

SEYMOUR H. KNOX III
Chairman of the Board
and Chief Executive Officer

It's been more a decade since the determination and drive shown by the Knox brothers put Buffalo's first National Hockey League team on the ice, and their ambitions for the team and the community which supports it still remain the same: a first Stanley Cup for Buffalo, and many more to follow.

For the first 12 years of the club's existence, Seymour served as the organization's president. He still remains extremely active as the Sabres' repre-

sentative on the NHL Board of Governors and as a member of its Advisory Committee.

Seymour and his brother Norty went to great lengths to get NHL hockey here, and didn't slow down in the first twelve seasons of the Sabres' existence. Their leadership was the key factor in the successful hockey history the franchise has chalked up.


Formerly a nationally-ranked squash racquets player and ex-president of the United States Squash Racquets Association, Seymour had his hockey career ended as a schoolboy with a football injury. He continued his interest in the game and it paid off in December, 1969, with the grant of the Sabres' franchise. He is a vice president of Kidder, Peabody and Co., Inc., members of the New York Stock Exchange and active as a leader in a variety of community organizations.



NORTHRUP R. KNOX President

During the club's first 12 NHL seasons, Norty served as the organization's vice chairman of the board as well as the Sabres' alternate representative on the NHL Board of Governors. His role with the club changed, though, on May 23, 1982 when the Sabres' Board of Directors elected him as president of the club. He remains the club's alternate representative on the NHL Board of Governors and also serves on a recently-formed public relations committee in the league. Dogged persistence by the Knox broth-

ers and their hockey associates led to the Buffalo Sabres' franchise, and persistence to build toward championship status describes North Knox's life style. He was undefeated world champion in the grueling sport of court tennis for ten years, and captain and number one player on the U.S. Polo team in 1966 and 1969. Norty is also Chairman of the Board of Marine Midland Bank — Western Region.




DAVID G. FORMAN Vice-Chairman of the Board

On May 21, 1982, Dave Forman, who headed Sabres' operations from the organization's formative months through its first 12 seasons, announced he was stepping down from his post of Executive Vice-President. He will, however, remain with the club as the Vice-Chairman of the Board (succeeding Northrup R. Knox) and as a member of the Sabres' Board of Directors Executive Committee as well as co-chairman of the National Hockey League Broadcast Policy Committee.

Dave was named to head the Sabres' operation in early 1970 at the time the Knox brothers were awarded an NHL franchise in Buffalo, and was instrumental in concluding negotiations with the City of Buffalo which resulted in a Memorial Auditorium home for the hockey team.

He also supervised the two-phase expansion of the Auditorium which turned it into the current 16,433 capacity hockey arena and was in charge of other projects which modernized the building, such as the construction of the Aud Club, the Executive boxes, enlarged press box, new dasher boards, and new ice floor.

Responding to a need to provide coverage of Sabres' hockey to a wider community audience, he negotiated the first Sabres' television and radio contracts and formulated a policy which has consistently provided extensive coverage of Sabres' hockey to the hockey fans of the Niagara Frontier.



ROBERT O. SWADOS
Vice President
and Counsel

There are few men who worked long and hard to convince the nation that Buffalo was a big league sports town in the days when there wasn't a big league sports franchise on the Niagara Frontier. Bob Swados was one of those men, and in large part it was his dedication and articulate advocacy for big time sport here that resulted in this becoming one of pro sports premier hotbeds in the past several years.

Former vice president of the Buffalo Bisons Baseball Club and vice president of Major League for Buffalo, Inc., he has been counsel to the Knox brothers since their first NHL application in 1965. He is a senior partner in the law firm of Cohen Swados Wright

Hanifin Bradford & Brett. Bob also was re-elected Secretary of the NHL Board of Governors.




MITCHELL OWEN
Administrative Vice President

Mitch was the key addition when the Sabres announced the first major restructuring of the Niagara Frontier Hockey Corporation in October, 1980.

