The Washington Capitals hold five picks in the 2025 NHL Draft, which begins on Friday, June 27 and will air on ESPN and ESPN+ at 7 p.m. ET. Rounds 2-7 will take place on Saturday, June 28 and will air on NHL Network and ESPN+ starting at 12 p.m. ET. Last year, the team made eight selections, including right wing Terik Parascak (1st rd., 17th overall) and defenseman Cole Hutson (2nd rd., 43rd overall). CAPITALS DRAFT NOTES

27th Overall – The Capitals' first selection in the 2025 NHL Draft is in the 1st Round, 27th overall. The Capitals hold the 27th overall pick for the fourth time in franchise history. Washington used the 27th pick to select a defenseman in all three previous instances (2008: John Carlson; 2005: Joe Finley; 2004: Jeff Schultz). Notable players selected with the 27th overall pick in NHL history include Joe Nieuwendyk (Calgary, 1985), Scott Mellanby (Philadelphia, 1984), Tie Domi (Toronto, 1988) and Scott Gomez (New Jersey, 1998).

Early and Often – With the 27th and 37th overall picks, the Capitals are poised to make two selections within the first 43 picks for the fourth consecutive draft. The Capitals are one of two teams that qualified for the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs with two top 40 selections in this year's draft (also Montreal: 16th overall & 17th overall).

Acquiring Accolades – Ryan Leonard (8th overall in 2023), Cole Hutson (43rd overall in 2024) and Andrew Cristall (40th overall in 2023) all earned individual accolades during the 2024-25 season. Leonard led the NCAA in goals (30) and became the first NCAA player with back-to-back 30-goal seasons since Cam Atkinson in 2009-10 and 2010-11. The 6'0", 200-pound forward was named Hockey East Player of the Year and was one of three finalists for the Hobey Baker Memorial Award. Hutson, who led all first-year collegiate skaters in assists and points, won the Tim Taylor Award as the NCAA's top rookie and was named the Hockey East Rookie of the Year. In addition, Hutson was named to the NCAA (East) First All-American Team and the Hockey East First All-Star Team. Cristall led the WHL in scoring with 132 points (48g, 84a) in 57 games and was named to the CHL First All-Star Team.

Just Like '08 – The Capitals own the 27th and 93rd overall picks in this years' draft. This is the fourth time the Capitals have held the 27th pick and the seventh time owning the 93rd pick. The last time the Capitals held these two picks in the same draft was in 2008, when they selected defenseman John Carlson (27th overall) and goaltender Braden Holtby (93rd overall). Carlson, who recently completed his 16th season with Washington, is the franchise's all-time leader in games played (1,088), goals (156), assists (569) and points (725) among defensemen. Among all skaters, Carlson ranks third in Capitals history in assists and plus-minus (+100) and fifth in points. Holtby ranks first in franchise history in save percentage (.916) and goals against average (2.53) (min. 150 GP), tied for first in shutouts (35) and second in games played (468) and wins (282). Both Carlson and Holtby were integral members of the 2018 Stanley Cup Championship team.

First Rounders – Excluding last year's first-round pick Terik Parascak, Washington's five most recent first-round picks played games with the Capitals in 2024-25 – Ryan Leonard (2023), Ivan Miroshnichenko (2022), Hendrix Lapierre (2020), Connor McMichael (2019) and Alex Alexeyev (2018). In total, nine Capitals' first-round choices appeared with the team last season (also Alex Ovechkin: 2004; John Carlson: 2008; Tom Wilson: 2012; Jakub Vrana: 2014).

Class of 2019 Breakout – The Capitals selected both Connor McMichael (25th overall) and Aliaksei Protas (91st overall) six years ago at the 2019 NHL Draft in Dallas. McMichael (26g-31a–57p in 82 GP) and Protas (30g-36a–66p in 76 GP) each set career highs in goals, assists and points in 2024-25 and finished the season as top six point producers for the Capitals. In addition, McMichael led the Capitals and ranked tied for 17th in the NHL in five-on-five goals (22), while Protas led Washington and ranked tied for 11th in the League in points at five-on-five (50).

