on pace to finish the 2024-25 regular season with a career-high 34 assists and 50 points.
  - If he were to maintain this pace, he would become the third Stars defensemen to reach the 50-point mark in the last 18 seasons, joining Miro Heiskanen, who did so in 2022-23 and 2023-24, and John Klingberg, who did so in 2015-16 and 2017-18.
  - His 12 goals this season were the eighth-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Saturday.

### A TALE OF TWO SEASONS

Prior to Dec. 1, the Stars had a 14-8-0 record for 28 points and a 0.636 points percentage. Their 0.636 points percentage was the seventh best mark in the NHL during that span.

- Since Dec. 1, the Stars have posted a 28-13-2 record in 42 games for 58 points and a 0.674 points percentage. The team's win total during that span was tied for the most the NHL entering play Saturday and their point total and points percentage ranked third and fourth, respectively.
- Special teams have also been a point of improvement for the Stars since Dec. 1. Prior to the start of December, the Stars power play was clicking at an 18.6 percent success rate and the team was killing off 81.5 percent of the penalties they took. Since Dec. 1, the Stars have a 25.0 percent and 86.5 percent success rate on the power play and penalty kill,
- Several Stars skaters have also seen significant spikes in their offensive production:

Robertson (seventh) and Johnston (tied 11th) both ranked in the top 15 in the NHL in scoring since Dec. 1 entering play Saturday.

#### JOHNNY B. GOODE

- On March 8, Wyatt Johnston signed a five-year, \$42 million contract extension with the Stars that will begin next season and carry an average annual value (AAV) of \$8.4 million.
- Johnston has 60 points (24-36-60) in 64 games this season, which ranks fourth on the Stars in scoring and makes the 2024-25 season his second-consecutive 60-point season. He's now on pace to finish the year with 76 points, which would be a career high.
- Johnston has also recorded a point in each of the last 14 games he has played at the American Airlines Center, making him the third player in franchise history to have a point in at least 14 consecutive home games according to NHL Stats, joining Mike Modano (16 games; Jan. 31 to April 3, 2000) and Neal Broten (18 games; Oct. 5 to Dec. 14, 1989).
- Johnston scored the third hat trick of his career and his second of the season in Dallas' March 2 game, a 6-3 win over the St. Louis Blues. Johnston tied Steve Payne for the second-most hat tricks in franchise history by a player before turning 22 according to NHL Stats.
- According to NHL Stats, Johnston's hat trick also made him the ninth active player to score at least three career hat tricks before his 22nd birthday.
- All three of Johnston's goals came on the power play, making him the second player this season to score three powerplay goals in a game, joining Patrik Laine who did so on Dec. 17 against the Buffalo Sabres.
  - Johnston's performance against the Blues marked the eighth time in franchise history and first since Philippe Boucher on Nov. 24, 2006 - that a Stars/North Stars skater has scored three power-play goals in a single game.
- Johnston's first goal of the night was the 75th of his career, making him the third players in franchise history to score 75 career goals before turning 22 according to NHL Stats. The others are Bruan Bellows (133 in 311 games played) and Mike Modano (90 in 235 games played).
- His second goal of the night was his 20th of the season, which made him the third player in franchise history to record three 20-goal seasons before the age of 22 according to NHL Stats, joining Brian Bellows (4) and Mike Modano (3).
- Johnston's tallied his 34th assist of the season in Dallas' Feb. 25 game against the Columbus Blue Jackets, which set a career high for the forward.

- Johnston scored his third shorthanded goal of the season in Dallas' Feb. 22 game against the New Jersey Devils. Entering play Saturday, his three shorthanded goals were tied for fifth in the NHL this year.
- The goal was also the sixth shorthanded tally of his career. Since Johnston made his NHL debut, his six shorthanded goals rank second on Dallas' roster (Roope Hintz; 7) and are tied for 10th in the NHL.

#### **POWER UP**

- Since Jan. 1, the Stars have gone 26-for-76 on the power play for a 34.2 percent success rate, which was the secondbest mark in the NHL during that span entering play Saturday (Vegas; 34.3).
- The team's 26 power-play goals since Jan. 1 were also the second-most in the NHL entering play Saturday, trailing only the Detroit Red Wings (30) for the league lead.
- Wyatt Johnston has scored six power-play goals since Jan. 1, which was tied for the third-most in the NHL during that span entering play Saturday.
  - In all this season, Johnston has scored a career-high eight power-play goals, which is five more than he had in both 2022-23 and 2023-24.
- The Stars went a perfect 4-for-4 on the power play in their game on March 2 against the Blues, marking the first time that they have scored four power-play goals in a game since Nov. 12, 2023.
  - o Dallas' game against St. Louis marked one of four instances this year in which a team has scored four powerplay goals in a game. The Ottawa Senators (10/14 vs. LAK), Winnipeg Jets (10/18 vs. SJS) and Florida Panthers (12/5 at PHI) all previously did so.
- Their performance against the Blues also was the first time in Stars team history that the team had a 100 percent success rate on the power play in a single game while scoring at least four power-play goals.

