

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****October 26, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [5] vs. NEW YORK RANGERS [1]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames earned a decisive 5–1 win over the New York Rangers on Sunday night at the Scotiabank Saddledome. Nazem Kadri opened the scoring just 1:42 into the game before Kevin Bahl made it 2–0 midway through the first, with New York's Noah Laba responding seconds later. Yegor Sharangovich restored the Flames two-goal lead in the second period, and Blake Coleman sealed the victory in the third with a pair of goals — including a short-handed empty-netter — as Calgary pulled away. Dustin Wolf stood tall in between the pipes, stopping 30 of 31 shots he faced to post a .968 save percentage on the night, while Kadri (1G, 1A) and Mikael Backlund (2A) also registered multi-point nights.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of two meetings this season between the Flames and Maple Leafs. Calgary fell in both matchups with Toronto in 2024-25.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 0-0-1 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 1-0-1 against Eastern Conference opponents.

HUNGRY LIKE THE WOLF:

Dustin Wolf has recorded 39 wins in 78 career NHL starts and is looking to become the third goaltender in Flames history to reach 40 victories in 80 starts or fewer, joining David Rittich (67 GS) and Mike Vernon (68 GS). Wolf turned aside 30 of 31 shots on Sunday against New York and has posted a .922 save percentage along with 2.34 goals-against average over his last three outings.

THE TEXAS TIGER:

Blake Coleman recorded his eighth multi-goal game as a member of the Calgary Flames on Sunday against the New York Rangers. He leads the team with five goals so far in 2025–26, including three over his last two contests. Coleman also tallied his 19th career shorthanded goal, the fifth-most among active NHL players behind Brad Marchand (36), Jordan Staal (21), Jean-Gabriel Pageau (21), and Sebastian Aho (20). His two goals on Sunday improved his goal total against the New York Rangers to nine through his career, tied for his most versus a single franchise (also Detroit and Vegas).

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

With his assist on Blake Coleman's shorthanded goal Monday against New York, Mikael Backlund passed Theo Fleury (13) for the most shorthanded assists in Flames franchise history. The helper also moved Backlund into a tie with Peter Forsberg (32) for the fifth-most shorthanded points by a Swedish player in NHL history.

CALAGRY/TORONTO TIES:

Flames forward Nazem Kadri was selected seventh overall by the Toronto Maple Leafs in the 2009 NHL Draft. He spent his first 10 NHL seasons with Toronto, skating in 561 games and recording 161 goals, 196 assists, and 357 points, along with 387 penalty minutes, before being traded to Colorado.

Maple Leafs defenceman Chris Tanev spent four seasons in Calgary from 2020-21 through 2023-24, appearing in 259 games for the Flames. During his time in Calgary, Tanev led the team with 566 blocked shots and a +73 plus-minus rating while averaging over 20 minutes of ice time per game.

Toronto centre Calle Järnkrok was acquired by the Flames at the 2022 trade deadline, appearing in 17 regular-season games and 12 playoff contests. Maple Leafs Assistant Coach Marc Savard also has Flames ties, having served as an assistant coach in Calgary during the 2023-24 season. As a player, Savard skated four seasons with the Flames from 1999 to 2003, tallying 60 goals and 94 assists for 154 points.

SAM I AM:

Flames forward Sam Honzek registered his first NHL point on Friday night in Winnipeg with an assist on Mikael Backlund's second-period marker. Honzek has appeared in eight games for the Flames so far this season and earned a career-high 15:05 of ice-time on Monday night against the Rangers. He was the Flames first round pick (16th overall) in the 2023 NHL Draft.

ZAYNE TRAIN:

Zayne Parekh recorded his first NHL assist on Friday night in Winnipeg, setting up Nazem Kadri's first-period power play marker. The Flames' first-round pick (9th overall) in the 2024 NHL Draft, Parekh skated in 61 games for the Saginaw Spirit in 2024–25, posting 107 points (33G, 74A) to finish second on the team in scoring. His 107 points ranked fifth in the OHL and led all CHL defencemen, as he became just the fifth blueliner in Canadian Hockey League history to record a 100-point season. Parekh reached the 30-goal mark on March 2 in North Bay, becoming only the second defenceman in OHL/OHA history to record 30 or more goals in back-to-back seasons — joining Bobby Orr (1964–65 and 1965–66). He also made his NHL debut in 2024–25, scoring his first NHL goal.

