PRESIDENT AND CHAIRMAN OF THE ROARD

Stability and leadership are keys to successful sports ownership. Seymour H. Knox, III, along with his brother, Northrup, has provided the Buffalo Sabres. with those qualities during the entire history of the franchise.

The Knox brothers' first attempt to bring the NHL to Buffalo came in September, 1965, when they first applied for a franchise. The city was passed over in the 1967 league expansion, so in 1968 Seymour and Northrup signed a contract to purchase the Oakland franchise with the intent of moving it to Buffalo. The NHL Board of Governors decided to keep the Seals in Oakland, but the Knox brothers continued to work towards their goal. Finally, their efforts were rewarded on December 2, 1969, when the city was granted an expansion franchise for the 1970-71 season.




Seymour added the President's duties in May, 1988 (he succeeded Northrup, who resigned to become Chairman of the Board at Marine Midland Bank N.A.), and represents the Sabres on the NHL's Board of Governors.

Seymour currently serves as a Vice President of Kidder, Peabody and Co. He is a director of Pratt & Lambert, Inc. and the F.W. Woolworth Company, is President of the Buffalo Fine Arts Academy and on the Board of Trustees of the YMCA of Greater Buffalo. Seymour formerly was nationally ranked as a squash racquets player, and is a three-time winner of the U.S. court tennis doubles championships. His hockey career ended as a schoolboy because of a football injury.

Seymour and his wife, Jean, live in Buffalo. They have four children: Seymour IV - the team's Assistant to the President. W.A. Read, Avery F. and Helen Edith.

GENERAL MANAGER

The Buffalo Sabres' fortunes continue to be headed in the proper direction under General Manager's Gerry Meehan's guidance.

Meehan took over his current position on December 22, 1986. In his first full year on the job in 1987-88, the Sabres jumped from 21st place to a tie for seventh in the overall standings. He finished in a tie for second in voting by The Sporting News for the NHL's Executive of the Year. The club again was above the .500 mark in 1988-89 despite a great many injuries to key players. Then last season, the Sabres again showed great improvement as they finished third in the overall standings - their best showing in that category since 1979-80.

Meehan's performance as General Manager is another sign of the Sabres' wisdom in drafting him in the Expansion Draft of 1970. He spent four seasons

in Buffalo as a player and was the second captain in the team's history. The center played in the team's first regular season game ever (and had the Sabres' first penalty ever). Meehan's most memorable moment in a Buffalo uniform came in the 1971-72 season, when his goal in the final seconds of the season's last game knocked the Flyers out of the playoffs.

The Toronto native spent 10 seasons in the National Hockey League in all, also playing with Toronto, Philadelphia, Vancouver, Atlanta and Washington.

After retiring from hockey, Meehan received his undergraduate degree from Canisius College and a law degree at the University of Buffalo. Upon graduating in 1982, he joined the law firm of Cohen, Swados, Wright, Hanifan, Bradford and Brett, where he was involved in some of the Sabres' legal work. He was named the team's assistant general manager in the summer of 1984, the first ex-Sabre player to move into the club's front office.

Gerry lives in Amherst with his wife, Mirella, and their three children, Danny, Adam and Katie.

HEAD COACH

Whenever Rick Dudley shows up in Buffalo, wins seem to follow. The Buffalo Sabres hope this tradition goes on for several seasons.

Dudley was hired as the 12th coach of the team in June 16, 1989. In his first season on the job he led the Sabres to a 45-27-8 record, third-best in the NHL. The team's 98 points were the highest number since the 1983-84 season. The rookie coach finished in a tie for third in the voting for the Jack Adams Trophy, which goes to the coach of the year.

Dudley first arrived in Buffalo in 1973-74 after spending two seasons in the minor leagues. His aggressive style and trademark headband helped to make him one of the most popular players on the team. Dudley had his best season as a Sabre in 1974-75, when his 31 goals helped the team reach the Stanley Cup Finals for the only time in its history.

He returned to Cincinnati in the fall of 1975 when he jumped to the Stingers of the World Hockey Association. There the left winger led the team in scoring in his first season, and teamed up with such players as Mike Liut, Mark Messier and Mike Gartner.

Dudley jumped back to the Sabres in the spring of 1979, as he was the last player ever to leave the World Hockey Association for the National Hockey League. He helped the club reach the Stanley Cup semi-finals a year later. Dudley was claimed off waivers by Winnipeg on January 12, 1981, and he finished his NHL career with the Jets that season.

Rick served as a player-coach in Fredericton in 1981-82, and moved on to full-time coaching duties in 1982 with Carolina of the Atlantic Coast Hockey League. He stayed for four seasons, winning three championships. Dudley then moved up to the Flint Spirits of the International Hockey League in 1986-87, where he turned in two more fine seasons. (The Sabres had an agreement to send some players to Flint at that time, so Dudley often visited Buffalo's training camp during those years.) In 1988-89 Dudley jumped to New Haven of the American Hockey League. After a slow start, the Nighthawks lost in the Calder Cup Finals.

Dudley and his wife, Jahee, live in East Amherst.

