MOTOR CITY MEETS BROAD STREET

- Going into Wednesday's game, Philadelphia is looking to extend the one-game win streak (1-0-0) against Detroit. This is the second of three contests against Detroit.
- The Flyers are 1-3-1 on the road against the Red Wings and currently on a two-game winless streak (0-1-1).
- Forward **Scott Laughton** has 16 points (12g-4a) in the last 11 games against the Red Wings.
- Forward **Travis Konecny** has nine points (0g-9a) in the last eight games against the Red Wings.
- Forward **Noah Cates** has four points (2g-2a) in the last five games against the Red Wings.
- Defenseman **Rasmus Ristolainen** has three points (0g-3a) in the last five games against the Red Wings.
- Defenseman **Travis Sanheim** has three points (0g-3a) in the last three games against the Red Wings.
- Forward **Garnet Hathaway** has two points (1g-1a) in the last three games against the Red Wings.

ON THE ROAD

- Philadelphia owns a 6-2-2 record in their last 10 games on the road since Oct. 29.
- The Flyers will play two of their next four games on the road, leading up to the Christmas Break.
- Philadelphia lead the NHL in shootout wins (2) on the road and have a 84.3% penalty kill percentage on the road (5th best in NHL).
- The Flyers recorded a seven-game point streak (5-0-2) on the road from Nov. 7 to Dec. 10.

EAST MODE ACTIVATED

- Philadelphia has a 7-7-2 record against the Eastern Conference, including a 5-3-2 record against the Atlantic Division and a 2-4-0 record against the Metropolitan Division.

BACK-TO-BACK GAMES

- Wednesday's and Thursday's games mark the Flyers' sixth of 13 back-to-back sets this season.
- Philadelphia holds a 3-1-1 record in the first game of a back-to-back series and a 1-4-0 record in the second contest.
- This set marks the second of three road-to-home back-to-backs this season:
 - Dec. 7 at BOS (4-3 L OT); Dec. 8 vs. UTA (4-2 L)
 - Dec. 18 at DET; Dec. 19 vs. LAK
 - Jan. 29 at NJD; Jan. 30 vs. NYI



KILLER INSTINCTS

- Philadelphia ranks 6th in the league in the penalty minutes per game (9:30), however the Flyers rank 14th in the NHL with 18 power-play goals-against in 91 penalty kills (80.2%).
- The Flyers have a perfect kill rate in 18 of 31 games this season.
- Philadelphia owned a seven-game streak without allowing a goal on the penalty kill, 10/29-11/11.
- Philadelphia tallied a shorthanded goal against Calgary (10/12).

TEAM MISCELLANEOUS

- Philadelphia is 2-2-1 in their last five games and 5-3-2 in the last ten games.
- The Flyers lead the NHL with 582 blocked shots and are tied for first with 189 takeaways.
- Philadelphia ranks 18th in the NHL with 649 hits. Forward **Garnet Hathaway** ranks 11th in the NHL in hits (101).
- Philadelphia joined Colorado (3), Tampa Bay (3), New Jersey (2) and Winnipeg (2) to become the fifth team to record multiple hat tricks this season, Sean Couturier (10/26/24 vs. MIN) and Scott Laughton (12/12/24 vs. DET).
- Per NHL Stats, Philadelphia won after scoring a game-tying goal within the final 15 seconds of regulation for the fourth time in franchise history on Nov. 27 at Nashville. The others: March 8, 2006 (59:59 vs. CAR), March 31, 2013 (59:50 vs. WSH) and Feb. 21, 2012 (59:50 at WPG).

KEEPING IT ERR-TIGHT

- **Samuel Ersson** has allowed three-or-fewer goals in 10 of 14 games played.
- He returned to action after missing 11 games against Utah (12/8), stopping 21-of-25 shots in the contest.
- He returned to action against Florida (11/9) after missing two games due to a lower-body injury, stopping 28-of-31 shots in regulation/OT and 3-of-5 shots in the shootout.
- The Swedish native posted his sixth career shutout in a 2-0 win at Boston (10/29), stopping all 25 shots he faced. He becomes the 17th Flyers goaltender to reach the milestone in franchise history.
- Per NHL Stats, Ersson became just the third Flyers goaltender to post a shutout in Boston, joining Antero Niittymaki (27 saves on Jan. 2, 2006) and Brian Boucher (21 saves on March 4, 2000).
- He stopped a season-high 28-of-31 shots in regulation against Vancouver (10/19).
- He earned his first win of the season on Friday (10/11), saving 24-of-26 shots in regulation/OT and 4-of-5 shots in the shootout.
- The win during the season-opener against Vancouver (10/11) marked the goaltender's fifth career shootout win to tie for fourth all-time among Flyers goaltenders in shootout wins.