#### **GOALIE GANG**

- Jake Oettinger has an 14-6-1 record in his last 21 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .907 save percentage and a 2.61 goals-against average during that span.
  - o His 14 wins since Dec. 29 were tied for the second-most in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- Oettinger earned his 30th win of the season in Dallas' game on March 6, a 3-2 overtime win over the Calgary Flames. According to NHL Stats, he became the fourth goaltender in Stars/North Stars history with four or more 30-win seasons, joining Marty Turco (6x), Ed Belfour (4x) and Kari Lehtonen (4x). He also joined Turco (6 from 2002-03 to 2008-09) and Belfour (4 from 1997-98 to 2000-01) as the only netminders to do so in four consecutive campaigns with the franchise.
- Oettinger made a season-high 39 saves in Dallas' March 2 game, a 6-3 win over the Blues. The Stars were outshot 42-21 in that game.
- Casey DeSmith has won each of the last six games that he has played dating back to Jan. 25 against the St. Louis Blues, posting a .931 save percentage and a 2.01 goals-against average in those contests.
  - Among netminders that have played at least five games since Jan. 25, DeSmith tied for sixth and ranked seventh in save percentage and goals-against average, respectively, entering play Saturday.
- DeSmith's six-game win streak is the longest such streak of his career and was the longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Saturday. If he were to win the next game that he plays, he would become the seventh goaltender this season to have a win streak of at least seven games.
- In all, Oettinger and DeSmith have combined for a .905 save percentage this season, which was tied for the third-best mark of any team in the NHL this season entering play Saturday. Only Winnipeg (.917) and Tampa Bay (.906) ranked higher.
- The duo's 2.58 goals-against average this season was ranked fourth in the NHL this year entering play Saturday.

#### **KILLING IT**

- The Stars have had an 84.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was the best mark in the NHL this year entering play Saturday.
- No team in the league this season has allowed fewer power-play goals against than the Stars' 26, and their -20 goal differential on the penalty kill this year was tied for the best mark in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- If the Stars maintain this pace, it would make the 2024-25 season their best on the penalty kill since 2007-08, when the team finished the season with an 85.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill.
- The Stars are also one of the least-penalized teams in the league, ranking 30th in the league in total penalty minutes (422) and 29th in penalty minutes per game (6:39) entering play Saturday.
  - Dallas' game on March 8 against the Oilers marked the second time this season that the Stars were not assessed a penalty in a game.
- Entering play Saturday, Esa Lindell was leading all NHL skaters in total shorthanded ice time (217:30) and ranked second in shorthanded ice time per game (3:21) this season.
- Among players that have played at least 100 minutes on the penalty kill this season, Thomas Harley and Sam Steel both ranked in the top five in the NHL in power-play goals against entering play Saturday.
  - o Harley, who has played 104:20 of shorthanded ice time, ranked second with 3.45.
  - Steel ranked third with 3.63. He has totaled 115:40 of shorthanded ice time and is averaging 1:50 of shorthanded ice time per game, both of which top all Dallas forwards this season.

#### **IRON SHARPENS IRON**

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: Jamie Benn (362), Jason Robertson (275), Esa Lindell (235) and Wyatt Johnston (229). Entering play Saturday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on March 15 against the Jets was the 362nd consecutive game that **Benn** played in, which is the fifthlongest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- Robertson's 275-game Iron Man streak is the 10th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 10 entering play Saturday.
- Lindell's 235-game Iron Man streak ranks seventh among all NHL defensemen.
- Johnston's Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

#### ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- Thomas Harley is seven assists shy of tying Gary Sargen (71) for 25th-most assists by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Thomas Harley is two points shy of surpassing Larry Murphy (93) for the 25th-most points by a defenseman in team
- Roope Hintz is four goals shy of tying Danny Grant (176) for 15th-most goals in franchise history.
- Esa Lindell is seven assists shy of tying Stephane Robidas (165) for 10th-most assists by a defenseman in franchise
- Esa Lindell is 14 points shy of tying Lou Nanne (225) for 10th most points by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Jason Robertson is six assists shy of surpassing Miro Heiskanen (225) the 20th-most assists in franchise history.

- Stars forward Matt Duchene was drafted by Colorado with the third pick in the 2009 NHL Draft, he played for Colorado from 2009-10 to 2017-18.
- Stars forward Mikko Rantanen was drafted by the Avalanche with the 10th pick in the 2015 NHL draft. He played for Colorado from 2015-16 to 2024-25.
- Avalanche forward Joel Kiviranta played for the Dallas Stars from 2019-20 until the 2022-23 season.
- Avalanche goaltender Scott Wedgewood played for the Dallas Stars from 2021-22 to 2023-24.
- Avalanche forward Valeri Nichushkin played for the Dallas Stars from 2013-14 to 2015-16 then returned to Dallas for the 2018-19 season.
- Stars defenseman Matt Dumba and Avalanche forward Ross Colton both played for Tampa Bay during the 2023-24
