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

EDWARD J. DEBARTOLO Chairman of the Executive Committee

With ownership of the Pittsburgh Penguins of the National Hockey League, the three-time world champion San Francisco 49ers of the National Football League (owned by Edward J. DeBartolo, Jr.) as well as three thoroughbred racing facilities, the DeBartolo name has become synonymous with success in sporting competition. Edward J. DeBartolo has been instrumental in the development of each of these dynamic enterprises.

Thistledown, Mr. DeBartolo's first sports venture, is one of Ohio's top racing facilities. Home to the \$250,000 Ohio Derby, Thistledown hosts approximately 180 racing dates each year. In 1985, the facility underwent a \$25 million renovation which included the addition of the Midwest's first full-color Diamond Vision display system and other amenities. Louisiana Downs, the country's fifth largest track, is a premier facility which attracts the top contenders in the "Sport of Kings". The \$1,000,000 Super Derby, envisioned by Mr. DeBartolo and hosted at the Downs annually, is one of the world's richest 3-year-old Grade I stakes. America's newest world-class racing facility - Remington Park - which celebrated its inaugural season of racing in 1988, has already attained worldwide recognition for its racing innovations including Equitrack.

The firm also operates The Marie P. DeBartolo Sports Centre - new home to the San Francisco 49ers. The 49ers have been touted by sports professionals as the NFL "Team of the Decade" for their accomplishments.

Complementing his sporting achievement, Mr. DeBartolo is the founder and chief executive officer of the nation's leading shopping center development and management firm. During the past four decades, the firm has developed, owned/operates over 86 million square feet of commercial space from coast to coast. Office buildings, hotels, industrial parks and other ventures also carry the DeBartolo portfolilo. At Executive Headquarters in Youngtown, Ohio, Mr. DeBartolo employs a complete in-house staff with the capacity to research, plan, engineer, construct, manage, lease and promote any project the firm undertakes. Currently over 82 projects are in the development/planning stages.

Mr. DeBartolo has earned national acclaim from business and community leaders for his expertise. He was selected as Man of the Year in 1983 by the Vectors/ Pittsburgh, Youngtown State University's Distinguished Citizen in 1984 and as a 1985 recipient of the Ohio Governors award. He was also one of 80 distinguished Americans to receive the Ellis Island medal of honor in 1986. During 1989, Mr. DeBartolo was named as a winner of thoroughbred racing's highest honor - The Special Eclipse. He became one of only seven individuals in the 18 year history of the program to receive this prestigious award which is presented annually by the Thoroughbred Racing Assocoation, the Daily Racing Form and National Turf Writers Assocoation.

A member of the Thoroughbred Racing Association, Urban Land Institute and the National Realty Committee, Mr. DeBartolo has also served on the Board of International Council of Shopping Centers and the Advisory Council of the University of Notre Dame (where he received his degree in engineering).



MARIE DENISE DEBARTOLO YORK President

Marie Denise DeBartolo is actively involved in the family's sports enterprises. Along with her father, Edward J. DeBartolo and brother, Edward J. DeBartolo, Jr., she has helped to shape the growth of the Pittsburgh Penguins as well as three top-notch thoroughbred racing facilities. In addition to these responsibilities, Marie Denise oversees wide-ranging activities for the nation's largest shopping center development and management firm - The Edward J. DeBartolo Corporation. As Executive Vice President of Personnel and Public Relations, she is dedicated to the formulating innovative employee-oriented programs which have earned her the respect of professionals throughout the shopping center industry. Additionally, her department is responsible for all Corporate marketing efforts, advertising campaigns, press conferences, community events as well as all publications and brochures.

A graduate of St. Mary's College at Notre Dame, Marie Denise has been with the Corporation 17 years. Her significant contributions to the firm during that period have earned her several key promotions. Marie Denise is married to John C. York II, M.D. They have two sons and twin daughters.



ANTHONY W. LIBERATI Secretary and Treasurer

For the past seven years, Anthony W. Liberati has successfully directed a broad spectrum of real estate and financial activities for The Edward J. DeBartolo Corporation, the nation's largest developer and manager of shopping malls.

