Los Angeles Kings: Head Coach and Player Bios

Head Coach: Head Coach Jim Hiller

Jim Hiller is in his second full season as Head Coach of the LA Kings. Hiller was originally elevated to Kings interim head coach on Feb. 2, 2024, after serving as an assistant coach the previous two seasons, and made his head coaching debut on Feb. 10 against Edmonton to become the 18th different head coach in league history to make their coaching debut with the team that originally drafted them.

In 2024-25, Hiller led the Kings to a 48-25-9 record with 105 points and a .640 PTS% in his first full season as head coach to tie the franchise record for the most wins and points in a single season. Of the team's 48 wins, a record-breaking 31 came at Crypto.com Arena, surpassing the previous franchise mark of 26 set three times. On Feb. 7, 2025, the Kings improved to 50-29-7 under Hiller's watch to make him the fastest head coach in franchise history to reach the 50-win mark, doing so in 86 games (50-29-7). As a result, the Kings qualified for their fourth consecutive Stanley Cup Playoffs.

OUT IN FRONT

- The Wild went 29-0-0 when leading through two periods, the only NHL team with a perfect record when holding a lead after 40 minutes of play.
- Was 21-4-2 when leading through one period last season.
- The Wild scored first in 45 games last season, tied for fourth-most in the NHL, and held a 31-11-3 record when doing so.
- Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

ROAD DAWGS

- Recorded a 23-13-5 record on the road last season, establishing a franchise record with 51 road points.
- Ranked fourth in the NHL in road points, road point percentage (.622) and T-4th in road wins.
- Reached 20 road wins in the 28th road game of the season, tying the 2022-23 Boston Bruins for the fourth fewest games in NHL history required to reach the mark.

The only active players with more points through 300 games include: Sidney Crosby (407), Connor McDavid (394), Alex Ovechkin (384) and Evgeni Malkin (371). Only Ovechkin (204) and Auston Matthews (176) had more goals through 300 games among active skaters.
- Among players selected in the fifth round of the NHL Draft or later, only four skaters have tallied as many goals as Kaprizov at the time of their 300th career contest: Brett Hull (226), Pavel Bure (187), Luc Robitaille (185) and Alexander Mogilny (176).

BYFIELD, BY THE WAY

Forward **Quinton Byfield** skates into the Land of 10,000 Lakes after scoring his first goal and netting his first assist for his first multi-point effort (1-1=2) of the season last Wednesday in Las Vegas. The forward played in 81 games last season for the Kings, setting new single-season career highs in games played (81), goals (23), average time-on-ice (15:57), and shooting percentage (14.6%). From March 5 – 15, 2025, Byfield posted a career-long six-game goal streak to become just the fourth skater under the age of 23 to record a six-game goal streak in Kings history. Among all 2020 draftees, Byfield's cumulative +40 rating is tied with Winnipeg's **Cole Perfetti** for third highest:

A BRANDT NEW YEAR

Defenseman **Brandt Clarke** will take the ice in the Gopher State after scoring the game-tying goal in the Kings' opening away game on Wednesday in Las Vegas, marking his first tally of the season. Clarke's goal came in the second game of his second full NHL season after tallying 33 points (5-28=33) with nine power play points and a plus-13 rating in 78 games as a rookie last year. His 28 helpers and 33 points led all Kings defensemen while his nine points on the man-advantage placed fourth among all Kings skaters.



Clarke looks to replicate his fast start from last year where he recorded 11 points through the team's first 11 games of the season. By doing so, the native of Nepean, Ontario became just the third blueliner in team history aged 21 years old or younger to record as many points through the team's first 11 games to start a season, joining **Larry Murphy** (2x, 4-7=11 in 1980-81 and 5-8=13 in 1981-82) and **Rob Blake** (2-11=13 in 1990-91).

KUZ-ING THROUGH THE TWIN CITIES

Forward **Andrei Kuzmenko** skates into tonight's matchup in Minnesota after scoring his first goal of the season last Wednesday night in Vegas, his first power play goal as a member of the Kings. Kuzmenko then earned his first assist of the season in the third period to help tie the contest 5-5. After joining the team at the trade deadline this past March, the 29-year-old winger scored five goals and 12 assists for 17 points (5-12=17) in 22 regular season games for LA following his acquisition from Philadelphia. Kuzmenko, who recorded his second helper of the season on Saturday in Winnipeg, has three points (2-1=3) in his last pair of visits to Minnesota, dating back to Jan. 25, 2025, with Calgary.