Since Dave Forman's retirement, many of the day-to-day responsibilities have fallen upon Mitch's shoulders. In addition to his many desk duties, Mitch can often be found out in the Auditorium checking on everything — advertising, security, ticket counts, even Zamboni signs. He also oversees affairs at Sabreland, the skating facility purchased by the Sabres in 1981.

Formerly the Senior Vice President of Healy-Schutte & Comstock Advertising Ltd. in Buffalo, Mitch has been one of the leading advertising executives on the Niagara Frontier for nearly 30 years.

A Colgate University alumnus, Mitch entered the advertising business in 1952 with the Buffalo Evening News. He later worked as an account supervisor with Batten, Barton, Durstine & Osborn Inc. and became Vice President of Comstock Advertising in 1970, moving up to president in 1975.



ROBERT W. PICKEL Vice President/Finance


There is no such thing as an eight-hour day for one of the "original" Sabres. Bob, who joined the club in 1970 and served as comptroller and office manager for ten years before being appointed to his new position in 1980, often spends 10 or more hours a day in his office six and sometimes seven days a week.

Bob was instrumental in computerizing the Sabres' accounting department. He also plays a key role in the operation of Sabreland, Inc. as well as the Sabres' top farm club, the AHL

Rochester Americans, purchased by the Niagara Frontier Hockey Corporation in 1981.

In addition, he has served as chairman of the National Hockey League comptrollers' committee, headed up several league audit committees, and is a member of the Erie County Sports Board. He is also a member of the audit committee for the American Heart Association.

Prior to joining the Sabres, Bob was a senior accountant with Loblaws Inc. for 12 years and comptroller of Boss-Linco Lines Inc. for three years.



WILLIAM SCOTT BOWMAN Director of Hockey Operations, General Manager and Coach

It was because of Scott Bowman's wheeling and dealing that in 1982 the Buffalo Sabres, for the first time in club history, ended up with more than one first round draft pick. On June 9, 1982, the Sabres had three of the first 16 selections and five of the first 30, largely due to Scott's persistence and belief that 1982 was a very good draft year. His 1980 trade for Los Angeles' first round pick (in exchange for Jerry Korab) brought the Sabres 18-year-old de-

fenseman Phil Housley, who is already considered a world class player. The night before the draft, Bowman acquired Calgary's first and second round picks in 1982, a second round pick in 1983 and the right to exchange first round picks in 1983 in exchange for Don Edwards, Richie Dunn and the Sabres second round pick in 1982. With Calgary's first round pick, Bowman selected left winger Paul Cyr, a 52-goal scorer who will be given an excellent opportunity to stick with the Sabres in 1982-83. The Sabres' own selection, 16th overall, was center Dave Andreychuk, who scored 57 goals for Oshawa.

The Sabres will also have two first round selections in 1983. Bowman acquired Los Angeles' choice in exchange for Richard Martin in 1981.

In addition to an outstanding draft, Scott also announced that the Sabres had signed free agent goaltender Bob Sauve, a popular player in Buffalo prior to being traded to Detroit in December, 1981.

One of the NHL's biggest deals in recent years was made by Bowman when the Sabres sent Danny Gare, Jim Schoenfeld and Derek Smith to Detroit for Dale McCourt, Mike Foligno and Brent Peterson on December 2, 1981.

Once again, Scott will handle the bench duties in 1982-83. One of the most successful coaches of all-time, Bowman coached 35 games in 1981-82 (18-10-7) while Associate Coach Jim Roberts took charge in 45 games.

The 49-year-old Montreal native previously held down the dual job of coach and general manager of the St. Louis Blues from 1967 through 1971. During that time, he guided the Blues to three Stanley Cup final appearances.

He has also had a great deal of international coaching experiencing as he served as head coach of Team Canada in the 1981 Canada Cup tournament. Scott was also chief coach of Team Canada, winner of the 1976 Canada Cup tournament and coach of the 1979 NHL All-Stars in the three-game series against the Soviet Union. In 1977, he was named NHL Coach of the Year.