Homegrown – Eleven Capitals draft picks appeared in games with Washington last season (Alex Ovechkin: 1st overall in 2004; John Carlson: 27th overall in 2008; Tom Wilson: 16th overall in 2012; Jakub Vrana: 13th overall in 2014; Alex Alexeyev: 31st overall in 2018; Martin Fehervary: 46th overall in 2018; Connor McMichael: 25th overall in 2019; Aliaksei Protas: 91st overall in 2019; Hendrix Lapierre: 22nd overall in 2020; Ivan Miroshnichenko: 20th overall in 2022; Ryan Leonard: 8th overall in 2023). Capitals draftees accounted for 53.1 percent of the team's goals, 43.6 percent of the team's assists and 47.2 percent of the team's points in 2024-25.

For Country – Six recent Capitals draft selections represented their native countries at the 2025 IIHF World Junior Championship (Ryan Leonard: 8th overall in 2023; Cole Hutson: 43rd overall in 2024; Leon Muggli: 52nd overall in 2024; Eriks Mateiko: 90th overall in 2024; Petr Sikora: 178th overall in 2024; Miroslav Satan: 212th overall in 2024). Leonard and Hutson won the gold medal with Team USA, while Sikora earned a bronze medal with Czechia. Leonard, the U.S. captain, was named tournament MVP and Best Forward after recording 10 points (5g, 5a) in seven games. Hutson, who finished as the tournament leader in points (3g-8a–11p in 7 GP) and plus-minus (+11), became the first defenseman in World Junior Championship history to lead the tournament in scoring outright. Washington's six representatives at the 2025 tournament were tied for the fourth most among NHL teams.

No. 1 Among No. 1s – Alex Ovechkin played in his 1,460th career game on Jan. 28 at Calgary, which moved him past Mike Modano (1,459) for the most games played by a No. 1 overall pick with the team that drafted them. Ovechkin, the NHL's all-time goals leader, has the third-most career points (1,623) among No. 1 overall picks in NHL history (Mario Lemieux: 1,723; Sidney Crosby: 1,687). In addition, he is one of 13 No. 1 overall picks to win the Stanley Cup with their drafted team.

WASHINGTON CAPITALS 2024-25 PROSPECT REPORT

CAM ALLEN | D | GUELPH (OHL)

Allen, the Capitals' fifth-round pick (136 overall) in the 2023 NHL Draft, recorded 45 points (11g, 34a) in 49 games with the Guelph Storm and London Knights (OHL) this season. The Toronto, Ontario native ranked second among Knights defensemen in assists and points, tied for second in goals and fourth in shots on goal (144). Allen, who was traded to London from Guelph on Dec. 17, registered 6 points (3g, 3a) and a plus-11 plus-minus rating in 17 playoff games, helping lead the Knights to the OHL and Memorial Cup championships. The 6'0", 196-pound defensemen registered 116 points (31g, 85a) in 201 career OHL games.

GARIN BJORKLUND | G | SOUTH CAROLINA (ECHL)

Bjorklund, 23, posted a 21-4-3 record with a 2.02 goals-against average, a .927 save percentage and one shutout in 29 games with the South Carolina Stingrays (ECHL) in 2024-25. The 6'2", 190-pound goaltender ranked second in the ECHL in goals-against average and third in save percentage, helping the Stingrays capture the Brabham Cup championship as the ECHL team with the best record in the regular season. The Grande Prairie, Alberta native also made two starts for the Hershey Bears of the American Hockey League (AHL), going 2-0-0 with a 1.49 goals-against average and a .942 save percentage. Bjorklund made his American Hockey League debut with Hershey on March 26, making 26 saves in a 4-1 win at Bridgeport. The Capitals re-signed Bjorklund to a one-year, two-way contract extension on June 2.

RYAN CHESLEY | D | MINNESOTA (NCAA)

Chesley, the Capitals' second-round pick (37th overall) in the 2022 NHL Draft, registered career highs goals (8), assists (12) and points (20) in 40 games during his junior season at the University of Minnesota in 2024-25. Chesley's eight goals ranked second among Golden Gopher defensemen, while his 20 points ranked tied for second. In addition, Chesley led the team in blocked shots (73). Chesley, who was named to the All-Big Ten Honorable Mention Team, helped Minnesota to a share of the Big Ten Hockey Championship and a fifth straight NCAA Tournament appearance. The Mahtomedi, Minnesota native made his professional debut with the Hershey Bears and scored his first career AHL goal on Apr. 6 vs. Hartford. In four AHL games with the Bears, Chesley registered three points (1g, 2a). The Capitals signed Chesley to a three-year, entrylevel contract on May 16.

