- Jamie Benn scored his 28th career playoff goal and tied Dino Ciccarelli and Neal Broten for the fourth most in Stars/North Stars playoff history according to NHL Stats.
- **Jake Oettinger** played in his 50th career playoff game while earning his 25th postseason win. He posted 27 saves on 28 shots with a .964 save percentage.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight marks the Stars' 415th postseason game in franchise history. Dallas has an 210-204 all-time postseason record.
- The Stars have a 38-26 all-time record in Game 4s including a 17-12 record on the road, while Colorado is 31-22 in Game 4s with a 10-11 record at home.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give Mason Marchment points in three consecutive playoff games for the second time in his career after previously doing so from April 25 to May 2, 2023.
- Roope Hintz has gone 30-for-55 at the faceoff dot this postseason for a 54.6 percent rate. Entering play Friday, his 30 faceoff wins were tied for seventh in the NHL.
- Lian Bichsel has recorded 12 hits through the first three games of the postgame, which led all rookies entering play Friday.
- 2025 marks the first trip to the Stanely Cup Playoffs for rookies **Oskar Bāck** and **Lian Bichsel**. **Mavrik Bourque** appeared in one game for the Stars during the 2024 postseason.
- The Stars' American Hockey League (AHL) affiliate the Texas Stars also qualified for the postseason after finishing the 2024-25 regular season with a 42-25-3 record. Dallas is one of nine organizations this season to have both its NHL and AHL clubs qualify for their respective postseasons, with the others being Carolina, Colorado, Florida, Los Angeles, Montreal, St. Louis, Tampa Bay and Washington.
- The Stars rank ninth all-time in playoff wins with 210. With a series win over Colorado, they will tie the Pittsburgh Penguins for eighth.

SNOWPLOWS

- In the postseason, the Stars are 20-21 all-time against the Avalanche, including a 11-8 mark on the road.
 - In regular season, Dallas is 69-68-22 all-time vs. Colorado, including a 26-45-9 mark on the road.
- Jamie Benn has earned 16 points (6-10—16) in 17 career playoff appearances against the Avalanche. His 16 playoff points vs. Colorado are the second-most among active NHL skaters, behind teammate Miro Heiskanen (6-11—17, 14 GP).
 - During the regular season, Benn earned three points (1-2-3) in three games against Colorado.
- Tyler Seguin has recorded 11 points (7-4-11) in 17 total playoff games against the Avalanche, including tallying the overtime game-winning goal in Game 3 on April 23. Seguin enters tonight's contest having two goals in two consecutive playoff games vs. Colorado.
 - In 42 career regular-season games vs. Colorado, Seguin has 49 points (26-23-49), averaging better than a point per game against them (1.17).
- Wyatt Johnston led Stars skaters in points against the Avalanche in the regular season, earning five points (0-5-5) in three games, which ranked tied for fourth across the NHL. In all, Johnston has 10 points (2-8-10) in 11 career regular season games vs. Colorado, while registering six points (3-3-6) in nine playoff appearances against them.
- Roope Hintz has totaled 12 points (4-8—12) in 15 career postseason games against the Avalanche.
 - Hintz's third-period goal in Game 1 on April 19 was the 22nd of his playoff career, which is tied for fifth among active Finnish skaters.
 - His 12 career playoff points against Colorado are tied for third among all active NHL skaters, trailing only teammates Miro Heiskanen (17) and Jamie Benn (16).
- Matt Duchene has eight points (4-4—8) in 13 postseason appearances against the Avalanche.
- Mikael Granlund nine points (2-7—9) in 14 playoff games vs. Colorado.
- Mikko Rantanen assisted on the overtime winner in Game 3 on April 23. During his postseason career with the Avalanche, he recorded 14-37—51 at Ball Arena according to NHL Stats.
- Jake Oettinger is 6-3 in his playoff career vs. Colorado, posting a .911 save percentage and a 2.29 goals-against average in nine games.
 - His six playoff wins against the Avalanche tops all active NHL netminders.