During the off-season, Bowman was one of the featured guests at The International Hockey Experts Coaching Symposium which was held in Turku, Finland in July.

Scott and his wife, Suella, and family live in Suburban Amherst.



JOHN "BUCKY" KANE Assistant to the **General Manager**

The first scout ever hired by the Sabres' organization was promoted to the role of assistant to the general manager prior to the 1981-82 season after holding the dual positions of director of player personnel and scouting for one season.

Though his Christian name is John, he's known throughout the hockey world as "Bucky." A native of Boston and a former employee of the Boston public school system, Bucky joined the Bruins organization under the late Lynn

Patrick in 1950, and worked for two decades with famed Boston scout Harold "Baldy" Cotton.

He came to the Buffalo organization in 1970 and increased his involvement in personnel matters under Scott Bowman to the point where he was named to both posts on the same day. With Bowman returning to the coaching ranks in 1982-83, Bucky will handle many of the early season day-to-day responsibilities of the general manager. He is in charge of evaluating player talent at Buffalo's American Hockey League farm club in Rochester, working as a liason with Bowman's Buffalo staff.



JIM ROBERTS **Associate Coach**

Jim spent almost his entire playing career under Scott Bowman and now he enters his fourth season at the coaching level — all under Bowman. After two seasons as an assistant coach with the Sabres, the 42-year-old Roberts heads into his second season as the associate coach. While Bowman coached the club in 35 regular season games in 1981-82, it was Roberts who was in charge during the other 45 games as well as during a good portion of the club's practices.

Roberts, who retired after the 1977-78 season, is among the NHL's alltime leaders in games played, having appeared in 1,006 games over his 15-year career with Montreal and St. Louis, Jim was a member of five Montreal Canadiens' Stanley Cup winning teams.

When Bowman is behind the bench, Jim will be alongside, serving as the man in the middle of the Sabres' three-man coaching system, receiving and relaying game strategy from the press box to the players. As was the case last season when Bowman was unable to be behind the bench, Roberts will serve as the Sabres' bench boss.

Jim and his wife Judy, and their two daughters. Vicki and Corri, live in Williamsville.



RED BERENSON **Assistant Coach**

Beginning his career with the Buffalo organization in early August, 1982, pointing out that titles aren't that important to him, Red made it clear that he would have plenty of input with the 1982-83 Buffalo Sabres.

Joining the Sabres following Nick Polano's departure to become assistant general manager and head coach in Detroit. Red's coaching qualifications are outstanding.

Red took over the head coaching reins with the St. Louis Blues with 56 games

remaining in the 1979-80 season after serving as a Blues' assistant coach for a year and a half. He posted a 27-20-9 record during the remainder of that season before guiding the Blues to their finest record in history (45-18-17) and was named NHL Coach of the Year in 1980-81.

He was one of the NHL's steadiest centermen during a career which spanned 17 seasons and 987 regular season games. He scored 261 goals and added 397 assists during that career which ended following the 1977-78

Red and his wife Joy, their two daughters, Kelly and Sandy, and two sons. Gordie and Rusty, recently purchased a home in Clarence.

When Scott Bowman claimed Yvon in the NHL Waiver Draft on October 5, 1981, he knew exactly what type of player he was getting. After all, Bowman had coached him from 1973 until the end of the 1979 Stanley Cup championship. The Drummondville, Quebec native enjoyed several outstanding seasons in Montreal with Bowman and his first season with Bowman in Buffalo was no different as Yvon had his best season point-wise, since 1978-79 and the fourth best season of his NHL career. Eye injuries are among the most serious in any sport and on January 30, 1982, Ric nearly had his NHL career ended when his right eye was accidentally struck by a stick. Fortunately, the injury was not as serious as it well could have been, and the 24-year-old returned to the lineup after just 18 games on the sidelines. The recent trend in hockey has been leaning towards high-scoring forwards with little emphasis on defense. However, this former St. Catharines star can play at either end of the rink. UNBALANCED SCHEDULE:

Each of the 21 teams will play an 80 game schedule with those teams in the Smythe, Norris and Adams Divisions having eight games (four home, four away) against each of their Divisional opponents, plus three games against each of the remaining 16 teams in the League. In the case of the three games against the remaining clubs, teams will play two home, one away or vice-versa, alternating the extra home game each year.