Liberati, who effectively serves as Senior Vice President of Corporate Planning and Finance, has helped coordinate the development of DeBartolo's diversified interests, including shopping centers, mixed-use projects, office towers and sports enterprises, in 24 states. Prior to his appointment with DeBartolo, Liberati was the former Executive Vice President of Equibank's Banking Group in Pittsburgh. He was responsible for both retail and commercial functions at the Bank's 89 offices. Liberati was also involved in commercial and international lending, construction/real estate finance as well as government institutional lending. In June, 1981, Liberati left Equibank to organize LDS Associates as specialists in real estate development and investment. The DeBartolo Corporation made LDS a Pittsburgh subsidiary after Liberati's appointment in April, 1982.

Liberati is a graduate of Duquesne University in Pittsburgh with a degree in finance. He attended St. Mary of the Mount High School in Pittsburgh. Married to the former Margie Hirth of Pittsburgh, Liberati and his wife have three daughters, Lisa and Carla of Pittsburgh and Dayna Liberati DiRienzo. The Liberati's reside in Canfield, Ohio.



TONY ESPOSITO Vice President & General Manager

Tony, 46, proved to be very successful in his first year of managing the Penguins. A team that had not qualified for the playoffs in seven seasons improved and advanced to a 7-game Patrick Division Finals.

Named Vice President & General Manager of the franchise on April 14, 1988, Tony joined the Pens after a 16-year playing career which earned him the reputation as one of the premier goaltenders in the history of the sport. On September 7, 1988, he was inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame in Toronto, and on November 20, 1988 the Chicago Blackhawks' organization retired Tony's jersey #35 as a tribute to his years of outstanding play in the National Hockey League.


He broke into the NHL with the Stanley Cup Champion Montreal Canadiens in 1968-69 and was selected the following year by Chicago in the NHL Inter-League Draft, playing with the Blackhawks through 15 seasons until he retired from play in 1984.

In his first year with Chicago, Tony won the Vezina Trophy as the league's top goaltender and was honored with the Calder Trophy as the NHL Rookie of the Year. He won the Vezina Trophy a second time in 1972 sharing the honors with teammate Gary Smith and again in 1974 along with Philadelphia's Bernie Parent. In addition, he was named to the NHL All-Star Teams on five occasions.

Tony currently ranks 3rd among All-Time NHL goaltenders with 423 wins to his credit and 7th among all-time shutout leaders with 76 including 15 his rookie season which is still a Blackhawk record. He ended his playing career with a 2.92 goals against average through 886 regular season games and accumulated an additional 45 wins and 6 shutouts in playoff competition.

Prior to his appointment with the Penguins, Tony served as Director of Player Personnel for the NHL's Player Association. He is a graduate of Michigan Tech with a Bachelor of Science degree in business.

Tony and wife Marilyn have two sons, Mark (21) and Jason (18) and reside in Pittsburgh's North Hills area.



J. PAUL MARTHA General Counsel

A native Pittsburgher, Paul is well known for his involvement with sports thoroughout the city. A standout athlete for many years, he has spent the past ten years serving the sports community at the management level.

A graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Paul was an All-American halfback at Pitt and was the Pittsburgh Steelers' #1 draft choice in 1964. He played defensive back for the Steelers in the NFL from 1964-69 while attending law school. Paul obtained his Doctor of Law degree at Duquesne University in 1969 and retired from pro football with the AFL Denver Broncos in 1970 to practice law on a full-time basis.

Paul joined the Penguins' organization during the summer of 1978 after the DeBartolo Corporation took control of the franchise. He was elected Vice-President prior to the 1978-79 season and has handled the club's legal matters as general counsel since that time. He has also served on the NHL Board of Governors.

With a background in law and professional football, Paul was selected to serve as Neutral Arbitrator for the NFL in 1982. He also served as President for the defunct Maulers in the USFL during their season in Pittsburgh and has handled legal work for the San Francisco 49ers of the NFL. He became involved with the Major Indoor Soccor League as well, serving as Vice President for the Pittsburgh Spirit.

Paul currently serves as Executive Vice President of the Civic Arena Corporation and heads operations of the entertainment facility by overseeing its daily operation. He and wife Bobbie reside in the North Hills and are the parents of three sons.



