- 14 different skaters recorded a point and five had multi-point efforts.
- Oskar Bäck scored his first NHL goal during the game.
- **Tyler Seguin** factored on **Matt Duchene's** goal to record his 800th career point and became first player from the 2010 NHL Draft to reach the milestone.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the first of four games the Stars will play against the Wild this season and the first of two games that the teams will play in Minnesota this year.
- A Dallas victory tonight would give the Stars consecutive road wins for the first time this season.
- The Stars are 5-0-1 in their last six games against the Wild, outscoring Minnesota 28-8 in those contests.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.33 goals against per game this season, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Dallas has outscored its opponents 52-35 this season. Their plus-17 goal differential was tied for the sixth-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Friday.
- Esa Lindell has seven points (1-6–7) in his last seven games played. A goal or an assist tonight would give him his first three-game point streak since March 2 to 6, 2022.
 - Lindell is averaging 3:28 of shorthanded time on ice per game this season, which was the eighth-highest mark in the NHL entering play Friday.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give **Brendan Smith** points in three consecutive games for the first time since Nov. 17 to 24, 2018.
- Jamie Benn has gone 76-for-120 at the faceoff dot this season. His 63.3 percent success rate was the third-best mark in the NHL this year among skaters to take at least 20 draws entering play Friday.
- Casey DeSmith has posted a 1.79 goals-against average and a .929 save percentage in five games with the Stars this season. Entering play Friday, he ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in both goals-against average (third) and save percentage (sixth) among goaltenders to play in at least two games this year.

WILD THINGS

- Jamie Benn has 11 points (6-5—11) in his last 11 games against the Wild since the start of the 2021-22 season. In all, Benn has 48 points (20-28—48) in 55 career regular-season games against Minnesota, which is the fifth-highest total of any active player.
- Casey DeSmith has a 5-1-1 career record in seven career games against the Wild, posting a .915 save percentage, 2.53 goals-against average and one shutout in those contests.
- Matt Duchene has 23 points (7-16–23) in his last 22 games against Minnesota dating back to Dec. 7, 2015. Additionally, he has posted six multi-point efforts in his last nine games against the Wild.
- Miro Heiskanen has 11 points (1-10-11) in his last 11 games against the Wild dating back to Oct. 29, 2019.
- Roope Hintz has 19 points (9-10—19) in 19 career games against the wild and enters tonight's game riding a three-game point streak against Minnesota.
 - Sixteen of those points have come in 11 games since the start of the 2021-22 season, which in the fourth-most in the NHL during that span.
- Wyatt Johnston has seven points (3-4–7) in seven career games against the Wild.
- Esa Lindell has five assists in his last five games against Minnesota.
- Nils Lundkvist has three points (1-2–3) in his last three games against the Wild.
- Mason Marchment has nine points (4-5–9) in eight career games against Minnesota.
- Jake Oettinger a native of Lakeville, Minnesota has a 5-0-1 career record against the Wild, posting a .913 save percentage and 2.49 goals-against average in those games.
- Jason Robertson has 17 points (10-7–17) in 11 career games against the Wild.
 - **Robertson's** 17 points against Minnesota since the start of the 2021-22 season are the third-most in the NHL, trailing only Roman Josi (7-14–21) and Nathan MacKinnon (7-12–19).
 - His 1.55 points per game against the Wild is the second-best mark of any active NHL skater that has played Minnesota at least twice in their career, trailing only Washington's Alex Ovechkin (1.55).
- **Tyler Seguin** has 50 points (20-30–50) in 44 career games against Minnesota and enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak against the Wild.
 - His 50 points against Minnesota are the fourth-most among active NHL players.

LUCKY NO. 7

- The Stars enter tonight's matchup against the Wild having scored seven goals in each of their last two games a 7-1 win over the Penguins on Nov. 11 and a 7-2 win over the Bruins on Nov. 14.
- According to NHL Stats, it marked the first time that the Stars scored seven goals in consecutive games since the club relocated to Dallas in 1993-94 and the 11th time overall in their franchise history, with their most recent instance occurring from Oct. 19-22, 1986 (2 GP).
- The Stars became the first team to score seven goals in consecutive games since the Blackhawks posted a streak of equal length from March 10 to 12, 2024 according to NHL Stats.
- If the team were to score seven or more goals again tonight, it would mark the third time in franchise history that the Stars had at least seven goals in three straight games according to NHL Stats, having previously done so from Jan. 23 to 27, 1982 and again from Feb. 20 to 24, 1982.
- Dallas is one of six teams this season to have scored at least seven goals in multiple games, with the others being Ottawa, Seattle, Vegas, Washington and Winnipeg.
- The Stars have had five skaters with multi-point efforts in each of their two seven-goal games Matt Duchene, Miro Heiskanen, Esa Lindell, Mason Marchment and Brendan Smith against the Penguins and then Oskar Bäck, Evgenii Dadonov, Duchene, Marchment and Tyler Seguin against the Bruins.

