ANAHEIM DUCKS POSTGAME NOTES

The Anaheim Ducks extended their point streak to a season-long four games following a 3-2 in overtime to the Buffalo Sabres Friday night at Honda Center. Anaheim is 3-0-1 it's last four games and has earned points in consecutive home contests (1-0-1) and three of the last four (2-1-1).

DREW HELLESON opened the scoring for the Ducks with his first goal of the season, his second career goal (seventh game).

TREVOR ZEGRAS earned the primary assist for his third helper the last two games (0-3=3) and his fourth point the last four contests (1-3=4, +2).

LEO CARLSSON tallied an assist for his second points in as many games (1-1=2) and four points his last four outings (1-3=4, +3). The assist marked his 40th career point (18-22=40 in 74 GP) to tie Cam Fowler for seventh-fewest game to accomplish the feat. He trails only Paul Kariya (48 GP), Bobby Ryan (54 GP), Trevor Zegras (56 GP), Ryan Getzlaf (58 GP), Steve Rucchin (69 GP) and Mason McTavish (71 GP).

OLEN ZELLWEGER tallied his fifth assist and ninth point (4-5=9 in 17 GP) of the season to match his career high in points (4-5=9 in 18 GP) set in 2023-24 in eight fewer games. He leads Ducks defensemen in scoring and has 2-3=5 points in his last four games.

ISAC LUNDESTROM recorded his third goal of the season at 14:07 of the second period.

ROSS JOHNSTON collected his fourth point on the campaign with an assist (1-3=4).

JOHN GIBSON stopped 29 shots in regulation and overtime and is now 3-0-1 in his four appearances this season.

Tonight's attendance was 13,776. Anaheim will conclude a two-game homestand and open a home-at-home series vs. the Seattle Kraken Monday, Nov. 25 at Honda Center (7 p.m. PT).

BRIAN DUMOULIN

On the game

I thought we played hard. Gibby (John Gibson) made some good saves when we need him too and I mean, I thought we played a good game, especially in the second [and] third.

On the first half of the third period

I think we were pressing them really hard. We were forcing turnovers, creating some extended time which left for them to keep punting it out and not be able to play on every regroup and have fresh guys out there for forechecks. HEAD COACH GREG CRONIN

On the game

It was really a heck of a hockey game. It was fun to watch. I thought our guys played well. First period we were a little bit slow. We didn't have the same snap we had the last few games and I thought the second and third period, we played the way we want to play. It was a fast game, I thought we got on top of them quickly. They're a good team, they have a lot of talent. They've been together for a couple years now. Those young kids are gelling and they're a fun team to watch as well. Their D get up into the play. It was a fun game.

On the need to score more goals

We still got to shoot the puck more. In the first period, I think Leo (Carlsson) had a 2-on-1 and the D shaded towards Killer (Alex Killorn) and he still passed. I think Minty (Pavel Mintyukov) had one in the slot and he didn't shoot it. It's a strange mentality. It's hard to get shots in the slot in the NHL and we have them and we don't shoot them. On the game