The Yakutsk, Russia native notched 15 points (5-10=15) in as many contests played at Crypto.com Arena to account for the fifth-most home points by any NHL skater from the deadline on March 8 through the end of the season, April 17. Kuzmenko finished tied with linemate **Anze Kopitar** (6-9=15) and trailed only **Quinton Byfield** (9-7=16) for the most home points among Kings skaters after joining the team, with the three skaters respectively ranking fourth, fifth, and sixth in home points in the NHL in that span:

CAN'T CATCH 22

Forward **Kevin Fiala** returns to St. Paul looking to extend his six-game point streak against his former team (2-6=8), dating back to Oct. 19, 2023. The St. Gallen, Switzerland native joins **Anze Kopitar** (2-9=11 in 7 GP from Feb. 24, 2011 – April 4, 2013), **Jack Johnson** (2-5=8 in 7 GP from Feb. 24, 2009 – Oct. 25, 2010) and **Drew Doughty** (2-6=8 in 6 GP from Feb. 28, 2021 – Nov. 8, 2022) as the fourth Kings skater in franchise history to record a six-game point streak against Minnesota. Fiala has scored a total of 104 points (40-64=104) in 115 games played at Grand Casino Arena and has recorded 11 points (3-8=11) in nine contests against his former club since being acquired via trade from the Wild on June 29, 2022.

Fiala picked up his first assist of the season on Kuzmenko's game-opening tally on Wednesday in Las Vegas, accounting for his second power play point (1-1=2) in as many games this season. In last Tuesday's season-opener at Crypto.com Arena, Fiala netted his first goal of the season with his 59th career power play goal, tying **Timo Meier** (59 PPG) for the second most man-up markers by a player of Swiss nationality in NHL history. Fiala also became the 25th player in Kings history to score 20 power-play goals on home ice.

The 29-year-old led the Kings with seven multi-goal games on the season through 2024-25. Fiala contributed a total of 19 multi-point efforts last year, trailing only **Adrian Kempe's** 24 total multi-point nights through 81 games played on the campaign. Since joining the Kings, Fiala has now scored two points or more in 61 regular season games for the Kings, keeping pace with Kempe (61) for the most such performances on the team in that span. Of those 61 outings where Fiala has registered a pair of points or more, 28 have featured at least two assists—the most such games among all Kings skaters since his first season with the team in 2022-23.

CRIMSON PRIDE

Forward **Alex Laferriere** is underway for his third season in the NHL and the first campaign of the three-year contract extension he signed with the Kings this past August. The 23-year-old winger played in 77 games for LA last season, establishing personal-bests in goals (19), assists (23), points (42), plus/minus (+22), game-winning goals (4), shots (193), hits (124), blocked shots (43) and time-on-ice per game (TOI; 16:32 min.).

The native of Chatham, N.J. accumulated a plus-22 rating to tie **Adrian Kempe** for the second highest among team forwards last season. On the defensive side of the puck, Laferriere recorded 124 hits and 43 blocked shots, placing third on the roster in each category. The 6-1, 205-pound winger is the fourth U.S.-born skater in franchise history to reach the 15-goal and 40-point marks in a single season before turning 24 years old, and the first to do so since **Dustin Brown** in 2007-08. The third-year winger has scored a goal and added two assists (1-2=3) in his last three contests with the Minnesota Wild, dating back to Nov. 5, 2024.



OVERTURE #11: 'IN AUTUMN'

Captain **Anze Kopitar** enters tonight's contest with points (0-3=3) in each of the Kings' three games to begin the season. It marks the eighth different season-opening point streak of at least three games in his career, and first since his four-game stretch to begin the 2021-22 campaign. The captain will take the ice for the third road game of his franchise-record 20th NHL campaign after notching his first point of the year earlier this week in Tuesday's season-opener at Crypto.com Arena. With an assist on a power-play goal by **Kevin Fiala**, Kopitar extended his season-opening point streak to an eighth game (8-9=17), dating back to Oct. 5, 2018, ranking among the three longest active season-opening point streaks.