GENE UBRIACO HEAD COACH

Gene, 51, enters his second season behind the Penguins' bench after coaching the team to their best finish (6th overall) in club history.

Under his guidance, the Penguins had a record breaking year as they established a new NHL record for power play goals (119) and set club records for most overall wins (40), most goals (347) and most shorthanded goals (19) in a season. In addition, the Penguins play improved on the road as they set club records for most road wins (16), road points (36) and road goals (162) in a season.

A member of the original Penguins team in 1967-68, Gene rejoined the Penguins after coaching the Baltimore Skipjscks of the AHL for five years. During his first year with Baltimore he guided his club to the best record in the league (46-24-10) and Southern Division title advancing to the playoff semi-finals. At the conclusion of the 1983-84 season, he was honored as the AHL Coach of the Year.

In 1984-85, during his second year behind the Jacks' bench, Ubriaco's team advanced to the Calder Cup Finals and set a new AHL record which still stands with 16 consecutive victories during the season.

A competitive forward during his playing career, Ubriaco played in the AHL from 1960-67 for Rochester, Pittsburgh and Hershey. He broke into the NHL ranks in 1967 with the Penguins and played for Oakland and Chicago before retiring as a player in 1971.

Gene's coaching career began in 1972-73 as an assistant with Lake Superior State College. In 1975 he served as general manager and coach for Chicago in the United States Hockey League and was honored as USHL Coach of the Year before moving on to coach Milwaukee in 1976. His coaching career has spanned the International Hockey League (1977-79), Eastern Hockey League (1979-81), Central Hockey League (1981-83) and American Hockey League (1983-88) since 1976.

Actively involved in a variety of charity and community programs, Ubriaco has served as counselor and program director for the American Hearing Impaired Hockey School in Chicago since 1974 and currently serves as their Executive Vice President.

Gene and wife Nella are parents of a daughter Francine and son Gene.

RICK KEHOE Assistant Coach

Rick, 37, begins his third season on the Penguins' coaching staff. An NHL right winger through 14 seasons, he broke into the NHL with Toronto after the Maple Leafs drafted him in 1971. After three seasons he was traded to Pittsburgh where he spent the remainder of his playing career making his mark in the Penguins' record books.

He ranks second on the Penguins All-Time Scoring List with 636 points points to his credit through nine plus seasons. He also ranks second in all-time goals scored with 312 and games played with 722 while ranking third in all-time assists with 324.

Rick was honored after the 1980-81 season winning the NHL's Lady Byng Trophy in recognition of a year when he set a club record for goals in a season with 55. He was also Pittsburgh's representative in the 1981 and 1983 NHL All Star Games.

Residing in the South Hills of Pittsburgh, Rick is married to Kathy and has a daughter Carrie (13).



RICK PATERSON Assistant Coach

Rick, 31, enters his second year of coaching after a 10-year playing career which spanned three leagues as a pro. Drafted by Chicago in the 1978 NHL Draft, he spent his entire NHL career with the Blackhawks' organization. Known for his defensive work as a forward and his penalty killing, he still owns the Black Hawks' record for fastest two shorthanded goals scored in a game when he tallied the goals 2:30 apart vs Winnipeg during the 1984-85 campaign.

During his NHL career, Paterson played in 430 games for Chicago and scored a total of 50 goals with 14 coming when his team was shorthanded. A dedicated and hard-working player, he primarily played on his team's checking line and has experience at all three forward positions.

After the 1987-88 season, Rick entertained the thought of working as a hockey referee and attended a school for on-ice officials in Canada.

Rick and wife Anne have a daughter Brittany (2 1/2 years) and reside in Pittsburgh's North Hills year-round.

CHARLES "SKIP" THAYER - TRAINER Skip has 19 years of experience as an athletic trainer including 18 years with the Chicago Black Hawks organization. While attending the University of Maine, he worked as a trainer at Colby College and upon graduation moved to Indiana University where he worked in athletic therapy and obtained his masters degree. He served as the head trainer at Nicholls College in Massachusetts for two years prior to joining the BlackHawks in 1969. While working in the NHL with Chicago he helped to organize the NHL Trainers Association and at one time served as it's president. Skip has worked as a certified paramedic for ten of the past eleven offseasons. Last summer he recieved his massage practitioner certification from Heartwood Institute in California.

