AT A GLANCE

WE'RE GOING STREAKIN'

The Kings skate into Canadian Tire Centre riding a 10-game point streak (7-0-3) vs. Ottawa, dating back to Nov. 7, 2019. It is the longest active point streak against any one opponent for the Kings and is tied for the second-longest active point streak among all NHL teams against the Senators behind Vegas (12GP, 11-0-1). Should the team collect a point in Ottawa tomorrow, it would be the ninth different point streak of at least 11 games against any one opponent in franchise history.

QUINT-ONTARIO

Forward **Quinton Byfield** skates into Canada's capital fresh off recording his team-leading sixth multi-point game (1-1=2) of the season on Thursday in Toronto, and second in as many games (1-1=2 on Nov. 11 at MTL). Byfield's goal in the extra frame against the Maple Leafs was the fourth overtime goal of his career, which tied him with Carolina's **Seth Jarvis** for the third most overtime goals among 2020 draftees, trailing only Detroit's **Lucas Raymond** (6) and tonight's opponent, Ottawa's **Tim Stutzle** (7). With his matching stat-lines through his first two stops in Eastern Canada, Byfield became the second player in Kings history to forge two-straight multi-point games with a game-winning goal on the road before age 24, following **Steve Bozek** (3-1=4, Oct. 20 - 21, 1981). The native of Newmarket, Ontario, can join **Luc Robitaille** (6-4=10, 3 GP from Nov. 18 - 25, 1989) as the only players in team history to register three consecutive multi-point nights that include a game-winner before turning 24 should he repeat the feat again tomorrow.


SWISS-SASTIONAL

Forward **Kevin Fiala** has found the scoresheet in each of the Kings first three stops to begin their mid-November road trip, totaling four points (3-1=4) with goals in Pittsburgh (Nov. 9), Montreal (Nov. 11), and Toronto (Nov. 13). The Kings' leading goalscorer looks to extend both this current goal-streak and his goal-streak against tonight's opponent, the Ottawa Senators, to a fourth game. Fiala has 15 points (6-9=15) in 14 career games against Ottawa and has lit the lamp four times in his last three matchups with the Atlantic Division foe, dating back to March 7, 2024.
