PHILADELPHIA FLYERS

All-Time Wild Record: 13-17-5 (8-5-3 at Grand Casino Arena, 5-12-2 at Philadelphia)

2025-26: The Flyers won the series-opening game, 2-1, in Philadelphia...RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** scored Minnesota's lone goal, assisted by C Marco Rossi and D **Jonas Brodin**...G **Jesper Wallstedt** stopped 19-of-21 shots faced for the Wild...LW **Noah Cates** and RW **Owen Tippett** scored for Philadelphia...G **Dan Vladar** saved 15-of-16 shots faced to earn the win for the Flyers.

WILD LEADERS: LW **Nick Foligno** leads Minnesota with 30 points (18-12=30) in 49 career games against the Flyers...LW **Marcus Johansson** (8-13=21, in 44 games) and RW **Mats Zuccarello** (5-16=21, in 35 games) each own 21 career points against Philadelphia...Tarasenko owns 19 points (8-11=19) in 23 games.

WILD GOALIES: G **Filip Gustavsson** is 0-2-0 with a 6.09 GAA and a .789 SV% in two starts vs. the Flyers...Wallstedt is 0-0-1 with a 1.92 GAA and a .905 SV% in his lone start earlier this season.

FLYERS LEADERS: C **Sean Couturier** leads Philadelphia with 15 points (9-6=15) in 19 career games against Minnesota...RW **Travis Konecny** has 10 points (3-7=10) in 14 games...D **Travis Sanheim** (2-7=9, in 14 games) and C **Christian Dvorak** (2-9=9, in 26 games) have nine points each.

FLYERS GOALIES: G **Samuel Ersson** is 1-1-0 with a 4.09 GAA and a .830 SV% in two starts against the Wild...Vladar is 3-1-1 with a 2.63 GAA and a .896 SV% in five starts.

CONNECTIONS: Minnesota Goaltending Coach **Frederic Chabot** went 0-1-1 in four games with the Flyers in the 1993-94 season...C **Ryan Hartman** skated in 19 games with Philadelphia during the 2018-19 season...RW **Bobby Brink** was selected by Philadelphia in the second round (No. 34 overall) of the 2019 NHL Draft and skated in 94 points (36-59=94) in four seasons (2021-22, 2023-26) with the Flyers...Flyers Vice President & Assistant General Manager **Brent Flahr** served as Wild Assistant General Manager (2009-18) before joining Philadelphia...LW **Alex Bump** is from Prior Lake and played three seasons at Prior Lake High School (2019-22)...LW **Noah Cates** is from Stillwater and played four seasons at the University of Minnesota Duluth (2018-22)...D **Nick Seeler** is from Eden Prairie and was selected by the Wild in the fifth round (131st overall) of the 2011 NHL Draft, collecting 11 points (2-9=11) in 99 games with Minnesota (2017-20).

FAST FACTS: Minnesota has posted back-to-back shutouts twice against Philadelphia (last, 11/11-11/14/17)...The first time was Feb. 10-12, 2003, which also marked the first back-to-back shutouts in team history...The Wild has shutout the Flyers five times in the 33 all-time meetings.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: At 38-16-11, ranks fourth in the NHL with 87 points, the second-highest point total through a season's first 65 games in franchise history...Has scored first in 40 games, most in the NHL...Ranks T-1st in the NHL with eight shutouts (also NYI), tied for the single-season franchise record (five other occurrences)...Ranks second in the NHL with 24 extra-time games played and third with 13 extra-time victories...Ranks fifth in the NHL with 15.6 blocked shots per game...Ranks third in the NHL with 54 PPG and fourth with a 25.2 PP% (54/214).

Matt Boldy: Owns 73 points (36-37=73) on the season, tied for his career high (also 2024-25)...Ranks second in the NHL with 17 points (7-10=17) since Feb. 1...For the season, ranks T-2nd in the NHL with four SHG, T-4th with 36 goals and 13th in points...Ranks second on the Wild in goals, points, assists and PPG (nine), T-2nd in plus-minus (plus-19) and T-4th in GWG (three).

Jonas Brodin: Currently at 899 career games played, all with Minnesota.

Bobby Brink: Scored his first goal in a Wild sweater vs. UTA (3/10).

Joel Eriksson Ek: Owns 28 points (13-15=28) in his last 30 games played...Ranks third on the Wild in points (17-27=44) and goals.

