**All-Time Wild Record:** 5-2-0 (2-1-0 at Xcel Energy Center, 3-1-0 at Seattle)

**2023-24:** Minnesota won the series-opening game, 3-0, at Climate Pledge Arena in Seattle (12/10)...LW **Matt Boldy** (1-0=1), C **Marco Rossi** (1-0=1) and C **Joel Eriksson Ek** (1-0=1) scored for the Wild...G **Filip Gustavsson** saved all 24 shots faced to earn the shutout win for Minnesota...G **Joey Daccord** stopped 23-of-25 shots faced for the Kraken.

**WILD LEADERS:** LW **Kirill Kaprizov** (1-6=7 in six games) and C **Ryan Hartman** (3-4=7 in five games) lead Minnesota with seven career points each against Seattle...Eriksson Ek owns six points (3-3=6) in seven games...Boldy has five points (4-1=5) in five games...LW **Marcus Johansson** (1-3=4 in four games) and RW **Mats Zuccarello** (2-2=4 in six games) each have four points.

**WILD GOALIES:** G **Marc-Andre Fleury** is 4-1-1 with a 1.97 GAA, a .935 SV% and one shutout in six career starts vs. the Kraken...Gustavsson shut out the Kraken in his lone start against Seattle (12/10/23).

**KRAKEN LEADERS:** C **Jaden Schwartz** leads the Kraken with 28 points (14-14=28) in 41 career contests vs. Minnesota...RW **Jordan Eberle** has 23 points (7-16=23) in 38 games...LW **Andre Burakovsky** owns 16 points (4-12=16) in 25 contests...LW **Tomas Tartar** (7-3=10 in 19 games) and C **Alex Wennberg** (5-5=10 in 18 games) each own 10 points against Minnesota.

**KRAKEN GOALIES:** G **Philipp Grubauer** is 9-7-0 with a 3.00 GAA, a .892 SV% and one shutout in 16 career games (15 starts) against the Wild...Daccord is 0-1-0 with a 2.09 GAA and a .920 SV% in one career start against the Wild (12/10/23).

**CONNECTIONS:** LW **Marcus Johansson** recorded 23 points (6-17=23) in 51 games with Seattle in 2021-22...D **Will Borgen** hails from Moorhead and skated in four seasons at St. Cloud State University (2015-18)...Kraken television analyst **J.T. Brown** recorded eight points (3-5=8) in 56 games with Minnesota in 2018-19.

**FAST FACTS:** Minnesota is 5-1-0 in its last six games against Seattle, outscoring the Kraken 19-10.

**Team:** Is 10-4-1 since Jan. 15th. During that span Minnesota ranks second in the NHL with 4.00 goals per game and 60 total goals, fourth with a 32.2 PP%, T-4th with a plus-13 goal differential and T-5th with a .700 point percentage...Set a franchise record with 10 goals vs. VAN (2/19)...Set a franchise record with seven third-period goals vs. VAN (2/19).

**Matt Boldy:** T-6th in the NHL with 21 goals scored since Nov. 28...Has 13 points (6-7=13) in his last eight games...Tied a career-high with four points (1-3=4) vs. VAN (2/19).

**Declan Chisholm:** Has three points (1-2=3) in four games played for Minnesota since 2/17...Scored the first goal of his NHL career while making his Wild debut vs. BUF (2/17)...Skated a career-high 20:35 of TOI at EDM (2/23).

**Connor Dewar:** Posted a career-high six hits in consecutive games vs. VAN (2/19) and at WPG (2/20).

**Brandon Duhaime:** Posted a career-high eight hits at WPG (2/20).

**Joel Eriksson Ek:** Leads Minnesota with 12 PPGs and a career-high 28 goals this season...Owns an active seven-game point streak (7-7=14), tied for his career long...Ranks T-5th in the NHL in PPGs and 10th with 208 shots on goal this season...Posted his second career hat trick vs. VAN (2/19) and finished with a career-high six points (3-3=6), which tied the single-game franchise record...Posted a career-long four-game goal streak (7-4=11) from 2/12 to 2/19...Has 28 points (13-15=28) in his last 20 games.

**Brock Faber:** Leads all NHL rookies with 25:10 TOI per game, 114 blocked shots and 29 assists, and is T-2nd with 33 points (4-29=33)...Seventh among all NHL skaters in TOI/game.

