- Seven different skaters recorded a point during the game and four had multi-point efforts.
- **Tyler Seguin** opened the scoring 18 seconds into the game. Only three active players have scored a faster game-opening goal for Dallas: **Jamie Benn** (0:11 on Jan. 2, 2024), **Wyatt Johnston** (0:15 on March 14, 2024) and **Esa Lindell** (0:16 on Nov. 29, 2016), according to NHL Stats.
- **Miro Heiskanen** scored his 57th career goal which tied Joni Pitkanen for seventh most in NHL history by a Finnish-born defenseman, according to NHL Stats.
- **Matt Duchene** recorded his ninth multi-point game of the season, a team high. Closely trailing, **Mason Marchment** also recorded a multi-point game, his seventh of the year.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the third of four games the Stars will play against the Blackhawks this season and the first time that the teams will play in Chicago this year. They will next face off on Dec. 29 in Chicago.
- The Stars have posted a 11-2-0 record against the Blackhawks since the 2021-22 season, outscoring Chicago 53-30 in those games.
 - No team has scored more goals against the Blackhawks than the Stars since the start of the 2021-22 season.
 - The team's 22 points against Chicago since 2021-22 were second-most of any NHL team.
- Entering play Tuesday, the Stars tied for sixth and ranked eighth in wins (13) and points percentage (.650), respectively, this season.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.50 goals against per game this season, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL entering play Tuesday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 12 of the 20 games that they have played this year.
- Dallas has outscored its opponents 69-50 this season. Their plus-19 goal differential was tied for the fifth-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Tuesday.

BLACKHAWK DOWN

- Dallas is 126-137-42 all-time vs. Chicago, including a 51-79-20 mark on the road.
- **Jamie Benn** has 19 points (7-12-19) in his last 19 games against Chicago dating back to March 9, 2021.
- **Matt Duchene** has five points (3-2-5) in his last five games against Chicago.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has 15 points (2-13-15) in his last 15 games against Chicago dating back to April 8, 2021.
 - Since the start of the 2020-21 season, **Heiskanen** has recorded 16 points (2-14-16) in 20 games against the Blackhawks, which is tied for the second-highest total of any NHL defenseman during that span.
 - In all, **Heiskanen** has 17 career points (2-15-17) in 27 career games against Chicago, which is his highest total against a single opponent.

- **Roope Hintz** has 26 points (14-12—26) in 25 career games against Chicago. His 14 goals and 26 points are both his highest totals against a single opponent.
 - **Hintz** is the highest-scoring player in the NHL against the Blackhawks since the start of the 2020-21 season, totaling 25 points (13-12—15) in 18 games. His 13 goals against Chicago are also the most of any skater during that span.
- **Mason Marchment** has five points (4-1—5) in his last four games against Chicago.
- **Jake Oettinger** has won nine of the last 10 games he has played against Chicago, posting a .909 save percentage, a 2.50 goals-against average and one shutout in those games.
- **Jason Robertson** has 22 points (9-13—22) in 21 career games against Chicago. His 22 points against the Blackhawks are his second-highest total against a single opponent, trailing only the 24 career points (10-14—24) against Nashville.
 - **Robertson's** 22 points against Chicago since the start of the 2020-21 season are the second-most of any NHL skater, trailing only Dallas teammate **Roope Hintz**.
- **Tyler Seguin** has 10 points (5-5—10) in his last 10 games against Chicago.
- **Logan Stankoven** has three points (1-2—3) in three career games against Chicago.

ROAD WARRIORS

- **Matt Duchene** is the team's leading scorer when playing on the road this year, totaling 14 points (4-10—14) in 10 games. His 14 road points were tied for 11th in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- **Tyler Seguin** has recorded a point in seven of the eight road games that he has played this season, totaling 10 points (4-6—10) in all. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in five consecutive road games for the first time since Oct. 25 to Nov. 18, 2021.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has seven points (4-3—7) in his last seven road games dating back to Oct. 24 against the Buffalo Sabres. His seven road points during that span were tied for fifth among all NHL defensemen entering play Tuesday.
 - If **Heiskanen** were to score tonight, it would give him goals in three consecutive road games for the first time in his career.
- **Mason Marchment** has 13 points (6-7—13) in 10 road games played this season, which includes posting multi-point efforts in three of his last four road games played.

FIRST THING'S FIRST

- The Stars have opened the scoring in 60 percent of the games that they have played this season, recording the first goal of the game in 12 of their 20 games.
- Dallas has gone on to win 10 of the 12 games that they have scored first in. Their 10 wins when scoring first were tied for the best mark in the league this season entering play Tuesday.
- Additionally, the Stars' .833 win percentage when scoring first this year was the fourth-best mark in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- Dallas' first goal in their last game on Nov. 25 came on their first shot of the game. **Tyler Seguin** opened the scoring 18 seconds into the game, which tied Michael Kesselring (0:18 on Nov. 7 w/ UTA) for the second-fastest game-opening goal this season behind Nathan Walker (0:11 on Nov. 21 w/ STL) according to NHL Stats.
 - The Stars have scored on their first shot of the game three times this season according to NHL Stats.