RAZZLE DAZZLE:

Rasmus Andersson enters play today with two goals on the season, and 49 in his NHL career. With one more tally, Andersson can become the eighth defenceman in Flames franchise history with 50 or more goals, and tie Phil Housley (50) for the seventh-most goals by a defenceman in Flames franchise history.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Flames forward Morgan Frost and Maple Leafs defenceman Conor Timmins were teammates on the Soo Greyhounds of the OHL for two seasons in 2016-17 and 2017-18.

KADRI 1KOUNTDOWN:

Now in his 17th NHL season, Nazem Kadri is closing in on his 1000th NHL game, entering tonight with 995 games played. Drafted 7th overall by the Toronto Maple Leafs in 2009, Kadri made his NHL debut later that season and became a full-time member of the Leafs roster by 2012–13. During his tenure in Toronto, he developed into a consistent scoring threat, posting back-to-back 32-goal seasons in 2016–17 and 2017–18.

In July 2019, Kadri was traded to the Colorado Avalanche, where he elevated his game to another level. His physical edge and clutch scoring became key elements of Colorado’s identity, particularly during their 2022 Stanley Cup run. That year, Kadri recorded a career-best 87 points (28G, 59A) in 71 games and added 15 points in 16 playoff contests, including the overtime winner in Game 4 of the Stanley Cup Final. His determination and timely heroics helped the Avalanche capture their first championship in over two decades.

Kadri joined the Calgary Flames as a free agent, signing in August 2022, immediately taking on a leadership role both on and off the ice. He became an alternate captain and a central figure in the team’s offensive core. In 2024–25, Kadri delivered one of the finest seasons of his career, posting a career-high 35 goals along with 32 assists for 67 points while appearing in all 82 games. His production and compete level earned him the Harley H. Hotchkiss Award as the Flames’ Most Valuable Player.

Through his 995 NHL games, Kadri has amassed 309 goals and 408 assists for 717 points Kadri is in line to become the 41st – active skater in the league to reach the 1000-game marker. He is also looking to become the 13th player to appear in his 1,000th career regular-season game as a member of the franchise:

FLAMES SUMMER 25’ RECAP:

May 3: Re-signed RW Matt Coronato to a seven-year extension. In his third professional season, and his first complete NHL campaign, Coronato set career highs in 77 games played with Calgary in 2024-25. The 22-year-old right winger recorded 47 points from 24 goals and 23 assists, including five powerplay goals and four game winners. He finished third on the Flames in both points and goals, trailing only Nazem Kadri and Jonathan Huberdeau.

May 30: Named Trent Cull assistant coach.

Trent Cull was in his second year as head coach with the Calgary Wranglers at the time of his interim appointment to the Flames on December 22nd, 2024. During his time on the NHL bench, the Flames penalty kill improved from 29th in the league to 15th (December 23rd – April 17th). Before his recall, Cull led the Wranglers to a 20-8-1 record, 41 points and a .707 points percentage (1st in the AHL). As a result, the Wranglers coaching staff were selected to represent the Pacific Division at the 2025 AHL All-Star Game.

June 10: Re-signed RW Adam Klapka to a two-year extension.

Klapka skated in 31 games for the Flames in 2024-25, scoring six goals and four assists for 10 points along with 29 penalty minutes. From April 1st until April 17th, Klapka would record three goals and three assists for six points which ranked sixth on the team during the Flames final nine games. He also averaged a career-high 12:43 of ice time while registering a team-leading 32 hits during the month of April.

Jun. 16: Named Peter Hanlon assistant general manager.

Peter Hanlon began his managerial career with the Toronto Maple Leafs' American League franchise in St. John's, Newfoundland. He was then recruited to work at the AHL head office in Springfield, Mass. before joining the Flames to begin the 1997-98 season. He has international experience having represented Team Canada at the 2002 Olympics, World Championships, and the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.

Jun. 23: Re-signed C Justin Kirkland to a one-year contract extension.

Justin Kirkland skated in 21 games for the Flames in 2024-25, scoring two goals and six assists for eight points before an injury at the end of November sidelined him for the remainder of the season. The 28-year-old scored his first NHL goal this past season on October 13th in Edmonton. He would go 3/4 in shootout attempts in 2024-25 with his 75% success rate in shootouts leading all Flames with at least two attempts.