**Filip Gustavsson:** Played in his 100th career NHL game at EDM (2/23)...Is 5-0-0 in his last five road games with a 2.45 GAA and a .932 SV%.

**Jake Lucchini:** Posted his first NHL assist vs. VAN (2/19).

**Kirill Kaprizov:** Leads Minnesota with 60 points (24-36=60) this season...With two points (1-1=2) at WPG (2/20), recorded his 79th career multi-point game and tied Zach Parise for third-most in franchise history...Posted his fourth career hat trick vs. VAN (2/19) and finished with a career-high six points (3-3=6), which tied the single-game franchise record...Tied the franchise record for points in a period with a 3-1=4 line in the third period vs. VAN (2/19)...Also tied the franchise record for single-period goals vs. VAN (2/19)...Owns an active seven-game point streak (5-10=15) and has 36 points (16-20=36) and a plus-12 rating in his last 22 games played.

**Marco Rossi:** Among NHL rookies is T-1st in goals (17) and GWG (two), T-2nd in points (17-16=33), and fourth in shots on goal (108).

**Mats Zuccarello:** Tied a career high with four points (1-3=4) vs. VAN (2/19)...Second on the Wild with 35 assists this season.

## HEAD COACH JOHN HYNES



John Hynes was named Head Coach of the Minnesota Wild on Nov. 27, 2023. Bringing eight seasons of NHL head coaching experience to the start of his Wild tenure, Hynes owns a career record of 306-269-65 (.529) in 670 regular season games with Minnesota, the Nashville Predators and New Jersey Devils.

Hynes, 48, most recently served as Head Coach of the Nashville Predators for parts of four seasons (2020-23). He was named Head Coach of the Predators on Jan. 7, 2020, and recorded a 134-96-18 record in 248 games (.576) while qualifying for the Stanley Cup Playoffs three consecutive seasons (2020-22). Prior to his time with the Predators, Hynes spent four-plus seasons as Head Coach of the New Jersey Devils and went 150-159-45 in 354 games (2015-19).

Before his time in New Jersey, Hynes spent six seasons with the Wilkes-Barre Penguins in the American Hockey League, including five seasons as Head Coach (2010-15) and one season as Assistant Coach (2009-10). He led Wilkes-Barre to a record of 231-126-27 in 384 games (.636) and five consecutive appearances in the Calder Cup Playoffs while helping the team allow the fewest goals in the AHL in four of his five seasons. Hynes received the Louis A. R. Pieri Memorial Award, annually awarded to the AHL's most outstanding head coach, at the conclusion of the 2010-11 season.

In between assistant coaching positions at Mass-Lowell (2000-01) and the University of Wisconsin (2002-03), Hynes spent nine seasons on the coaching staff of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program, serving as an Assistant Coach (1998-2000, 2001-02) and Head Coach (2003-09). Team USA claimed four medals during his time with the National Team Development Program at the IIHF World Under-18 Championships, including gold medals in 2002 and 2006.

The native of Warwick, R.I., has also served as an Assistant Coach for Team USA at the 2004 IIHF World Junior Championship, where the Americans won gold for the first time and earned their first medal in the event since 1997. Hynes was also Head Coach of Team USA at the 2016 IIHF World Championship, an Assistant Coach at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey and an Assistant Coach at the 2019 IIHF World Championship.

He played forward at Boston University (1993-97) and helped the Terriers advance to four consecutive Frozen Four appearances and win the 1995 NCAA championship. Hynes was inducted into the Rhode Island Hockey Hall of Fame on August 23, 2023.

He and his wife, Sarah, have three daughters, Sophia, Julia and Anna.

# TEAM NOTES



## GETTING WARMER

- Is 10-4-1 since Jan. 15th. During that span Minnesota ranks second in the NHL with 4.00 goals per game and 60 total goals, fourth with a 32.2 PP%, T-4th with a plus-13 goal differential and T-5th with a .700 point percentage
- Posted a six-game point streak from 2/7 to 2/19 and won five consecutive road contests from 1/19 to 2/14.