Brock Faber: In 33 games since Dec. 14, ranks T-9th among NHL defensemen with eight goals and T-10th with 27 points (8-19=27)...Since Nov. 7, ranks fourth among NHL defensemen (seventh among all skaters) with a plus-33 rating...For the season, ranks seventh among NHL defensemen in goals (14) and third among all skaters in even strength TOI/G (21:07) and T-7th in TOI/G (24:48)...His 14 goals are tied for the third-highest single-season total by a defenseman in Wild history, trailing only Brent Burns (17 goals, 2010-11; 15 goals, 2007-08)...His 13 even-strength goals rank T-4th among NHL defensemen this season and mark a single-season franchise record among Wild defensemen.

Filip Gustavsson: Saved all 25 shots faced vs. Utah (3/10) to earn his 15th career shutout, tying Dwayne Roloson for third in franchise history...Per NHL Stats, Gustavsson (210 GP) became the second-fastest Swedish goaltender in NHL history to 15 career shutouts behind only Henrik Lundqvist (178 GP)...Owns a point in 11 of his last 12 games overall (10-1-1) and 12 of his last 13 starts (10-1-2)...In 28 games (27 starts) since Nov. 16, is 20-3-4 and ranks first in the NHL with a .923 SV%, third with a 2.17 GAA, and T-4th in wins and with three shutouts (min. 14 GP)...For the season, holds a 24-10-6 record and ranks T-3rd in SV% (.914) and shutouts (four), T-7th in wins, and eighth in GAA (2.46).

Quinn Hughes: Owns an active five-game point streak (1-5=6)...Since Jan. 17, has notched a point in 16 of 17 games played and ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 22 assists and seventh (second among defensemen) in points (3-22=25)...Leads NHL defensemen with 58 assists this season (fifth among all skaters) and 29 PPP (2-27=29) and ranks fifth with 64 points (6-58=64)...Leads all NHL skaters with a 27:40 TOI/G and even strength TOI/G (23:12), and fourth in power-play TOI/G (4:21) this season...In 33 games since debuting with the Wild on Dec. 14, leads NHL defensemen (third among all skaters) with 37 assists and ranks second (ninth among skaters) with 41 points (4-37=41).

Kirill Kaprizov: Has scored a goal in five consecutive home games, tied for the fourth-longest home goal streak in Wild history, and owns a goal in four of his last five games overall...With two points (1-1=2) vs. UTA (3/10), reached 242 career assists and moved past Pierre-Marc Bouchard (241) for fifth in franchise history...Ranks first in the NHL in PPG (seven), T-2nd in goals (12), and sixth in points (12-14=26) in 17 games since Jan. 17...On the season, ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 37 goals and 16 PPG, fourth with 227 shots, and T-6th with 78 points (37-41=78)...Ranks first on Wild in goals, assists, points, PPG, and shots, and GWG (five).

Jared Spurgeon: Currently at 998 career games played...Owns 434 points (123-311=434), four shy of passing Marian Gaborik (219-218=437) for third in franchise history...Needs four assists to pass Ryan Suter (314) for second in franchise history.

Yakov Trenin: Logged a game-high nine hits vs. UTA (3/10), tied for the second-highest total of his NHL career...Leads the NHL with 326 hits, the third-highest single-season total in franchise history and the second-highest total in the NHL through 65 games since the 2005-06 season.

Jesper Wallstedt: Owns a 7-3-1 record against teams currently in a playoff position as of 3/10 and leads the NHL with a .929 SV% against such teams (min. 10 GP)...Is 7-3-4 with a 2.60 GAA, .917 SV% and two shutouts in 14 road starts this season...Ranks T-3rd in the NHL with four shutouts.

Mats Zuccarello: Currently at 499 career assists...Recorded a nine-game road point streak (5-7=12) from 1/8 - 3/6, fourth-longest in Wild history.

LOCKING IT DOWN

- The Wild ranks T-1st in the NHL with eight shutouts this season, tied for the single-season franchise record (five other occurrences, last 2015-16 season).
- Ranks second in the NHL with 2.53 goals against/game since November 1.

- Is 36-1-9 (.880) this season when allowing three or fewer goals in regulation, the best point percentage in the NHL.