On Sept. 18, 2025, the Jesenice, Slovenia native announced that he will retire following this upcoming season, which will conclude an unparalleled two-decade career as an LA King. The captain now has one last campaign to add to a trophy case that holds a pair of Stanley Cup Championship rings, two Frank J. Selke Trophies, three Lady Byng Memorial Trophies and a Mark Messier NHL Leadership Award. The first Slovenian-born player to reach the NHL was selected by the Kings with the 11th overall pick in the 2005 NHL Draft. He now ranks in the top three in nearly every major regular-season category in team history, including seasons played (1st; 20), games played (1st; 1,457), goals (3rd; 440), assists (1st; 841), points (2nd; 1,281), plus/minus (2nd; +109), power-play goals (3rd; 124), overtime goals (T-2nd; 9), game-winning goals (1st; 78), shots (3rd; 3,332), faceoff wins (1st; 14,526), blocked shots (3rd; 1,034) and takeaways (1st; 833).

Kopitar's 1,457 games played are tied with **Glen Wesley** for the 30th most in NHL history and are the 10th most by a player with a single franchise. His 14 separate 20-goal seasons are also tied for the most in franchise history while his 154 multi-assist and 319 multi-point games each rank third in club history.

Since making his NHL debut in 2006-07, Kopitar has amassed 1,281 points (440-841=1,281) in 1,457 regular season outings. The 6-3, 225-pound forward started the year within the top 40 for most points in NHL history and will break a tie with fellow three-time Lady Byng Memorial Trophy winner **Alex Delvecchio** (456-825=1,281) for 39th most when he next finds the scoresheet:

Kopitar capped off the 2024-25 campaign with 21 goals and a team-high 46 assists for 67 points (21-46=67) with a career-low four penalty minutes (PIM) in 81 games to earn his third Lady Byng Trophy. It marked the 16th time in his career Kopitar has finished as the Kings' leader in assists and 17th time finishing top two in team scoring (**Adrian Kempe**; 35-38=73 in 2024-25). Over his two decades with the Kings, the captain has led the team in scoring 15 times, including six consecutive campaigns from 2017-23, and is joined by **Gordie Howe** as the only two players in NHL history to lead the same franchise in points on at least 15 occasions.

JUICED TO BE BACK

Forward **Adrian Kempe** prepares for the second half of the Kings' two-game road trip after recording his first multi-point effort (1-1=2) of the year on Saturday in Winnipeg. Kempe has posted multiple points in a single game 93 times, the 15th most in franchise history, with 24 of those performances occurring in the 2024-25 campaign to lead all Kings skaters. With his goal on Saturday, Kempe now has



scored 195 times as a member of the LA Kings, breaking a three-way tie with **Jeff Carter** and **Mike Murphy** (194 G) for sole possession of the 10th most goals in franchise history. The native of Kramfors, Sweden, has scored six goals and added seven assists for 13 career points (6-7=13) in 15 career road games against the Wild.

Kempe skated in his 600th career regular season NHL game on Feb. 5 against the Montreal Canadiens. By doing so, the 28-year-old forward became the 16th player in LA Kings history to reach such mark and just the second Swedish-born skater to do so, following **Mattias Norstrom** (780 GP).

Kempe recorded his 200th career assist on April 5 against Edmonton, his 31st helper of the season, to become just the eighth LA King to tally at least 200 assists in his first 625 career games, joining **Dave Taylor** (433 A), **Luc Robitaille** (406 A), **Anze Kopitar** (349 A), **Butch Goring** (307 A), **Rob Blake** (271 A), **Drew Doughty** (243 A) and **Dustin Brown** (203 A).

On April 14 in Edmonton, Kempe (1-2=3) contributed two power play assists, his 36th and 37th helpers of the year, before burying his 34th goal and 71st point (34-37=71) of the year in the final frame to clinch his second consecutive 70-point campaign (28-47=75 in 2023-24). Kempe is the 14th player in Kings history to register multiple 70-point seasons and joins current teammates **Anze Kopitar** (9x from 2007-08 through 2023-24) and **Kevin Fiala** (2x from 2022-23 through 2023-24) as three of five European-born players on that list. The active trio is joined by **Jari Kurri** (2x from 1992-93 through 1993-94) and **Ziggy Palffy** (2x from 2000-01 through 2002-03).