CHASE CLARK | G | AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE (NCAA)

Clark, 23, posted a 9-14-2 record with a 2.80 goals-against average, a .913 save percentage and one shutout in 25 games during his junior season at American International College (NCAA). The Williamsville, New York native ranked fourth among AHA Conference goaltenders in saves per game (28.6), sixth in save percentage and eighth in goals-against average. Clark stopped 30 or more shots in 12 of his 25 appearances, including a career-high 49-save performance in AIC's 8-2 victory over Army West Point on Jan. 7. Clark will attend Canisius College for the 2025-26 season.

ANDREW CRISTALL | LW | SPOKANE (WHL)

Cristall, the Capitals' second-round pick (40th overall) in the 2023 NHL Draft, won the Bobby Clarke Trophy as the Western Hockey League's top scorer after recording 132 points (48g, 84a) in 57 games with the Kelowna Rockets and Spokane Chiefs. The Vancouver, British Columbia native led the WHL in points per game (2.32) and ranked second in goals, assists and plus-minus (+59). The 20-year-old registered a leagueleading seven games with five or more points during the regular season, including a seven-point performance (3g, 4a) on Jan. 11 vs. Wenatchee, tying a career-high. In 19 playoff games, Cristall scored a league-leading 21 goals, the most by a WHL player in a single postseason since 1999 and tied for third most all-time. In addition, Cristall ranked second in playoff points (41), power-play goals (7) and game-winning goals (3). The 5'10", 180-pound forward was named to the Canadian Hockey League First All-Star Team and the WHL Western Conference First All-Star Team. Cristall concluded his WHL career with 412 points (157g, 255a) in 248 games and became the first WHL player this century to reach the 400-point mark.

PIERRICK DUBE | RW | HERSHEY (AHL)

Dubé recorded 40 points (19g, 21a) in 58 games with Hershey in 2024-25, ranking third among Bears forwards. The 5'9", 172-pound forward ranked first among Bears skaters in shots (175) and third in goals and penalty minutes (44). The 24-year-old also appeared in all eight of Hershey's playoff games, where he registered three points (2g, 1a).

ETHEN FRANK | RW | HERSHEY (AHL)

Frank recorded 28 points (20g, 8a) in 35 games played with Hershey in 2024-25 and ranked fourth among Bears skaters in points-per-game (0.80). The 27-year-old forward was selected to represent Hershey in the AHL All-Star Classic for the third consecutive season but missed the event after being recalled by Washington on Jan. 10. Frank began his NHL career with the Capitals on a three-game point streak, registering an assist in his NHL debut on Jan. 10 vs. Montreal, and scoring his first two career goals on Jan. 11 at Nashville and Jan. 14 at Anaheim. Frank became just the sixth player in franchise history to record a point in each of his first three career games, joining Alex Ovechkin (8 GP in 2005-06), Andre Burakovsky (4 GP in 2014-15), Milan Novy (4 GP in 1982-83), Ryan Walter (4 GP in 1978-79) and Jan Bulis (3 GP in 1997-98). In 24 regular-season game with Washington, Frank recorded seven points (4g, 3a).

ZAC FUNK | RW | SOUTH CAROLINA (ECHL)

Funk, 21, made his AHL debut with Hershey on Oct. 27 vs. Providence and led Bears rookies with four points (2g, 2a) in 15 games played in 2024-25. In addition, Funk played 11 games with South Carolina of the ECHL, where he recorded nine points (3g, 6a). Funk's 0.82 points-pergame ranked fifth among Stingrays skaters.