BIKER GANG

- **Thomas Harley** scored in Dallas' last game and now has 10 points (2-8—10) in 20 games played this season. He enters tonight's matchup leading all Stars defensemen in scoring this year.
- With eight assists in 20 games, **Harley** is pacing to finish the season with 33 assists, which would be a career high for the blueliner.
- **Harley** has recorded a plus-16 on-ice goal differential this season, which was tied for the fifth-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Tuesday.
 - This includes having a plus-10 on-ice goal differential over the course of Dallas' last seven games dating back to Nov. 11, 2024. No player in the NHL had a better on-ice goal differential during that span entering play Tuesday.
- In all, **Harley** has been on the ice for 31 even-strength goals this season, which ranked second in the NHL to only Washington's Rasmus Sandin (32) entering play Tuesday.

DOUBLE DUTCH

- **Matt Duchene** enters tonight's game having totaled 25 points (11-14—25) in 20 games this season, which includes recording nine multi-point efforts this year.
- Entering play Tuesday, **Duchene** ranked in the top 10 among Canadian skaters this season in goals (tied fifth) and points (10th).
- With 25 points in 20 games, **Duchene** has already reached 38.5 percent of his total scoring from last year (25-40—65) despite only being 24.4 percent of the way through the 2024-25 season.
- **Duchene** has recorded a point in 14 of the 20 games he has played this season and enters tonight's game leading the Stars in both goals (11), assists (14) and points (25).

- When **Duchene** has been on the ice this season during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 18-8 according to Natural Stat Trick.

SETTING THE PACE

- With 20 games played this year, the Stars are officially 24.4 percent of the way through the 2024-25 regular season. With 62 games remaining, seven different Stars skaters are pacing to set career highs in scoring this year: **Matt Duchene**, **Esa Lindell**, **Ilya Lyubushkin**, **Mason Marchment**, **Tyler Seguin**, **Brendan Smith** and **Sam Steel**.
- **Duchene** is currently pacing to finish the year with 45 goals, 57 assists and 103 points, which would all be career highs for the 16-year veteran. If he were to maintain that pace, his 2024-25 season would tie for the fifth-highest scoring season in franchise history.
 - Dino Ciccarelli (52-52—103) previously posted a 103-point season for the Minnesota North Stars in 1986-87.
 - Forty-five goals would also be the seventh-highest total by a Stars skater in a single season in franchise history.
- **Marchment** is currently pacing to finish the year with 30 goals, 55 assists and 85 points, all of which would be career highs. His 20 points this year are already 37.7 percent of his career high of 53 (22-31—53) that he reached last season in 81 games.
- **Seguin** is on pace to finish the year with 39 goals, 49 assists and 88 points. His assist and point totals would be the most of his career and his 39 goals would be one shy of the career-high 40 he scored in 2017-18.
- **Lindell** (8-25—33), **Lyubushkin** (0-25—25), **Smith** (0-20—20) and **Steel** (9-26—34) are all on pace to finish the regular season with career highs in both assists and points.
- Additionally, rookie **Logan Stankoven** is pacing to finish the year with 45 assists and 62 points. Forty-five assists would be the fourth-most by a rookie in franchise history and 62 points would make him the highest scoring rookie since Michael Bunting had 63 points (23-40—63) in 2021-22.

IDES OF MARCH

- **Marchment** has totaled 12 points (5-7—12) over the Stars' last seven games dating back to Nov. 11. His 12 points during that span were tied for the second-most in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- The 2024-25 season marks the first time in his career that **Marchment** has played at a point-per-game pace or better through his first 19 games played of a season.
- **Marchment** has a plus-13 on-ice, even-strength goal differential this season, which was tied for fourth among all NHL forwards entering play Tuesday.
- **Marchment** recorded in assist in Dallas' game on Nov. 18 against the Anaheim Ducks. The helper marked the 100th assist of his NHL career and made him the 18th undrafted, active skater to reach the 100-assist milestone.
- **Marchment** recorded five points (1-4—5) in Dallas' 7-1 win over the Pittsburgh Penguins on Nov. 11, making him one of four skaters this season to record a five-point game
 - It was the second-highest scoring game of his career, trailing only the six points (2-4—6) he had against the Columbus Blue Jackets on Jan. 31, 2022.
 - **Marchment** joined Artemi Panarin (5) as the only active undrafted players with multiple five-point games according to NHL Stats.
- **Marchment** (1-4—5) became the third Stars player in the last decade to record five points in a game, following **Wyatt Johnston** (March 5, 2024) and Joe Pavelski (Jan. 12, 2022) according to NHL Stats.
- **Marchment** was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending in Nov. 17 after totaling nine points (4-5—9) in three games, the most of any player during that span.
 - It marked the second time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors after being named the Third Star of the Week on Feb. 6, 2022 after totaling six points (2-4—6) in two games while playing for the Florida Panthers.
 - It is also the second time this season that a Stars player has earned Star of the Week honors after **Matt Duchene** was named the league's Third Star of the Week for the week ending in Oct. 27

