



### FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP

January 28, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [1] vs. WASHINGTON CAPITALS [3]

The Calgary Flames began a four-game week by welcoming the Washington Capitals to the Scotiabank Saddledome. The Flames would outshoot the Caps 13-5 in the opening frame, but the visitors would lead 1-0 through 20 thanks to a Pierre-Luc Dubois tally. In the second, Blake Coleman redirected a Tyson Barrie point shot past Logan Thompson to draw the Flames level. Washington would reclaim their lead later in the frame and the Flames trailed 2-1 through 40. In the third, Calgary pushed but were unable to solve Logan Thompson, and Washington added a third to knock off the Flames 3-1.

### TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of four meetings this season between the Flames and Ducks. Calgary emerged victorious in overtime in these clubs' first matchup on January 7<sup>th</sup> by a score of 3-2.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 7-4-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 15-12-2 against Western Conference opponents.

### **FIRST MEETING WITH ANAHEIM:**

The Calgary Flames met the Anaheim Ducks for the first time in 2024-25 on January 7<sup>th</sup> at the Honda Center. In the first, MacKenzie Weegar gave the Flames the lead with under a minute remaining by deflecting a Blake Coleman shot as the visitors skated into the intermission up 1-0. Anaheim would tie things up just before the midway point in the second, but Nazem Kadri would tap home a slick backdoor pass from MacKenzie Weegar to help Calgary retake their lead and that is where things stood through 40. Anaheim would level things in the third after Mason McTavish deflected home a point shot, and this game required overtime. In the extra frame, Jonathan Huberdeau redirected a wild bounce off the end boards into the net to lift the Flames over the Ducks 3-2.

### **ROONEY 300:**

Kevin Rooney enters play tonight having skated in 299 career NHL contests and has a chance to skate in his 300<sup>th</sup> NHL game tonight. The Canton, MA native made his NHL debut on March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2017 against tonight's opponent the Washington Capitals as a member of the New Jersey Devils. Rooney joined the Flames organization in July of 2023, and has skated in 89 contests in Flames colours, with nine points from six goals and three helpers.

### **WEEGSY BABY:**

MacKenzie Weegar has recorded 30 goals in his Calgary Flames tenure and with two more tallies can tie Dennis Wideman for the 14<sup>th</sup>-most by a defenceman in Flames franchise history. Weegar recorded his 30<sup>th</sup> goal in Flames colours on Sunday in Winnipeg in his 211<sup>th</sup> game for Calgary which made him the sixth-fastest rearguard to 30 goals. Only Dion Phaneuf (124GP), Phil Housley (160GP), Al MacInnis (165GP), Gary Suter (171GP), and Dougie Hamilton (204GP) required fewer games to reach 30 goals in a Flames sweater.

### **HARVARD ALUMNI:**

Tonight's matchup features two of the nine active Harvard alumni in the NHL with Anaheim's Alex Killorn and Calgary's Matt Coronato set to faceoff. Coronato spent the 2021-22 and 2022-23 campaigns with the Crimson, totaling 38 goals and 34 assists for 72 points in 68 contests for Harvard. Killorn spent four years at Harvard from 2008 to 2012, amassing 109 total points in 130 NCAA games.

### **JUNIOR CHAMPS:**

Ducks forward Brett Leason and Flames rearguard Brayden Pachal were teammates on the 2018-19 WHL Championship-winning Prince Albert Raiders. Leason posted a career-best team-leading 89 points with 36 goals and 53 assists, while Pachal led all defencemen in scoring on the Raiders with 15 goals and 36 helpers for 51 points, also a career-high. The club would advance to the Memorial Cup where Pachal would finish tied for second on the team in scoring with a goal and two assists for three points in three round-robin games.

### **FUTURE WATCH:**

Flames 2024 first round pick Zayne Parekh recorded his second hat trick in his last four games on Sunday against the Ottawa 67's and was named the OHL player of the week. The 18-year-old is on a six-game point streak with nine goals and seven assists for 16 points since January 10<sup>th</sup>. Parekh's 21 goals lead all OHL defenceman and the Nobleton, ON native recently became the highest-scoring defenceman in Saginaw Spirit franchise history.



Flames 2024 third round pick Henry Mews currently leads the OHL in assists as a defenceman with 48 through 45 games played and has recorded four helpers in his last four games. Mews is also the OHL's highest scoring defenceman, posting 60 points, with fellow Flames prospect Zayne Parekh one point behind him.

A pair of fellow Flames prospects find themselves inside the top 20 in OHL scoring along with Mews and Parekh. Kingston forward Jacob Battaglia (27-35 – 62 in 44GP) and Brampton forward Luke Misa (25-34 – 59 in 44GP) are also over a point-per game so far in 2024-25.

### **HEY DID YOU KNOW?**

Ducks defenceman Olen Zellweger and forward Brett Leason are both Calgary natives. Zellweger is preparing to face his hometown club for the fourth time in his career, while Leason is slated to face the Flames for the eighth time.