BY THE PERIOD

- Rank T-5th in the NHL by allowing .75 first-period goals per game this season and T-7th with a plus-12 goal differential in the opening frame.
- Ranks second the NHL by allowing 0.85 second-period goals per game this season and sixth with a plus-13 second-period goal differential.
- Since Nov. 1, ranks third in the NHL with a plus-19 third-period goal differential and T-4th by allowing 0.89 third-period goals per game.
- Ranks second in the NHL with 24 extra-time games played and third with 13 extra-time victories

OUT IN FRONT

- Has scored first in 40 games this season, most in the NHL.
- Owns a 29-5-6 record (.800) when scoring first this season.
- From 11/7 - 11/26/25, did not trail in regulation for over eight consecutive games, a franchise-record span of 505:41 minutes, the 17th longest streak in NHL history.
- The Wild scored the game-opening goal in 12 consecutive contests from 10/30 - 11/23, a franchise record. The run was tied for the 10th-longest streak in NHL history and is the longest since Colorado's 13-game streak in the 2022-23 season.
- As a franchise, holds a 685-181-112 all-time record (.758) when scoring first in a regular-season game.

SCORING UPTICK

- Minnesota ranks third in the NHL with 3.82 goals scored per game since Dec. 14.

- Since Dec. 14, ranks T-2nd in the NHL in PPG (30) and PPG/game (0.91), fourth in PP% (28.8, 30/104), and T-7th in shots on goal/game (29.5).
- The Wild scored a power-play goal in a season-long eight consecutive games from 1/29 - 3/3, tied for the longest streak in the NHL this season (also DAL, EDM, VAN) and tied for the third-longest streak in franchise history.
- The Wild leads the NHL with 83 assists and ranks T-1st with 102 points (19-83=102) recorded by defensemen since Dec. 14.

RED HOT AND ROLLING

- At 38-16-11, ranks fourth in the NHL with 87 points, the second-highest point total through a season's first 65 games in franchise history.
- Is 35-10-8 (.736) since Nov. 1, leading in the NHL in points (78) and ranking second in point percentage and third in wins.
- Since Nov. 1, ranks first in the NHL in team SV% (.916), second in team GAA (2.48) and T-2nd in goal differential (plus-51).
- Recorded a seven-game road point streak (5-0-2) from 12/8 - 1/3, the team's longest road point streak since a nine-game run last season (Oct. 29 - Dec. 6, 2024).
- Recorded a 14-game home point streak (12-0-2) from 11/1 - 12/20, the longest run in franchise history and the second-longest streak in the NHL this season (COL, 22).
- Won seven consecutive games from 12/8 - 12/20, tied for the team's longest streak of the season (also seven GP, 11/15 - 11/29) and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- All seven wins from 12/8 - 12/20 were in regulation, tying the franchise record for most consecutive wins in regulation (2x previously).
- Recorded an 11-game point streak (10-0-2) from 11/7 - 12/2, the third-longest run in franchise history and the club's longest since a franchise-record 14-game run (11-0-3) from 2/17 - 3/15/23.
- Finished 11-1-2 (.857) in November, ranking T-1st in the NHL in wins and points (24).
- Recorded 10 or more wins in both November and December 2025, marking the fourth time in franchise history the team has won 10 or more games in consecutive months (February and March, 2014-15; December and January, 2016-17; March and April, 2021-22).
- Minnesota's 24 points in November 2025 was the highest November total in franchise history, while its 11 wins ranked T-1st (also Nov. 2011).
- Matt Boldy and Kirill Kaprizov were Minnesota's co-leaders in goals in November, with each player scoring 10 goals in 14 games. It marked the first time in team history that the Wild had two players each score 10 or more goals in the same calendar month.

- Ranks first in the NHL in PPG (seven), T-2nd in goals (12), and sixth in points (12-14=26) in 17 games since Jan. 17.
- On the season, ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 37 goals and 16 PPG, fourth with 227 shots, and T-6th with 78 points (37-41=78).
- Ranks first on Wild in goals, assists, points, PPG, and shots, and GWG (five).
- Scored the 220th goal of his NHL career vs. TBL (3/3), moving past Marian Gaborik (219) for the all-time franchise record.

