- Seven different Stars skaters recorded a point during the game and six had multi-point outings.
- With the win, Dallas swept the series against Calgary this season for the first time since 2018-19.
- Roope Hintz (4-22—26 in 15 GP) tallied a goal and an assist and now has 26 points since the Four Nations break the
  most among all players over that span according to NHL Stats.
- Jason Robertson (0-2—2) extended his point streak against Calgary to 11 games, tying his longest run versus one franchise (also 11 GP vs. DET).
- Casey DeSmith put up 46 saves, his third-most saves in a single game in his career (most 52 on 4/21/22 vs. BOS and 48 on 12/14/18 vs. BOS).

## **GAME NOTES**

#### THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the second of three games the Stars will play against the Kraken this season and the first of two times they are playing in Seattle this year. Dallas won their previous meeting against Seattle defeating them 2-0 on Oct. 13.
- The Stars enter tonight's game with a 47-21-4 record for 98 points and a .681 points percentage. Their point total, points percentage and 47 wins ranked third in the NHL this season entering play Friday.
- Jamie Benn enters tonight's game one goal shy of scoring his 400th career goal. When he reaches the milestone, he will become...
  - o The second player in franchise history to score 400 goals, joining Mike Modano (557). 438 of Modano's 557 goals were scored with the Star after the team relocated to Dallas.
  - The second player drafted in 2007 to score 400 goals, with the other being Detroit's Patrick Kane (490).
  - o The 10th active skater to score 400 career goals.
- In 17 games since the Four Nations break (since Feb. 22), the Stars have outscored their opponents 21-7 at even strength when Cody Ceci has been on the ice. His plus-14 on-ice even-strength goal differential was tied for the second-best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Friday.
- Entering play Friday, the Stars were the only team this season to have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- Entering play Friday, the Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL this season in goals for per game (3.39, fifth) and in goals against per game (2.57, fourth).
  - o Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 36 of the 72 games that they have played this year.

# **SQUID GAMES**

- Dallas is 8-1-1 all-time vs. Seattle, including a 3-1-0 mark on the road.
- Jamie Benn has recorded 10 points (2-8-10) in 10 career games against the Kraken.
  - Seattle is one of four teams that Benn has averaged at least a point per game against in his career, with the others being Calgary (1.00), Carolina (1.03) and Florida (1.06).
- Evgenii Dadonov has eight points (2-6-8) in 11 career games vs. Seattle. Dadonov has recorded at least a point in all but one game he has played against the Kraken as a member of the Stars.
- Matt Duchene has totaled eight points (6-2-8) in 10 career games against Seattle.
- Roope Hintz has recorded 10 points (5-5-10) in 10 career games against the Kraken.
  - Seattle is one of seven teams that Hintz has averaged at least a point per game against in his career, with the others being Detroit (1.57), Edmonton (1.18), Washington (1.09), Chicago (1.00), New Jersey (1.00) and Los Angeles (1.00).
- Mikko Rantanen enters tonight's contest riding a two-game point streak vs. Seattle, earning four points (2-2-4) in those games. In all, Rantanen had registered nine points (4-5—9) in 11 career games against the Kraken.
- Mikael Granlund enters tonight's matchup riding a five-game point streak against the Kraken, earning seven points during that span (1-6-7). In all, Granlund has 11 points (2-9-11) in 10 career games played against Seattle, averaging over a point per game against them (1.10).
- Wyatt Johnston has six points (4-2-6) in his last six games against Seattle.
- Jason Robertson has 10 points (4-6—10) in 10 career games against the Kraken.
- Jake Oettinger has a 6-1-1 career record against the Kraken, posting a 2.25 goals-against average, .916 save percentage and one shutout in that span.
  - Oettinger's six wins against Seattle are tied for the second-most by any goalie, trailing only Edmonton's Stuart Skinner (eight).