MITCHELL GIBSON | G | SOUTH CAROLINA (ECHL)

Gibson, the Capitals' fourth-round pick (124th overall) in the 2018 NHL Draft, posted a 12-1-0 record with a 1.75 goals-against average, a .933 save percentage and one shutout in 14 games with the South Carolina in 2024-25. The Phoenixville, Pennsylvania native ranked first in the ECHL in goals-against average and second in save percentage among goaltenders with at least 10 games played. The 6'2", 204-pound goaltender also appeared in one game with Hershey on Oct. 26, making 26 saves in a 6-2 win at Springfield. In 56 career ECHL games with South Carolina, Gibson has posted a record of 34-15-3 with a 2.37 goals-against average, a .907 save percentage and three shutouts.

DAVID GUCCIARDI | D | MICHIGAN STATE (NCAA)

Gucciardi, 22, recorded career highs in goals (6), assists (10), points (16), plus-minus (+21) and shots (88) in 37 games with Michigan State University (NCAA) this season. The 6'1", 200-pound defenseman ranked second on the Spartans in plus-minus, third in blocked shots (39) and tied for first in goals among the team's defensemen. The fourth-year senior helped the Spartans claim its second straight Big Ten Conference Tournament title and earn its second consecutive NCAA Tournament bid. Gucciardi, who signed a two-year entry-level contract on March 31, made his professional debut with Hershey and scored his first career AHL goal on April 5 vs Hartford.

RYAN HOFER | C | HERSHEY (AHL)

Hofer, 23, recorded 26 points (12g, 14a) in 52 games played with the South Carolina Stingrays (ECHL) in 2024-25. Hofer ranked first on the Stingrays in short-handed assists (3), and fourth in penalty minutes (100). The 6'4", 191-pound forward appeared in all seven of South Carolina's playoff games, recording five points (3g, 2a). Hofer's three goals and five points during the Stingray's seven-game first round series ranked second on the team. In addition, Hofer played five games with the Hershey Bears in 2024-25.

COLE HUTSON | D | BOSTON UNIVERSITY (NCAA)

Hutson, the Capitals' second-round pick (43rd overall) in the 2024 NHL Draft, recorded 48 points (14g, 34a) in 39 games during his freshman season at Boston University (NCAA). Hutson led Terriers' defensemen in goals, assists and points, helping BU reach the NCAA National Championship game. Hutson, who led all first-year collegiate skaters in assists and points, won the Tim Taylor Award as the NCAA's top rookie and was named the Hockey East Rookie of the Year. Additionally, Hutson was named to the NCAA (East) First All-American Team and the Hockey East First All-Star Team. The North Barrington, Illinois native helped lead Team USA to a gold medal at the 2025 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he finished as the tournament's leader in points (3g-8a–11p in 7 GP) and plus-minus (+11). With 11 points in seven games, Hutson broke Team USA's single-tournament scoring record for a defenseman and became the first defenseman in World Junior Championship history to lead the tournament in scoring outright.

BRETT HYLAND | LW | UNIVERSITY OF ALBERTA (USPORTS)

Hyland, the Capitals' seventh-round pick (200th overall) in the 2023 NHL Draft, recorded 33 points (13g, 20a) in 21 games with the University of Alberta (U SPORTS) in 2024-25. Hyland ranked second on the team in goals, tied for second in assists and third in points in his first season with the program. Hyland, who added four points (3g, 1a) in six playoff contests, was named to the Canada West All-Rookie Team and the Canada West Second All-Star Team.

VINCENT IORIO | D | HERSHEY (AHL)

lorio, the Capitals' second-round pick (55th overall) in the 2021 NHL Draft, tallied 20 points (5g, 15a) in 67 games with the Hershey Bears in 2024-25. The 6'4", 200-pound defenseman registered single-season career highs in games played, goals and game-winning goals (2) during his third professional season with the Bears. Among Hershey blueliners, lorio ranked third in goals, points and shots on goal (86). The Coquitlam, British Columbia native also appeared in all eight of Hershey's playoff games, registering two assists.

NICHOLAS KEMPF | G | NOTRE DAME (NCAA)

Kempf, 19, posted a 2-10-1 record with a 3.74 goals-against average and a .895 save percentage in 13 games during his freshman season at the University of Notre Dame (NCAA) in 2024-25. Kempf, the Capitals' fourthround pick (114th overall) in the 2024 NHL Draft, made 30 or more saves in six of his 13 appearances, including a career-high 45 saves on March 1 vs. No. 1 Michigan State. In addition, Kempf lifted the Fighting Irish to an eight-round shootout victory over Penn State in his hometown of Chicago as a part of the Frozen Confines series at Wrigley Field on Jan. 3.

