

- The Stars defeated the Sharks 5-2 in Dallas, extending their winning streak against the Sharks to five games dating to March 2 (SJS: 0-2-3), which marks their second longest active run versus one franchise (behind 7 GP vs. DET dating to April 21, 2021, according to NHL Stats.
- Nine different skaters recorded a point during the game and three had multi-point efforts.
- Jason Robertson tallied three points (1-2—3) during the game. He extended his active point streak against the Sharks to eight games, dating back to Nov. 11, 2022. Robertson also recorded his 20th career game-opening goal to pass Brett Hull, J.P. Parise and Darryl Sydor (all w/ 19) on the franchise's all-time list, according to NHL Stats.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the first of two games the Stars will play against the Lightning this season and the only time that the teams will play in Tampa this year. They will next face off on March 20, 2025 in Dallas.
- A win tonight would give the Stars victories in three consecutive road games for the first time this season.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.33 goals against per game this season, which was the best mark in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Dallas has outscored its opponents 61-42 this season. Their plus-19 goal differential was tied for the fifth-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Friday.
- Tyler Seguin is one assist away from bringing his total with the Stars to 381, which would give him sole possession of fifth on the franchise's all-time assists list.
 - Seguin has recorded a point in five of the six road games that he has played this season.
- Thomas Harley has recorded a plus-8 on-ice goal differential over the course of Dallas' last five games dating back to Nov. 11, 2024. No player in the NHL had a better on-ice goal differential during that span entering play Friday.

Y2K

- Dallas' next victory will mark their 2,000th win in franchise history.
- When they reach the milestone, the Stars will become the 10th franchise in NHL history to record at least 2,000 wins.
- The team's first 758 wins came while the team was known as the North Stars and located in Minnesota (1967-68 to 1992-93) and the next 1,241 wins came when the team was relocated to Dallas (1993-94 to 2024-25).
- Since entering the league in 1967-68, the Stars have the ninth-most wins in the NHL and the 16th-ranked points percentage (.524).
- Since relocating to Dallas, the Stars have posted a .590 points percentage, which is the fourth-best mark in the NHL during that span. Their 1,241 wins during that span rank third in the NHL.

LIGHTNING STRIKES TWICE

- Dallas is 29-23-6 all-time vs. Tampa Bay, including a 15-12-3 mark on the road.
- Jamie Benn has four points (2-2-4) in his last four games against the Lightning.
- Roope Hintz has 12 points (4-8—12) in his last 11 games against Tampa Bay dating back to March 23, 2021.
- Jason Robertson has 11 points (4-7—11) in his last 11 games against the Lightning dating back to March 16, 2021.
- Evgenii Dadonov has 13 points (4-9—13) in 19 career games against Tampa Bay.

IDES OF MARCH

- Mason Marchment was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending in Nov. 17 after totaling nine
 points (4-5—9) in three games, the most of any player during that span.
 - It marked the second time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors after being named the Third Star of the Week on Feb. 6, 2022 after totaling six points (2-4—6) in two games while playing for the Florida Panthers.
 - o It is also the second time this season that a Stars player has earned Star of the Week honors after Matt Duchene was named the league's Third Star of the Week for the week ending in Oct. 27.
- Marchment has totaled 10 points (4-6—10) over the Stars' last five games dating back to Nov. 11. His 10 points during
 that span were tied with Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl for the second-most in the NHL entering play Friday.
- The 2024-25 season marks the first time in his career that Marchment has played at a point-per-game pace or better through his first 17 games played of a season.
- His 18 points are already 34.0 percent of his career high of 53 (22-31-53) that he reached last season in 81 games.
 Marchment is currently pacing to finish the year with 29 goals, 57 assists and 86 points, all of which would be career highs.
- Marchment has a plus-11 on-ice, even-strength goal differential this season, which was tied for eighth among all NHL forwards entering play Friday.
- Marchment recorded in assist in Dallas' game on Nov. 18 against the Anaheim Ducks. The helper marked the 100th assist of his NHL career and made him the 18th undrafted, active skater to reach the 100-assist milestone.
- Marchment recorded five points (1-4-5) in Dallas' 7-1 win over the Pittsburgh Penguins on Nov. 11, making him one of four skaters this season to record a five-point game
 - o It was the second-highest scoring game of his career, trailing only the six points (2-4—6) he had against the Columbus Blue Jackets on Jan. 31, 2022.
 - o Marchment joined Artemi Panarin (5) as the only active undrafted players with multiple five-point games according to NHL Stats.
- Marchment (1-4—5) became the third Stars player in the last decade to record five points in a game, following Wyatt Johnston (March 5, 2024) and Joe Pavelski (Jan. 12, 2022) according to NHL Stats.