IT'S NOT OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER

- The Stars have defeated the Avalanche in overtime in each of their last two games played 4-3 in Game 2 and 2-1 in Game 3 - erasing one-goal deficits in the third period in both games.
 - According to NHL Stats, the Stars registered consecutive third-period comeback wins in the Stanley Cup Playoffs for the fourth time in franchise history, following 2008 (Game 2 & 3 of CSF), 2001 (Game 5 & 6 of CQF) and 1999 (Game 3 & 4 of CQF).
- According to NHL Stats, Dallas' Game 3 and Game 4 victories over Colorado is the first time in franchise history that the Stars have won consecutive overtime games in the playoffs.
- Three of the last four games that Dallas has played against Colorado in the playoffs have gone to overtime, dating back to Game 6 of the Second Round in 2024.
- If tonight's game goes beyond regulation, it will mark the fourth time in franchise history that the team has played three consecutive overtime games in the Stanley Cup Playoffs.
- The Stars last played three consecutive overtime games in the playoffs from April 15 to 19, 2001 in Games 3, 4 and 5 in their Conference Quarterfinals series against the Edmonton Oilers.
 - Dallas posted a 2-1 record in those games with Benoit Hogue scoring the game-winner in Game 3 and Kirk Mueller giving the Stars a 3-2 series lead in Game 5.
- Tyler Seguin scored the game-winning goal in Dallas' Game 3 overtime win over Colorado. The goal was the second overtime goal of his career and first since Game 6 of the 2012 Conference Quarterfinals when he was playing for Boston.
- According to NHL Stats, Seguin is the third player in NHL history to go more than 13 years between scoring overtime goals in the playoffs, joining Ray Whitney (16 years, 344 days) and Teemu Selanne (14 years, 23 days).
- Seguin's overtime winner was his sixth playoff game-winning goal with Dallas, which is tied for sixth in franchise history according to NHL Stats.
- Colin Blackwell scored the first overtime goal of his career in Dallas' Game 2 win. According to NHL Stats, Blackwell is the second player in franchise history to score an overtime goal in his first Stanley Cup Playoff game with the Stars/North Stars, joining Brian Propp who did so in Game 1 of the Division Semifinals in 1991.
- Blackwell, who was drafted by San Jose in the seventh round (194th overall) of the 2011 draft, also became the fourth active seventh-round pick to score an overtime goal in the Stanley Cup Playoffs, joining Nick Dowd, Erik Haula and Ondrej Palat.

KILLING IT

- The Stars have gone 11-for-13 on the penalty kill through the first three games of the series for an 84.6 percent success rate, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL this postseason entering play Friday.
- Dallas went a perfect 6-for-6 on the penalty kill in Game 3 (10:17 of shorthanded ice time in total), which includes killing off 3:20 of a penalty kill to begin overtime.

- Since the NHL began tracking penalty kills in 1977-78, Dallas' Game 3 performance marked the 13th time that the Stars
 have been shorthanded for at least 10 minutes without allowing a power-play goal against in a Stanley Cup Playoff
 game.
 - o The Stars last accomplished this feat on Sept. 2, 2020 against the Avalanche, going 5-for-5 on the penalty kill.
- Game 3 also marked the 17th time since 1977-78 that the Avalanche have not scored a power play goal in a postseason game while having at least 10 minutes of power-play time.
- Esa Lindell played 8:09 of Dallas' 10:17 of shorthanded time, the highest single-game total by a Stars skater in a Stanely Cup Playoff game since the NHL began tracking penalty killing in 1977-78.
- Entering play Friday, Lindell was leading the NHL in total shorthanded time on ice (16:12) and shorthanded time on ice per game (5:24) this postseason.
 - Lindell also led the NHL in total shorthanded ice time (287:02) and shorthanded ice time per game (3:35) during the regular season. His 287:02 of shorthanded ice time was nearly 10 more minutes than the second ranked played (Mike Matheson; 277:22).

