JACK RILEY
General Manager

Born: Toronto, Ontario
June 14, 1919

IF EVER A MAN was well-prepared for the job of general manager of a National League hockey team, **John Thomas Riley** certainly is that man.

Long rated one of the top executives in the game, Jack has made all the stops along the hockey trail. He was assigned the tough task of developing a brand new team just a few months after the city was granted a franchise in the expanded NHL.

In commenting on Riley's appointment, Penguin President Jack E. McGregor said, "When we first started looking for a general manager we asked NHL officials and the other owners to help us. Each one submitted a list of prospects. Only Jack Riley's name appeared on every single list."

The Penguins were not the only team interested in Riley's services. At least two other expansion clubs contacted Jack and were prepared to offer him the top position in their organizations. Had they had time, the others would have been interested, too. That's how highly thought of Jack Riley was then and he has added to his stature since taking over the post, impressing one and all, in and out of hockey.

Like most young Canadian boys, Jack's hockey career started in the junior ranks in his hometown of Toronto. He was a good stickhandler and a clever player, but he never made it big as a player, the American Hockey League being the top level of competition he reached. Most of his success was achieved in the Eastern Amateur League.

In 1940 the New York Rangers signed Jack to a professional contract. First, an injury and later two years in the Canadian Army sidetracked any big league ambitions Riley might have had.

After the war he played with Hershey, Baltimore and Washington in the AHL before turning to coaching. A painful arthritic condition put a temporary halt to his activities before he returned to manage Washington's Uline Arena and later manage the hockey club.

From there it was a steady path of progress to Johnstown and then Rochester. While at Rochester Jack's executive acumen came to the fore. So much so, in fact, that when Pittsburgh's Jim Balmer retired as president of the American Hockey League in 1964 Riley was drafted to fill the vacancy.

Two years later the call from the Penguins came. Never one to make a hasty decision, Riley, now 48, mulled it over, considered the other offers and then accepted the Pittsburgh challenge.

Typical of Jack's confidence in himself and his organizational talents, he named Red Sullivan his coach only minutes after his own appointment was made public. This indicated that he believed he would get one of the expansion positions and was planning for it by lining up the former New York coach for his own club, regardless of what city it might have been.

Riley's and Sullivan's thoroughness in the expansion draft was another fine example of Jack's ability. Observers marvelled at the quickness and firmness with which he selected his future players. He had a plan and followed it.

Since coming to Pittsburgh Jack Riley has impressed everyone he has met whether they be sportswriters, public officials, fans or neighbors.

Jack is married and he and his wife, Jeanne, have three children. The oldest, John, teaches school in Buffalo while Tom is a senior at St. Michaels College in Toronto. Ten year old Barbara is busy making friends around the Rileys' new Mt. Lebanon home.

**GEORGE JAMES
(RED) SULLIVAN**

Coach

RED SULLIVAN, who celebrates his 38th birthday the day before Christmas, already has three seasons of NHL coaching experience to call on in his efforts to make the Penguins a winner in their first big league season. And to go with this rare combination of youth and experience, Sullivan has always been one of the hardest workers in hockey.

As a player, Red relied more on desire and hustle to make his mark than he did on natural ability. Not that he didn't have the talent. His 107 NHL goals and nine seasons in the league attest to that. But he was known more for his aggressive play and never-say-die attitude on the ice.

Sully coaches the same way he played and an observer watching a Penguin workout will quickly see this. He drives his players hard in their drills, feeling there is no substitute for a well-conditioned team. He puts great emphasis on checking and knows the goals will come if you skate hard on both ends of the ice.

Sullivan played in the NHL with three different teams, two seasons with Boston, two with Chicago and five with New York. In his 14-year pro career, he also spent some time in the American Hockey League and still holds the league record of 119 points in one season.

Red started his coaching career as a player-coach with Kitchener of the old Eastern Professional Hockey League in 1961. The following season he headed the Baltimore Clippers for a half season before getting the call to take over the New York coaching reins from Doug Harvey.

Not having the best playing personnel with which to work, Red, like most coaches with losing teams, was relieved of the Ranger bench job in mid-December of 1965. General Manager Emile Francis took over and Sullivan was made a trouble-shooter in the organization.

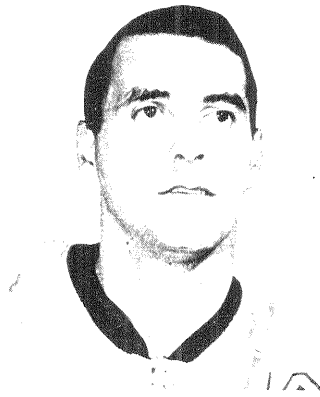
He wasn't out of coaching long when he became the Penguins initial coach in May of 1966. It was General Manager Jack Riley's first official move and came a few minutes after Jack was named to his post.