## KEEB-LER COOKIES

- The line of Kirill Kaprizov, Joel Eriksson Ek and Matt Boldy has combined for 17 goals, 24 assists and 41 points in seven games since 2/7 at CHI.
- Since Feb. 7, Kaprizov (5-10=15) ranks fifth in the NHL in points, while Eriksson Ek (7-7=14) ranks T-5th and Boldy (6-7=13) T-7th.

## OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION VS. CANUCKS

- Minnesota set a new single-game franchise record for goals scored in a 10-7 win vs. VAN (2/19).
- Minnesota's seven third-period goals vs. Vancouver marked a franchise record for goals scored in a single period. Per #NHLStats, the last time a team scored more goals in a period was Feb. 3, 1999, when the Capitals put up eight in the second frame against the Lightning.
- The Wild scored six third-period goals in a span of 5:45 vs. Vancouver, a franchise record and the fourth-fastest six-goal spree in NHL history.
- The Wild overcame a three-goal deficit to win in regulation for the third time in franchise history vs. Vancouver.
- Minnesota's 37.0 shooting percentage vs. Vancouver (10 goals on 27 shots) marked the best single-game shooting percentage by a team with 25-plus shots on goal since the start of the the 2000-01 NHL season.
- The Wild scored three 5-on-3 goals against the Canucks, tying the single-game NHL record since the league began tracking power-play time in 2009-10.

- Minnesota leads the NHL with 0.50 rookie points scored per game played (min. 40 games played by rookies).

# PLAYER NOTES

## KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** leads Minnesota with 60 points (24-36=60), assists and six GWG this season while ranking second in goals and PPGs (nine).
- Owns an active seven-game point streak (5-10=15) and has 36 points (16-20=36) and a plus-12 rating in his last 22 games played.
- With two points (1-1=2) at WPG (2/20), Kaprizov recorded his 79th career multi-point game and tied Zach Parise for third-most in franchise history.
- Kaprizov posted his fourth career regular-season hat trick vs. VAN (2/19) and finished with a career-high six points (3-3=6), which tied the single-game franchise record.
- With a 3-1=4 line in the third period vs. VAN (2/19), Kaprizov also tied the franchise records for single-period goals and single-period points.
- Became the first player in franchise history to reach 50 points in four consecutive seasons with an assist at ARI (2/14).
- With a goal vs. PIT (2/9), Kaprizov reached 20 for the season and became the first player in franchise to record four consecutive 20-goal seasons with the club.
- Kaprizov received his third NHL All-Star honor on 1/4/24, becoming the second player in franchise history to be selected to three All-Star games and first to do so in three consecutive seasons.
- Was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending Jan. 21 after ranking T-1st in the NHL in scoring (4-4=8) and goals in four games.
- Notched his third career regular-season hat trick (3-0=3) at CAR (1/21).
- Scored his 133rd career goal vs. ANA (1/27) to move past Jason Zucker (132 goals with MIN) for sole possession of fourth on the franchise's all-time goal scoring list.
- Currently with 22 career multi-goal games, Kaprizov registered the 19th multi-goal game of his NHL career at BOS (12/19), moving past Eric Staal and Mikko Koivu (each with 18 multi-goal games) for third-most in franchise history.
- Currently with 48 career PPGs, Kaprizov scored the 40th PPG of his career at MTL (10/17) to become the fifth player in franchise history to reach 40 career PPGs. He joined Zach Parise (69), Mikko Koivu (60), Marian Gaborik (59) and Andrew Brunette (55).
- Kaprizov recorded the 26th three-point game of his career vs. VAN (2/19, 3-3=6). Only two players have more such games in a Wild sweater (Mikko Koivu, 34 and Marian Gaborik, 29).

## STONE-COLD KIRILL-ER

- Kaprizov's game-winning goal in overtime vs. MTL (12/21) marked the eighth of his NHL career, furthering his franchise record. The total is tied for third-most in the league since the start of the 2020-21 season.