- Has surpassed the 70-point plateau for the fourth season in his career, one of two players (Matt Boldy, 2x) in franchise history with multiple 70-point seasons.
- With an overtime assist at NSH (2/4), recorded his ninth overtime point (4-5=9) of 2025-26 and tied Connor McDavid and Leon Draisaitl (both w/ 9 in 2024-25) for the most overtime points in a single season in NHL history.
- Scored his fourth OTG of the season vs. MTL (2/2), T-1st in the NHL, and now ranks T-1st in the NHL since debuting in 2020-21 with a franchise-record 14 career OTG.
- Is the second player in franchise history to record four-plus 30 goal seasons (Gaborik, 5x).
- Named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending 1/25 after recording nine points (3-6=9) across four games.
- Tied his season-high in points (2-1=3) and plus-minus rating (plus-3) vs. DET (1/22).
- Scored a goal vs. NYI (1/10) to move his career point total to 438 (210-228=438) and pass Marian Gaborik for second on the franchise's all-time points list (Koivu, 205-504=709).
- Recorded a power-play assist at WPG (12/27), reaching 146 career power-play points (70-76=146) and passing Marian Gaborik (145) for second in franchise history (Koivu, 251).
- Notched a PPG vs. WSH (12/16) to reach 70 career PPG, establishing a new franchise record, and 206 career goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (205) for second in franchise history.
- Reached 200 career goals in his 344th career game, becoming fourth-fastest player drafted in fifth round or later to hit the landmark (Brett Hull, 280 GP; Luc Robitaille, 323 GP; Pavel Bure, 328 GP).
- With two goals vs. COL (11/28), reached 115 career home goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (113 home goals) for most in franchise history.
- Tallied the 115th MPG of his career with two goals (2-0=2) vs. COL (11/28), moving past Marian Gaborik (114 MPG) for second in franchise history (Koivu, 153).
- Scored a goal vs. WPG (10/28) and reached 401 career points (191-210=401) to pass Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth-most points in franchise history.

HE'S GOING STREAKING

- Kaprizov recorded an eight-game point streak (7-4=11) from 1/29 - 3/3, his longest of the season.
- Kaprizov posted multiple points in five consecutive games (3-9=12) from 1/17 - 1/24, marking the second-longest multiple-point-game streak of his career (seven consecutive MPG, 10/15 - 11/1/24) and third-longest in franchise history.
- Recorded a season-long five-game goal streak (6-1=7) from 11/21 - 11/29, tied for the fourth-longest streak in the NHL this season.

- Per NHL Stats, is the third American defenseman in NHL history to reach the mark in five or more consecutive seasons (P. Housley, 11 from '82-83 to '92-93; R. Larson, five from '81-82 to '85-86).
- Became the fastest player in Wild history to record 10 multi-point games, doing so in his 30th game with the team.
- Recorded 11-game point and assist streaks (2-17=19) from 1/17 - 2/26, tying the longest point streak of his NHL career (also 11 games, 11/6-11/25/23 with VAN) and marking the fourth-longest point streak in Wild history.
- The 11-game assist streak extended his franchise record and is the longest assist streak in the NHL this season.
- Per NHL Stats, the 11-game assist streak also tied Mark Howe (1979-80 w/ HFD) for the second-longest point streak by a defenseman in their first season with a franchise, behind only Steve Duchesne (15 GP in 1992-93 w/ QUE).
- Per NHL Stats, is the first defenseman in NHL history to register an assist streak of 10-plus games in his first season with a franchise.

- Also reached 400 career assists vs. MTL (2/2) in his 484th career game, becoming the third-fastest defenseman in NHL history to reach the milestone (B. Orr, 437 games; P. Coffey, 464 games).
- Per NHL Stats, is the second-fastest American skater in NHL history to hit the 400-assist milestone, behind only C. Janney (477 GP).
- Recorded 29 assists in his first 25 games with Minnesota, the most ever by a NHL defenseman in his first 25 games with a club. Among all skaters, he trails only W. Gretzky (35, LAK, 1988-89), P. Forsberg (34, PHI, 2005-06) and C. Janney (30, STL, 1992-92).
- Finished with two points (1-1=2) and a season-high plus-4 rating at EDM (1/31), tied for the highest plus-minus rating of his career (two other occurrences).
- Recorded 20 assists in January, T-2nd among NHL skaters (first among defensemen) and the highest single-month total in franchise history. His 20 assists marked the second-highest January total by a defenseman in NHL history (Bobby Orr, 21 assists, Jan. 1973).
- Per NHL Stats, tied Paul Coffey (23 GP w/ PIT) and Sergei Zubov (23 GP w/ PIT) as the fastest defenseman in NHL history to record 25 assists with a franchise.
- Became the second player in NHL history with four three-assist games through his first 20 games with a franchise. (Dan Daoust, 4 GP w/ TOR).
- With two assists at TOR (1/19), became the fastest player in Wild history to reach 20 points with the club, doing so in his 18th game.
- Overall, owns eight three-assist outings this season, doing so for the second time in his career (also 9 in 2023-24). Is one of four defensemen in NHL history to reach the mark in multiple campaigns, alongside Paul Coffey (2x) and Bobby Orr (5x).
- Is one of two defensemen since 1995-96 to record eight three-assist outings in a single season (also 9 in 2023-24). The others: Roman Josi (8 in 2021-22).
- Finished with four assists (0-4=4) at ANA (1/2) to set the Wild's single-game franchise record for assists by a defenseman and tie Matt Dumba (1-3=4, 3/29/18 vs. DAL) for single-game franchise point record among defensemen.
- Notched fourth career four-assist game at ANA (1/2), one point shy of his single-game career point record (1-4=5, 11/2/23 at SJS). Per NHL Stats, tied Phil Housley for the fourth-most four-assist games by an American defenseman in NHL history. Gary Suter (8), Chris Chelios (6) and Brian Leetch (6) are the only ones with more.

