

Lindgren recorded career highs in points (18) and assists (17) in 2022-23 and was a team-best +29, also a career high for the defenseman. Acquired by the Rangers in a Feb. 25, 2018 trade with Boston, Lindgren has tallied 63 points (7G, 56A) in 257 career NHL games, all with New York. The Minneapolis, Minnesota, native spent two seasons at the University of Minnesota (2016-18) prior to turning pro and served as an alternate captain for the Golden Gophers in his final year with the team (2017-18). A product of the U.S. National Team Development Program, Lindgren represented his country at two IIHF World Junior Championships, helping the U.S. win gold in 2017 and bronze in 2018.