FEDS AND FEARLESS

- **Ivan Fedotov** was pulled after saving five of seven shots in the first period against Florida (12/5).
- He has earned a point in five of his last seven games (4-1-1) and has gone past regulation in five of his last seven games.
- He saved 26-of-30 shots in regulation/overtime and 2-of-3 shots in the shootout against Vegas (11/25).
- He faced 30-plus shots in four of his eight games this season.
- He stopped 33 of 37 shots against Carolina (11/20).
- He posted a three-game win streak, 11/7-11/16.
- He earned his first win at home and first win in regulation on Nov. 16 vs. Buffalo, saving 24-of-26 shots.
- The goaltender notched his first overtime win at Ottawa on Nov. 14, stopping 33-of-37 shots he faced.
- He recorded his first NHL win and shootout win against Tampa on Nov. 7.
- He stopped 22-of-23 shots he faced in regulation/overtime and went 2-for-2 shots in the shootout vs. Tampa (11/7).

KOLOS-SAL IN THE CREASE

- **Aleksei Kolosov** saved 25-of-26 shots he faced against Detroit (12/12) for his fourth win in his career and this season.
- He holds a 3-1-1 record in his last five games and has allowed three-or-fewer goals in six of his ten games played.
- He ranks third among NHL rookie goaltenders in wins (4), ranks ninth in goals-against average (3.05) and tied for ninth in save percentage (.889).
- He is only one of three NHL rookie goaltenders to play 10-plus games.
- The Belarusian native posted a career-high three-game win streak, Nov. 23-30, all three games had gone past regulation.
- He recorded his first NHL win on Nov. 23 against Chicago and became the first Belarusian-born goaltender to record a win in the NHL.
- Per NHL Stats, he became the fourth goaltender in Flyers history to record their first career win in overtime joining Rob Zepp, Samuel Ersson and Ivan Fedotov.
- He missed three games due to a lower-body injury, 11/17-11/11.
- The goaltender made his NHL debut against Montreal on Oct. 27, saving 20-of-24 shots he faced and posting a .833 save percentage.
- He became the first Belarusian-born goaltender and 17th Belarusian-native to play in the National Hockey League.



CAPTAIN O' CAPTAIN

- **Sean Couturier** owns six points (3g-3a) in the last 11 games.
- He ranks second on the team in overtime goals (1), tied for third in game-winning goals (1), tied for fourth in assists (9), fifth in goals (6), fifth in points (15) and sixth in shots (57).
- He tied Gary Dornhoefer (316) for 12th in Flyers history in all-time assists on Dec. 7 at Boston.
- He posted a four-game point streak (3g-2a), 11/23-11/29.
- He leads all the Flyers in career overtime goals (7) and ranks third in franchise history behind Claude Giroux (11) and Jakub Voracek (9).
- With his assist against Carolina on Nov. 5, he passes John LeClair for 13th in all-time assists in Flyers history with 311 assists.
- He tallied his second career regular season hat trick in his first career five-point game (3g-2a) on Saturday vs. Minnesota (10/26).
- The forward tallied his 500th career NHL point with his first goal on Oct. 26 against Minnesota. He is the 16th player in franchise history to surpass this milestone and the 11th NHL player to hit the 500 point-mark from the 2011 NHL Draft class.
- He recorded his 800th NHL game on Oct. 19 against Vancouver.