#### **IT TAKES TWO**

- Jake Oettinger has an 18-6-2 record in his last 26 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .911 save percentage and a 2.56 goals-against average during that span.
  - His 18 wins since Dec. 29 were tied for the second-most in the NHL during that span entering play Friday.
- Oettinger made a season-high 41 saves in Dallas' March 26 game, a 4-3 win over the Oilers. The Stars were outshot 44-24 in that game.
- Oettinger made 33 saves for his 12th career shutout in Dallas' March 24 game, a 3-0 win over Minnesota, which tied Jon Casey for the sixth-most shutouts in franchise history.
  - Oettinger saved 5.74 goals above expected in the game according to MoneyPuck.com.
- Oettinger's shutout was also the 12th of his career, which tied teammate Casey DeSmith for the fifth-most by a U.S.born goaltender in NHL history according to NHL Stats.
- The Stars' victory over the Wild was also the 146th win of Oettinger's career, which passed Cesare Maniago (145) for the fourth-most wins by a goaltender in franchise history.
- Oettinger earned his 30th win of the season in Dallas' game on March 6, a 3-2 overtime win over the Calgary Flames. According to NHL Stats, he became the fourth goaltender in Stars/North Stars history with four or more 30-win seasons, joining Marty Turco (6x), Ed Belfour (4x) and Kari Lehtonen (4x). He also joined Turco (6 from 2002-03 to 2008-09) and Belfour (4 from 1997-98 to 2000-01) as the only netminders to do so in four consecutive campaigns with the franchise.
- Casey DeSmith has posted a 7-0-1 record in his last eight games played dating back to Jan. 25 against the St. Louis Blues, posting a .938 save percentage and a 1.98 goals-against average in those contests.
  - Among netminders that have played at least five games since Jan. 25, DeSmith ranked third and eighth, respectively, in the NHL in save percentage and goals-against average.
- DeSmith made 46 saves in Dallas' March 27 game against the Flames, a 5-2 Stars win. His 46 wins were the most by a Dallas netminder this season and the third-most in a single game in DeSmith's career.
- In all, Oettinger and DeSmith have combined for a .909 save percentage this season, which was the second-best mark of any team in the NHL this season entering play Friday. The duo's 2.55 goals-against average this season ranked fourth in the NHL this year entering play Friday.

### R&R&R

- Roope Hintz, Jason Robertson and Mikko Rantanen have played 96:21 together in all situations since Rantanen was acquired from the Hurricanes prior to the NHL Trade Deadline. The line has logged a 53.8 percent Corsi rating together during that span according to Natural Stat Trick.
- According to Natural Sat Trick, when the trio has been on the ice together in all situations, the Stars have outscored their opponents 9-3.
  - During the Stars current road trip, Hintz, Robertson and Rantanen have combined the score five goals.
- The line also plays on the Stars' top power-play unit together along with forward Wyatt Johnston and defenseman Thomas Harley. In the eight games that the unit has played together, the Stars have scored four goals in 19:34 of powerplay ice time according to Natural Stat Trick.

#### WALKING A TIGHT ROOPE

- Roope Hintz enters tonight's game having tallied three consecutive multi-point games he had two assists on March 24 against Minnesota, three assists on March 26 against Edmonton, and one goal and one assist on March 27 against
- It marks the second time this season that Hintz has had at least two points in three straight games, after having four consecutive multi-point games from Feb. 28 to March 6.
- Hintz has totaled 26 points (4-22-26) in 15 games played since the Four Nation Break. His 22 assists and 26 points since Feb. 22 both topped all NHL skaters during that span entering play Friday.
- According to Natural Stat Trick, when Hintz has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play since Feb. 22, the Stars have outscored their opponents 13-6.

