

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****February 2, 2026 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. TORONTO MAPLE LEAFS [4]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames battled back but couldn't complete a late push Monday night at the Scotiabank Saddledome, falling 4–2 to the Toronto Maple Leafs. Toronto built a 3–0 lead midway through the second period before Calgary responded with back-to-back goals from Nazem Kadri and Joel Farabee just over two minutes apart to pull within one and swing momentum. The Flames pressed in the third and outshot the Leafs 13–8 in the final frame but were unable to find the equalizer, and Bobby McMann sealed the result with an empty-net goal in the closing seconds. Both Kadri and Farabee finished with a goal and an assist to earn Second and Third Star honours respectively, while 19-year-old rookie Zayne Parekh made his return to the lineup, skating in a season-high 20:05 of ice-time.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the fourth and final meeting this season between the Flames and Oilers. Calgary owns a 2-1-0 record through the three previous 'Battle of Alberta's' in 2025-26.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 7-6-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 8-6-1 against Western Conference opponents.

NATIONAL PRIDE:

On June 16, 2025, Martin Pospisil was named as one of the six players to Team Slovakia's preliminary roster for the Olympic Winter Games Milano Cortina 2026. Pospisil represented Slovakia at the 2024 IIHF World Championships, where he scored three goals and added four assists for seven points in seven games before his participation was cut short due to injury. In August of 2024, Pospisil again represented his nation at the 2024 Men's Final Olympic Ice Hockey Qualification Group D, posting three assists in three games to help lift



Slovakia over Austria, Hungary, and Kazakhstan to punch their ticket to the Olympics for the ninth-consecutive time. Team Slovakia is in Group B and will open their tournament on February 12 against Team Finland. Following that, they will face the hosts, Team Italy, on February 14, before closing out the group stage against Team Sweden on February 14.

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

With his assist on Joel Farabee's shorthanded goal on Saturday afternoon, Mikael Backlund recorded his 35th career shorthanded point. He moved into a tie with Mika Zibanejad for the fourth most by a Swedish player in NHL history. The goal would hold up as the game-winner giving Backlund an assist on a game-winning goal for the 54th time in his career, tying Theo Fleury for the fifth-most instances in Flames history. Jarome Iginla leads the list with 89.

Backlund enters play today with 227 career goals, sitting two shy of tying Kent Nilsson (229) for the fifth-most in Flames franchise history. With two more tallies, he would also tie Nilsson for the most goals by a Swedish-born player in Flames history, with the pair ranking as the only two Swedes to eclipse 200 goals with the club.

KILLER CONFIDENCE:

The Calgary Flames enter tonight's contest with the NHL's top penalty kill unit since December 29, boasting a league-leading 92.1% on the kill over that span. In that timeframe, the Flames have successfully killed 35 of 38 shorthanded situations with the lowest powerplay goals against per game average in the NHL at 0.19.

Thanks to Joel Farabee's goal on the PK on Saturday against San Jose, the Flames have now scored eight shorthanded goals as a club in 2025-26, the most by any team. Farabee leads the Flames with four shorthanded goals, while Mikael Backlund has four shorthanded points from one goal and three assists on the kill.

HIT THE GRIDDY:

19-year-old Matvei Gridin scored his second career goal on Saturday afternoon against San Jose, recording his first NHL goal at the Scotiabank Saddledome. Only two teenagers have scored as many goals in a season for the Flames over the past 10 years:

Matthew Tkachuk (6 in 2017-18) (13 in 2016-17)

Sam Bennett (18 in 2015-16)



HOWLIN FOR YOU:

Dustin Wolf played his 100th NHL game in Calgary and Edmonton's last meeting on December 27 to become the second California-born goaltender in NHL history to reach 100 NHL contests, joining Thatcher Demko (262). Wolf would turn aside 29 of the 31 shots he faced against the Oilers to record the 49th career win, the third most by a Flames goaltender through the milestone contest, behind Mike Vernon (53) and David Rittich (52). This season, Wolf has posted two shutouts, and, in his career, he has five with all of them coming at the Scotiabank Saddledome. He tied with Mike Smith for the sixth-most shutouts by a Flames goaltender at the time of their 100th-game in a Flames uniform:

THE BEES KNEES:

Joel Farabee scored his fourth shorthanded goal of the season on Saturday against San Jose to tie Joel Armia as well as Ryan McLeod for the most among all skaters so far in 2025-26. Only one Flames skater has more shorthanded goals in a campaign in the past 25 years: Mark Jankowski (5 in 2018-19).

