- Prior to their flight to Denver, the Stars will hold media availability with forward **Matt Duchene** and head coach **Pete DeBoer** at approximately 1 p.m. CT at **Signature Flight Support - Terminal 3** (8321 Lemmon Ave, Dallas, Texas 75209) on Thursday, May 16.

NOTES

- Forward **Joe Pavelski** (1-1—2) potted his first goal of the playoffs with the game-opening tally in the first period. Pavelski ranks 13th all-time in postseason goals with 74. He improved his postseason totals to 74-67—141 (194 GP), which is the third most by a U.S.-born player. He moved within three of **Chris Chelios** (31-113—144 in 266 GP) who sits second.

- Pavelski became the 13th player in NHL history to score 15-plus goals in potential series-clinching games and the first active skater to do so – **Patrick Kane** has 14.

- Defenseman **Miro Heiskanen** (1-0—1) scored his fourth goal in a potential series-clinching game – already the most by a defenseman in franchise history. He 11 points (4-7—11) overall in those contests (15 GP), which is the second most among blueliners in franchise history behind only **Sergei Zubov** (1-11—12 in 15 GP). Heiskanen's goal

- the 15th of his playoff career - tied Zubov and **Craig Hartsburg** for the most by a defenseman in franchise history. - Forward **Logan Stankoven** (1-0—1) tallied his third career playoff goal in the third period. All three goals have

come in this series. - Forward **Jason Robertson** (0-2—2) extended his point streak to five games (0-7—7) and has 12 points (3-9—12) in

- Forward Matt Duchene (0-1-1) recorded his fifth point of the playoffs with an assist in the opening frame.