LIND, LAUGH, LOVE

- Esa Lindell has recorded eight points (2-6—8) in 18 games this season and enters tonight's contest ranked second among Stars defensemen in scoring (Thomas Harley, nine points).
- Lindell enters tonight's game one point shy of totaling 200 career points. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 13th defenseman from the 2012 NHL Draft class to total 200 points.
- · He will also become the 49th player and 13th defenseman in franchise history to record 200 points with the Stars.
- Lindell is one goal away from tying Philippe Boucher (52) for 10th in franchise history in goals scored by a defenseman.
- Lindell is currently on pace to finish the year with 27 assists and 36 points, both of which would be career highs for the 10-year veteran.
- He is averaging 3:24 of shorthanded ice time per game this season, which was the eighth-highest mark in the NHL entering play Friday.

SLIDING INTO YOUR DMS

- Matt Duchene, Mason Marchment and Tyler Seguin have combined for 23 goals this season, accounting for 37.7
 percent of Dallas' total offense this year.
- According to Natural Stat Trick, when the trio is on the ice during 5-on-5 play, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 8-5, outshooting them 80-61 and have 76 scoring chances to their opponents' 59.
- Additionally, according to MoneyPuck.com, the Duchene/Marchment/Seguin line has 58.8 expected goals for
 percentage this year, which ranks 11th among all NHL forward lines to play at least 100 minutes together this season.
- All three of **Duchene** (1.17), **Marchment** (1.06) and **Seguin** (1.07) are playing at a point-per-game pace this season. Only Tampa Bay Lightning (six), Toronto Maple Leafs (four) and Winnipeg Jets (four) had more players playing at a point-per-game rate or better this season than the Stars entering play Friday.
- The trio also ranks first (Duchene), second (Marchment) and third (Seguin) in scoring on the Stars roster this season.

FACING OFF

• **Jamie Benn** has gone 99-for-152 at the faceoff dot this season. His 65.1 percent success rate was the third-best mark in the NHL this year among skaters to take at least 20 draws entering play Friday.

- Benn is one of four players this season to take at least 10 draws while only losing one or fewer and the only player to
 do it twice.
- Benn first went a perfect 16-for-16 at the faceoff dot on Nov. 7 against the Chicago Blackhawks. It marked the first time
 in his career that he has taken at least 16 draws in a game without losing one.
- Since the NHL began tracking faceoffs in 1997-98, **Benn** became just the sixth player to go undefeated at the faceoff dot when taking at least 16 draws.
- Benn then went 10-for-11 at the faceoff dot in Dallas' game on Nov. 18 against the Anaheim Ducks for a 90.9 percent success rate.
- In all, the Stars have won 51.7 percent of the faceoffs they have taken this season, which was the ninth-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday.

FIRST THING'S FIRST

- The Stars have opened the scoring in 61.1 percent of the games that they have played this season, recording the first goal of the game in 11 of their 18 games.
- Dallas has gone on to win 10 of the 11 games that they have scored first in. Their 10 wins when scoring first were tied with Minnesota and the NY Ranger for the best mark in the league this season entering play Friday.
- Additionally, the Stars' .909 win percentage when scoring first this year was the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday.

