General Manager

& Coach



Red Kelly, voted "Coach of the Year" by *The Sporting News*, has achieved what every coach wants — a winner every season.

In his first year as coach of the Pittsburgh Penguins (1969-70) he led the Pens to the semi-finals in their first Stanley Cup Playoffs after clinching second place in the National Hockey League's Western Division. He capped the season by being named General Manager and Coach on May 21, 1970.

Perhaps the achievement gained by Kelly which best exemplifies his career was his winning the Lady Byng Memorial Trophy in 1951, making him only the second defenseman ever to win the award. He went on to win the award three more times.

In the sometimes violent world of hockey, Red Kelly has proven that "good guys" can, in fact do, belong in the NHL. Because of the physical contact of hockey, roughness — both in playing and behavior — is often part of the sport. But it has been refreshing to followers of the game to know the likes of Kelly, where words such as "hang" or "by shucks" are his strongest shows of anger. Yet, Kelly, one of only five players to participate for 20 years in the NHL, has never been thought of as anything but a man who gives his best effort at all times.

Consider his record, keeping in mind that during his twelve and a half seasons with the Detroit Red Wings, he was mostly a defenseman; a four-time winner of the Lady Byng Memorial Trophy; the first winner of the James Norris Memorial Trophy as the outstanding defenseman; six First Team All-Star selections and two Second Team berths; eight times on Stanley Cup championship teams; nine times on Prince of Wales Trophy-winning teams; most years in the Stanley Cup playoffs (19); most playoff games (164); runner-up to Gordie Howe for most regular-season games (1,316); and most games including playoffs (1,480); 13th among all-time goalscoring leaders (281 goals); seventh among all-time pointscoring leaders (823 points).

Leonard Patrick Kelly was born at Simcoe, Ontario, July 9, 1927. At the age of two he was beginning to skate. He later entered St. Michael's

College in Toronto and starred with the Junior "A" team of that school, the Majors. In 1947, the Detroit Red Wings signed the nineteen-year-old Kelly to an NHL contract.

Near the end of the 1959-60 season, Kelly was traded to the Toronto Maple Leafs. He became a forward, playing center and left wing for the rest of his career.

With the expansion of the NHL to 12 teams, Kelly looked hopefully for a coaching job, despite many cynics saying he was "too nice a man" to coach a hockey team. "Not enough fire and brimstone in him," was the way some critics put it. But Kelly went to Los Angeles and proved otherwise.

Off the ice, Kelly was a member of Parliament (Liberal) for three years from 1962 until 1965 when he decided he could no longer combine hockey with the Maple Leafs and politics to the satisfaction of both jobs. During his days as a Member of Parliament, Kelly had a simple philosophy, one which he has used through his life.

"The best way to make a speech is to say what you think and feel. If you're sincere and the idea is good, the delivery isn't so vital," he said.

Red is married to Andra McLaughlin, former U.S. Olympic Team member, world free-style skating champion and professional star. They have two sons and two daughters.

Ken Carson Trainer


The best judges of a trainer's value are the coach and players with whom he works. To a man, the Penguins have nothing but praise for Ken Carson.






ANDY BATHGATE
