

#### POTTER - HEAD PENGUIN

The Pittsburgh Penguins are in their fifth year as a member of the National Hockey League, but for the four new owners, it is as if expansion had just taken place.

Four very aggressive and optimistic businessmen from the Pittsburgh area pulled together to come up with seven million dollars and purchase the heretofore sagging franchise.

Thayer R. "Tad" Potter, 38, is making his first venture into professional sports as General Partner and

Chief Executive Officer of the Pittsburgh Penguin Partners (the club's official name).

The new chairman is a graduate of Edgewood High School, Valley Forge Military Academy and holds a bachelor of science degree in business administration from Penn State University.

Mr. Potter was serving as Director of Residential and Commercial Sales for the Peoples Natural Gas Company at the time his group acquired the franchise. During his eleven year tenure with the utility firm he held a variety of positions in the marketing department and brings a vast knowledge of local marketing techniques and sales to the club.

His previous connection with the Penguins was as a Hockey Hound. Year after year he was the top season ticket salesman which prompted the statement, "Only in America can you go from Hockey Hound to Chairman of the Board in one year."

Potter and his associates, Peter H. Block, Elmore Keener and A. H. "Peter" Burchfield plan to transform the Penguins into a winner as soon as possible. Their first trip to the National Hockey League draft meetings resulted in expenditures of over 110 thousand dollars for eleven new players, many of whom have become part of the "New Look" Pens.

Potter then proved to Pittsburghers how much faith he has in General Manager-Coach "Red" Kelley. A five-year contract was given to Kelly to insure his security with the club and alleviate the pressure of trying to produce an instant winner. The five year contract allows Kelly the time to build a solid contender that will be around for a number of years.

Executive Director Jack Riley and Director of Player Personnel, Jack Button, both were given new three year pacts to keep the trio of hockey minds together.

With the worries of financial difficulties now history, Potter can work on selling out the arena, and Kelly, Riley and Button can work on building a Stanley Cup Champion.

#### **RED KELLY**

From 1947 until 1971, the Stanley Cup Playoffs have been a way of life for Leonard "Red" Kelly. Last year, for only the second time in 24 years, Kelly was not involved in the playoffs as either a player or a coach. It was a bitter pill for him to swallow, and knowing what a fierce competitor Kelly is, there is no question that Kelly and the Penguins will be back on the post season action this April.



Leonard Patrick Kelly came into
the world in Simcoe, Ontario on July 9, 1927. He shed his diapers for ice skates at the age of two and a long and illustrious career in hockey had just begun. Kelly went directly from St. Michael's College in Toronto to the National Hockey League Detroit Red Wings as a nineteen-year-old rookie, and never looked back.

Kelly stayed in the NHL with the Red Wings for twelve and a half seasons where he played mostly defense. In 1960 he was traded to the Toronto Maple Leafs and became a forward playing center and left wing for the next seven and a half years.

His playing record is a legend; 1,316 regular season games played, 164 playoff games, 314 career goals scored, 601 career assists and 915 career points.

He was the first winner of the James Noris Memorial Trophy as the outstanding defenseman; a four-time winner of the Lady Byng Memorial Trophy; six First Team All Star Selections and two Second Team berths; eight times on Stanley Cup championship teams; and nine times on Prince of Wales Trophy-winning teams.

Kelly also tried his hand at politics where he served in Parliament as a member of the Liberal party for three years from 1962 to 1965, when he decided he could no longer give full attention to both hockey and politics.

In 1967 Kelly was named as coach of the Los Angeles Kings new expansion club. He guided the Kings to a second place finish (missing the title by one point) in his first season. Kelly's second season found the Kings in fourth, but making it to the playoff finals in the Western Division.

He was brought to Pittsburgh by Jack Riley in 1969 and led the Pens to a second place finish and an exciting showdown in the Western Division playoff finals with St. Louis before bowing out.

For his efforts he was named "Coach of the Year" by The Hockey News.