#### **BIKER GANG**

- Thomas Harley has 24 points (8-16-24) in his last 22 games played dating back to Jan. 31, which ranks fourth on Dallas' roster during that span.
  - Harley has recorded multi-point efforts in three of the last six games that he has played.
- Harley's 24 points (8-16-24) since Jan. 31 were the second-most during that span among all NHL defensemen entering play Friday, trailing only Colorado's Cale Makar (28). His eight goals since Jan. 31 were also just one shy of Makar for the most among NHL blueliners during that span entering play Friday.
- Since Jan. 31 Dallas' first game without Miro Heiskanen Harley has been averaging 25:22 of ice time per game, which tops all Stars skaters and ranked fifth in the NHL entering play Friday.
  - Prior to Jan. 31, Harley was averaging 22:27 of ice time per game.
  - Harley skated a career-high 31:11 in Dallas' game on March 20 against the Tampa Bay Lightning. It was the highest time on ice total by a Stars skater in a regular-season game since Heiskanen skated 32:01 on April 11, 2021 against the Nashville Predators.
- In all, Harley has totaled 47 points (15-32-47) in 70 regular-season games this season. His goal, assist and point totals from this season all match his career high from last year.
  - His 15 goals this season were tied for the sixth-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Friday.
  - His 15 goals this year are also tied for the eighth-most by a Stars defenseman in a single season in franchise history.
- When Harley has been on the ice during even-strength play this season, the Stars have outscored their opponents 85-50. His plus-35 on-ice even-strength goal differential was the third-best mark in the NHL this season entering play
- Harley recorded the 100th point of his NHL career with an assist in Dallas' March 26 game against the Oilers, making him the third defenseman drafted in 2019 to reach the 100-point milestone, joining Detroit's Moritz Seider and Buffalo's Bowen Byram. He also became the 24th defenseman in franchise history to total 100 points with the Stars.
- Harley's 100th career point came in his 188th career regular-season games, making him the fourth-fastest defenseman in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 career points according to NHL Stats, following John Klingberg (145 GP), Craig Hartsburg (170 GP) and Brad Maxwell (170 GP).
- Harley matched his single-game career high with three points (1-2-3) in Dallas' March 18 game against the Ducks, surpassing Larry Murphy (93) for the 25th-most points by a defenseman in team history.
  - In that game, the Stars outshot the Ducks 15-2 when Harley was on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
- Harley's game-winning goal in Dallas' March 22 game against the Flyers came just nine seconds into overtime, which set a record for the quickest overtime goal in franchise history according to NHL Stats.
- Harley is one of four defensemen this season to score two overtime goals. In total, he has scored five overtime goals since the start of 2023-24, which leads all NHL defensemen and is tied for fourth in the NHL.
- Harley's two-goal performance against the Flyers brought his season total up to 15, matching his career high that he set last season. He is the third defenseman in franchise history to record consecutive 15-goal seasons according to NHL Stats, joining Phillippe Boucher (2 from 2005-06 - 2006-07) and Lou Nanne (1971-72 - 1972-73).

#### **ROAD WARRIORS**

- Matt Duchene leads the Stars in road scoring this season, totaling 42 points (16-26-42) in 36 games. His 42 road points were tied for seventh in the NHL this season entering play Friday.
  - Duchene's 26 road assists this season are already a career high and his 42 road points are the second-most of his 16-year NHL career, four shy of his career high that he set in 2021-22.
- Mikael Granlund has recorded 39 points (13-26-39) in 32 road games this season, which includes notching nine points (2-8-9) in 12 road games with this Stars.
  - Granlund's 13 goals, 26 assists and 39 points on the road this season are already career bests.
- Mikko Rantanen has 39 points (15-24-39) in 36 road games this season, including tallying seven points (3-4-7) in six road games since being acquired by the Stars.

- Rantanen and Granlund were tied for 11th in road scoring this season entering play Friday, and Duchene's and Granlund's 26 road assists this year were tied for 10th.
- Jason Robertson has been playing at a point-per-game pace on the road since Nov. 3, totaling 31 points (15-16—31) in 31 games played.
  - Robertson's 18 road goals this year were tied for seventh in the NHL entering play Friday.
  - Since Jan. 10, Robertson has scored 10 goals on the road, which topped the NHL during that span entering
- Wyatt Johnston has been playing at a point-per-game pace on the road since Jan. 12, totaling 17 points (8-9-17) in 17 games played.
- Roope Hintz has 15 points (2-13—15) in the last 14 games he has played on the road dating back to Jan. 12.
- Thoams Harley has nine points (4-5-9) in his last 11 games played on the road dating back to Feb. 7. His nine road points during that span were tied for the second-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Friday.
  - Harley and Buffalos' Rasmus Dahlin were the only defensemen to score four goals in the road since Feb. 7 entering play Friday.
- Casey DeSmith has won each of the last five games that he has played on the road dating back to Jan. 25, posting a .951 save percentage and a 1.60 goals-against average during that span. His save percentage and goals-against average on the road since Jan. 25 were both the second-best marks in the NHL entering play Friday.