FIRST THING'S FIRST

- The Stars have opened the scoring in 60 percent of the games that they have played this season, recording the first goal of the game in nine of their 15 games.
- Dallas has gone on to win eight of the nine games that they have scored first in. Their eight wins when scoring first were tied for the third-best mark in the league this season entering play Friday, trailing only the Minnesota Wild and New York Rangers (nine each).
- Additionally, the Stars' .889 win percentage when scoring first this year was also the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Dallas has scored on their first shot of the game in each of the last two games they have played a 7-1 win over the Pittsburgh Penguins on Nov. 11 and a 7-2 win over the Boston Bruins on Nov. 14. If they were to do so again tonight, it would mark the first time in franchise history that the team has scored on its first shot of the game for three consecutive games according to NHL Stats.
 - Since the data officially started being tracked in 2009-10, there have been 14 instances of a team scoring on its first shot of the game in three straight games according to NHL Stats.

DOUBLE DUTCH

• Matt Duchene enters tonight's game having totaled 20 points (9-11–20) in 15 games this season, which includes recording seven multi-point efforts this year.

- 2024-25 marks the first time in **Duchene's** career that he has had 20 or more points through his first 15 games played of a season.
- With 20 points in 15 games, **Duchene** has already reached 30.8 percent of his total scoring from last year (25-40–65) despite only being 18.3 percent of the way through the 2024-25 season.
- Duchene has recorded a point in 11 of the 15 games he has played this season and enters tonight's game leading the Stars in both goals (nine) and points (20) and is tied for the team lead in assists (10).
- When **Duchene** has been on the ice this season during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 12-5 according to Natural Stat Trick.
- He is currently pacing to finish the year with 49 goals, 60 assists and 109 points, which would all be career highs for the 16-year veteran.

ROOKIE REPORT

- Logan Stankoven scored the game-winning goal in Dallas's 7-2 win over the Bruins and now has 14 points (4-10–14) through his first 15 games played this season. He enters tonight's game ranked third on the team in scoring.
- Entering play Friday, **Stankoven** was leading all rookies in scoring, game-winning goals (three) and points per game (0.93) this season, and his 10 assists were tied with Montreal's Lane Hutson for the league lead among first-year players.
 - His four goals this year were tied for the second-most among rookie skaters this season entering play Friday.
- If Stankoven were to score again tonight, it would give him goals in three consecutive games for the second time in his career, having previously done so from Feb. 26 to 29, 2024.
- Stankoven's goal against the Bruins in Dallas' last game was his 14th point of the season. His 14 points are tied with Danny Grant (10-4—14 in 1968-69) for the third most through 15 games in a season by a Stars/North Stars rookie behind only Neal Broten (10-7—17 in 1981-82) and Steve Christoff (8-7—15 in 1979-80) according to NHL Stats.
- Stankoven recorded his 10th assist of the season (12 GP) in Dallas' game on Nov. 7 against Chicago, establishing a franchise mark for fewest games to 10 helpers in a season by a Stars/North Stars rookie according to NHL Stats. The previous mark of 14 games was shared by Don Barber (1989-90 w/ MNS), Tim Young (1975-76 w/ MNS) and Danny O'Shea (1968-69 w/ MNS).
- Stankoven (8-18—26 in 36 GP) added an empty-net goal against Chicago to become the second-fastest player in Stars team history to record 25 career points, following Jason Robertson (33 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- With his assist on Oct. 15 against the Sharks, **Stakoven** became just the second rookie in Stars/North Stars history to record five or more assists through his first four games of a season, joining Marc Bureau (5 in 4 GP in 1990-91) according to NHL Stats.
- He recorded three assists in Dallas' 4-3 win over the Predators on Oct. 10, making him the only rookie to have a threepoint game this season.
- According to NHL Stats, **Stankoven** became the second rookie in franchise history to record three points in the team's season-opening contest, alongside Roland Eriksson (0-4–4 w/ MNS) on Oct. 6, 1976.
- Originally selected by the Stars in the second round (47th overall) of the 2021 NHL Draft, **Stankoven** appeared in 24 regular-season games for Dallas last year, totaling 14 points (6-8–14) in those contests and adding eight points (3-5–8) in 19 Stanley Cup Playoff games.
- Despite only playing in 39 regular-season games in his career, **Stankoven** already ranks 12th in career scoring among skaters selected in the 2021 NHL Draft. His 0.72 career points per game also top 2021 draftees who have appeared in at least two regular-season games.
 - The 11 skaters ranked in front of him have all played in at least 90 career regular-season games.
- His 10 assists this season have already surpassed his total from last year and he is one point shy of surpassing his total from 2023-24.
- Stankoven is pacing to finish the year with 55 assists and 77 points. Fifty-five assists and 77 points would both rank second among rookies in franchise history, trailing Neal Broten's 60 assists and 98 points in 1981-82.
 - If he were to finish the year with 77 points, he would also become the highest scoring rookie since Mathew Barzal had 85 points (22-63–85) in 2017-18.