BIKER GANG

- Thomas Harley recorded the primary assist on Jamie Benn's game-tying goal in Game 3 against the Avalanche to give him three points (1-2—3) through his first three games of the series. Harley's three points this postseason top all Stars skaters and were tied for the second-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Friday.
- A goal or an assist tonight would extend **Harley's** point streak to four games, which would tie his playoff career high that he previously set from May 9 to 15, 2023 when he has an assist in four consecutive games.
- Harley has totaled 93:15 of ice time and is also averaging 31:05 of ice time per game this postseason, both of which led all NHL skaters entering play Friday.
 - o Harley set a playoff single-game career high with 35:54 in Game 2, which was also the highest time on ice by and NHL skater in a single game this postseason.
 - He also had 27:34 of ice time in Game 1, which was the most he's ever played in a Stanley Cup Playoff game that ended in regulation an topped all skaters from either team.
- Harley's three points against Colorado this series brings his playoff career total to 16 (2-14—16). He currently leads all
 players drafted in 2019 in playoff career goals (tied), assists and points.
 - Only Seattle's Kaapo Kakko (44) has played more Stanley Cup Playoff games among skaters selected in 2019 than Harley (42).
- The Stars have outshot the Avalanche 32-31 when **Harley** is on the ice during 5-on-5 play this series according to Natural Stat Trick. Entering play Friday, no player in the Stanley Cup Playoffs this year has been on the ice for more 5-on-5 shots for than **Harley**.
 - o Dallas has also outscored Colorado 3-0 at 5-on-5 when Harley is on the ice.
 - Harley's defensive partner Ilya Lyubushkin was tied for second in the NHL in on-ice shots for with 30 entering play Friday.
- Harley finished Game 1 with six blocked shots, which was one shy of his playoff single-game career high and led both Dallas and Colorado skaters.
- Harley had a career year in 2024-25, finishing the regular season with 50 points (15-34—50), setting career highs in goals, assists, points, even-strength goals (15), power-play points (15), plus/minus (plus-32) and time on ice per game played (23:23).
 - o His 50 points ranked 15th among all NHL defensemen this season.
- Harley became the third Stars defenseman in the last 10 years to reach the 50-poing plateau (Miro Heiskanen, John Klingberg), and his 16 goals were tied for the sixth-most by a Stars defenseman in a single season in franchise history.
- The Stars outscored their opponents 93-59 when **Harley** was on the ice during even-strength play during the regular-season season, which topped the Stars and was tied for the sixth-best mark in the NHL.

PLAYOFF PROWESS

- Mikko Rantanen is a point-per-game player in the postseason in his career, totaling 102 points (34-68—102) in 84 Stanley Cup Playoff games.
 - His 102 career playoff points rank 13th among all active skaters and rank third in NHL history among Finnish players.
- Miro Heiskanen has notched 61 career playoff points (16-45—61) in 85 Stanley Cup Playoff games, which ranks ninth among all active defensemen.
- Heiskanen (6-10—16), Wyatt Johnston (6-10—16) and Jason Robertson (10-6—16) led the Stars in postseason scoring in 2024 with 16 points each.
- Wyatt Johnston has seven points (3-4—7) in his last eight playoff games played dating back to May 25, 2024 against Edmonton. His 24 career playoff points (14-10—24) are the most of any player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft and are tied for fifth on Dallas' roster since his made his postseason debut in 2023.
 - o In Game 2 against the Avalanche, **Johnston** earned his 10th playoff assist in his career on **Evgenii Dadonov's** goal, making him the sixth player in Stars/North Stars history with at least 10 playoff helpers before age 22 according to NHL Stats. The others: **Miro Heiskanen** (22), Brian Bellows (20), Mike Modano (15), Craig Hartsburg (13) and Tom McCarthy (11).
- Jamie Benn has 10 points (3-7—9) in his last 10 postseason games played dating back to May 17, 2024 vs. Colorado.

• Sam Steel recorded the first multi-assist game of his playoff career with two assists against the Avalanche in Game 2.

ROAD WARRIORS

- In franchise history, the Stars has played 19 Stanely Cup Playoff Games against the Avalanche in Colorado, owning a 11-8 record in those games.
- Dallas has won its last five road games played against Colorado dating back to April 28, 2006, which includes going a
 perfect 3-0 at Ball Arena in the postseason last year.
 - o Please note that this excludes the 2020 Stanley Cup Playoffs that were played on neutral ice.
- Among goaltenders that have played in at least two road playoff games since the start of the 2024 Stanley Cup Playoffs,
 Jake Oettinger tops the NHL in both road save percentage (.939) and road goals-against average (1.67, tied).
- The Stars had a 22-15-3 record when playing on the road during the 2024-25 regular season, with their 22 wins tying for the seventh-most road wins in a single season in franchise history.
- Matt Duchene had 46 points (17-29—46) in 41 road games this season, which topped the Stars and tied for seventh in the NHL this season. His 29 road assists were a career best and tied for 13th in the league this year.
- Forty-one (14-27—41) of **Mikael Granlund's** 66 points during the regular season were scored on the road, setting a career high in both road goals and road points. He finished the year tied for 15th in road scoring in the NHL.
- Mikko Rantanen had 44 points (16-28—43) in 40 road games this season, including tallying 12 points (4-8—12) in 11 road
 games after being acquired by the Stars.
 - o Rantanen's 44 road points during the regular season tied for 10th in the NHL.
- Mason Marchment had 10 points (3-7—10) in his final 10 road games of the year, finishing the regular season with a five-game road point streak.