ROOKIE REPORT

- Logan Stankoven has 15 points (4-11—15) through his first 18 games played this season and enters tonight's game tied for third on the team in scoring.
- Entering play Friday, **Stankoven** was tied for first in both assists and points by a rookie this season. His four goals tied for third among first-year players this year.
 - Philadelphia's Matvei Michkov also has 15 points (6-9—15) this year and Stankoven shares the assists lead with Montreal's Lane Hutson.
- Three of **Stankoven's** goals this season have been game-winners, which led the Stars and topped all NHL rookies entering play Friday. Only Minnesota's Matt Boldy (5), Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl (4) and New York's Chris Kreider (4) have scored more game-winning goals than **Stankoven** this year.
- Stankoven's goal against the Bruins in Dallas' game on Nov. 14 was his 14th point of the season. His 14 points are tied with Danny Grant (10-4—14 in 1968-69) for the third most through 15 games in a season by a Stars/North Stars rookie behind only Neal Broten (10-7—17 in 1981-82) and Steve Christoff (8-7—15 in 1979-80) according to NHL Stats.
- Stankoven recorded his 10th assist of the season (12 GP) in Dallas' game on Nov. 7 against Chicago, establishing a
 franchise mark for fewest games to 10 helpers in a season by a Stars/North Stars rookie according to NHL Stats. The
 previous mark of 14 games was shared by Don Barber (1989-90 w/ MNS), Tim Young (1975-76 w/ MNS) and Danny
 O'Shea (1968-69 w/ MNS).
- Stankoven (8-18—26 in 36 GP) added an empty-net goal against Chicago to become the second-fastest player in Stars team history to record 25 career points, following Jason Robertson (33 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- With his assist on Oct. 15 against the Sharks, Stakoven became just the second rookie in Stars/North Stars history to
 record five or more assists through his first four games of a season, joining Marc Bureau (5 in 4 GP in 1990-91) according
 to NHL Stats.
- He recorded three assists in Dallas' 4-3 win over the Predators on Oct. 10, making him the only rookie to have a threepoint game this season.
- According to NHL Stats, **Stankoven** became the second rookie in franchise history to record three points in the team's season-opening contest, alongside Roland Eriksson (0-4—4 w/ MNS) on Oct. 6, 1976.
- Originally selected by the Stars in the second round (47th overall) of the 2021 NHL Draft, Stankoven appeared in 24 regular-season games for Dallas last year, totaling 14 points (6-8—14) in those contests and adding eight points (3-5—8) in 19 Stanley Cup Playoff games.
 - o His 10 assists and 15 points this season have already surpassed his totals from last year.
- Despite only playing in 42 regular-season games in his career, Stankoven already ranks 12th in career scoring among skaters selected in the 2021 NHL Draft. His 0.69 career points per game also top 2021 draftees who have appeared in at least two regular-season games.
 - o The 11 skaters ranked in front of him have all played in at least 90 career regular-season games.
- Stankoven is pacing to finish the year with 50 assists and 68 points. Fifty assists would be the second-most by a rookie in franchise history and 68 points would make him the highest scoring rookie since Mathew Barzal had 85 points (22-63—85) in 2017-18.

DOUBLE DUTCH

- Matt Duchene enters tonight's game having totaled 21 points (10-11—21) in 18 games this season, which includes recording seven multi-point efforts this year.
- With 21 points in 18 games, **Duchene** has already reached 32.3 percent of his total scoring from last year (25-40—65) despite only being 22.0 percent of the way through the 2024-25 season.

- Duchene has recorded a point in 12 of the 18 games he has played this season and enters tonight's game leading the Stars in both goals (10) and points (21) and is tied for second on the team in assists (11).
- When Duchene has been on the ice this season during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 14-8
 according to Natural Stat Trick.
- He is currently pacing to finish the year with 46 goals, 50 assists and 96 points, which would all be career highs for the 16-year veteran.

BENN THERE DONE THAT

- Stars captain Jamie Benn enters tonight's contest having played in 315 consecutive games.
- Dallas' Oct. 13 matchup against the Kraken marked the 300th consecutive game that Benn had played in, making him
 the fourth player in franchise history to play in 300 consecutive games for the team according to NHL Stats.
- He is one game shy of recording the second-longest Iron Man streak in franchise history and the longest ever by a Stars skater.