BUZZIN' WITH BEEZER

- **Joel Farabee** has three points (1g-2a) in the last six games.
- He ranks fourth on the team in shots (67), tied for fifth in power-play points (3), tied for eighth in goals (4), and ninth in points (11).
- He scored a goal against Utah on Dec. 8, breaking a 12-game goal drought.
- He has tallied two three-game point streaks this season, Oct. 27-31 and Oct. 11-17.
- He posted a three-game point streak (1g-2a) from Oct. 27-31.
- The 24-year-old owned three points (1g-2a) in the first four games of the season, Oct. 11-17.
- He tallied a power-play assist on Friday against Vancouver (10/11) to kick off the season. Per NHL Stats, with the assist, Farabee extended his career totals in season-opening games to three goals and five assists (5 GP). Only five players have more with the franchise: Bob Clarke (6g-11a in 15 GP), Bill Barber (10g-3a in 11 GP), Travis Konecny (7g-5a in 9 GP), Mark Howe (1g-9a in 10 GP) and John LeClair (5g-4a in 8 GP). (10/11)

FULL FOERS AHEAD

- **Tyson Foerster** owns four points (2g-2a) in the last eight games and six points (4g-2a) in the last 13 games.
- He ranks third on the team in power-play goals (3), tied for third in game-winning goals (1), tied for fifth in goals (6), and tied for 11th in points (10).
- He posted a three-game point streak (2g-1a), 11/29-12/5.
- He ranks tied for second on team in game-winning goals (1), third in power-play goals (3), tied for fourth in goals (6) and tied for fifth in power-play points (3).
- He scored his first goal of the season in the season opener at Vancouver (10/11).

FROSTING OVER

- **Morgan Frost** owns two points (1g-1a) in the last three games and six points (3g-3a) in the last 10 games.
- He is tied for third on the team in power-play points (4), tied for sixth in assists (8), eighth in points (12) and shots (46).
- He ranks second on the team in career shootout goals (3).
- He recorded his third multi-point game this season (1g-1a) on Dec. 10 at Columbus, 25th multi-point game in his career.
- He tallied his second multi-point game this season (1g-1a) on Nov. 25 vs. Vegas.
- He posted two assists against Edmonton (10/15), his first multi-point game this season.
- The forward scored the game-deciding goal in the shootout, his third shootout goal in his eighth career attempt at Vancouver (10/11).

KONNECT THE DOTS

- **Travis Konecny** saw his four-game point streak (2g-4a), 12/7-12/12, come to an end on Dec. 14 at Minnesota.
- He owns 13 points (4g-9a) in 11 games and 26 points (10g-16a) in the last 19 games.
- He ranks tied for seventh in the NHL in points (26) since Nov. 5th.
- He ranks tied for 16th in the NHL in points (36).
- The 27-year-old leads the team in goals (15), assists (21), points (36), power-play goals (6), and shots (83), tied for first in shorthanded goals (1) and ranks third in time on ice per game (21:12).
- Seven of his 15 goals this season have been on special teams.
- He notched two assists on Dec. 12 vs. Detroit, his ninth multi-point game this season and 101st in his career.
- The Canadian native was named to Canada's roster for the NHL's 2025 Four Nations Faceoff.
- He posted a seven-game point streak (6g-7a), 11/5-11/18, his second-longest point streak in his career.
- He notched his fifth multi-point game (2g-1a) of the season on Nov. 16 vs. Buffalo.



- He tallied multi-point games in consecutive contests: Nov. 14 at OTT (1g-1a) and Nov. 16 vs. BUF (2g-1a).
- He scored the game-deciding goal in the shootout against Tampa (11/7), his second shootout goal this season and fourth goal in his career. It was also his second game-deciding goal in his career.
- He tallied a four-point game (2g-2a) against Carolina on Nov. 5, his third multi-point game this season and 94th in his career.
- He tallied a three-game point streak (3g-4a) from Oct. 23-27.
- He notched his first career four-assist and five-point game (1g-4a) on Oct. 26 vs. Minnesota.
- The right-winger scored two goals (SH/PP), his first multi-point game at Calgary (10/12).
- He scored a shootout goal in the season-opener at Vancouver (10/11).

LOCKED ON LAUGHTON

- **Scott Laughton** scored his first career four-goal game on Dec. 12 against Detroit, ending a six-game goal drought.
- He owns five points (4g-1a) in the last six games.
- He ranks tied for first on the Flyers in shorthanded points (2), fourth in goals (7), sixth in points (14), seventh in shots (56), and tied for 10th in assists (7).
- He is the first Flyer to score four goals in a game since John LeClair on Oct. 15, 2002 against Montreal.
- He scored his 100th career NHL goal on Dec. 12 against Detroit and became the 38th player in Flyers franchise history to reach this milestone.