LIND, LAUGH, LOVE

- **Esa Lindell** has recorded eight points (2-6—8) in 20 games this season and enters tonight's contest ranked second among Stars defensemen in scoring (**Thomas Harley**, 10 points).
- **Lindell** enters tonight's game one point shy of totaling 200 career points. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 13th defenseman from the 2012 NHL Draft class to total 200 points.
- He will also become the 49th player and 13th defenseman in franchise history to record 200 points with the Stars.
- **Lindell** is one goal away from tying Philippe Boucher (52) for 10th in franchise history in goals scored by a defenseman.
- He is averaging 3:22 of shorthanded ice time per game this season, which was the eighth-highest mark in the NHL entering play Tuesday.

FACING OFF

- **Jamie Benn** has gone 108-for-171 at the faceoff dot this season. His 63.2 percent success rate was the fifth-best mark in the NHL this year among skaters to take at least 20 draws entering play Tuesday.
- **Benn** is one of five players this season to take at least 10 draws while only losing one or fewer and the only player to do so twice.

- **Benn** first went a perfect 16-for-16 at the faceoff dot on Nov. 7 against the Chicago Blackhawks. It marked the first time in his career that he has taken at least 16 draws in a game without losing one.
- Since the NHL began tracking faceoffs in 1997-98, **Benn** became just the sixth player to go undefeated at the faceoff dot when taking at least 16 draws.
- **Benn** then went 10-for-11 at the faceoff dot in Dallas' game on Nov. 18 against the Anaheim Ducks for a 90.9 percent success rate.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- **Jake Oettinger's** next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history. He is also just two wins away from tying Don Beaupre (126) for seventh on the franchise's all-time wins list.
- **Miro Heiskanen** is six assists shy of tying Dennis Hextall (216) for 23rd on the franchise's all-time assists list. He's also seven assists shy of trying Brad Maxwell (217) for 7th on the all-time assists list by defensemen.
- **Jason Robertson** is seven points away from tying Tom McCarthy (333) for 24th on the franchise's all-time scoring list.
- **Matt Duchene** is 10 points away from recording his 100th point with the Stars.
- **Esa Lindell** is 11 games shy of tying Lou Nanne (635) for ninth on the franchise's all-time games played list by defensemen.

- Blackhawks forward Jason Dickinson was drafted by the Dallas Stars 29th overall in the 2013 NHL Draft and played for Dallas from 2015-16 until 2020-21.
- Blackhawks forward Craig Smith played for the Dallas Stars during the 2023-24 season.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** played for the Toronto Maple Leafs alongside Chicago forward Joey Anderson during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Blackhawks forward Tyler Bertuzzi both played for the Maple Leafs following the trade deadline in the 2023-24 season.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and Blackhawks forward Tyler Bertuzzi were members of the Red Wings in the 2016-17 season until the trade deadline.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and Blackhawks goaltender Petr Mrazek were teammates with the Red Wings from 2012-13 to 2016-17.
- Stars defenseman **Matt Dumba** and Blackhawks forward Ryan Donato both played for the Minnesota Wild from 2018-19 to 2019-20.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and Blackhawks forward Ryan Donato skated for the Seattle Kraken during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Blackhawks forward Nick Foligno and defenseman Seth Jones were all members of the Blue Jackets following the trade deadline during the 2018-19 season.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** played for the Toronto Maple Leafs alongside Blackhawks forwards Nick Foligno and Ilya Mikheyev as well as defenseman TJ Brodie and goaltender Petr Mrazek during the 2020-21 season.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Blackhawks forward Taylor Hall were both with the Arizona Coyotes during the 2019-20 season.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and Blackhawks forward Craig Smith played with the Predators from 2018-19 to 2019-20.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** played alongside Blackhawks forward Craig Smith with Nashville in the 2019-20 season.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and Blackhawks forward Teuvo Teravainen were teammates with the Hurricanes during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward **Evgenii Dadonov** and Blackhawks defenseman Alec Martinez were teammates for a short time with the Vegas Golden Knights in 2021-22.
- Stars goaltending coach **Jeff Reese** and Blackhawks head coach Luke Richardson were both drafted by the Toronto Maple Leafs (Reese in 1984 and Richardson in 1987). The two played together for the Maple Leafs from 1987-88 to 1990-91.
- Stars goaltending coach **Jeff Reese** and Blackhawks assistant coach Kevin Dean both played for the New Jersey Devils during the 1996-97 season.
- Blackhawks assistant coach Kevin Dean played the 1999-00 season with the Dallas Stars, playing in 14 games.
- Stars goaltending coach **Jeff Reese** and Blackhawks assistant coach Derek King both played for the Toronto Maple Leafs during the 1998-99 season.
- Blackhawks assistant coach Derek Plante played two seasons with the Dallas Stars organization (1998-99 to 1999-00), playing in a total of 26 games.