IDES OF MARCH

- Mason Marchment scored a goal and added an assist in Dallas' last game on Nov. 14, a 7-2 win over the Boston Bruins. His two-point game brought his season total to 15 points (4-11—15), which ranks second on the team in scoring this season.
- The 2024-25 season marked the first time in his career that **Marchment** has played at a point-per-game pace or better through his first 14 games played of a season.
- His 15 points are already 28.3 percent of his career high of 53 (22-31-53) that he reached last season in 81 games.
 Marchment is currently pacing to finish the year with 23, 64 assists and 87 points, all of which would be career highs.
- Marchment has a plus-11 on-ice, even-strength goal differential this season, which was tied for fourth among all NHL forwards entering play Friday.
- Marchment enters tonight's game one assist shy of total 100 NHL assists. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 18th undrafted, active skater to tally 100 career assists.
- Marchment recorded five points (1-4—5) in Dallas' 7-1 win over the Pittsburgh Penguins on Nov. 11, making him one of four skaters this season to record a five-point game

- It was the second-highest scoring game of his career, trailing only the six points (2-4—6) he had against the Columbus Blue Jackets on Jan. 31, 2022.
- **Marchment** joined Artemi Panarin (5) as the only active undrafted players with multiple five-point games according to NHL Stats.
- Marchment (1-4-5) became the third Stars player in the last decade to record five points in a game, following Wyatt Johnston (March 5, 2024) and Joe Pavelski (Jan. 12, 2022) according to NHL Stats.
- If **Marchment** were to have at least two points tonight, it would give him multi-point efforts in three consecutive games for the first time since Dec. 31, 2023 to Jan. 4, 2024.

TYLER THE CREATOR

- **Tyler Seguin** has recorded a point in nine of the 11 games that he has played this year (7-6–13) and enters tonight's matchup against the Wild ranked fourth on the team in scoring.
- Seguin's 13 points through his first 11 games played of the season is his highest scoring rate to begin a year since he had 16 points (5-11–12) in the first 11 games he played in 2015-16.
- With seven goals and 11 points in 10 games, Seguin is playing at a 50-goal and 92-point pace.
- When **Seguin** has been on the ice this year during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 8-3 according to Natural Stat Trick.

BENN THERE DONE THAT

- Stars captain Jamie Benn enters tonight's contest having played in 312 consecutive games.
- Dallas' Oct. 13 matchup against the Kraken marked the 300th consecutive game that **Benn** had played in, making him the fourth player in franchise history to play in 300 consecutive games for the team according to NHL Stats.
- He is two games shy of matching **Tyler Seguin** for the third-longest Iron Man streak in franchise history.

- Benn's current 312-game Iron Man streak is the fifth-longest active streak in the NHL.
- Benn is one of 17 players to have an active Iron Man streak of at least 200 games and is one of 11 NHL players to appear in each of his team's 246 regular-season games between 2021-22 and 2023-24.
- The Stars captain leads all Dallas players in career games played (1,127), goals (386), assists (529) and points (915). His 915 career points rank 13th among active NHL skaters, and he is the second-highest scoring fifth-round draft pick in NHL history (Alexander Mogilny; 1,032).

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Esa Lindell has several franchise milestones withing reach:
 - He is two points shy of becoming the 49th player and 13th defenseman in franchise history to record 200 points with the Stars.
 - Lindell is two goals away from tying Philippe Boucher for 10th in franchise history in goals scored by a defenseman.
 - He is also 16 games shy of tying Lou Nanne (635) for ninth on the franchise's all-time games played list by defensemen.
- **Tyler Seguin** is two assists away from bringing his total with the Stars to 380, which would tie him with Brian Bellows for fifth-most assists by a skater in franchise history.
- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- **Miro Heiskanen** is seven assists shy of tying Dennis Hextall (216) for 23rd on the franchise's all-time assists list. He's also eight assists shy of trying Brad Maxwell (217) for 7th on the all-time assists list by defensemen.

CONNECTIONS

- Stars defenseman Matt Dumba was originally selected by Minnesota in the first round (seventh overall) in the 2012 NHL Draft. He played for the Wild from 2013-14 to 2022-23.
 - **Dumba** and Wild defenseman Jonas Brodin and Jared Spurgeon were teammates in Minnesota during Dumba's tenure there from 2013-14 to 2022-23.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and defenseman **Matt Dumba** both played together for one season in Minnesota during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars player development assistant Jordie Benn and Stars defenseman Matt Dumba both played together in Minnesota during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and Wild forwards Ryan Hartman and Frederick Gaudreau were all members of the Nashville Predators during the 2018-19 season and played five games together.

- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith played alongside the Wild's Frederick Gaudreau in part of the 2020-21 season with the Pittsburgh Penguins.
- Stars forwards Matt Duchene and Colin Blackwell played with Wild forward Yakov Trenin in Nashville during the 2019-20 season.
- Stars forward Evgenii Dadonov and Wild goaltender Filip Gustavsson played together in Ottawa in 2021-22.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell and Wild forward Marcus Johansson were both members of the Seattle Kraken during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and Wild forward Mats Zuccarello both played for the New York Rangers from 2016-17 until 2018-19.
- Wild forward Mats Zuccarello played two games for the Dallas Stars in 2018-19.
- Stars goaltending coach Jeff Reese and Wild associate coach Jack Capuano both played for the Toronto Maple Leafs in 1989-1990.