In 633 career NHL contests, Kempe has accumulated 195 goals and 209 assists for 404 points (195-209=404) with a plus-27 rating. Since his NHL debut on Feb. 16, 2017, Kempe occupies the top three among team skaters in multiple regular season categories:

WARREN PEACE

In his first season with the Kings, forward **Warren Foegele** set career-highs in goals (24), assists (22) points (24-22=46), even-strength goals (23), game-winning goals (7) and blocks (40) while maintaining a team-high plus-36 rating. Foegele's plus-36 was tied for the second highest among all League forwards and tied for fourth in the League overall last season. In addition to his pacesetter plus/minus rating, Foegele finished the 2024-25 regular season tied with **Anze Kopitar** for the most game-winning goals on the team and played in all 82 regular season contests for the third time in his career.

In addition to receiving the team's Mark Bavis Memorial Award for "Best Newcomer" last season, Foegele was also recognized with the team's Unsung Hero Award. Of Foegele's personal-best 24 goals during his freshman campaign in Los Angeles, 23 were scored in even-strength situations. The Markham, Ontario native also led the Kings with 33 takeaways last season.

Foegele has scored four goals in six career visits to Minnesota's capital since making his first trip to the Twin Cities exactly seven years ago to the day, Oct. 13, 2018, with Carolina.

THE KUEMPEROR'S NEW GROOVE

The Kings begin the second year of goaltender **Darcy Kuemper**'s second stint in the LA crease after the Saskatoon, Saskatchewan native turned in a Vezina Trophy caliber season in 2024-25. Kuemper joined Tampa Bay's **Andrei Vasilevski** and the winner, Winnipeg's **Connor Hellebuyck**, as the three finalists for the award for "the goaltender adjudged to be the best at his position." Kuemper's performance last season also earned him the Bill Libby Memorial Award as the Kings' Most Valuable Player and Best Defensive Player honors, both of which were selected by the media.

The 34-year-old backstop finished the regular season with a 31-11-7 record, a career-low 2.02 goals against average (GAA), .922% save percentage (SV %) and five shutouts in 50 games played. Kuemper's GAA and SV% both ranked second, respectively, among all goaltenders with a minimum of 40 games played last season:

Per NHL EDGE, the 6-5, 215-pound netminder maintained a .863 SV% in high-danger situations through the 2024-25 regular season, the highest such save-percentage of any goaltender in the League. Kuemper posted the fourth best SV% of his career and matched his personal-best in shutouts for a fourth time, being credited with five, while also playing most of a team-shutout on April 14 in Edmonton.

By stonewalling all 27 of Oilers' shots a week prior on April 5, Kuemper secured his fifth shutout of the '24-'25 campaign and improved his record to 28-10-7 on the year to that point. With 26 saves on 28 shots faced on April 7 against Seattle and a 24-save outing on April 10 against Anaheim, Kuemper joined **Miikka Kiprusoff** (16 GS in 2003-04) as the only two goaltenders in the NHL's expansion era (since 1967-68) to have 15 or more *consecutive starts* of allowing two or fewer goals:

Kuemper earned his 199th and 200th career victories on March 13 and March 15 by posting consecutive shutouts against the Washington Capitals and Nashville Predators. The pair of wins were the first time a Kings goalie recorded back-to-back shutouts since Kuemper himself did so on Jan. 30 and Feb. 3, 2018.

The team limited their opponents to a combined 203 goals against (GA) through 82 games played in the 2024-25 campaign, the second fewest total goals allowed last season behind only the Winnipeg Jets (190 GA). The team's success keeping pucks *out* of the net corresponds to keeping shots *away* from the cage; the Kings maintained a shots-against per game (SA/GP) average of 25.5 last season, trailing only the Carolina Hurricanes (24.9):

WELCOME TO HOCKEYWOOD

On May 14, 2025, the LA Kings named **Ken Holland** as the team's new General Manager and Vice President. Holland began his first season in Los Angeles as the fifth-winningest general manager in NHL history, having accumulated 1,145 wins over 26 seasons between the Detroit Red Wings (1997-2019) and Edmonton Oilers (2019-14).

Holland, the 10th GM in Kings history, won four Stanley Cups over two decades with Detroit while leading the organization to four President's Trophies, 10 division championships, and five regular season conference titles. A 2020 Hockey Hall of Fame inductee, Holland also served on several management staffs for Hockey Canada, winning gold medals at the 2010 and 2014 Olympic Winter Games and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.

The native of Vernon, British Columbia, is one of several new additions to the Kings organization. At the 2025 NHL Draft, held at Peacock Theater in downtown Los Angeles this past June, the Kings made nine total selections, including defenseman **Henry Brzustewicz** (First Round, 31st overall), who made his first appearance for the Kings this preseason. The 18-year-old native of Washington, Mich., was one of 28 players on the Kings' preseason training camp roster that were drafted by Los Angeles.