MARVELOUS MICHKOV

- **Matvei Michkov** owns 10 points (3g-7a) in the last seven games and 12 points (5g-7a) in the last 11 games.
- He posted a career-high five-game point streak (3g-7a), 11/30-12/10.
- The rookie leads NHL rookies in goals (11), points (27), power-play goals (5), and power-play points (12), overtime goals (3), ranks tied for first in game-winning goals (3), second in assists (16), third in shots (59) and sixth in time on ice (17:04).
- He leads the team in overtime goals and game-winning goals, ranks second in goals, assists, points and power-play goals and fifth in shots.
- He tallied multi-point games in three consecutive games: two points (1g-1a) on Nov. 30 at STL, three points (0g-3a) on Dec. 5 vs. FLA and two points (2g-0a) on Dec. 7 at BOS.
- Per NHL Stats, Michkov has three consecutive multi-point outings, joining Eric Lindros (3 GP in 1992-93) and Peter Zezel (2x in 1984-85) as the only Flyers teenagers to do so in three consecutive games.
- He scored his third career overtime goal on Nov. 30 at St. Louis and is tied for most by a teenager in NHL history along with Sidney Crosby, Rick Nash and Ilya Kovalchuk.
- Michkov (8g-10a in 23 GP) required the fourth-fewest games by a Flyers teenager to reach 10 career assists behind Peter Zezel (10 GP in 1984-85), Eric Lindros (17 GP in 1992-93) and Behn Wilson (21 GP in 1978-79). (NHL Stats)
- Per NHL Stats, Michkov joined Danius Zubrus (5 in 1997-98), Sean Couturier (4 in 2011-12) and Mike Ricci (4 in 1990-91) as the fourth teenager in Flyers history with three or more game-winning goals in a single season.
- He scored his second career overtime goal on Saturday against Chicago. Per NHL Stats, Michkov became the eighth teenager in NHL history to score multiple overtime goals along with Ilya Kovalchuk (3), Rick Nash (3), Sidney Crosby (3), Lucas Raymond (2), Clayton Keller (2), Cam Fowler (2) and Andrei Svechnikov (2).
- He scored the overtime goal at Ottawa (11/14), his first career overtime goal. He is the youngest Flyer to score an overtime goal in franchise history.
- The right wing is the fourth Flyers rookie to score an overtime goal, along with Shayne Gostisbehere, Murray Baron and Dmitry Yushkevich. (NHL Stats)
- Per NHL Stats, Michkov (1g-1a) recorded his fourth career multi-point game, which ties with Ron Sutter and Bobby Kelly for sixth-most by a Flyers teenager. (11/11)
- He tallied an assist at Carolina (11/5) to become the 17th Flyers skater to reach 10 career points in 13 games or fewer. Over the past 30 years, only two Flyers skaters have accomplished the feat: James van Riemsdyk (9 GP in 2009-10) and Mike Richards (11 GP in 2005-06). (NHL Stats)
- He was named NHL Rookie of the Month for October (11/1).
- The forward became the first Flyers rookie since James van Riemsdyk (1g-6a in 2009-10) to record at least seven points through his first seven NHL games. The only other teenage rookies to do so for the club are Peter Zezel (2g-6a in 1984-85), Eric Lindros (4g-3a in 1992-93) and Rich Sutter (5g-2a in 1983-84). (NHL Stats)
- The 19-year-old tallied his first and second NHL goals, both while on the power play, his first multi-goal and multi-point game in his career (10/15 at EDM).
- He is the first Flyers rookie to score multiple power-play goals since Nolan Patrick on April 3, 2018 at NY Islanders.
- The forward posted his first NHL assist/point against Calgary (10/12).
- He posted four shots and blocked one shot in 18:32 ice time in his NHL debut on Oct. 11 against Vancouver.



SANNY SIDE UP

- **Travis Sanheim** owns four points (1g-3a) in the last five games and seven points (1g-6a) in the last 11 games.
- He ranks fifth in the NHL in time on ice per game (25:12), sixth in takeaways (25) and tied for ninth in blocked shots (74).
- He ranks tied for 10th among NHL defensemen in points (13) since Nov. 11th.
- He leads the team in blocked shots and time on ice per game, ranks third in assists (13), points (19) and shots (69) and tied for fifth in goals (6).
- The 28-year-old leads all Flyers defensemen in goals, assist, points and shots.
- Per NHL Stats, Sanheim became the eighth defenseman in Flyers history to record 200 points with the franchise.
- The Canadian native was named to Canada's roster for the NHL's 2025 Four Nations Faceoff.
- He posted a three-game point streak (2g-4a), 11/14-11/18.
- The Manitoba-native posted his third multi-point game (1g-1a) vs. Buffalo (11/16).
- He registered his fifth-career three-point game (1g-2a) at Ottawa on Nov. 14.
- He notched three points (2g-1a), his first multi-point appearance of the season, against Montreal (10/27).
- The defenseman logged a season-high 27:49 time on ice on Oct. 26 vs. Minnesota (10/26).
- He scored his first goal of the season against Washington (10/22).