JOHN WELDAY - STRENGTH & CONDITIONING COACH

John joins the Penguins this year after working five years as the Strength and Conditioning Coach at Dartmouth College, During that time he also served as an instructor for physical education classes in strength training. A Penn State graduate with a Bachelors degree in health and physical education, John played offensive tackle for the Nittany Lions in 1978 and 1979 until an injury confined him to the training room. He then served as an assistant strength coach with PSU from 1980 to 1983 working with the varsity athletes. He also worked as a teaching assistant for PSU major's program on strength and conditioning. A native of Toronto, Ohio, John and wife Jodi are the parents of son Jared and daughter Jordon.



STEVE LATIN - EQUIPMENT MANAGER A gradute of Eastern Michigan University in Ypsilante with an associates degree in business, Steve began working in the NHL with the Detroit Red Wings in 1980. After gaining six

the Detroit Red Wings in 1980. After gaining six years of experience with Detroit, he moved on to Hartford where he worked as the Whalers assistant equipment manager the following two seasons. A Dearborn, Michigan native Steve begins his second season with the Penguins.

CIVIC ARENA

Pittsburgh's Civic Arena features the largest retractable stainless steel roof in the country. Originally designed for use by the Civic Light Opera, the dome cost 9 million dollars of the building's 22 million dollars in construction costs. The roof has no interior support but instead is supported by a huge cantilever arm arching 260 feet.


Opened in 1961, the Civic Arena has undergone various expansion programs. In 1972-73, the press box was built on the East side and 23 "super boxes" were constructed on its West side two years later. North end and South end balconies (each with 1,500 additional seats) were constructed. Currently, the Civic Arena is in the midst of a three-year \$11.4 million renovation program which includes exterior landscaping, new A-level seating, reconstruction of the Igloo Club and the addition of new super boxes, new concoures and an expanded press box.

Tom played 10 games for the Buffalo Sabres before being traded to Pittsburgh on Nov. 12... played 44 games with the Penguins with a 18-15-7 record and posted a 4.04 average...his 18 wins was the most by a Penguin netminder since 1985-86...set a club record with 57 saves at Chicago on March 12...recorded two 4-game win streaks from Nov. 23-Dec. 3 and Dec. 14-20...played in 16 consecutive games from Feb. 18-Mar. 20...Was 12-8-3 at home and 7-7-4 on the road...ranked 2nd among NHL goalies in penalty minutes with 70...set a new club record for assists with five and his combined total (Buffalo) of eight shared the league lead with Ron Hextall of Philadelphia...missed 10 games with a pulled groin and two with an injury to his right shoulder...was 7-4 in the playoffs with a 3.75 average.

He has the distinction of being drafted higher than any goaltender in NHL history as Buffalo selected him 5th overall in 1983...a native of Boston, Mass., he broke into the NHL after a successful high school career at Acton-Boxboro...captured the Vezina Trophy as the league's top goalie in 1983-84 along with the Calder Trophy as the NHL's Rookie of the Year...named to the NHL First All-Star Team and All Rookie Team at the conclusion of the 1983-84 season...was named to the NHL Second All-Star Team and shared the William Jennings Trophy with teammate Bob Sauve in 1984-85...played in the 1985 All-Star Game...played for Team USA in the 1984 and 1987 Canada Cup Tournaments...has 142 NHL victories to his credit...has finished 1st or 2nd in voting for the Vezina Trophy three of the last six years.