Following the Draft, Holland and the Kings acquired several veteran players through free agency, signing forwards **Joel Armia** and **Corey Perry**, defensemen **Cody Ceci** and **Brian Dumoulin**, and goaltender **Anton Forsberg**. The quartet of skaters brought a combined 3,555 regular season contests and 478 games of Stanley Cup Playoff experience to their first season with the Kings. Forsberg—who joined the Kings with a 74-81-14 record through 174 career starts with Columbus, Carolina, Chicago, and Ottawa—earned his first win in his first start as an LA King last Wednesday night in Vegas, making 30 saves on 35 shots through regulation and overtime and stopping two attempts in the shootout.



A ROYAL RECAP

The LA Kings are underway with the 2025-26 campaign following one of the most successful regular seasons in team history, tying franchise records in wins (48; also 48 in 2015-16) and points (105). The second 105-point campaign in Kings history marked the seventh time the organization surpassed 100 points and matched the team's single-season high (42-17-21) set in 1974-75. The Kings' historic success last year was powered in part by consistency at Crypto.com Arena. The team ultimately finished the regular season with a 31-6-4 record in DTLA, marking the first time the 30-win bar was eclipsed on home ice in a single season in team history:

In their win against the Hurricanes on March 22, 2025, the Kings scored six consecutive goals in a game for the first time in nearly a year (March 20, 2024 vs. MIN). All 12 forwards who dressed against Carolina recorded at least one point, marking the sixth time in franchise history—the first since Oct. 28, 1988—that all forwards who dressed found the scoresheet in the same game for the Kings:

The following day, their 7-2 victory over the Bruins on March 21 saw 16 different skaters recorded a point in a game for the first time in team history. By scoring 14 goals in their back-to-back set against Carolina and Boston, last year's group marked the 17th time in Kings history—and first occasion since April 1 & 3, 1995—the team scored seven goals in back-to-back games. Furthermore, it was the third time the Kings had seven-plus goals in *consecutive calendar days*, following Dec. 20-21, 1988, and Nov. 13-14, 1987 (via NHL PR).

As part of their successful play on home ice last season, the team established another franchise mark for the longest home point streak at 15 games from Jan. 22 – March 25, 2025, where they went 12-0-3 while outscoring their opponents by a cumulative 54-26 in that span. That streak saw the Kings defeat the Golden Knights on Feb. 24 as part of the team's 20th home win of the year in their 27th game played at Crypto.com Arena. With a home record of 20-3-4 through their first 27 games played in Los Angeles, the Kings set a franchise record for the fastest pace to the 20-win mark on home ice, eclipsing their previous best of 20-9-1 in 30 GP in the 2005-06 campaign.

After the League returned from its 4 Nations Face-Off break, the Kings allowed two goals or fewer in 14 of their 19 games at Crypto.com Arena, including three shutouts. Overall, the Kings completed the campaign with an NHL-best .805 home points percentage (PTS %), earning 31 wins and 66 points in DTLA last season. Since Head Coach **Jim Hiller** was elevated to interim head coach on Feb. 2, 2024, the Kings boast a 45-10-5 record at home with 45 wins, 95 points and an NHL-best .792 PTS %:

THIS DATE IN KINGS HISTORY

Oct. 13, 1974 – **Bob Nevin** scored his fourth career hat trick (his first with Los Angeles) and added an assist in the Kings' 4-1 win against the Sabres, at Buffalo.

Oct. 13, 1981 – **Marcel Dionne** scored twice to become the first player to score 300 goals as a member of the Kings. The milestone came in a 4-3 win over the visiting Calgary Flames.

Oct. 13, 1984 – Playing in his second NHL game, Kings' rookie defenseman **Garry Galley** scored the first goal of his career, in a 6-5 overtime loss to the visiting Vancouver Canucks. **Marcel Dionne** scored a 5-on-3 shorthanded goal, the first time in team history that a player scored with the team two men short.

Oct. 13, 1989 – **Steve Kasper** scored at 19:59 of the third period, to give the Kings a 6-5 win at Vancouver. The winning goal was set up by **Wayne Gretzky** for NHL career assist number 1,849, just one short of Gordie Howe's mark