ANTOINE KELLER | G | LAUSANNE HC (NL)

Keller, the Capitals' seventh-round pick (206th overall) in the 2023 NHL Draft, posted a 5-5-0 record with a .894 save percentage and one shutout in 13 games played for Lausanne HC of the Swiss National League (NL). The 6'3", 187-pound goaltender also appeared in two games for HC la Chaux-de-Fonds (Swiss-2), where he posted a 2-0-0 record with a .936 save percentage and 1.95 goals-against average. The Dijon, France native also represented France at the 2025 IIHF World Championships, where he stopped 100 of 113 shots against (.897 save percentage) in four appearances. On June 4, the Hershey Bears signed Keller to a one-year American Hockey League contract for the 2025-26 season.

HENDRIX LAPIERRE | C | HERSHEY (AHL)

Lapierre, the Capitals' first-round pick (22nd overall) in the 2020 NHL Draft, recorded an AHL career-high 25 assists and 32 points in 32 games with Hershey this past season. Lapierre ranked first on the team in points-per-game (1.00), tied for third in assists and tied for second in power-play assists (11). Lapierre, who recorded eight points (0g, 8a) in 27 games with the Capitals before being loaned to Hershey on Dec. 29, registered 17 points (4g, 13a) in his first 17 games with the Bears and was named AHL Player of the Week for the week ending Feb. 16. Lapierre, the 2024 Calder Cup Playoffs MVP, appeared in all eight of Hershey's playoff games, registering three assists.

JOAQUIM LEMAY | D | NORTHEASTERN UNIVERSITY (NCAA)

Lemay, the Capitals' fourth-round pick (119th overall) in the 2021 NHL Draft, recorded 12 points (3g, 9a) in 30 games during his junior season at Northeastern University (NCAA). Lemay, who transferred to Northeastern from the University of Nebraska-Omaha, was named the team's Most Improved Player after finishing the season ranked second among Husky defensemen in goals and third in points. The Sainte-Pierre-les-Becquets, Quebec native also ranked 13th among all NCAA skaters in ice time per game (24:48). In 99 career collegiate games at Northeastern and UNO, Lemay has tallied 42 points (10g, 32a).

RYAN LEONARD | RW | BOSTON COLLEGE (NCAA) / CAPITALS (NHL)

Leonard, the Capitals' first-round pick (8th overall) in the 2023 NHL Draft, recorded 49 points (30g, 19a) in 37 games during his sophomore season at Boston College (NCAA). The 6'0", 200-pound forward led the nation in goals and became the first NCAA player with back-to-back 30-goal seasons since Boston College's Cam Atkinson in 2009-10 and 2010-11. In addition, Leonard led the NCAA in game-winning goals (9) and ranked 10th in the country in points. The Amherst, Massachusetts native was named Hockey East Player of the Year, a Hockey East First Team All-Star and was one of three finalists for the Hobey Baker Memorial Award, given to the top NCAA men's ice hockey player in the nation. In January, Leonard led Team USA to its second straight gold medal at the 2025 IIHF World Junior Championship, the United States' first back-to-back World Junior gold medals in the history of the tournament. Leonard, the U.S. captain, was named tournament MVP and Best Forward after recording 10 points (5g, 5a) in seven games. Leonard recorded two primary assists in the gold medal game against Finland to help the Americans overcome a 3-1 deficit en route to a 4-3 overtime win. Leonard, 20, made his NHL debut on April 1 at Boston and scored his first career goal on April 4 vs. Chicago. Leonard appeared in Washington's final nine regular-season contests and in eight playoff games, recording an assist in Game 2 of the First Round vs. Montreal.

ALEX LIMOGES | LW | HERSHEY (AHL)

Limoges, 27, recorded 44 points (17g, 27a) in 53 regular-season games with Hershey in 2024-25. Limoges led Hershey forwards and ranked second on the team in points and assists. The Winchester, Virginia native also ranked first on the Bears in shooting percentage (20.7), tied for first in overtime goals (2), tied for second in power-play goals (7) and fifth in goals. The 6'1", 205-pound forward represented Hershey at the 2025 AHL All-Star Classic, his first career AHL All-Star Game selection. In eight playoff games, Limoges registered six points (1g, 5a), which ranked second on the team.

