



FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP

February 4, 2026 – CALGARY FLAMES [4] vs. EDMONTON OLIERIS [3]

The Calgary Flames earned a thrilling 4–3 Battle of Alberta victory over the Edmonton Oilers on February 4 at the Scotiabank Saddledome to head into the Olympic break on a high. Calgary struck three times on the power play, with Jonathan Huberdeau opening the scoring and Matvei Gridin adding another man-advantage marker in the first before Connor Zary extended the lead in the second. After Edmonton battled back to tie the game early in the third, Ryan Lomberg restored the Flames’ advantage at the 6:44 mark, finishing a setup from Nazem Kadri and Zach Whitecloud for the eventual game-winner. Matvei Gridin (1G, 1A), Nazem Kadri (2A), Zach Whitecloud (2A) and MacKenzie Weegar (2A) all recorded multi-point nights, while Devin Cooley was sharp under heavy pressure, stopping 36 of 39 shots to backstop Calgary to an emotional home win.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the fourth and final meeting this season between the Flames and Sharks. Calgary owns a 2-1-0 record through three previous meetings with San Jose in 2025-26.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 9-6-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 13-18-2 against Western Conference opponents.

NATIONAL PRIDE:

Martin Pospisil returns from the Olympic Winter Games Milano Cortina 2026, helping Slovakia finish fourth place in the men's hockey tournament. Pospisil skated in four games for his nation, registering an assist in their quarterfinal victory over Germany. He was named as one of the six players to Team Slovakia's preliminary roster for the Olympic Winter Games Milano Cortina 2026, and in August 2024, Pospisil helped Slovakia win their Olympic Ice Hockey Qualification Group, posting three assists in three games.



HIT THE GRIDDY:

With his two-point outing in Calgary's last game before the Olympic break, Matvei Gridin (1-1—2) became the first teenager to post a multi-point game for the Flames since Matthew Tkachuk had five multi-point outings in 2017-18. The 19-year-old has three goals this season, with only two teenagers having scored as many goals in a season for the Flames over the past 10 years:

Matthew Tkachuk (6 in 2017-18) (13 in 2016-17)
Sam Bennett (18 in 2015-16)

MAGIC NUMBER:

With their four-goal outburst against Edmonton in their last outing on February 4, the Calgary Flames have won 49-straight games when scoring four or more goals, dating back to December 16, 2023. Calgary is 12-0-0 this season when reaching or surpassing the four-goal mark in a game.

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

With his assist on Joel Farabee's shorthanded goal in Calgary and San Jose's last meeting on January 31, Mikael Backlund recorded his 35th career shorthanded point. He moved into a tie with Mika Zibanejad for the fourth most by a Swedish player in NHL history. The goal would hold up as the game-winner giving Backlund an assist on a game-winning goal for the 54th time in his career, tying Theo Fleury for the fifth-most instances in Flames history. Jarome Iginla leads the list with 89.

Backlund enters play today with 227 career goals, sitting two shy of tying Kent Nilsson (229) for the fifth-most in Flames franchise history. With two more tallies, he would also tie Nilsson for the most goals by a Swedish-born player in Flames history, with the pair ranking as the only two Swedes to eclipse 200 goals with the club.

KILLER CONFIDENCE:

The Calgary Flames enter tonight's contest with the NHL's third-best penalty kill unit since December 29, boasting a league-leading 88.1% on the kill over that span. In that timeframe, the Flames have successfully killed 37 of 42 shorthanded situations with the second-lowest powerplay goals against per game average in the NHL at 0.28.

Thanks to Joel Farabee's goal on the PK in Calgary and San Jose's last meeting on January 31, the Flames have now scored eight shorthanded goals as a club in 2025-26, the most by any team. Farabee leads the Flames with four shorthanded goals, while Mikael Backlund has four shorthanded points from one goal and three assists on the kill.



THE BEES KNEES:

Joel Farabee scored his fourth shorthanded goal of the season in Calgary and San Jose's last meeting on January 31 to tie Joel Armia and Ryan McLeod for the most among all skaters so far in 2025-26. Only one Flames skater has more shorthanded goals in a campaign in the past 25 years: Mark Jankowski (5 in 2018-19).

NACHO 300:

Joel Hanley has 299 NHL games to his credit and has a chance to skate in his 300th NHL game tonight against San Jose. Hanley played two full seasons in Junior A hockey with Newmarket before playing four seasons with the University of Massachusetts. He signed a contract with Portland of the American Hockey League after his college eligibility ended. The Montreal Canadiens signed Hanley to a one-year, two-way contract in the summer of 2015 and he would make his NHL debut on March 20, 2016 against the Calgary Flames. Following that, Hanley would spend time with Arizona and Dallas, scoring his first NHL goal on February 1, 2022, again against the Calgary Flames. Calgary claimed Hanley off waivers from Dallas on March 5, 2024, where he has played 116 games in Flames threads.

CALIFORNIA PAINT:

Flames netminders Dustin Wolf and Devin Cooley are both California natives (Wolf: Gilroy, CA, Cooley: Los Gatos, CA).

Dustin Wolf played his first NHL game against the San Jose Sharks, turning aside 23 saves to record his first NHL win on April 12, 2023. Earlier this season, Wolf recorded a 16-save shutout in Calgary's first meeting with San Jose on November 13, becoming just the second California-born goaltender to record a shutout against a California-based team in NHL history, joining Thatcher Demko (Dec. 6, 2021 vs. LAK).

Devin Cooley was a member of the San Jose Sharks during his rookie campaign in 2023-24, playing the first six games of his NHL career with San Jose. Cooley has never faced the Sharks in his NHL career but faced the San Jose Barracuda twice in the AHL last year, posting a 1-1-0 record.

SUCCESS AGAINST SAN JOSE:

Dating back to April of 2022, the Flames are 13-2-0 against the San Jose Sharks and have swept their season-series with San Jose twice (2022-23 and 2024-25) over that span. Calgary has won eight of their last nine games against the Sharks since April of 2024.

WEEGSY BABY:

With two assists against Edmonton on February 4, MacKenzie Weegar recorded his 149th and 150th points as a Calgary Flame, becoming the 15th defenceman in franchise history to reach the 150-point plateau. Weegar has posted 35 goals and 115 assists through 300 games with Calgary.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

With Calgary's 2-0 over San Jose in these clubs' first meeting, the Flames recorded their 40th win against the Sharks on home ice. Calgary has now posted 40+ wins all-time on home ice against 11-different franchises.