ZAYNE TRAIN:

On Saturday morning, the Flames recalled rookie defenceman Zayne Parekh from his conditioning stint with the AHL's Calgary Wranglers. The 19-year-old played four American Hockey League contests, registering two goals and three assists for five points during his conditioning stint, leading the club in scoring over that stretch.

Earlier this season, Parekh helped Canada earn a Bronze Medal at the 2026 IIHF World Junior Championship, scoring five goals and seven assists for 13 points in seven games. He made history in Minnesota, setting a new record for the most points by a Canadian defenceman at a single World Junior tournament, beating Alex Pietrangelo (2010) and Bryan McCabe (1995), who previously held the record with 12-point tournaments. The Flames 2024 first-round pick made his way onto the scoresheet in each game, registering multi-point efforts in five of his seven outings to finish third in tournament scoring, while leading all defencemen in goals, assist, and points at the World Juniors. Parekh would be named to the tournament's all-star team.

On Monday night, Parekh appeared in his first NHL contest since November 7, skating in a season-high 20:05 of ice-time through 24 shifts, registering one shot.

WEEGSY BABY:

With his assist on Monday night against Toronto, MacKenzie Weegar recorded his 148th point since becoming a Calgary Flame. With two more points, Weegar would become the 15th defenceman in franchise history to reach the 150-point plateau, having scored 35 goals and 113 assists through 299 games with Calgary.

TRICK OF THE TRADE:

On Monday afternoon, the Calgary Flames acquired defenceman Gavin White from Dallas in exchange for defenceman Jérémie Poirier. White, a native of Brockville, ON, has skated in 23 games for the AHL's Texas Stars, scoring three goals and two assists for five points along with eight penalty minutes. The 23-year-old has registered goals in two of his last four outings, helping Texas record seven out of eight points in his last four appearances.

White played his junior hockey in the OHL, winning two separate Ontario Hockey League Championships, first in 2021-22 with the Hamilton Bulldogs, then again in 2022-23 as a member of the Peterborough Petes. He would go on to play in five games during both the 2022 and 2023 Memorial Cup, accumulating three assists in 10-career tournament games.


He was drafted by Dallas in the fourth round (115th overall) in the 2022 NHL Draft and will report to the Calgary Wranglers.



HEY DID YOU KNOW?

The Flames erased a 3-0 deficit in their first meeting with Edmonton to come back and win, marking just the second time they have recorded a three-goal comeback victory in the Battle of Alberta. The other came on March 26, 2011 in a 5-4 shootout victory. The shootout would last eight-round to go down as the longest shootout in NHL history for a season-opening game.

LAST MEETING WITH EDMONTON:

The Calgary Flames posted a hard-checking effort on home ice, earning a 3–2 win over the Edmonton Oilers at the Scotiabank Saddledome on December 27. Yegor Sharangovich opened the scoring at the 7:00 mark with a perfectly placed shot after a hard forecheck from Adam Klapka to set up the opportunity. Edmonton tied it on the powerplay later in the frame, and these clubs were knotted at ones through 20. In the second, Ryan Lomberg pounced on an Oilers turnover and converted to give him goals in three of his last five outings to restore Calgary’s lead. The final frame would see Blake Coleman bury the eventual game-winner after a slick setup from Mikael Backlund and Kevin Bahl. Dustin Wolf was sharp with 29 saves on 31 shots, including 12 in the opening period, while the Flames out-hit Edmonton 29–13 to claim Round Three of the Battle of Alberta.