ERIKS MATEIKO | LW | RIMOUSKI (QMJHL)

Mateiko, the Capitals' third-round pick (90th overall) in the 2024 NHL Draft, split the 2024-25 season between the Saint John Sea Dogs and Rimouski Océanic (QMJHL), recording 41 points (26g, 15a) in 47 games. Mateiko, who was named captain of the Sea Dogs prior to the start of the season, registered 19 points (14g, 5a) with Saint John before being traded to Rimouski on Jan. 6. The 6'5", 207-pound forward recorded 22 points (12g, 10a) in 24 regular-season games with the 2025 Memorial Cup hosts and added 11 points (7g, 4a) in 18 playoff games, helping Rimouski reach the QMJHL Final. Mateiko's seven goals during the QMJHL Playoffs were tied for the third most on his team. At the Memorial Cup, Mateiko scored one goal in three games. In addition, Mateiko served as an alternate captain for Latvia at the 2025 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he registered five goals in five games. Mateiko's five goals ranked tied for fourth at the tournament and were tied for the most among skaters with five or fewer games played. In a preliminary round game vs. Canada on Dec. 27, Mateiko scored a third-period goal and netted the gamedeciding shootout goal in Latvia's 3-2 upset win. On Dec. 30 vs. Germany, Mateiko scored two goals, including the overtime winner, to send Latvia to the quarter-finals. The 19-year-old also scored both goals in Latvia's 3-2 quarterfinal loss to Sweden on Jan. 2.

IVAN MIROSHNICHENKO | LW | HERSHEY (AHL)

Miroshnichenko, 21, set AHL career highs in goals (23), assists (19) and points (42) with Hershey in 2024-25. Miroshnichenko's 23 goals led the Bears, while his 42 points ranked third on the team. The 6'0", 200-pound forward also ranked second on the Bears in shots (146), tied for second in power-play goals (7), tied for third in game-winning goals (4) and fourth in power-play assists (10). During the 2025 Calder Cup Playoffs, Miroshnichenko recorded five points (3g, 2a) in eight games, ranking tied for second on Hershey in goals and tied for third in points. Miroshnichenko, the Capitals' first-round pick (20th overall) in the 2022 NHL Draft, played 18 games with Washington in 2024-25, registering four points (1g, 3a). Miroshnichenko's four points came in his first six games of the season, which included a career-long three-game point streak from Nov. 29 to Dec. 3 (3a). During his 18-game call-up, Miroshnichenko led the Capitals in hits per 60 minutes (9.99).

LEON MUGGLI | D | EV ZUG (NL)

Muggli, the Capitals' second round pick (52nd overall) in the 2024 NHL Draft, recoded 11 points (5g, 6a) in 40 games with EV Zug of the Swiss National League (NL). Muggli ranked first among EV Zug defensemen in penalty minutes (43) and third in goals. The 6'1", 176-pound defenseman also appeared in four playoff games for EV Zug. In addition, Muggli represented Switzerland at the 2025 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he recorded three assists in five games. Muggli, 18, was reassigned to Hershey on April 5 and made his AHL debut with the Bears on April 12 at Lehigh Valley.

TERIK PARASCAK | RW | PRINCE GEORGE (WHL)

Parascak, the Capitals' first-round pick (17th overall) in the 2024 NHL Draft, recorded 82 points (28g, 54a) in 59 regular-season games with the Prince George Cougars (WHL) in 2024-25. The 6'0", 180-pound forward ranked second on Prince George in points, assists, and points-per-game (1.39). In addition, Parascak ranked tied for second on his team in gamewinning goals (4), third in power-play goals (6), fourth in goals and shots (168) and fifth in plus-minus (+16). Parascak led the Cougars in scoring in the WHL Playoffs, recording 10 points (4g, 6a) in seven games during the team's first round series against Portland. The Lethbridge, Alberta native registered three points (2g, 1a) in Game 1 on March 28, including the game-winning goal in overtime. Parascak, 19, made his professional debut with Hershey on April 19 vs. Lehigh Valley.