ON THIS DATE IN PITTSBURGH PENGUINS HISTORY

June 5, 1967 Pittsburgh franchise joins the National Hockey League. October 11, 1967 Penguins first NHL game at the Civic Arena vs Montreal. Penguins lost to Montreal 2-1 with 9,307 fans on hand. Andy Bathgate scores the Penguins first goal. October 13, 1967 Penguins first victory as they defeated St. Louis 3-1 on the road. October 18, 1967 Andy Bathgate records first hat trick in club history vs Minnesota. Les Binkley records the club's first shutout (1-0) vs California. November 4, 1967 February 3, 1968 Penguins first sellout at Civic Arena vs Toronto (12,563) March 22, 1968 Donald Parsons heads a Michigan group who purchases 80% of the Penguins franchise. July 2, 1969 Leonard "Red" Kelly is named coach of the Penguins. April 1, 1970 Penguins defeat Philadelphia 4-1 to clinch second place in the Western Divison, putting them in playoffs for the first time. Penguins defeat Oakland 2-1 in club's first playoff game April 8, 1970 April 11, 1970 Ken Schinkel records 1st playoff hat trick in club history vs Oakland. May 21, 1970 Jack Riley, club's general manager for first three years is promoted to president and coach Red Kelly is promoted to general manager/coach. March 3, 1971 Les Binkley records his 11th career shutout with Penguins which is still a club record. April 13, 1971 Michel Briere dies from injuries suffered in an auto accident on May 15, 1970. Thayer Potter heads a Pittsburgh group who buys team. April 21, 1971 January 29, 1972 Red Kelly steps down as general manager but remains coach and Jack Riley regains general manager duties. Ken Schinkel is named coach of Penguins. Greg Polis wins MVP honors at NHL All-Star Game in New York January 13, 1973 January 30, 1973 after scoring two goals. January 13, 1974 Jack Button named general manager of Penguins. February 6, 1974 January 22, 1975 Marc Boileau named coach of the Penguins. Syl Apps named MVP in NHL All-Star Game in Montreal after scoring two goals. Penguins defeat St. Louis 3-2 to establish a 20-game home February 22, 1975 unbeaten streak which is still a club record. June 13, 1975 Pittsburgh Penguins declared bankruptcy. July 11, 1975 July 29, 1975 Albert Savill, Otto Frenzel and Wren Blair buy Penguins. Marc Boileau rehired as coach. December 29, 1975 January 16, 1976 March 24, 1976 Penguins are beaten by Soviet Wings 7-4 at Civic Arena. Ken Schinkel rehired as coach. Jean Pronovost becomes the first Penguin to score 50 goals in a season and Pierre Larouche becomes first Penguin to record 100 points in one season vs Boston. December 3, 1976 Aldege "Baz" Bastien named club's general manager. January 13, 1977 October 19, 1977 Johnny Wilson hired to coach Penguins. Bob Prince debuts as the club's television play-by-play announcer. Edward J. DeBartolo takes control of the club, having purchased April 5, 1978 one-third of the franchise the year before. George Ferguson scores in OT to eliminate Buffalo in preliminary April 14, 1979 round of playoffs. UNBALANCED SCHEDULE

Each of the 21 teams will play an 80-game scheduled with those teams in the Smythe, Norris and Adams Division having eight games (four home and four away) against each of their divisional opponents, plus three games against each of the remaining 16 teams in the league. In the case of the three games, teams will play two home and one away or vice-versa, alternating the extra home game each year.

STANLEY CUP PLAYOFFS

At the conclusion of the regular schedule, the top four finishers in each division will qualify for the Stanley Cup Playoffs.

The opening round features divisional playoffs that will have the first place club oppose the fourth place team and second versus third in the best-of-seven series. The winners of each series will advance to a best-of-seven divisional final series, with the team gaining higher standing during the regular season holding home-ice advantage.

The four divisional winners will meet in a best-of-seven conference championship. The Smythe Division winner will face the Norris Division winner for the Campbell Conference title and the Patrick Division winner will face the Adams Division winner for the Prince of Wales Conference crown. Teams with the most points during the regular season will have home-ice advantage.

Conference winners will meet in the Stanley Cup Finals in a best-of-seven series, again with the team having the most regular season points getting the home-ice advantage. The finals will be played in a 2-2-1-1-1 setup with the home team advantage having the first and second, fifth (if needed) and seventh (if needed) games in their building.

For the fourth consecutive year, all playoff series will be scheduled on a 2-2-1-1-1 basis.

TIE BREAKING PROCEDURE

If two or more teams in ther same division finish the regular season with an equal number of points, the following criteria, in order, are used to determine the order of finish:

- (1) The greater number of victories by each club.
- (2) The greater number of points earned by each club in games played among each club.
- (3) The greater differential betweens goals scored for and against during the entire 80game season by each club.





 In a 5-goal effort vs New Jersey on Dec. 31, he recorded one of each type of goal possible with an even strength, power play, shorthanded, penalty shot and empty net goal.