TIPP OF THE HAT

- **Owen Tippett** owns five points (5g-0a) in the last seven games.
- He ranks second on the team in shots (80), third in goals (9), fourth in points (16) and tied for 10th in assists (7).
- He scored the lone goal for Flyers in regulation against Tampa on Nov. 7 as well as a shootout goal to help earn the victory. His shootout goal was on his first shootout goal on his first attempt this season and his fourth attempt in his career.
- He tallied a multi-point game (1g-1a) against Carolina (11/5), his third this season and 35th in his career.
- The right winger posted a three-game point streak (1g-4a) from Oct. 23 - 27.

BLUELINE BRILLIANCE

- In the last ten games, the Flyers have had 19 points (4g-15a) from defensemen (11/25-12/14).
- **Emil Andrae** ranks second among NHL rookie defensemen in time on ice per game (19:26), tied for second in plus/minus (+3), third in shots (23) and tied for third in assists (4), points (5) and power-play points (2).
 - He ranks third among NHL rookies in time on ice per game and tied for sixth in plus/minus.
 - He scored his first NHL goal on Nov. 25 vs. Vegas.
 - He returned to the lineup against Chicago (11/23) after missing two games with a mid-body injury.
 - He played a career-high 25:40 TOI on Nov. 11 vs. San Jose.
 - He notched his first NHL assist/point at Boston (10/29).
 - He became the 25th Swedish-born player and 16th Swedish defenseman to tally a point for the Flyers franchise.
- **Jamie Drysdale** posted an assist on Dec. 10 at Columbus, his third assist this season, and his first point since returning to the lineup.
 - He returned to the lineup after missing 12 games against Utah (12/8) with an upper-body injury
 - He leads Flyers defensemen in power-play points (3) and ranks fourth in time on ice per game (20:13).
 - He logged a career-high 25:51 TOI on Nov. 7 at Tampa Bay.
 - He tallied his first multi-point game (2a) of the season at Washington (10/23).
- **Erik Johnson** recorded his 1,000th game in the NHL on Nov. 16 against Buffalo.
 - He scored his first goal of the season against San Jose (11/11).
 - He is one of eight players drafted in the 2006 NHL Draft still actively playing in the NHL and just one of two defensemen.
 - He ranks 12th among players drafted in the 2006 NHL Draft in games played (1000).
- **Rasmus Ristolainen** ranks second among Flyers defensemen in shots (39) and third in assists (7), points (8) and time on ice (20:19).
 - He posted a season-high four-game assist/point streak (0g-4a), 11/23-11/29.
 - The Finnish native was named to Finland's roster for the NHL's 2025 Four Nations Faceoff.
 - Per NHL Stats, his assist streak is his longest run as a member and the longest assist streak by any Philadelphia skater this season. (11/29)
 - He ranks fourth among NHL defensemen drafted in the 2013 NHL Draft in assists (240) and points (293).
 - He recorded two points (1g-1a) on Oct. 26 vs. Minnesota, his 47th career multi-point game.
- **Nick Seeler** owns four points (1g-3a) in the last six games.
 - He ranks 17th in the NHL in blocked shots (67).
 - He ranks second among Flyers defensemen in assists (8) and points (10), third in goals (2) and tied for third in shots (23).
 - He tallied two assists on Dec. 8 against Utah.
 - He posted two points (1g-1a) on Saturday against Minnesota (10/26).



- **Cam York** has two points (1g-1a) in the last five games.
 - He ranks second among Flyers defencemen in goals (3) and time on ice per game (22:18).
 - He scored a goal on Dec. 7 at Boston.
 - He returned to the lineup on Nov. 23 vs. Chicago after missing 13 games due to an upper-body injury.