LUDWIG PERSSON | LW | JUKURIT (LIIGA)

Persson, the Capitals' third-round pick (85th overall) in the 2022 NHL Draft, recorded 16 points (4g, 12a) in 52 games played with Jukurit of Liiga (Finland-1) in 2024-25. The Gothenburg, Sweden native ranked second on the team in scoring among players age 21 and younger. The 6'0", 186-pound forward made his AHL debut and recorded his first career AHL point (1a) with Hershey on April 19 vs. Lehigh Valley.

LUKE PHILP | C | HERSHEY (AHL)

Philp, signed by the Capitals as a free agent on July 2, 2024, recorded 30 points (10g, 20a) in 58 games during his first season with Hershey. The Canmore, Alberta native ranked tied for eighth on Hershey in goals and power-play assists (5) and tied for ninth in assists. Philp added four points (1g, 3a) in eight playoff games, which ranked tied for fifth on the team.

Priskie, 29, established single-season career highs in goals (12) and points (35) during his sixth professional season in 2024-25. The Pembroke Pines, Florida native ranked third among all AHL blueliners in power-play goals (9) and tied for seventh in goals. Priskie led Hershey defensemen in goals, power-play goals and shots (116), while his 23 assists and 35 points ranked second. In eight Calder Cup Playoff games, Priskie led Bears defensemen in goals (2) and points (5) and ranked second in assists (3).

ILYA PROTAS | LW | WINDSOR (OHL)

Protas, the Capitals' third-round pick (75th overall) in the 2024 NHL Draft, ranked second in the OHL in points (124), assists (74) and plus-minus rating (+58) in 2024-25. The 6'5", 200-pound forward also ranked third in the OHL in goals (50) and game-winning goals (8). Protas became the first player since Alex DeBrincat in 2014-15 to score 50 goals in his first OHL season, while his 2.03 points-per-game rate was the highest by a Windsor Spitfires player over a full season since Jason Spezza (2.09) in 2000-01. In addition, the Vitebsk, Belarus native led Windsor in power-play goals (15), power-play assists (23) and shorthanded assists (3). Protas added 25 points (5g, 20a) in 12 postseason games, which led all skaters through the first two rounds of the OHL Playoffs. Protas was the recipient of the William Hanley Trophy, presented annually to the League's Most Sportsmanlike Player as voted by OHL General Managers, and named to the OHL Second All-Star Team.

HENRIK RYBINSKI | RW | HERSHEY (AHL)

Rybinski, 23, established AHL career highs in goals (10), assists (25), points (35) and games played (60) in his third AHL season, nearly doubling his previous career high in points (2022-23: 18p in 51 GP). The Vancouver, British Columbia native ranked tied for third on Hershey in assists, fourth in plus-minus (+11) and third in shooting percentage (16.4). The 6'2", 187-pound forward registered one assist in three playoff games.

MIROSLAV SATAN | C | OMAHA (USHL)

Satan, the Capitals' seventh-round pick (212th overall) in the 2024 NHL Draft, recorded four points (3g, 1a) in 45 games played with the Sioux Falls Stampede and Omaha Lacers of the USHL in 2024-25. Satan also represented Slovakia at the 2025 IIHF World Junior Championship, appearing in three games.

HUNTER SHEPARD | G | HERSHEY (AHL)

Shepard, 29, posted a 23-11-4 record with a 2.80 goals-against average, a .891 save percentage and three shutouts in 39 games with Hershey in 2024-25. Shepard posted an AHL-leading 1.000 shootout save percentage, while his 23 wins ranked sixth among all goaltenders. The 6'0", 225-pound netminder started seven of Hershey's eight playoff games, posting a 2.77 goals-against average, .893 save percentage and one shutout. The Cohasset, Minnesota native also appeared in one game for Washington on April 12 at Columbus.