ASSOCIATE COACH

It took some time for John Van Boxmeer to reach Buffalo during his days as a player. The same was true as a coach. Van Boxmeer moved up to the Sabres when he was named an assistant coach under Rick Dudley this past August. The former defenseman "traded" jobs with Don Lever.

Van Boxmeer coached five full seasons and part of a sixth in Rochester. That's the longest continuous stretch in Americ coaching history. He won a Calder Cup in one of those seasons (1986-87), and guided the Amerks to the finals again last season. Van Boxmeer had 226 career wins in Rochester, only 35 behind Joe Crozier's record.

The long-time NHL defenseman received his coaching start in the Sabres' organization during the 1984-85 season when he was named an assistant coach

under Jim Schoenfeld in Rochester. When Schoenfeld returned to the active ranks with the Sabres in December of that year. Van Boxmeer was named interim coach.

Van Boxmeer's career coaching record in the AHL was 226-177-46 (.554 winning percentage). He, Crozier and Mike Keenan are the only Amerk coaches to win AHL championships.

The former high-scoring defenseman started his professional career in Montreal, as the Canadiens selected him in the first round of the 1972 Entry Draft. Van Boxmeer also played with Colorado and Quebec in addition to Buffalo. He enjoyed four productive seasons with the Sabres, registering a career-high 69 points in 1980-81. (That was a Sabre record for points by a defenseman until Phil Housley scored 70 in 1988-89.) Van Boxmeer was selected to take part in the 1982 NHL All-Star Game. He had 54 assists in 1982-83. Van Boxmeer earned a Stanley Cup ring as a member of the Canadiens in 1975-76.

John and his wife, Judy, have a daughter, Ashley Marie, and a son, Henry Gerald.

JOHN VAN BOXMEER

ASSOCIATE COACH

It took some time for John Van Boxmeer to reach Buffalo during his days as a player. The same was true as a coach. Van Boxmeer moved up to the Sabres when he was named an assistant coach under Rick Dudley this past August. The former defenseman "traded" jobs with Don Lever.

Van Boxmeer coached five full seasons and part of a sixth in Rochester. That's the longest continuous stretch in Amerk coaching history. He won a Calder Cup in one of those seasons (1986-87), and guided the Amerks to the finals again last season. Van Boxmeer had 226 career wins in Rochester, only 35 behind Joe Crozier's record.

The long-time NHL defenseman received his coaching start in the Sabres' organization during the 1984-85 season when he was named an assistant coach

under Jim Schoenfeld in Rochester. When Schoenfeld returned to the active ranks with the Sabres in December of that year, Van Boxmeer was named interim coach.

Van Boxmeer's career coaching record in the AHL was 226-177-46 (.554 winning percentage). He, Crozier and Mike Keenan are the only Amerk coaches to win AHL championships.

The former high-scoring defenseman started his professional career in Montreal, as the Canadiens selected him in the first round of the 1972 Entry Draft. Van Boxmeer also played with Colorado and Quebec in addition to Buffalo. He enjoyed four productive seasons with the Sabres, registering a career-high 69 points in 1980-81. (That was a Sabre record for points by a defenseman until Phil Housley scored 70 in 1988-89.) Van Boxmeer was selected to take part in the 1982 NHL All-Star Game. He had 54 assists in 1982-83. Van Boxmeer earned a Stanley Cup ring as a member of the Canadiens in 1975-76. John and his wife, Judy, have a daughter, Ashley Marie, and a son, Henry Gerald.

Ramsay retired to concentrate on his duties as assistant coach in the fall of the 1985. He stayed in that post until November, 1986, when he was named Buffalo's head coach. Ramsay was shifted to the front office in December, 1986 as part of a reorganization by General Manager Gerry Meehan. He was named Assistant to the General Manager this past offseason.

It's Don Luce's job to try to find the next generation of Buffalo Sabres. If he's lucky, maybe he'll find some Don Luce-types out there.

Don works with Chief Scout Rudy Migay and the rest of the team's scouting staff during the course of the season. Together they search Canadian junior leagues, American high schools and colleges and European leagues in search of promising young players.

Luce has been with the Sabres almost from the beginning of the franchise. He was acquired with current Buffalo broadcaster Mike Robitaille from Detroit for Joe Daley in 1971. As a Sabre, Luce bloomed into one of the finest two-way players in the league.

Luce's best professional season came in 1974-75, when he had 33 goals and 43 assists for 76 points. The center won the Masterton Trophy that season. He and Craig Ramsay ranked as two of the league's best penalty-killers throughout the 1970's.

After a trade to Los Angeles, Luce went on to play for Toronto when he retired in the 1981-82 season. He rejoined the Sabres' organization in 1984, and worked on special assignments and American scouting before taking his current role in 1987. Luce was given his current title this past summer.

NHL NOTES OF INTEREST

•ENTRY DRAFT: It will be held on June 22, 1991 in Buffalo as part of the Annual NHL Congress. To be eligible, a player must be at least 18 years old by September 15 of that draft year, and not older than 20 by September 15 of that draft year. Starting in 1987, 18-year-old players were allowed to be selected only in the first three rounds of the draft. A drafted player must be made an offer by the next draft, or he may be eligible to be drafted again. There is no maximum age for players in Europe, who must be drafted before they can sign with an NHL team.