#### **ROBO ON THE GOGO**

- Jason Robertson scored the sixth hat trick of his career (five regular season and one playoffs) in Dallas' March 26 game - a 4-3 win over the Edmonton Oilers - with all three of his goals coming in the second period.
- Robertson's hat trick was the first natural hat trick of his career, making him the sixth player in Stars/North Stars history with one in a single period. He joined Jamie Benn (April 7, 2018), Radek Faksa (Nov. 28, 2017), Tyler Seguin (Dec. 7, 2013), Neal Broten (Nov. 17, 1985) and Bill Goldsworthy (Dec. 11, 1973).
- It marked the second time this season that a Stars skater has scored a natural hat trick, joining Wyatt Johnston who did so on Jan. 28 against the Vegas Golden Knights. 2024-25 is now the second season in franchise history where the Stars/North Stars had multiple natural hat tricks, following 2017-18 (Jamie Benn & Radek Faksa) according to NHL Stats.
- Robertson's first goal of the night was his 30th of the season, making him the sixth player in franchise history with three 30-goal seasons at age 25 or younger according to NHL Stats, following Brian Bellows (5), Mike Modano (4), Steve Payne (4), Tyler Seguin (3) and Dino Ciccarelli (3).
- Robertson's third goal of the contest stood as the game winner as he surpassed Neal Broten (30) for the 10th most game-winning goals in Stars/North Stars history according to NHL Stats.
- Robertson's performance against the Oilers was also his 28th career multi-point game, tying Joe Nieuwendyk and Jere Lehtinen for 10th place on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats.
- Robertson's third goal of the night was his 23rd since Jan. 1, which led the NHL entering play Friday.

## FROM START TO FINNISH

- Prior to the 2025 NHL Trade Deadline, the Stars acquired forward Mikko Rantanen from the Carolina Hurricanes in exchange for forward Logan Stankoven, a 2026 first-round pick, a 2026 third-round pick, a 2027 third-round pick and a 2028 first-round pick. Once the trade was completed, Rantanen signed an eight-year, \$96 million extension with the
- Rantanen, who averaged 1.13 points per game in 2024-25 at the time of the trade, was scoring at the highest rate of any player dealt on the NHL trade deadline since Joe Juneau (1.14) in 1994 according to Sportsnet Stats.
- Rantanen has tallied eight points (3-5-8) in 10 games with the Stars and enters tonight's game riding a three-game point streak.
- Rantanen scored a goal and added an assist in his first game with Dallas on March 8 at Edmonton, making him the fifth player in the past 10 years to record multiple points in their Stars debut according to NHL Stats. The others are Marchment (2-0-2 on Oct. 13, 2022), Mats Zuccarello (1-1-2 on Feb. 24, 2019), Connor Carrick (0-2-2 on Oct. 4, 2018) and Adam Cracknell (1-1-2 on Oct. 13, 2016).
- Rantanen's goal was also his 250th career power-play point. He became the seventh Finnish player in NHL history to reach the mark according to NHL Stats, behind Teemu Selanne (588), Jari Kurri (395), Kimmo Timonen (332), Saku Koivu (290), Teppo Numminen (274) and Mikko Koivu (251).
- Rantanen scored again in his second game with the Stars, becoming the sixth player in Stars team history to score in each of their first two games with the club according to NHL Stats. He joined Pelle Eklund in 1993-94, Lane MacDermid in 2012-13. Brett Ritchie in 2014-15. Mattias Janmark in 2015-16 and Marchement in 2022-23.
- Rantanen tallied the 400th assist of his career in Dallas' game on March 16 against Colorado. He became the 46th active skater and third player from the 2015 draft class (Connor McDavid, Mitch Marner) to record 400 NHL assists.
- Rantanen also became the 10th Finnish player in NHL history to record 400 career assists. He required the third-fewest games (636) to reach the mark behind Jari Kurri (523 GP) and Teemu Selanne (603 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- Rantanen's scored his 30th goal of the season in Dallas' last game, which made him the third Finnish player in NHL history to record five straight 30-goal seasons according to NHL Stats, following Jari Kurri (10 from 1980-81 - 1989-90) and Teemu Selanne (6 from 1995-96 - 2000-01).