The six clubs in the Patrick Division — New Jersey, New York Islanders, New York Rangers, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh and Washington — will play each other seven times with three games against each of the remaining 15 teams. The home-ice differential will be alternated each season.

STANLEY CUP PLAYOFFS:

At the conclusion of the regular schedule, the top four finishers in each of the Divisions will qualify for the Stanley Cup playoffs.

The opening round features divisional playoffs that will have the first place club oppose the fourth-place team and second versus third in a best-of-five series. The winners of each series will advance to a best-of-seven Divisional Final series with the team gaining higher standing during the regular-season holding home-ice advantage.

The four divisional winners will meet in a best-of-seven Conference Championship. The Smythe Division victor will face the Norris Division champion in the Campbell Conference championship, while the Patrick Division victor will oppose the Adams Division winner for the Prince of Wales Conference title. The Conference winners will meet in a best-of-seven series for the Stanley Cup.

Home-ice advantage for the semi-final and final rounds will be alternated each season according to Division and Conference. For the 1982-83 season, the Adams and Smythe Division winners will gain home-ice advantage in the Conference Championships, while the champion of the Campbell Conference will hold home-ice advantage in the Stanley Cup Final.

RADIO AND TELEVISION

Broadcast plans for the Sabres in 1982-83 include:

All games, pre-season, regular season and playoff on a Sabres network whose flagship is Buffalo's WGR (550 AM) which has carried every season of Sabres hockey since the club began in 1970. Rick Jeanneret returns as play-by-play, ex-Sabre Jim Lorentz will be commentator both home and away, and Don Dussias is home intermission host.

Thirty games, 27 away and 3 at home, will be telecast by WGR-TV, (Channel 2) in Buffalo, an increase of 15 games on standard broadcast this season. Ted Darling, the Voice of the Sabres, returns as play-by-play and ex-NHL winger Pat Hannigan will provide commentary. WGR Sports Director Ed Kilgore is host.

On cable television, the Sabres continue to provide one of the league's most extensive coverage schedules. Thirty home games will be on cable, 25 on basic service and 5 on a special subscription channel. Ted Darling is play-by-play here too, with former Sabres captain Gerry Meehan his commentator and long-time Buffalo sportscaster Ralph Hubbell as host.

Selected Sabres telecasts are beamed to the INTELLESET satellite stationed 3 degrees northwest of equatorial orbit and then retransmitted from this point 13,500 miles above the earth's surface to cable systems on Pluto, where they will arrive in 372 light years. Play-by-play and color announcers for the Plutonian re-broadcasts have yet to be announced.

Visiting radio is located in the main press box, and the principal visiting TV booth is located on the face of the same side balcony at center ice. Requests for special needs in broadcast facilities should be made to Paul Wieland at the Buffalo Sabres. The WGR-TV and cable telecast schedules are indicated on the inside back cover.

ACCOMMODATIONS/MEDIA SERVICES

The Sabres press box is located on the west side of Memorial Auditorium suspended from the ceiling. Telecopy transmitting facilities are located in the press box during games, and in the press lounge after games.

The press lounge is located on the west (press box) side of the building between Level Two and Level Three and opens two hours before game time. Food and refreshments are served to accredited members of the media during that time. Refreshments are served in the press box only during the game, and are available afterward in the press lounge, which is also the post game work area for the media.

Application for single game press credentials must be made by 12 p.m. game days to the Sabres public relations office. They will be filled on a space available basis. The press entrance is located on the Pearl St. (west) side of the Auditorium at sidewalk level and entry must be made there in order to receive proper accreditation.

Sabres media identification tags must be displayed for admission to the press box, press lounge and dressing rooms.