GOALS-AGAINST AVERAGE: To calculate for a player or team, divide goals against by minutes played and multiply by 60.

GOALS-FOR AVERAGE: To calculate for a goalie, divide goals scored by his team while he played by minutes played and multiply by 60.

PLUS-MINUS RATING: A player received a "plus-one" when he is on the ice for an even-strength or short-handed goal by his team. He receives a "minus-one" when he is on the ice for an even-strength or short-handed goal by the other team. The overall season rating is determined by totaling all of the pluses and minuses for the season.

POWER PLAY RANKINGS: When a team scores during a five minute power play situation, it is considered that a new situation is about to begin. Therefore, if a team scores one power play goal in five minutes it is considered one for two in the official league rankings. If it scores two goals in that time, it is considered two for three. If a team has a two man advantage, it is considered to be two separate power-play opportunities for statistical purposes.

ROOKIE: In order to be considered a rookie, a player must not have played in 25 or more NHL games in any preceding season, nor in six or more NHL games in each of any two preceding seasons.

SAVE PERCENTAGE: To calculate for a player or team, subtract goals-against from shots-against, then divide that figure (saves) by shots against.

SHOTS AGAINST AVERAGE: To calculate for a player or team, divide shots against by minutes played and multiply by 60.

SUPPLEMENTAL DRAFT: It will be held at the NHL Congress sometime before the Entry Draft. To be eligible, a player must be 21 or older, never have been claimed in an Entry Draft, never have played professionally and must have played for at least one season in college in North America when he was 18, 19, or 20. Free agents eligible for the Supplemental Draft can not play in the NHL unless they were selected in the Supplemental Draft and signed to a contract before the start of the regular season.

TIE-BREAKERS IN THE STANDINGS: According to the NHL, the following is the official method of determining which team is higher in the standings if two or more clubs have the same number of points:

- 1. Overall wins.
- 2. Points in head-to-head competition.
- 3. Overall goals scored minus overall goals allowed.
- 4. Special emergency meeting or conference call of general managers.

There is no provision for a coin flip. The same procedure is used for determining the order of the Entry Draft.

TRADING DEADLINE: The deadline is the 26th day preceding the final day of the NHL regular season. The date also marks the last day for loans and recalls from minor league teams except in emergency (usually injury-related) situations.







Lever spent parts of two seasons with Rochester, playing for the Amerks in 1985-86 and 1986-87. He was a player-coach in his final pro season, and he helped the Americans win the Calder Cup. Lever moved right into the coaching ranks after that, serving as an assistant coach for the Sabres under Ted Sator and Rick Dudley.

The team's new coach has plenty of experience at all levels of the game. Lever played his junior hockey in nearby Niagara Falls, Ontario. After scoring

126 points in 63 games for the Flyers, he was the first draft choice (and third pick overall) of the Vancouver Canucks in 1972. He spent almost eight full seasons there, and he set his career-high of 38 goals there in 1974-75.

Don was traded to Atlanta in February, 1980, and moved with the Flames to Calgary that summer. He was dealt to Colorado in 1981, and again he was a part of a franchise shift as the Rockies became the New Jersey Devils in 1982. The Sabres acquired his rights from the Devils on September 9, 1985, and he spent two seasons as a player in Buffalo's organization. During that time he played his 1,000th NHL game.

Don, his wife Karen and their children, Michael, Sarah and Caitlin, live in Amherst.



RADIO -TELEVISION INFORMATION

It's a year of change for the Sabres' broadcasting arrangement, as the team has switched television and radio stations while doing a little shuffling among its announcers.

A total of 30 of Buffalo's road games will be broadcast on WUTV, Channel 29 in Buffalo, while 30 home games will be shown on cable through the Niagara Frontier Sports Network. Fans will hear the familiar voice of Ted Darling doing the play-by-play. Darling has been with the organization since it played its first game in 1970. Before coming to Buffalo, Darling graduated from Ryerson Institute and worked for the CBC and for "Hockey Night in Canada."

Color commentator Mike Robitaille is back for his eighth season of broadcasting for the Sabres. The former NHL defenseman played for the Sabres from 1971 to 1974. He and current General Manager Gerry Meehan were traded to Vancouver together in 1974.

Robitaille will be joined in the analyst's role by Jim Lorentz, who moves over from radio. The ex-Sabre forward has been working on Buffalo's broadcasts since 1981.

On the radio side, WGR (AM-550) is again broadcasting the Sabres' games. The station was the team's first broadcast outlet. Rick Jeanneret and Danny Gare will be the announcers for most of the games. Jeanneret is entering his 20th season as a Buffalo broadcaster, while Gare will be the analyst. Danny was one of the top players in Buffalo history, having played for the team from 1975 to 1981.

The radio broadcasts will be heard on a network of stations throughout the area. We suggest you check your local listings to see if Sabre games are carried in your area.


