PLAYER NOTES

- Oliver Ekman-Larsson scored for the Maple Leafs at 6:46 of the first period, posting his fourth goal of the season. Ekman-Larsson also posted the secondary assist on McMann's goal, recording his 16th assist of the season. Ekman-Larsson extended his current point streak to nine games where he has posted 10 points (3G, 7A). Per NHL Stats, "Ekman-Larsson tied the second-longest point streak by a defenseman in Maple Leafs history." Ekman-Larsson marked his third multi-point game of the season.
- **Easton Cowan** scored for Toronto at 11:06 of the first period, posting his third goal of the season. Cowan has posted four points (2G, 2A) in his last five games.
- **Bobby McMann** scored for the Maple Leafs at 2:24 of the second period, posting his sixth goal of the season. McMann also recorded the secondary assist on Roy's goal, posting his fourth assist of the season. McMann marked his first multi-point game of the season and the 14th multi-point game of his NHL career.
- Dakota Joshua scored for Toronto at 4:53 of the second period, posting his third goal of the season.
- Nicolas Roy scored on a Maple Leafs power play opportunity at 13:58 of the second period, posting his second
 goal of the season. Roy also posted the primary assist on Joshua's goal, recording his fifth assist of the season.
 Roy marked his second multi-point game of the season.
- **Auston Matthews** scored for Toronto at 7:14 of the third period, posting his 10th goal of the season. Matthews also registered the secondary assist on Ekman-Larsson's goal, posting his seventh assist of the season. Matthews has recorded three points in his last two games (1G, 2A).
- **Nicholas Robertson** scored for the Maple Leafs at 13:16 of the third period, posting his sixth goal of the season.
- Matthew Knies recorded the primary assist on Ekman-Larsson's goal and the secondary assist on Matthews' goal, improving to 20 assists posted this season. Per NHL Stats, "Knies became the third Maple Leafs player in the past 15 years to record 20 assists in 22 games or fewer. He joined Mitch Marner (4x, fastest 19 GP in 2020-21) and William Nylander (20 GP in 2025-26)." Knies marked his fifth multi-assist game of the season and his eighth multi-point game of the season. Knies is currently on a three-game point streak where he has posted four points (1G, 3A).
- **William Nylander** posted the primary assist on Cowan's goal, recording his 21st assist of the season. Nylander has posted five points (2G, 3A) in his last three games played.
- Morgan Rielly registered the secondary assist on Cowan's goal and the primary assist on McMann's goal, improving to 16 assists recorded this season. Rielly has recorded three points (1G, 2A) in his last two games. Rielly marked his fourth multi-assist game of the season, his fifth multi-point game of the season and the 100th multi-point game of his NHL career. Per NHL Stats, "Rielly (0-2—2) became the third defenseman in Maple Leafs history to record 100 multi-point games. He joined Borje Salming (175) and Tomas Kaberle (102)."
- **Troy Stecher** posted the secondary assist on Joshua's goal, recording his second assist of the season. Stecher has recorded an assist in back-to-back games (2A).

- **Max Domi** recorded the primary assist on Roy's goal and the primary assist on Matthews' goal, improving to five assists recorded this season. Domi marked his first multi-assist game of the season and his second multi-point game of the season.
- **Dennis Hildeby** stopped 33 of 35 shots he faced in tonight's win.
- Troy Stecher was on the ice for a team-high 16 Toronto shot attempts-for at 5-on-5.
- **Bobby McMann** finished the game with a team-high 5-on-5 shot attempt percentage of 42.31 percent (11 for, 15 against).

TEAM NOTES

- The Maple Leafs were 1-for-3 on the power play and 2-for-3 on the penalty kill tonight.
- Toronto has posted a 3-7-0 record on the road this season.
- The Maple Leafs have posted a 3-2-0 record in the second game of a back-to-back this season.