- Benn's current 315-game Iron Man streak is the fifth-longest active streak in the NHL.
- Benn is one of 18 players to have an active Iron Man streak of at least 200 games and is one of 11 NHL players to appear in each of his team's 246 regular-season games between 2021-22 and 2023-24.
- The Stars captain leads all Dallas players in career games played (1,130), goals (387), assists (530) and points (917). His 917 career points rank 13th among active NHL skaters, and he is the second-highest scoring fifth-round draft pick in NHL history (Alexander Mogilny; 1,032).

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- Miro Heiskanen is seven assists shy of tying Dennis Hextall (216) for 23rd on the franchise's all-time assists list. He's also eight assists shy of trying Brad Maxwell (217) for 7th on the all-time assists list by defensemen.
- Jason Robertson is eight points away from tying Tom McCarthy (333) for 24th on the franchise's all-time scoring list.
- Matt Duchene is 14 points away from recording his 100th point with the Stars.
- Esa Lindell is 13 games shy of tying Lou Nanne (635) for ninth on the franchise's all-time games played list by defensemen.

CONNECTIONS

- Stars defenseman Matt Dumba was acquired by the Lightning at the trade deadline and finished the 2023-24 season
 with Tampa Bay.
- Lightning forward Luke Glendening played two seasons with the Dallas Stars from 2021-22 to 2022-23.
- Lightning forward Nick Paul was drafted by the Dallas Stars in the 2013 NHL Draft (fourth-round, 10th pick, 101st overall).
- Stars defenseman Matt Dumba and Lightning forward Mitchell Chaffee were a part of the Minnesota Wild in the 2021-22 season but didn't play a game together.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Lightning forward Zemgus Girgensons shared the ice during the 2022-23 season as members of the Buffalo Sabres.
- Stars defenseman Brendan Smith and Lightning forward Luke Glendening both played for Detroit from 2014-15 until
 the trade deadline in 2016-17 season.
- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith and Lightning forward Jake Guentzel played for the Pittsburgh Penguins from 2017-18 until the 2022-23 season.
- Stars forwards **Matt Duchene** and **Evgenii Dadonov** played with Lightning forward Nick Paul for the Ottawa Senators during the 2017-18 and 2018-19 seasons.
- Stars forward Evgenii Dadonov played with Lightning forward Nick Paul for the Ottawa Senators in 2020-21.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and Lightning blueliner Ryan McDonagh both played for the New York Rangers from the trade deadline in 2016-18 to 2017-18.
- Stars forward Matt Duchene played with Lightning defenseman Ryan McDonagh as members of the Nashville Predators during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars defenseman Ilya Lyubushkin and Lightning defenseman J.J. Moser were both with the Arizona Coyotes during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars defenseman Matt Dumba and Lightning defenseman J.J. Moser both played for the Arizona Coyotes in the 2023-24 season.
- Stars forward Mason Marchment and Lightning goalie Jonas Johansson played one game together as members of the Florida Panthers during the 2021-22 season.

- Stars goaltending coach Jeff Resse played 19 games for the Lightning during the 1995-96 season. He also was on their coaching staff from 1999-00 until 2007-08, winning the Stanley Cup in 2004.
- Stars player development coordinator Ben Bishop played for the Lightning from 2012-13 to 2016-17.
- Stars player development coordinator **Ben Bishop** and Lightning GM Julien BriseBois and assistant GM Stacy Roest were all a part of the Lightning organization from 2012-13 and 2016-17. **Bishop** as a player, BriseBois as assistant GM and Roest as director of player development.
- Lightning assistant GM Jamie Pushor played 62 games for the Dallas Stars in the 1999-00 season.
- Stars player development coordinator **Ben Bishop** and Lightning director of player development J.P. Cote played together for the Lightning for a short time in the 2013-14 season.
- Stars coaches Pete DeBoer and Steve Spott were on the San Jose coaching staff when Lightning director of player development J.P. Cote was a pro scout for the Sharks in 2018-19.
- Lightning Head Coach Jon Cooper coached Stars defenseman Matt Dumba during the 2023-24 season. Cooper also coached Stars player development coordinator Ben Bishop when he was a goaltender with Tampa from 2012-13 to 2016-17.
- Lightning assistant coach Jeff Halpern played for the Dallas Stars for the 2006-07 and 2007-08 seasons.