- **Matt Boldy** owns 73 points (36-37=73) on the season, tied for his career high (also 2024-25).
- Ranks second in the NHL with 17 points (7-10=17) since Feb. 1.
- For the season, ranks T-2nd in the NHL with four SHG, T-4th with 36 goals and 13th in points.
- Ranks second on the Wild in goals, points, assists and PPG (nine), T-2nd in plus-minus (plus-19) and T-4th in GWG (three).
- Recorded a career-best, seven-game assist streak (11 assists) from 1/31 - 3/3. Also had a 10-game point streak (8-13=21) from 1/24 - 3/3, tied for the longest of his career (10 games, 4/10 - 4/26/22).

- **Jared Spurgeon** scored the sixth OT goal of his career at NSH (2/4), tying Matt Dumba for second in franchise history.
- Owns 434 points (123-311=434), four shy of passing Marian Gaborik (219-218=437) for third in franchise history.
- Needs four assists to pass Ryan Suter (314) for second in franchise history.

THE WALL OF ST. PAUL

- **Jesper Wallstedt** owns a 7-3-1 record against teams currently in a playoff position as of 3/10 and leads the NHL with a .929 SV% against such teams (min. 10 GP).
- Is 7-3-4 with a 2.60 GAA, .917 SV% and two shutouts in 14 road starts this season.
- Ranks T-3rd in the NHL with four shutouts.
- Posted 39 saves at EDM (1/31), tied for the second-highest single-game total of his career and season, while tallying his first career assist, the 13th goalie in team history to do so.
- Made 29 saves vs. CHI (1/27) while also stopping all three Blackhawk shootout attempts to surpass Darcy Kuemper (2013-14) and Kaapo Kahkonen (2021-22) for the second-most wins by a rookie goaltender in a season in Wild history.
- Now 14-6-4 on the season, Wallstedt needs two wins to match Kahkonen in 2020-21 (16) for the franchise rookie record.
- Posted a 27-save win at CBJ (12/18) and improved to 10-1-2 (.846), setting the franchise benchmark for fewest games to 10 wins in a season by a rookie goaltender (previously Kaapo Kahkonen, 14 GP in 2020-21). He also tied Devan Dubnyk (13 GP in 2014-15) for the fastest to 10 wins by any Wild goaltender.
- Posted a 33-save shutout at EDM (12/2) for fifth career shutout in his 15th career game, the second-fewest appearances in NHL history to reach the landmark (F. Brimsek, nine GP on 12/18/38).
- Went 7-0-0 from in seven starts from 11/7 - 12/2, stopping 235 of 242 shots faced for a 0.98 GAA, .971 SV% and four shutouts and joining Jeremy Swayman (8-0-0 in 2021-22) as the second rookie goaltender in the last five years to record a win streak of seven or more games.

- Per NHL Stats, Gustavsson (210 GP) became the second-fastest Swedish goaltender in NHL history to 15 career shutouts behind only Henrik Lundqvist (178 GP).
- Owns a point in 11 of his last 12 games overall (10-1-1) and 12 of his last 13 starts (10-1-2).
- In 28 games (27 starts) since Nov. 16, is 20-3-4 and ranks first in the NHL with a .923 SV%, third with a 2.17 GAA, and T-4th in wins and with three shutouts (min. 14 GP).
- For the season, holds a 24-10-6 record and ranks T-3rd in SV% (.914) and shutouts (four), T-7th in wins, and eighth in GAA (2.46)
- Made a season-high 44 saves at COL (2/27), the fourth-highest save total of his NHL career.
- Appeared in 16 consecutive home games (15 starts) without a regulation loss (10-0-5) from Nov. 1 - Feb. 2, tied for the longest streak in franchise history (Dubnyk, 12-0-3, 2017-18 season).