## CROWN JOEL

- **Joel Eriksson Ek** leads Minnesota with 12 PPGs and a career-high 28 goals this season while ranking second with four GWG.
- Eriksson Ek ranks T-5th in the NHL in PPGs and 10th with 208 shots on goal this season.
- Eriksson Ek owns an active seven-game point streak (7-7=14), tied for his career-long, and posted a career-long four-game goal streak (7-4=11) from 2/12 to 2/19. He has 28 points (13-15=28) in his last 20 games.
- The Swede posted his second career hat trick vs. VAN (2/19) and finished with a career-high six points (3-3=6), which tied the single-game franchise record. With the hat trick, he reached 120 career goals and moved past Andrew Brunette (119 goals with MIN) for sixth on the franchise goal list.
- Recorded a six-game point streak (6-5=11) from 1/15 to 1/25.
- Posted a career-best plus-4 rating at CAR (1/21).
- Recorded a career-high 25:30 in TOI at CBJ (1/6).
- Eriksson Ek tied his career high with eight shots on goal at WPG (12/30) and vs. VAN (12/16).
- Currently with 37 career PPGs, Eriksson Ek needs two PPGs to tie Brian Rolston (39 PPGs with MIN) for sixth on the franchise's all-time list.
- Eriksson Ek reached 100 career goals by scoring a PPG at BUF (11/10), becoming the 11th player in franchise history to reach the milestone.
- Won 19-of-23 faceoffs (83%) at BUF (11/10), tying his career high (10/19/21 vs. WPG, 19-of-25).
- Eriksson Ek has recorded 13 multi-point games this season, second on the team.



# PLAYER NOTES



## BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- **Matt Boldy** is T-6th in the NHL with 21 goals scored since Nov. 28 and has 13 points (6-7=13) in his last eight games.
- Boldy ranks third on the Wild with 22 goals this season and T-3rd with 46 points (22-24=46).
- Boldy notched his 11th career multi-goal game with a 2-0=2 line at EDM (2/23). According to NHL Stats, is one of two Wild players with as many such performances before turning 23 is Marian Gaborik (14 times).
- Tied a career-high with four points (1-3=4) vs. VAN (2/19).
- Recorded three consecutive multi-point games from 2/9-2/14, a career-long.
- Posted seven SOG and three points (1-2=3) at VGK (2/12), both tying season highs.
- Boldy scored his 31st goal of the 2022-23 season at CHI (4/10) to surpass Marian Gaborik (30 in 2002-03 and 2001-02) for most by a Wild player age 22 or younger.
- Collected his 100th career point (45-55=100) in the 125th game of his career at PIT (4/6/23). Among players to debut with the franchise, he required the second-fewest games to reach the mark behind Kirill Kaprizov (92 GP).
- Scored 12 goals in the month of March 2023, becoming the third Wild player with as many in a calendar month (Kaprizov, 14 in March 2022; E. Staal, 13 in Feb. 2018).
- Recorded his third career hat trick (3-0=3) vs. SEA (3/27), the first natural hat trick of his career and his second hat trick in a five-game span.
- Became the fourth U.S.-born NHL player to record three hat tricks before turning 22, joining Jimmy Carson (seven), Alex DeBrincat (four) and Jeremy Roenick (four).
- Has joined Marian Gaborik (67 in 2001-02 & 65 in 2002-03) and Pierre-Marc Bouchard (59 in 2005-06) as the only Wild players to record a 50-point season before age 22.