Red is a top-notch golfer, playing lefthanded to a four handicap. Since moving to the area early this past summer he has tested most of the district golf courses and comes out on top more often than not.

A native of Peterborough, Ontario, Red and his wife, Marion, and their family of three girls and a boy have moved to the Pittsburgh suburb of Mt. Lebanon and will make their permanent home here.

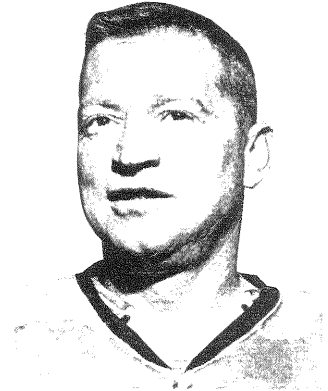

VERSATILE Paul Andrea was acquired by the Penguins a few minutes after the expansion draft was completed last June. GM Jack Riley traded Larry Jeffrey, a third round selection, to the New York Rangers for Andrea, Duncan McCallum and George Konik. . . . Andrea, who can play all three forward positions, brings impressive credentials to Pittsburgh. Playing in the Central League the past four seasons, the 26-year old native of Nova Scotia has scored 126 goals and racked up 284 points. In each of the past two winters he has registered 37 goals and led the CPHL in that department two seasons back. By adding 43 assists to his goal output, he earned a First Team All Star berth. . . . A smart guy with the puck, as his scoring records show, Paul has played just four NHL games prior to this season. He is going to get a good chance to make it this year. If he can come close to approaching his Central League form, he should become a fixture with the Penguins. . . . Paul is married and he and his wife, Paula, have two boys and a girl. They live in North Sydney, Nova Scotia during the off-season.

A LAST MINUTE acquisition from the Detroit Red Wings shortly before training camp opened, **Hank Bassen** gives the Penguins valuable NHL experience in goal. He has played in 127 National League games with Chicago and Detroit. When called upon, usually in an emergency, Hank has always turned in a capable performance. . . . The 34-year old redhead's return to Pittsburgh is a popular one with the local ice buffs. Hank has been a familiar figure in the nets over the past five seasons as he shuttled between Pittsburgh and Detroit. Last Spring he capped a great late season effort by allowing just 1.67 goals per game in nine Calder Cup playoff matches as Pittsburgh stormed to the AHL title. . . . Hank has been known to excite fans with his roaming habits, often going far out from the net to smother a play in front or behind the cage or sometimes even as far as the side boards. However, as his record clearly shows, Bassen is a sound goaltender who gives everything he has all the time. A chronic back injury has bothered him in recent years which, at times, requires a brief rest. . . . Hank is married and lives in Calgary with his wife, Shirley, and four children.

THIS IS THE SEASON when Andy Bathgate gets to prove to a lot of hockey people that he still has most of what it took for him to become the NHL's ninth all-time goal scorer. After a couple of sub-par campaigns, Detroit left Andy unprotected and he was drafted in the 17th round by the Penguins. . . . In 13 full NHL seasons, Bathgate has produced 314 goals while playing with New York, Toronto and Detroit. Add 556 assists to his goal total and Bathgate has registered almost a point-a-game in 919 regular season contests. . . . Andy enjoyed his greatest success in the nine plus years he spent with the Rangers. For seven straight seasons he totalled at least 74 points and his top mark was 88 in 1958-59, the season he won the Hart Trophy. He shared the league scoring crown with Bobby Hull in 1961-62, each getting 84 points. Twice Andy has been named to the All Star team. . . . Bathgate will be used primarily at right wing, the position where he feels most natural and has been most productive. However, if need be, Andy is available anywhere up front and plays the right point well on the power play. . . . Andy is married and he and his wife, Merle, have a boy and a girl. In the off-season Andy can usually be found on a golf course breaking par.

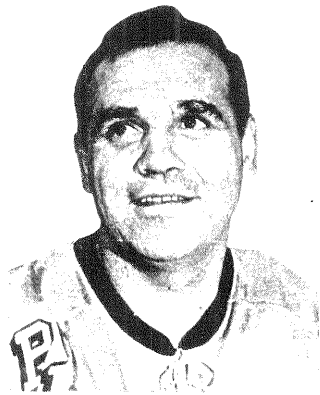

ONE OF FOUR PLAYERS purchased by the Penguins from the Cleveland Barons prior to the start of last season, Les Binkley was loaned to the San Diego Gulls of the Western League while waiting for the Penguins to actually begin playing. Despite being with a last place club, Les turned in a consistent performance and was named to the league's Second All Star team. . . . Binkley's entry into the active professional playing ranks had a most unusual twist. He actually came to Cleveland as the team's trainer for the 1960-61 season. An injury to the regular goalie near the end of the campaign gave Les a chance. He played so well that he won the regular job for the following season. In his first full campaign he copped the AHL's Rookie of the Year award and was named to the All Star team, an honor he duplicated two seasons ago when he led the league's goaltenders with the lowest goals against mark. . . . Prior to the present season Les had never played in the NHL, but Red Sullivan and Jack Riley are hoping he can duplicate the feats of another former Cleveland goaltender—Johnny Bower—who didn't reach the NHL until he was past the thirty mark. . . . Les is married and lives in Walkerton, Ontario where he is a salesman in the off-season. He and his wife, Eleanor, have two children, a boy and a girl.