PETR SIKORA | LW | HC OCELARI TRINEC (EXTRALIGA)

Sikora, the Capitals' sixth-round pick (178th overall) in the 2024 NHL Draft, recorded 15 points (7g, 8a) in 34 games with HC Ocelari Trinec of the Czech Extraliga (Czechia-1). The 6'0", 185-pound forward also registered five points (2g, 3a) in two games with HC Ocelari Trinec's U-20 team (Czechia-Jr.). The 19-year-old won the bronze medal with Czechia at the 2025 IIHF World Junior Championship and was named a top three player on his team. In seven games played, Sikora finished the tournament with seven points (4g, 3a), which ranked tied for 13th among all skaters, while his +10 plus-minus rating ranked tied for second. On Jan. 2, Sikora recorded an assist on the game-winning goal to eliminate Canada in the quarter-finals.

SPENCER SMALLMAN | LW | HERSHEY (AHL)

Smallman, 28, recorded 34 points (10g, 24a) in 62 regular-season games with Hershey. Smallman, who completed his first season with the Bears, ranked tied for fifth on the team in assists and eighth in points. Smallman's 24 assists and 34 points were both single-season AHL career highs. In addition, Smallman appeared in all eight of Hershey's playoff games, registering four points (2g, 2a). The Capitals re-signed Smallman to a two-year, two-way contract on April 1.

CLAY STEVENSON | G | HERSHEY (AHL)

Stevenson, 26, posted an 18-8-5 record with a 2.94 goals-against average, a .888 save percentage and two shutouts in 33 games with Hershey in 2024-25. Stevenson's 18 wins ranked fourth in the AHL among netminders with less than 35 games played. The Drayton Valley, Alberta native also played one playoff game for the Bears on May 9, making 28 saves in a 6-4 win at Lehigh Valley. The 6'4", 194-pound goaltender made his NHL debut on April 17 at Pittsburgh, where he made 33 saves.

RILEY SUTTER | RW | HERSHEY (AHL)

Sutter, 25, recorded nine points (4g, 5a) in 55 regular-season games with Hershey in 2024-25. The 6'4", 209-pound forward added three points (2g, 1a) in eight postseason contests, including the game-winning goal in Hershey's series-clinching Game 5 win over Leigh Valley in the Atlantic Division Semifinals.

ALEXANDER SUZDALEV | LW | SOUTH CAROLINA (ECHL)

Suzdalev, the Capitals' third-round pick (70th overall) in the 2022 NHL Draft, recorded 39 points (15g, 24a) in 50 games during his first full professional season with the South Carolina Stingrays (ECHL). Suzdalev's 39 points were the most among Stingrays skaters age 21 or younger, while his 15 goals ranked seventh on the team. Suzdalev also ranked tied for sixth on South Carolina in power-play assists (8). The 6'2", 180-pound forward added four points (2g, 2a) in seven playoff games, which tied for the third most points on the team. In addition, Suzdalev scored the gamewinning goal in overtime of Game 2 of the South Division Semifinals vs. Orlando. Suzdalev also appeared in three games with Hershey in 2024-25, making his AHL debut on Oct. 26 at Springfield.

PATRICK THOMAS | C | BRANTFORD (OHL)

Thomas, the Capitals' fourth-round pick (104th overall) in the 2023 NHL Draft, recorded a career-high 104 points (27g, 77a) in 66 games with the Brantford Bulldogs (OHL) in 2024-25. The 6'0", 176-pound forward finished the regular season as the OHL's assists leader and ranked sixth in the OHL in points. Thomas, Brantford's captain, also ranked first on his team in faceoff percentage (52.8), second in power-play goals (15) and game-winning goals (7) and fourth in plus-minus (+16). The Oakville, Ontario native recorded a 10-game point streak from Feb. 7 to March 1, registering 25 points (4g, 21a) in that span. In 11 OHL Playoff games, Thomas recorded 13 points (3g, 10a) and a team-high 10 assists. The Capitals signed Thomas to a three-year entry-level contract on April 9.

BOGDAN TRINEYEV | RW | HERSHEY (AHL)

Trineyev, the Capitals' fourth-round pick (117th overall) in the 2020 NHL Draft, recorded AHL career-highs in goals (14), assists (8) and points (22) with Hershey in 2024-25. The 6'3", 200-pound forward ranked third on the Bears in plus-minus rating (+13) and fifth in shots (109). The Voronezh, Russia native led the Bears in playoff points (7), goals (5) and plus-minus (+5) during the 2025 Calder Cup Playoffs.