FAMILIAR FOES

- The Stars' First Round matchup with the Avalanche is the seventh time in franchise history that Dallas has faced off against Colorado in a playoff series, owning a 4-2 record in their previous six postseason series meetings.
- In all, the Stars have an 20-21 record against the Avalanche, which is their third-highest playoff win total against a single opponent, trailing only the St. Louis Blues (40) and the Edmonton Oilers (29).
- No franchise in NHL history has won more playoff games against the Avalanche than the Stars.
- The Stars also tops all NHL franchises in playoff goals scored against Colorado (117).

PARTY LIKE IT'S 1999

- The Stars enter the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs looking to win their second Stanley Cup in franchise history after defeating the Buffalo Sabres in six games to bring the team's first championship to Dallas in 1999.
- At the time of the Stars' first Stanely Cup win, eight players on the team's current roster had yet to be born: Oskar Bāck, Mavrik Bourque, Lian Bichsel, Thomas Harley, Miro Heiskanen, Wyatt Johnston, Nils Lundkvist and Jason Robertson had not been born yet.
 - Heiskanen (July 18, 1999) and Robertson (July 22, 1999) were both born about a month after the Stars hoisted the Stanley Cup.
- The Stars defeated the Sabres 2-1 on June 19, 1999 to secure the franchise's first-ever championship. On that day...
 - The number one song in the United States was "If You Had My Love" by Jennifer Lopez.
 - o The number one movie was Disney's "Tarzan."
 - The 1999 FIFA Women's World Cup began. The United States would ultimately go on to win the tournament, led by superstars Mia Hamm and Brandi Chastain.

CUP RUNNETH OVER

- Tyler Seguin and Mikko Rantanen are the two players on Dallas' roster who have previously won the Stanley Cup.
- Seguin was a part of Boston's 2011 championship run, winning the Stanley Cup in his rookie season. He recorded seven points (3-4—7) in 13 postseason games.
- Seguin has reached the Finals on two additional occasions: in 2013 with Boston (vs. Chicago) and in 2020 with Dallas (vs. Tampa Bay).
- Rantanen hoisted the Cup in 2022 with the Avalanche, finishing the postseason with 25 points (5-20—25) in 20 games, which was good for fifth in the NHL is scoring that year.

FOR PETE'S SAKE

- Head Coach Pete DeBoer has an 90-72 all-time playoff record. His 89 wins are the 10th-most in NHL history and top all
 active coaches.
- Those 90 wins have amounted to 17 series wins, which also ranks 10th in NHL history and sits one shy of the league lead among active coaches (Jon Cooper, 18).
- No coach in NHL history has a better record in Game 7s than DeBoer, who is a perfect 8-0 in his career.
- The 2025 postseason marks the 10th consecutive year in which a DeBoer-coached team has reached the playoffs, which trails only Paul Maurice (12) and Cooper (11) for the longest active run among head coaches.
- **DeBoer** is looking to reach the Conference Finals for the seventh time in his career after previously doing so with New Jersey (2011-12), San Jose (2015-16, 2018-19), Vegas (2019-20) and Dallas (2022-23, 2023-24).

Entering this postseason, DeBoer and Cooper are the only active coaches to reach the Conference Finals six separate times, with DeBoer being the only coach to achieve that feat with multiple teams.

REGULAR SEASON RECAP

- The Stars finished the 2024-25 regular season with a 50-26-6 record, ranking in the top five in the NHL this year in wins (tied fourth), points (fifth), goals for (275, tied third), goals for per game (3.35, tied third) and penalty kill (82.0 percent, tied fourth).
- The 2024-25 campaign marks the second straight year that Dallas has finished the regular season with at least 50 wins and the third consecutive year that the team concluded the regular season with a points percentage above .640.
- This season also sits near the top in the franchise record book in terms of single-season success with the team's 50 wins tying for the fourth-most in franchise history.
- The team's regular-season success this year came in spite of logging 190 man games lost to injury, which includes significant stretches playing without Tyler Seguin (62 games), Miro Heiskanen (32 games), Nils Lundkvist (40 games), Mason Marchment (20 games) and others.

PLAYOFF BOUND

- Dallas became the third team to clinch a berth to the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs with their 5-1 win over the Kraken in their game on March 29.
- 2024-25 season marks the 37th postseason appearance in franchise history and their fifth time in the past five seasons - tied for the most among all teams in that span according to NHL Stats.
- The Stars have made the Conference Finals in each of their past two postseasons and can become the fifth team in the past 20 years to do so in three straight (also TBL, CHI, LAK & DET) according to NHL Stats.
- The Stars have won nine series in the past 10 years, tied with the Penguins for the third most in the NHL in that span according to NHL Stats behind only the Lightning (18) and Golden Knights (11).