- Rantanen enters tonight's contest five points shy of reaching the 700-point plateau. When he reaches the milestone, he will become:
  - The third player from the 2015 draft class to total 700 career points.
  - The seventh Finnish player in NHL history to total 700 career points. 0
  - The 40th active player to total 700 career points.
- Rantanen has totaled 695 points (292-403-695) in 642 regular-season games. Among Finnish-born players in NHL history, he ranks fourth in goals (292), seventh in points (695) and 10th in assists (403).
  - Rantanen is now one of five Finnish players on Dallas' roster, joining Mikael Granlund, Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz and Esa Lindell.

#### A TALE OF TWO SEASONS

- Prior to Dec. 1, the Stars had a 14-8-0 record for 28 points and a 0.636 points percentage. Their 0.636 points percentage was the seventh best mark in the NHL during that span.
- Since Dec. 1, the Stars have posted a 33-13-4 record in 50 games for 70 points and a 0.700 points percentage. The team's win total and point total during that span were the best marks in the NHL entering play Friday and their points percentage ranked second.
- Special teams have also been a point of improvement for the Stars since Dec. 1. Prior to the start of December, the Stars power play was clicking at an 18.6 percent success rate and the team was killing off 81.5 percent of the penalties they took. Since Dec. 1, the Stars have a 24.3 percent and 85.5 percent success rate on the power play and penalty kill, respectively.

#### **KILLING IT**

- The Stars have had an 84.2 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was the second-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Friday.
- No team in the league this season has allowed fewer power-play goals against than the Stars' 31, and their -25 goal differential on the penalty kill this year was tied for the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday.
- If the Stars maintain this pace, it would make the 2024-25 season their best on the penalty kill since 2007-08, when the team finished the season with an 85.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill.
- The Stars are also one of the least-penalized teams in the league, ranking 29th in the league in total penalty minutes (494) and 28th in penalty minutes per game (6:51) entering play Friday.
- Entering play Friday, Esa Lindell was leading all NHL skaters in both total shorthanded ice time (253:16) and shorthanded ice time per game (3:31) this season.

#### **BISCH BETTER HAVE MY MONEY**

- Stars rookie Lian Bichsel has recorded at least four hits in 16 of the 21 games that he has played since being recalled from Texas (AHL) on Jan. 23. In all this season, he is averaging 17.10 hits per 60, which tops the Stars roster and ranked sixth among all NHL rookies this season to play in at least five games entering play Friday.
- Despite only playing in 29 games this season, Bichsel leads all Stars skaters with 122 hits, which is 21 more than the second-ranked played (Jamie Benn; 101). His 122 hits ranked fifth among all NHL rookies this season entering play
- There have been 11 instances of a Stars skater recording at least six hits in a single game this season, with Bichsel owning 10 of them.
- Bichsel is the only rookie this season to have recorded at least six hits in a game 10 times. No other rookie had done it more than four times this season entering play Friday.
- Bichsel is the first Stars skater to have at least six hits in a game 10 times in a single season since Jani Hakanpää did so in 2021-22.
  - If he were to have at least six hits in one more game this season, he would become the first Stars skater to have at least six hits in 11 games since Mark Fistric (16) did so in 2011-12.

# **IRON SHARPENS IRON**

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: Jamie Benn (369), Jason Robertson (282), Esa Lindell (242) and Wyatt Johnston (236). Entering play Friday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on March 27 against the Flames was the 369th consecutive game that Benn played in, which is the fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- Robertson's 282-game Iron Man streak is the ninth-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 10 entering play Friday.
- Lindell's 241-game Iron Man streak ranks seventh among all NHL defensemen.
- Johnston's Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.
