

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****October 20, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [1] vs. WINNIPEG JETS [2]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

Despite controlling stretches of play and outshooting the Winnipeg Jets 33–28, the Calgary Flames couldn't hold on to a second-period lead, falling 2–1 Monday night at the Scotiabank Saddledome. Rasmus Andersson opened the scoring midway through the middle frame with his second goal of the season; a point blast set up by a hard forecheck by Adam Klapka and Ryan Lomberg. The Jets rallied in the third as Jonathan Toews tied the game on a powerplay early, before Mark Scheifele netted the winner with just under five minutes to go. Goaltender Dustin Wolf was sharp, turning aside 26 of 28 shots for a .929 save percentage, while the Flames penalty kill was tested often, successfully killing off four of five Winnipeg powerplays.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of two meetings this season between the Flames and Canadiens. Calgary swept the season series against Montreal in 2024-25.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; in 2024-25, the Flames had a record of 4-7-5 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 15-11-6 against Eastern Conference opponents.

2024-25 SEASON RECAP VERSUS MONTREAL:

The Flames and Canadiens met twice during the 2024-25 season, with Calgary knocking off Montreal on both occasions:

GAME ONE (November 5, 2024 – at MTL):

The Calgary Flames and Montreal Canadiens first met last season at the Bell Centre on November 5. Montreal outshot Calgary 15–10 in the opening frame, but Dustin Wolf was sharp, keeping the game scoreless through 20 minutes. In the second, Connor Zary found a loose puck in the slot and ripped home his third of the season to give the visitors a 1–0 lead. Montreal answered late in the period to level things at one heading into the third. Joel Armia gave the Canadiens their first lead of the night midway through the final frame, but Calgary battled back as Matt Coronato tied the game with just under three minutes left in regulation to force overtime. In the extra frame, Coronato picked up the puck off a scramble draw, walked in, and scored his second of the night just seven seconds into overtime to lift the Flames to a 3–2 victory.

GAME TWO (March 8, 2025 – vs MTL):

The Flames welcomed the Canadiens to the Scotiabank Saddledome for their second and final meeting of the season on March 8. The opening period saw the clubs combine for 13 shots, but both Calgary's Dustin Wolf and Montreal's Jakub Dobeš were perfect to keep things scoreless through 20 minutes. The deadlock was finally broken at the 16:21 mark of the second when Joel Farabee scored in back-to-back games to put the home side up 1–0. The Flames locked things down in the third while Wolf made 10 saves in the final frame to preserve the shutout, as Calgary blanked Montreal 1–0 to sweep the season series.

THE LOMBORGHINI:

Ryan Lomberg picked up his first assist of the season on Monday night, helping set up Rasmus Andersson's second-period goal against Winnipeg. Lomberg leads the Flames in hits with 35 through the club's first seven games of 2025–26 and ranks third on the team in penalty minutes with 10.

RAZZLE DAZZLE:

Rasmus Andersson scored his second of the night on Monday against Winnipeg. The goal was the 49th of Andersson's career and he surpassed TJ Brodie (48) for the eighth-most goals by a Flames defenseman. With one more tally, Andersson can tie Phil Housley (50) for the seventh-most goals by a defenceman in Flames franchise history.

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

Flames captain Mikael Backlund surpassed Lanny McDonald (215) for the sixth-most goals in franchise history with his first of the season on October 14. With 13 more goals, Backlund would tie Kent Nilsson for fifth in franchise history and match the most goals by a Swedish-born player in Flames history. Backlund also matched Gary Suter (564) for sixth on the franchise's all-time points list with that goal and now has more points than any other Swedish-born skater in club history.

WEEGSY BABY:

MacKenzie Weegar recorded his second assist of the 2025–26 season on Saturday night in Vegas. Since joining the team in 2022–23, Weegar has collected 132 points — the most among all Calgary defencemen during that span. The next closest is Rasmus Andersson, who has registered 121 points (33 goals, 88 assists) since the start of the 2022–23 campaign. With one more goal, Weegar can match Pekka Rautakallio (33) for the 13th-most goals by a defenceman in Flames franchise history.