Jun. 28: Re-signed D Kevin Bahl to a six-year contract extension.

Kevin Bahl skated in 73 games for the Flames in 2024-25, scoring three goals and adding 17 assists for 20 points and 35 penalty minutes. The 25-year-old defender averaged 21:23 of ice time this season which was the third highest total on the Flames. Bahl was originally acquired by Calgary on June 19, 2024 from New Jersey along with a 2025 first-round (Cole Reschny) in exchange for goalie Jacob Markstrom.

Jul. 1: Re-signed D Joel Hanley to a two-year contract extension.

Hanley skated in 53 games with the Flames in 2024-25, scoring two goals and seven assists for nine points. Hanley's 53 games were a career-high and the 34-year-old finished the season with a career-best +12 while averaging 18:35 of ice time.

Jul. 3: Re-signed C Morgan Frost to a two-year contract extension.

Frost was acquired by Calgary from Philadelphia on January 31st, 2025 and would skate in 32 games in a Flames sweater, scoring three goals and nine assists for 12 points. The 26-year-old averaged 16:37 of ice time with the Flames to set a new career high. He was a first round pick (27th overall) by Philadelphia in the 2017 NHL Draft.

Jul. 30: Re-signed C Martin Pospisil to a three-year contract extension.

Martin Pospisil, a native of Zvolen, SVK played 81 games for the Flames in 2024-25, registering a career-best 25 points from four goals and 21 assists along with 84 penalty minutes. Since making his NHL debut during the 2023-24 season, Pospisil has recorded 539 hits to lead all Flames over the past two seasons as well as rank third in the NHL in hits since he entered the league on November 4th, 2023. The 25-year-old was named to Slovakia's preliminary roster for the 2026 Olympic Winter Games in Milano and Cortina, Italy

Sep. 2: Named Dave Lowry assistant coach


Dave Lowry, a native of Sudbury, ON, spent the past three seasons as an assistant coach with the Seattle Kraken from 2022 through 2025. He previously spent time as an assistant coach with the Winnipeg Jets, Los Angeles Kings, and Calgary Flames throughout his NHL coaching tenure. During his playing career, Lowry spent nineteen years in the NHL and amassed over 1,000 NHL games split between the Vancouver Canucks, St. Louis Blues, Florida Panthers, San Jose Sharks, and Calgary Flames. He would captain the Flames from 2000 to 2002.

Sep. 6: Re-signed C Connor Zary to a three-year contract extension.
Connor Zary, a native of Saskatoon, SK, played 54 games for the Flames in 2024-25, scoring 13 goals and 14 assists for 27 points. The 23-year-old has 127 games of NHL experience to his credit, scoring 28 goals and 35 assists for 63 points along with 42 penalty minutes. He was the Flames first round pick (24th overall) in the 2020 NHL Draft.

Sep. 9: Re-signed G Dustin Wolf to a seven-year contract extension.
Dustin Wolf appeared in 53 games for the Flames in 2024-25, posting a 29-16-8 record, with a .910 save-percentage and a 2.64 goals-against average. Wolf's 29 wins led all rookie goaltenders in the NHL last season, while also leading all freshman netminders in saves (1,409), and shutouts (3). Wolf finished the 2024-25 season second in Calder Memorial Trophy voting. His 2024-25 totals also placed him among all NHL goaltenders in save percentage (11th), wins (11th), and goals against average (16th).

Sep. 17: Re-signed C Mikael Backlund to a two-year contract extension.
Mikael Backlund has played his entire 1,076-game NHL career in Calgary and is the longest tenured active skater on the Flames. In 76 games last season, Backlund scored 15 goals and recorded 17 assists for 32 points. He has been one of the top conditioned players on the team throughout his career and ranked in the top three fittest Flames the past four years and finished first in testing last year.

Oct 2. Extended Head Coach Ryan Huska for two more seasons.
Ryan Huska has coached in the Flames organization since the 2014-15 season in which he was appointed head coach of the Flames' American Hockey League affiliate in Adirondack. He would go on to coach the Flames top prospects in Stockton, posting a 135-118-27 record in four years as an AHL bench boss. In 2018, Huska became an assistant coach with the Flames where he spent five seasons before becoming the 24th head coach in Flames franchise history on June 12, 2023. In his two prior seasons as the Flames Head Coach, Huska has led the club to a 79-66-19 record and coming within one point of a playoff appearance in 2024-25.