In 1970 he was given the dual capacity of General Manager and coach and this past Summer he signed a five-year contract with the Penguins.

Last year injuries took a heavy toll, but Kelly refuses to alibi, but rather looks ahead optimistically at the new season. He feels this year's crop of players is the best he has ever seen and will not concede first place to anybody until he is proven differently.

Red is married to the former Andra McLaughlin, a champion and winner in her own right. Mrs. Kelly was a three-time world free-style skating champion, member of the U.S. Olympic Team and professional star. Now she is the mother of four adorable little redheads, Casey (12), Patrick (10), Conn (8) and Kitty (3).



## Jack Riley Executive Director

Jack Riley has been connected with hockey in three different levels, as a player, coach and executive and now begins his sixth year with the Penguins. Riley played minor league hockey for Hershey and Baltimore and became a coach when he was only 26 years old. He served as general manager for Washington (EHL), Johnstown (EHL) and Rochester (AHL) before being named President of the American Hockey League from 1964-1966. He became the Penguin's G.M. in 1966 and his first club finished two points out of the playoffs and just six points out of first place. Riley was elevated to the position of Executive Director in 1970 and recently signed a three-year contract. Riley is the man responsible for bringing Red Kelly to Pittsburgh and when the Stanley Cup arrives here, Riley will have had a hand in making the Penguins a winner. Riley, 52, lives with his wife Jeanne and their daughter Barbara. The Rileys also have two married sons.





Jack Button starts his third season with the Pittsburgh organization, serving as the Assistant General Manager and Director of Player Personnel. The 32-year old Button started out as Publicity Director for Rochester (AHL) and later served as the AHL's Publicity Director for four years. He has served the Penguin organization as the laison between the parent club and the farm teams, and supervises the scouting corps. Button signed a three-year pact recently, and with Riley and Kelly form one of the best trio of hockey executives in the business.

Jack and his wife Bridgette are the parents of three sons.

#### PETER H. BLOCK

Governor

If there is one person in the city of Pittsburgh who is responsible for bringing major league hockey to Pittsburgh, it has to be Peter H. Block.

Mr. Block headed a group in 1966 that purchased one of six new franchises for two million dollars during the National Hockey League's first expansion program. Part way through the first year Mr. Block left the organization to further his other business interests. When it be-



came apparent in 1970 that the ownership was to change hands, Mr. Block rounded up three other interested buyers, and with his vast experience in the NHL, was able to present the best offer. Mr. Block proved to be the key to the successful purchase with his legal knowledge and overall workings of the league. When the final sale was approved by the league, Mr. Block assumed the position of Governor for the franchise and takes part in all Board of Governors meetings held by the league.

The 37-year old native of Pittsburgh is a graduate of the University of Pittsburgh Law School and practiced law for five years before entering the sports field. He has been very active of late in the field of finance and the area of business development.

Block is a resident of Mt. Lebanon, and resides with his wife. Ina, and their three children.

#### Kent D. Bowen

#### Controller

Kent Bowen is in his fourth year with the Penguins as the watchdog of the business affairs and finances. Mr. Bowen is a native of West Virginia and a graduate of the University of Pittsburgh. Kent also serves as the President of the Igloo Club in the Civic Arena, where large crowds gather after each home game. He is a member of the Zoological Society and arranges for the team mascot "Slapshot Pete" to appear before the games. Kent and his wife Luette and their four children reside in Pittsburgh.

## Terry Schiffhauer Director of Press Relations

Terry Schiffhauer begins his second season with the Penguins as Director of Press Relations, following six years as a sports writer-photographer with WJAC-TV and two years as publicity director for the Johnstown Jets (EHL). Schiffhauer, 28, is a native of Pittsburgh and attended the University of Pittsburgh at Johnstown. Terry and his wife, Bernadette are the parents of a daughter, Nicol and are expecting their second during the season.