CONNECTIONS

- Stars forward Matt Duchene was drafted by Colorado with the third pick in the 2009 NHL Draft, he played for Colorado from 2009-10 to 2017-18.
- Stars forward Mikko Rantanen was drafted by the Avalanche with the 10th pick in the 2015 NHL Draft. He played for Colorado from 2015-16 to 2024-25.
- Avalanche forward Joel Kiviranta played for the Dallas Stars from 2019-20 until the 2022-23 season.
- Avalanche goaltender Scott Wedgewood played for the Dallas Stars from 2021-22 to 2023-24.
- Avalanche forward Valeri Nichushkin played for the Dallas Stars from 2013-14 to 2015-16 then returned to Dallas for the 2018-19 season.
- Stars defenseman Matt Dumba and Avalanche forward Ross Colton both played for Tampa Bay during the 2023-24
- Stars forward Evgenii Dadonov and Avalanche forward Jonathan Drouin played part of the 2022-23 season together with the Montréal Canadiens.
- Stars forward Evgenii Dadonov and Avalanche forward Parker Kelly played one game together as members of the Ottawa Senators during the 2020-21 season.
- Stars defenseman Ilya Lyubushkin and Avalanche forward Casey Mittelstadt were teammates in Buffalo during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars defenseman Brendan Smith and Avalanche forward Miles Wood skated together for the New Jersey Devils during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars defenseman Matt Dumba and Avalanche defenseman Calvin de Haan played together in Tampa Bay during the 2023-24 season.
- Stars forward Sam Steel and Avalanche defenseman Josh Manson both played for the Anaheim Ducks from 2018-19 to the 2021-22 season.
- Stars defenseman Brendan Smith and Avalanche goaltender Alexander Georgiev were members of the New York Rangers from 2016-17 to 2020-21. Stars forward Colin Blackwell also played for the Rangers in 2020-21 and defenseman Nils Lundkvist was a Ranger during the 2021-22 season while Georgiev was with the Rangers.
- Stars goaltending coach Jeff Reese and Avalanche assistant coach Nolan Pratt worked together and won a Stanley Cup in 2004 with the Tampa Bay Lightning when Pratt played for Tampa Bay in 2001-02 to 2003-04 and came back from 2005-06 and 2006-07.
- Avalanche skills coach Toby Petersen played for the Dallas Stars from 2007-08 to 2012-13. He also spent time as the Texas Stars (AHL) in 2012-13 and 2013-14 as the team's assistant captain.
- Stars forward Mikael Granlund and defenseman Matt Dumba played with Avalanche forward Charlie Coyle in Minnesota. Granlund played with Coyle from 2012-13 to 2018-19 and Dumba from 2013-14 to 2018-19.
- Stars defenseman Brendan Smith and forward Mikko Rantanen played with Avalanche forward Jack Drury in Carolina. Smith and Drury were in Carolina for part of the 2021-22 season, Rantanen and Drury played for Carolina during part of the 2024-25 season.

- Stars defenseman Brendan Smith and forward Mikko Rantanen played with Avalanche forward Martin Necas in Carolina. Smith and Necas shared the ice in 2021-22 while Rantanen and Necas skated together during the 2024-25
- Stars defenseman Thomas Harley and Avalanche forward Nathan MacKinnon and defenseman Cale Makar were members of Team Canada in the 2025 Four Nations tournament.
- Stars goaltender Jake Oettinger and Avalanche forward Brock Nelson both played for Team USA in the 2025 Four Nations tournament.
- Stars defenseman Brendan Smith and Avalanche forward Jimmy Vesey were teammates with the New York Rangers from 2016-17 to 2018-19.
- Stars Player Development Assistant Jordie Benn and Avalanche forward Jimmy Vesey shared the ice in Vancouver during the 2020-21 season.
- Stars defensemen Brendan Smith and Nils Lundkvist along with forward Colin Blackwell played with Avalanche defenseman Ryan Lindgren for the New York Rangers. Smith played with Lindgren from 2018-19 to 2020-21, Lundkvist joined the two in 2020-21 and Blackwell played with Lindgren in 2021-22.
- Stars forward Mikael Granlund, defenseman Cody Ceci and Avalanche goaltender Mackenzie Blackwood played together in San Jose. Granlund and Blackwood played in San Jose in 2023-24 to 2024-25 and Ceci joined them for the 2025 season.

REGULAR SEASON STARS REAL-TIME STATS LEADERS
