PLAYER NOTES

- **John Tavares** scored for the Maple Leafs at 10:37 of the first period and scored his second goal of the game at 7:49 of the second period, improving to 32 goals scored of the season. Tavares posted his seventh multi-goal game of the season. Tavares also recorded the primary assist on McMann's goal and the primary assist on Nylander's second goal of the game, improving to 33 assists recorded this season. Tavares marked his sixth multi-assist game of the season, his 16th multi-point game of the season and the 15th game of his NHL career with four or more points (2G, 2A). Tavares has scored in three-consecutive games (5G) while extending his current point streak to four games where he has posted nine points (5G, 4A).
- William Nylander scored on a Maple Leafs power play opportunity at 15:11 of the first period and scored his second goal of the game at 11:55 of the second period. With his second goal of the game, Nylander posted his 40th goal of the season, tying a single-season NHL career-high in goals which he has marked on three consecutive-occasions. Per NHL Stats, "Nylander became the fourth Maple Leafs player with three consecutive 40-goal seasons. The only other players to do so are Auston Matthews (5 from 2019-20 to 2023-24), Lanny McDonald (3 from 1976-77 to 178-79) and Rick Vaive (3 from 1981-82 to 1983-84). He also became the second Swedish player in NHL history to record three consecutive 40-goal seasons, joining Markus Naslund (3 from 2000-01 to 2002-03)." Nylander recorded his eighth multi-goal game of the season. Nylander also registered the lone assist on Tavares' first goal of the game and the secondary assist on McMann's goal, improving to 37 assists recorded this season. Nylander marked his ninth multi-assist game of the season, his 23rd multi-point game of the season and the third game of his NHL career with four or more points (2G, 2A). Nylander has recorded six points (2G, 4A) in his last three games.
- **Bobby McMann** scored the game-winning goal for the Maple Leafs at 1:45 of the second period, scoring his 20th goal of the season, reaching the 20-goal mark for the first time in his NHL career. McMann also recorded the secondary assist on Nylander's second goal of the game, posting his 13th assist of the season. McMann marked his eighth multi-point game of the season. McMann has recorded four points (2G, 2A) in his last three games.
- David Kämpf scored for the Maple Leafs at 15:08 of the second period, posting his fifth goal of the season.
- Max Domi scored for the Maple Leafs at 11:32 of the third period, posting his seventh goal of the season.
- Matthew Knies registered the primary assist on Nylander's first goal of the game and the secondary assist on Tavares' second goal of the game. With two assists tonight, Knies set a new single-season NHL career-high in assists (previously 20 in 2023-24). Knies marked his second multi-assist game of the season and his eighth multi-point game of the season. Knies has recorded three points (1G, 2A) in his last three games.
- **Auston Matthews** posted the secondary assist on Nylander's first goal of the game, recording his 37th assist of the season. Matthews has recorded three assists in his last two games.

- **Mitch Marner** posted the primary assist on Tavares' second goal of the game, recording his 64th assist of the season. Marner is currently tied for third in the league among assist leaders this season. Marner has recorded three points in his last two games (1G, 2A).
- **Steven Lorentz** posted the secondary assist on Kämpf's goal. With his 10th assist of the season, Lorentz set a new single-season NHL career-high in assists.
- **Jake McCabe** posted the lone assist on Domi's goal, recording his 19th assist of the season. McCabe has registered four assists in his last three games.
- **Anthony Stolarz** stopped 17 of 19 shots he faced in tonight's win.
- Oliver Ekman-Larsson and Simon Benoit were on the ice for a team-high 17 Toronto shot attempts-for at 5-on-5.
- Oliver Ekman-Larsson finished the game with a team-high 5-on-5 shot attempt percentage of 65.38 percent (17 for, 9 against).

TEAM NOTES

- The Maple Leafs were 1-for-1 on the power play and 1-for-1 on the penalty kill tonight.
- Toronto has posted a 23-13-1 record on home ice this season.
- The Maple Leafs have won three-consecutive games on home ice and have won four of their last five games played.
- At 4:41 of the third period, Philadelphia initiated a coach's challenge to determine whether Toronto's goal was a result of goaltender interference. Per the NHL's Situation Room, "Video review determined that Toronto's Mitch Marner entered the crease and made contact with goaltender Samuel Ersson, which impaired his ability to play his position in the crease prior to Morgan Rielly's goal. The decision was made in accordance with Rule 69.1 which states, in part, "Goals should be disallowed only if: (1) an attacking player, either by his positioning or by contact, impairs the goalkeeper's ability to move freely within his crease or defend his goal." Result: Call on the ice is overturned No goal Toronto