#### Mary Parliament Director of Sales

Marv Parliament is beginning his fourth season as Director of Sales. The native of Cochrane, Ontario played collegiate hockey at Colorado College where he graduated with a degree in sociology in 1964. Parliament coordinates and administers season and group ticket sales and program advertising. He also heads the Hockey Hounds organization. Marv and his wife Francie are the parents of one son, Casey.



#### Ken Carson Trainer

People in the know rate Ken Carson as one of the top hockey trainers in the business, despite his young age of 29. Carson spent several seasons with minor league clubs before taking over as the Penguin's trainer in 1967. Ken and his wife Jean and their four children live in Pittsburgh.





#### SYL APPS

Center 6' 185 lbs. Age: 24 (August 1, 1947) Born: Toronto, Ontario Home: Kingston, Ontario Shoots: Right

Syl Apps, Jr. is one of the few second-generation players in the NHL who could comprise the first father-son combination in the Hall of Fame. Apps came to Pittsburgh on January 27, 1971 from the New York Rangers in a trade for Glen Sather. He scored the first game he played as a Penguin and endeared himself to the fans with his graceful style and hard hitting body checks. Apps, the son of former Toronto great Syl Apps, combined with Jean Pronovost and Greg Polis to give the Pens a great young line that was used often in key situations. One of the top games for the youngster was on February 13 when he scored two power play goals in the span of twenty seconds against the Chicago Black Hawks. Apps is a product of the New York organization and helped lead the Omaha Knights to the Central Hockey League championship in 1970 when he led the playoffs in scoring with 10 goals and 19 points. Apps is single and resides in Kingston, Ontario during the off-season.

Les Binkley may never admit to being older than what is listed in most hockey annuals, and nobody will really care just how young "Bink" is, as long as he turns in the steady goaltending that he has for the past four seasons. Binkley was the first player purchased by Pittsburgh in 1966 after several outstanding years with the AHL Cleveland Barons. Binkley won the rookie-of-the-year award in 1962 and was the top goalie in 1965-66 with the Barons. Due to his longevity with the club he holds most of the goalies records including 11 career shutouts and 6 whitewashes in one year. Last year Binkley appeared in 34 games before suffering a knee injury in a 4-0 win over Montreal on March 3. An off-season operation (his second in as many years) was termed successful. Les, his wife Eleanor, and their two children, Randy (15) and Leslie (5) reside in Walkerton, Ontario during the summer.

Wally Boyer has to be the only player in the NHL that belonged to the Montreal Canadiens on two occassions, yet never wore a Hab's uniform. Boyer played 5 seasons with Rochester of the AHL and following the 1965-66 season with Toronto, Boyer was drafted by Montreal and then drafted by Chicago. Oakland claimed Boyer in the Expansion Draft and in 1968 Montreal drafted the hustling little center and later traded him to Pittsburgh for Al MacNeil (coach of last year's Stanley Cup champions). Wally turned in his finest NHL season last year with 41 points before being sidelined with a broken thumb and holds the team record of two goals in the span of seven seconds. Wally, his wife Barbara, and their two children, Ken (8) and Kerri Jo (10) live in Toronto when the season is finished.

Burns is not known as a profound goal scorer but is rated as a strong checker and tireless worker. Burns was purchased by Pittsburgh last year and was assigned to Amarillo where he scored 16 goals. The native of Montreal played in ten games and suffered a broken nose during the last game of the season.

Darryl was selected by the St. Louis Blues in the first Expansion Draft but played in only 12 games before being traded to Philadelphia in a three-way deal that involved Pittsburgh. He was traded to Hershey in 1970 and the Penguins acquired the rights to him after this past season when he was named as an All Star defenseman in the AHL. Darryl is an extremely good rushing defenseman and also picks up his share of penalties with his aggressive style of play. Darryl and his wife Patricia are the parents of one son, Darryn (3) and are expecting a second child during the season.

Roy Edwards is a Penguin again, but this time he is going to play for Pittsburgh. In 1967, he was drafted from the Chicago Black Hawks in the Expansion Draft by Pittsburgh, but never got a chance to play, as he was traded to Detroit for Hank Bassen. 