CONSIDERED THE HARDEST body checker in the National League, tough and durable **Leo Boivin** can pass the 1,000 game mark this season by playing in 61 regular season games. He was drafted fifth by the Penguins. . . . A good team player, Leo has the perfect temperament for a professional athlete. He puts out all the time and is a good thinker under fire. . . . Although he has spent 15 seasons in the NHL with Toronto, Boston and Detroit, Boivin has yet to play on a Stanley Cup winner. In fact, his teams have made the playoffs just six times. Two seasons ago he played a big role in Detroit's march to the finals but champagne from the cup was not his fate as Montreal turned back the gallant Red Wing bid. . . . Despite his rough style of play, Boivin collects relatively few penalty minutes and has only gone over the 100 minute mark in one season. He sees a lot of ice time as a penalty killer as opposing forwards find him hard to move around the net. . . . Leo and his wife, Pat, have three children, all boys and live in Prescott, Ontario where he was born.

Both Jack Riley and Red Sullivan liked what they saw in Daley during their intensive scouting tours last winter as the little netminder split his services between Pittsburgh and Memphis. . . . After compiling their reports and comparing notes, the pair of Irishmen agreed that Daley had more potential than any other young goalie in pro hockey. Having the courage of their convictions, they unhesitatingly named Daley when Pittsburgh's turn came around. . . . A real battler in the Red Sullivan mold, Daley has a natural quickness which is always a desirable trait in a goaltender. Couple these attributes with a strong desire to play hockey and you have a great prospect. . . . Joe played his amateur hockey in the West and came up through the Detroit farm system, making stops in all the pro leagues on his way to the NHL. . . . Joe is married and with his wife, Darlene, and young son, lives in East Kildonan, Manitoba.

WHEN TALK GETS AROUND to durable hockey players, sooner or later the name of Billy Dea enters the conversation. For Dea holds the American League's record for consecutive games. He played in 548 straight games and only the death of his father prevented the little left winger from adding to this total. He broke the record which was set during the 1965-66 season. . . . Selected in the thirteenth round of the draft by the Penguins, Dea can also claim consistency as well as durability. In the last nine years with Buffalo of the AHL, Billy has scored at least 20 goals a season and three times has reached the thirty mark. . . . Billy was originally signed by the New York Rangers and played his first NHL games with the Blues, but since has also seen service with Detroit and Chicago, the team from which he was drafted. In fact, last season he appeared in two Stanley Cup games for the Black Hawks. Short and compact, the 34-year old veteran is a solid, two-way player and does a good job killing penalties. . . . Billy is married and he and his wife, Sally, have one child, a son. Dea works for Molson's Brewery in the summer doing public relations work.

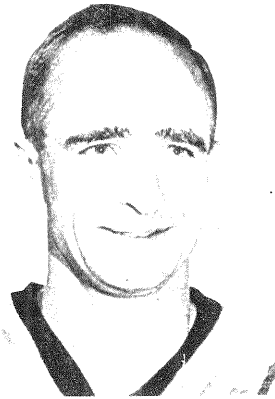

ONE OF THE BEST SKATERS in hockey, Bob Dillabough is a product of the Detroit Red Wing farm system but has spent most of his big league career with the Boston Bruins. The Bruins acquired Bob from Detroit in a seven player deal after the 1964-65 season. He played the entire past two seasons with the Bruins. . . . Although he has never hung up impressive point totals in his seven pro seasons, Dillabough is a solid two-way player and can be counted on to carry more than his share of the load defensively. His strong skating makes him a natural for penalty killing and he is one of the best in the game at it. . . . Injuries have done more to hold back Bob's progress than anything else. At various times he has been sidelined because of groin, shoulder and knee problems. The past two summers he has required surgery and his knee operation this year slowed him down in training camp. . . . Selected ninth in the expansion draft, Bob's small physical stature belies his actual strength. He is a good competitor, a real fighter, and battles all the way. . . . Bob is married and he and his wife, Shirley, have no children. They live in McArthurs Mills where Bob spends a lot of time hunting and fishing in the off-season.