HUBY DOO:

Johnathan Huberdeau made his season debut on Saturday night, marking his return to the lineup with a goal. In his 14th NHL season, Huberdeau has now recorded at least a point in 13 of his 14 season debuts. The 32-year-old is coming off a steady rebound campaign in 2024-25, recording 28 goals and 34 assists for 62 points in 81 games, including 10 power-play goals and three shorthanded markers. He averaged a career-high 19:33 of ice time and ranked sixth among Flames skaters in blocked shots last season with 64.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

MacKenzie Weegar played his first NHL game against the Montreal Canadiens back on April 3rd of 2017.

Canadiens Head Coach Martin St. Louis played 69 games as a member of the Calgary Flames over two seasons, scoring four goals and 16 assists for 20 points as a Flame.

This is Calgary's first meeting with an Eastern Conference opponent in 2025-26.

KADRI 1KOUNTDOWN:

Now in his 17th NHL season, Nazem Kadri is closing in on his 1000th NHL game, entering tonight with 992 games played. Drafted 7th overall by the Toronto Maple Leafs in 2009, Kadri made his NHL debut later that season and became a full-time member of the Leafs roster by 2012–13. During his tenure in Toronto, he developed into a consistent scoring threat, posting back-to-back 32-goal seasons in 2016–17 and 2017–18.

In July 2019, Kadri was traded to the Colorado Avalanche, where he elevated his game to another level. His physical edge and clutch scoring became key elements of Colorado's identity, particularly during their 2022 Stanley Cup run. That year, Kadri recorded a career-best 87 points (28G, 59A) in 71 games and added 15 points in 16 playoff contests, including the overtime winner in Game 4 of the Stanley Cup Final. His determination and timely heroics helped the Avalanche capture their first championship in over two decades.

Kadri joined the Calgary Flames as a free agent, signing in August 2022, immediately taking on a leadership role both on and off the ice. He became an alternate captain and a central figure in the team's offensive core. In 2024–25, Kadri delivered one of the finest seasons of his career, posting a career-high 35 goals along with 32 assists for 67 points while appearing in all 82 games. His production and compete level earned him the Harley H. Hotchkiss Award as the Flames' Most Valuable Player.

Through his 992 NHL games, Kadri has amassed 307 goals and 407 assists for 714 points Kadri is in line to become the 41st – active skater in the league to reach the 1000-game marker. He is also looking to become the 13th player to appear in his 1,000th career regular-season game as a member of the franchise:

FLAMES SUMMER 25' RECAP:

May 3: Re-signed RW Matt Coronato to a seven-year extension.

In his third professional season, and his first complete NHL campaign, Coronato set career highs in 77 games played with Calgary in 2024-25. The 22-year-old right winger recorded 47 points from 24 goals and 23 assists, including five powerplay goals and four game winners. He finished third on the Flames in both points and goals, trailing only Nazem Kadri and Jonathan Huberdeau.

May 30: Named Trent Cull assistant coach.

Trent Cull was in his second year as head coach with the Calgary Wranglers at the time of his interim appointment to the Flames on December 22nd, 2024. During his time on the NHL bench, the Flames penalty kill improved from 29th in the league to 15th (December 23rd – April 17th). Before his recall, Cull led the Wranglers to a 20-8-1 record, 41 points and a .707 points percentage (1st in the AHL). As a result, the Wranglers coaching staff were selected to represent the Pacific Division at the 2025 AHL All-Star Game.

June 10: Re-signed RW Adam Klapka to a two-year extension.

Klapka skated in 31 games for the Flames in 2024-25, scoring six goals and four assists for 10 points along with 29 penalty minutes. From April 1st until April 17th, Klapka would record three goals and three assists for six points which ranked sixth on the team during the Flames final nine games. He also averaged a career-high 12:43 of ice time while registering a team-leading 32 hits during the month of April.

Jun. 16: Named Peter Hanlon assistant general manager.

Peter Hanlon began his managerial career with the Toronto Maple Leafs' American League franchise in St. John's, Newfoundland. He was then recruited to work at the AHL head office in Springfield, Mass. before joining the Flames to begin the 1997-98 season. He has international experience having represented Team Canada at the 2002 Olympics, World Championships, and the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.

Jun. 23: Re-signed C Justin Kirkland to a one-year contract extension.

Justin Kirkland skated in 21 games for the Flames in 2024-25, scoring two goals and six assists for eight points before an injury at the end of November sidelined him for the remainder of the season. The 28-year-old scored his first NHL goal this past season on October 13th in Edmonton. He would go 3/4 in shootout attempts in 2024-25 with his 75% success rate in shootouts leading all Flames with at least two attempts.