## BROCKED AND LOADED

- **Brock Faber** leads all NHL rookies with 25:10 TOI per game, 114 blocked shots and 29 assists, and is T-2nd with 33 points (4-29=33).
- Faber is seventh among all NHL skaters in TOI/game and ranks T-15th in assists and T-20th in scoring among NHL defensemen.
- Recorded his seventh multi-point game of the season with two assists at VGK (2/12), tying Kurtis Foster (2005-06) for the third-highest total by a Wild rookie.
- With an assist vs. PIT (2/9), moved his season point total to 4-27=31 and surpassed Filip Kuba (9-21=30 in 2000-01) for the highest single-season point total by a Wild rookie defenseman. Also moved past Calen Addison (26 assists in 2022-23) for most single-season assists by a Wild rookie
- Recorded a six-game point streak (2-7=9) from 1/15 to 1/25, the longest point streak in franchise history by a rookie defenseman.
- Played in his 50th career game vs. NSH (1/25). With 29 points (4- 25=29) in 50 career games, matched Marek Zidlicky for the second-most points by a Wild defenseman through their first 50 games with the Wild. The only blueliner with more is Ryan Suter (4-29=33 in 50 GP), per NHL Stats.
- Posted his second career three-point game (1-2=3) at FLA (1/19). According to NHL Stats, he is the fourth rookie in franchise history with multiple three-point games: Kirill Kaprizov (3), Calen Addison (2x) and Rickard Wallin (2x).
- Reached 20 assists on the season with a helper at TBL (1/18). Per NHL Stats, became the fifth rookie in Wild history, and fourth in as many seasons, to reach the 20-assist plateau in a campaign, joining Calen Addison (26 in 2022-23), Matt Boldy (24 in 2021-22), Kirill Kaprizov (24 in 2020-21) and Filip Kuba (21 in 2000-01).
- Per NHL Stats, among defensemen to start their NHL career with the Wild, he required the fewest games (46 GP) in franchise history to reach 20 NHL assists with the franchise. Among all players under that criteria, he required the second fewest behind only Matt Boldy (40).
- Has recorded five games with 30-plus minutes of TOI this season, four of which came in a five-game span from 12/14 to 12/21. Became one of two NHL rookies since 1997-98 to play four games with 30-plus minutes of TOI in a single season.
- Skated a career-high 33:25 vs. MTL (12/21), the highest single-game total in the NHL this season and the third-highest by an NHL rookie since the start of the 2000-01 season.
- Owns four of the top eight single-game TOI totals by a rookie in Wild franchise history.
- Per NHL Stats, since time on ice began being tracked in 1997-98, Faber is only the 2nd rookie to record consecutive 30+-minute games (Atlanta's Toby Enstrom in March 2008), doing so vs. CGY (12/14) and vs. VAN (12/16).

## SHOT THROUGH THE HART

- **Ryan Hartman** is T-4th on Minnesota with 116 shots this season while ranking fifth with 15 goals and seventh with 28 points (15-13=28).
- Hartman was awarded the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the week ending Oct. 29 after ranking second in the NHL with five goals (5-2=7) in four appearances.
- Recorded five points (3-2=5) vs. EDM (10/24), marking his second career hat trick (first with MIN) and tying his career-best in points in a game.

## MATS-TER OF HIS CRAFT

- **Mats Zuccarello** is T-1st on the Wild with 35 assists and ranks T-3rd with 46 points (11-35=46) this season.
- Zuccarello tied his single-game career high with four points (1-3=4) vs. VAN (2/19).

## IN FULL BLOOM

- Goaltender **Marc-Andre Fleury** is 4-1-0 with a 2.23 GAA, a .918 save percentage and one shutout in seven game appearances (four starts) since Jan. 13th.
- Fleury recorded his 552nd career win with a 5-0 victory vs. NYI (1/15), moving past Patrick Roy (551 career wins) for second-most in NHL history.
- Posted the 74th shutout of his NHL career vs. NYI (1/15) and needs two more to tie Tony Esposito and Ed Belfour (76 career SO each) for 10th most in NHL history.
- Fleury became the fourth goaltender in NHL history to reach 1,000 games played when he started vs. WPG (12/31).
- With his 20th save of the game vs. WPG (12/31), became the third goaltender in NHL history to reach 26,000 career saves.
- He made 24 saves at NYR (11/9) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history.
- Fleury made a season-high 40 saves in a 4-3 OT win at BOS (12/19), his 40th career game with 40-plus saves (T-11th most in NHL history).
- Fleury made his season debut at MTL (10/17), making 27 saves in the 5-2 win and improving his record to 27-13-6 all-time against the Canadiens.
- Fleury played 58:31 vs. LAK (10/19), moving his career minutes total to 57,164:32 and surpassing Terry Sawchuk (57,155:51) for fourth on the all-time list among NHL goaltenders.
- Fleury notched the 65th shootout win of his career vs. NYR (11/4), further extending his all-time NHL record.
- Finished 24-16-4 for the 2022-23 season, Fleury recorded his 15th career season of 20-plus wins, tied for third-most in NHL history: Patrick Roy (17), Martin Brodeur (16) and Ed Belfour (15).
- With 73 career shutouts, Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
- Fleury faced his 28th career penalty-shot attempt at MTL (10/25). Per NHL Stats, Fleury's 22 saves on 28 all-time attempts trail only Roberto Luongo (33 PS SA, 29 PS saves) for the all-time lead in both categories.