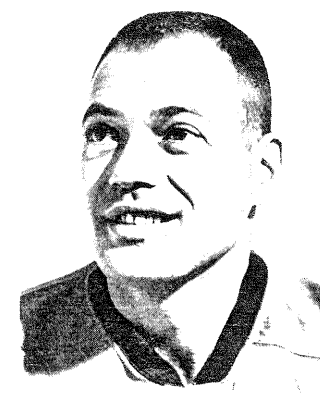

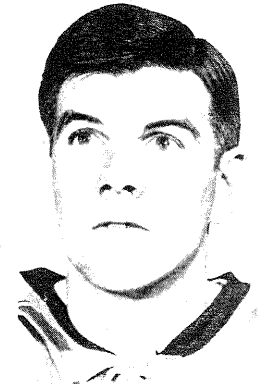

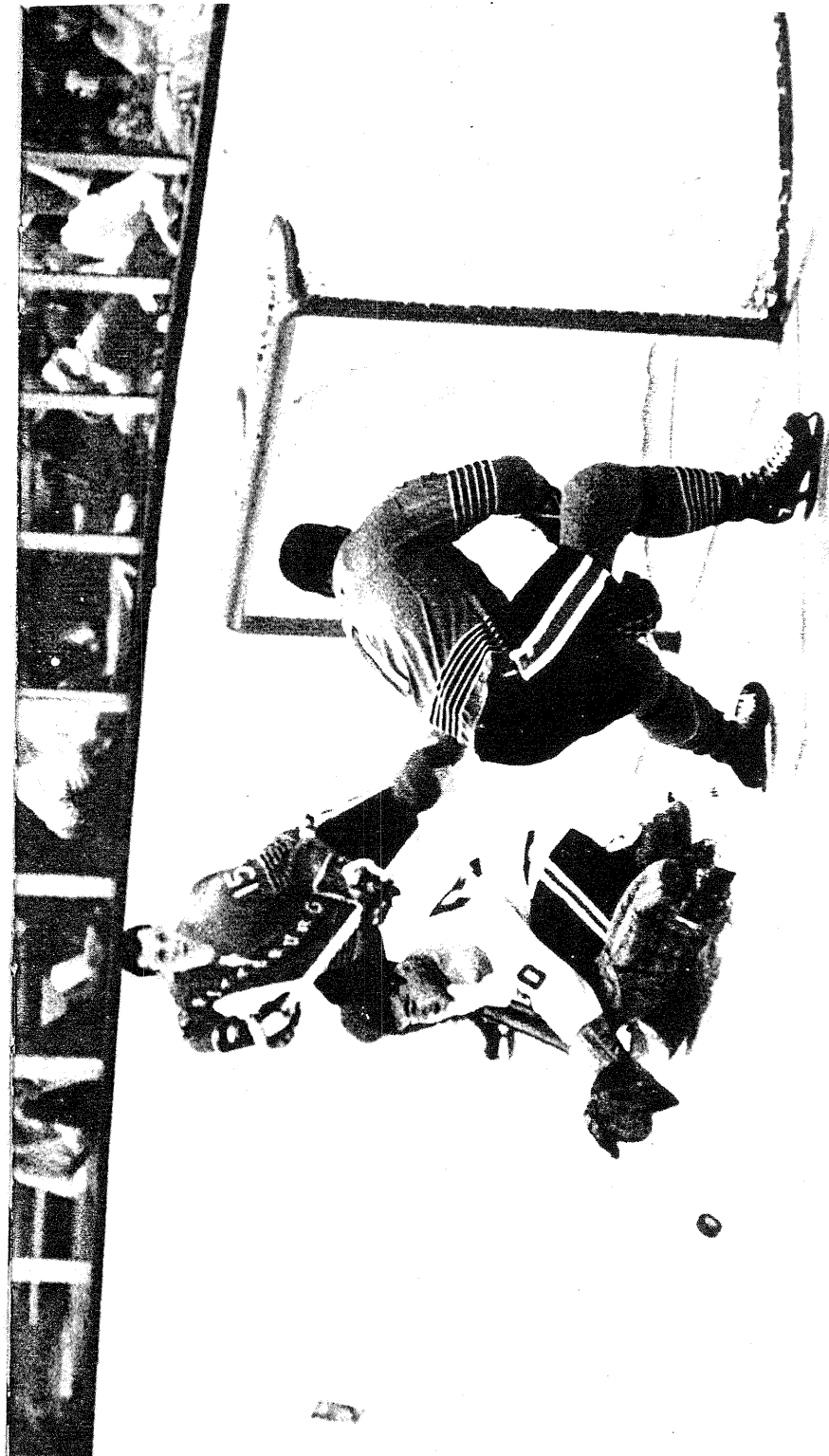