Jun. 28: Re-signed D Kevin Bahl to a six-year contract extension.

Kevin Bahl skated in 73 games for the Flames in 2024-25, scoring three goals and adding 17 assists for 20 points and 35 penalty minutes. The 25-year-old defender averaged 21:23 of ice time this season which was the third highest total on the Flames. Bahl was originally acquired by Calgary on June 19, 2024 from New Jersey along with a 2025 first-round (Cole Reschny) in exchange for goalie Jacob Markstrom.

Jul. 1: Re-signed D Joel Hanley to a two-year contract extension.

Hanley skated in 53 games with the Flames in 2024-25, scoring two goals and seven assists for nine points. Hanley's 53 games were a career-high and the 34-year-old finished the season with a career-best +12 while averaging 18:35 of ice time.

Jul. 3: Re-signed C Morgan Frost to a two-year contract extension.

Frost was acquired by Calgary from Philadelphia on January 31st, 2025 and would skate in 32 games in a Flames sweater, scoring three goals and nine assists for 12 points. The 26-year-old averaged 16:37 of ice time with the Flames to set a new career high. He was a first round pick (27th overall) by Philadelphia in the 2017 NHL Draft.

Jul. 30: Re-signed C Martin Pospisil to a three-year contract extension.

Martin Pospisil, a native of Zvolen, SVK played 81 games for the Flames in 2024-25, registering a career-best 25 points from four goals and 21 assists along with 84 penalty minutes. Since making his NHL debut during the 2023-24 season, Pospisil has recorded 539 hits to lead all Flames over the past two seasons as well as rank third in the NHL in hits since he entered the league on November 4th, 2023. The 25-year-old was named to Slovakia's preliminary roster for the 2026 Olympic Winter Games in Milano and Cortina, Italy

Sep. 2: Named Dave Lowry assistant coach

Dave Lowry, a native of Sudbury, ON, spent the past three seasons as an assistant coach with the Seattle Kraken from 2022 through 2025. He previously spent time as an assistant coach with the Winnipeg Jets, Los Angeles Kings, and Calgary Flames throughout his NHL coaching tenure. During his playing career, Lowry spent nineteen years in the NHL and amassed over 1,000 NHL games split between the Vancouver Canucks, St. Louis Blues, Florida Panthers, San Jose Sharks, and Calgary Flames. He would captain the Flames from 2000 to 2002.

Sep. 6: Re-signed C Connor Zary to a three-year contract extension.

Connor Zary, a native of Saskatoon, SK, played 54 games for the Flames in 2024-25, scoring 13 goals and 14 assists for 27 points. The 23-year-old has 124 games of NHL experience to his credit, scoring 28 goals and 34 assists for 62 points along with 39 penalty minutes. He was the Flames first round pick (24th overall) in the 2020 NHL Draft.

Sep. 9: Re-signed G Dustin Wolf to a seven-year contract extension.

Dustin Wolf appeared in 53 games for the Flames in 2024-25, posting a 29-16-8 record, with a .910 save-percentage and a 2.64 goals-against average. Wolf's 29 wins led all rookie goaltenders in the NHL last season, while also leading all freshman netminders in saves (1,409), and shutouts (3). Wolf finished the 2024-25 season second in Calder Memorial Trophy voting. His 2024-25 totals also placed him among all NHL goaltenders in save percentage (11th), wins (11th), and goals against average (16th).



Sep. 17: Re-signed C Mikael Backlund to a two-year contract extension.

Mikael Backlund has played his entire 1,067-game NHL career in Calgary and is the longest tenured active skater on the Flames. In 76 games last season, Backlund scored 15 goals and recorded 17 assists for 32 points. He has been one of the top conditioned players on the team throughout his career and ranked in the top three fittest Flames the past four years and finished first in testing last year.

Oct 2. Extended Head Coach Ryan Huska for two more seasons.

Ryan Huska has coached in the Flames organization since the 2014-15 season in which he was appointed head coach of the Flames' American Hockey League affiliate in Adirondack. He would go on to coach the Flames top prospects in Stockton, posting a 135-118-27 record in four years as an AHL bench boss. In 2018, Huska became an assistant coach with the Flames where he spent five seasons before becoming the 24th head coach in Flames franchise history on June 12, 2023. In his two prior seasons as the Flames Head Coach, Huska has led the club to a 79-66-19 record and coming within one point of a playoff appearance in 2024-25.
